Weights and Measures Acts.

ADDITION TO THE CENTRAL GIPPSLAND WEIGHTS
AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Weights and Measures Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, at the request of the Councils of all the municipalities concerned, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any municipality specified in such Proclamation shall be added to and form part of a Union:

And whereas the State Electricity Commission of Victoria in respect of the Yallourn Works Area, and the Shires of Alberton, Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Morwell, Narracan, South Gippsland, Traralgon, Warragul and Woorayl, do constitute a Union under the title of the "Central Gippsland Weights and Measures Union" for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts:

And whereas the State Electricity Commission of Victoria in respect of the Yallourn Works Area, the Council of each of the said municipalities and the Council of the municipality of the Borough of Moe have requested that the Borough of Moe be added to and form part of the said Union:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from the first day of November, 1957, the Borough of Moe shall be added to and form part of such Union and do fix as follows the apportionment among such municipalities and the Yallourn Works Area of the expenses devolving on the Union under the said Acts:—

1. Each such municipality and the Yallourn Works Area shall contribute one twenty-fourth part of the expenses devolving on the Union.

2. The Yallourn Works Area shall, in addition to the amount specified in clause 1 hereof, contribute an amount which shall bear the same proportion to the expenses devolving upon the Union and not contributed in accordance with clause 1 hereof as the number of persons residing in the Yallourn Works Area bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union.

3. Of the expenses devolving upon the Union and not contributed in accordance with clauses 1 and 2 hereof—

(a) one-half shall be contributed by the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area) in such manner that the amount to be contributed by each municipality in accordance with this sub-clause shall bear the same proportion to the total expenses to be contributed in accordance with this sub-clause as the number of persons residing in each such municipality bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area); and

(b) the other half shall be contributed by the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area) in such manner that the

amount to be contributed by each municipality in accordance with this sub-clause shall bear the same proportion to the total expenses to be contributed in accordance with this sub-clause as the total net annual values of properties in the municipal district of each municipality (other than the Yallourn Works Area) bear to the total net annual values of properties in all the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area).

4. For the purposes of clause 2 and of sub-clause (a) of clause 3 the number of persons residing in each such municipality shall be deemed to be the number of persons residing therein as disclosed by the last periodical census conducted by or on behalf of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

5. For the purposes of computing the amount to be contributed by any municipality pursuant to sub-clause (b) of clause 3 hereof during any period ending on the thirtieth day of September in any year, the net annual values of properties in such municipality shall be deemed to be the net annual values of properties in the Municipal District of such municipality during the twelve months next preceding the period for which the amounts of contributions are being computed.

6. The foregoing provisions relating to the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union shall have effect from the first day of October next after the declaration or publication by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of Australia of the result of the periodical census showing the number of persons residing in each such municipality.

Provided that from the first day of November, 1957, until the thirtieth day of September next after the declaration or publication of the result of the census aforesaid the apportionment among such municipalities and the Yallourn Works Area of the expenses devolving upon the Union shall be as follows (that is to say):—

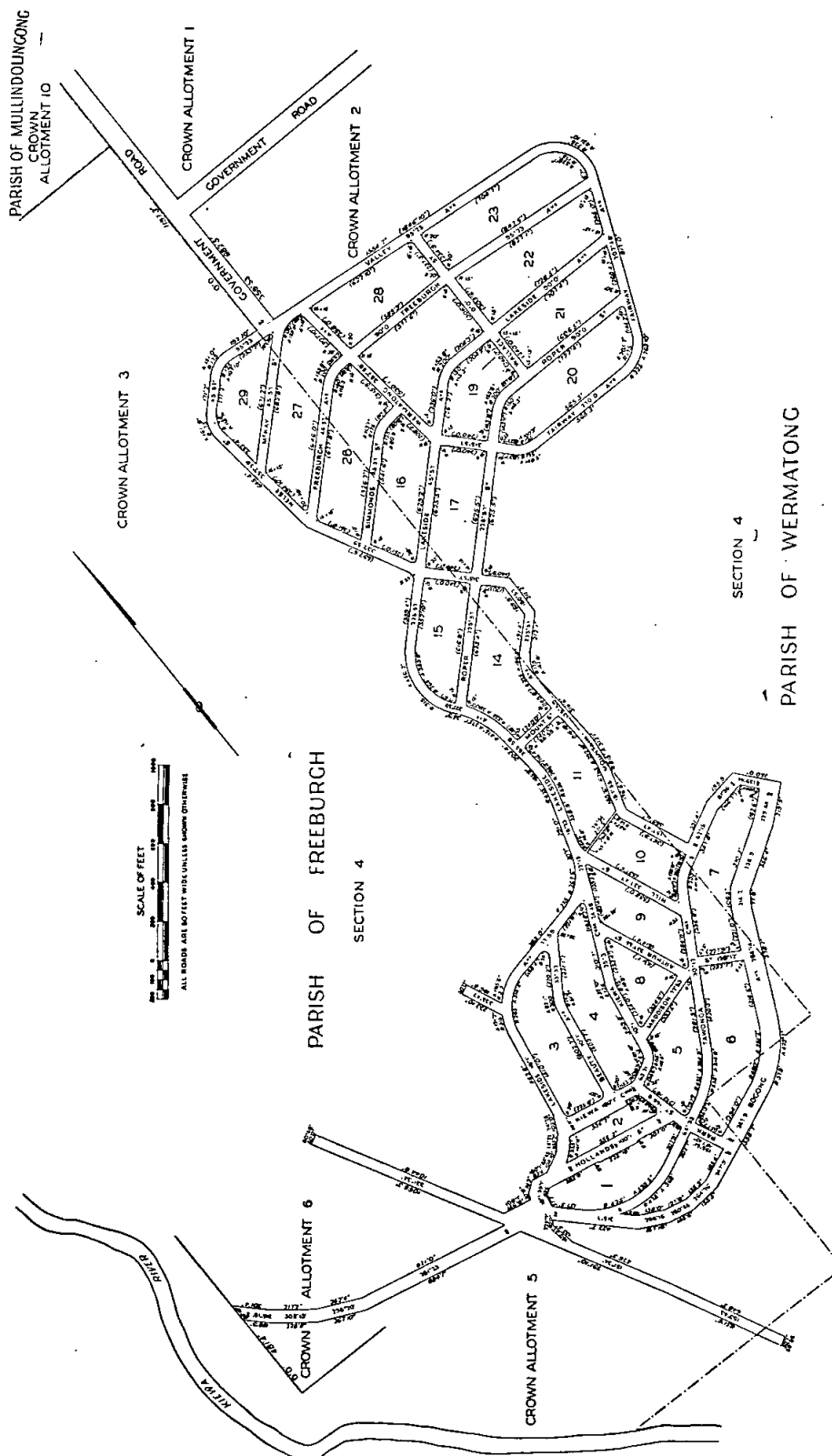
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Bright has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved for streets within the said Shire, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all those pieces of land at Mount Beauty in the Parishes of Wermatong and Freeburgh reserved for streets and defined by bearings and distances on the plan hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

REVOKING PROCLAMATIONS PROHIBITING THE BRINGING OF PLANTS OF THE SPECIES KNOWN AS TRIFOLIUM SUBTERRANEUM (SUBTERRANEAN CLOVER) OR ANY OF ITS VARIETIES FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF VICTORIA INTO OTHER PORTIONS OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 4 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928* (No. 3797), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamations made under the said Act on the 18th January, 1938, and the 5th October, 1948, with respect to the bringing of any plants of the species known or described as *Trifolium subterraneum* (Subterranean Clover) or any of its varieties or hybrids or any portions thereof (including the seed) into certain portions of Victoria from other portions of Victoria.

ADDITION TO THE GOULBURN REGION WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Weights and Measures Acts*, it is amongst other things enacted that, at the request of the councils of all the municipalities concerned, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any municipality specified in such Proclamation shall be added to and form part of a Union:

And whereas the City of Shepparton, the Boroughs of Echuca and Kyabram and the Shires of Deakin, Goulburn, Nathalia, Rochester, Rodney, Rutherglen, Shepparton, Waranga and Yarrawonga, do constitute a Union under the title of the "Goulburn Region Weights and Measures Union" for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Acts*:

And whereas the council of each of the said municipalities and the council of the municipality of the Shire of Numurkah have requested that the Shire of Numurkah be added to and form part of the said Union:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from the first day of October, 1957, the Shire of Numurkah shall be added to and form part of such Union and do fix as follows the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union under the said Acts:—

1. The amount to be contributed by each municipality of the Union as reconstituted in accordance with this Proclamation shall bear the same proportion to the expenses devolving upon the Union as the number of persons residing in each such municipality bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union.

2. The number of persons residing in each such municipality shall be deemed to be the number of persons residing therein as disclosed by the last periodical census conducted by or on behalf of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

3. The provisions set forth in paragraphs 1 and 2 hereof shall have effect from the first day of October next after the declaration or publication by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of Australia of the result of the periodical census showing the number of persons residing in each such municipality.

Provided that from the first day of October, 1957, until the thirtieth day of September next after the declaration or publication of the result of the census aforesaid, the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving upon the Union shall be as follows (that is to say):—

Borough of Echuca ..	8 per centum.
Borough of Kyabram ..	5 per centum.
Shire of Deakin ..	7 per centum.
Shire of Goulburn ..	3 per centum.
Shire of Nathalia ..	5 per centum.
Shire of Numurkah ..	7 per centum.
Shire of Rochester ..	9 per centum.
Shire of Rodney ..	14 per centum.
Shire of Rutherglen ..	5 per centum.
Shire of Shepparton ..	8 per centum.
Shire of Waranga ..	7 per centum.
Shire of Yarrawonga ..	6 per centum.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "The Principal Regulations".

2. Regulation No. 30 of the Principal Regulations is amended as under:—

(i) After sub-clause (d) insert the following:—

(e) The Master of a vessel proceeding either up or down the river to or from a berth in the areas mentioned in sub-clause (f) of Regulation No. 28 shall in addition to the berthing signals required by that sub-clause fly immediately below those signals the Answering Pennant, and if proceeding to sea shall fly the Answering Pennant only until such time as the vessel has swung and is proceeding on her passage outwards.

(ii) Delete the letter (e) from the present sub-clause so lettered and substitute therefor the letter (f).

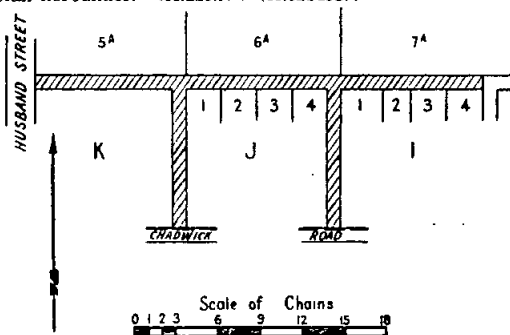

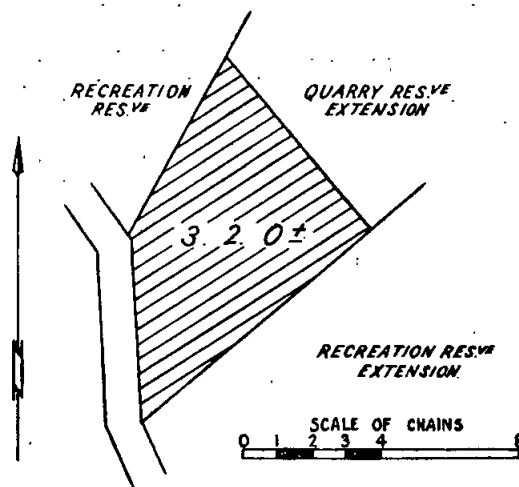

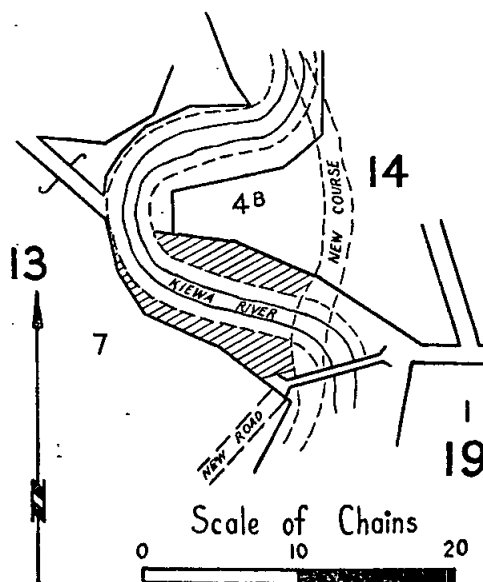

REGULATIONS—EXPENSES OF MEMBERS OF THE CANCER INSTITUTE BOARD.

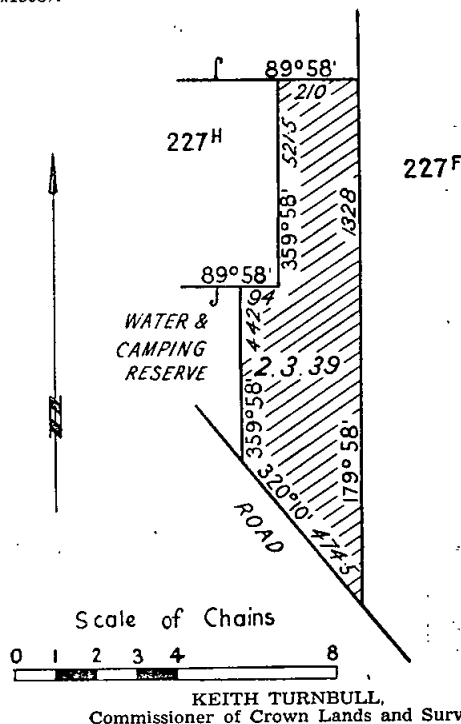

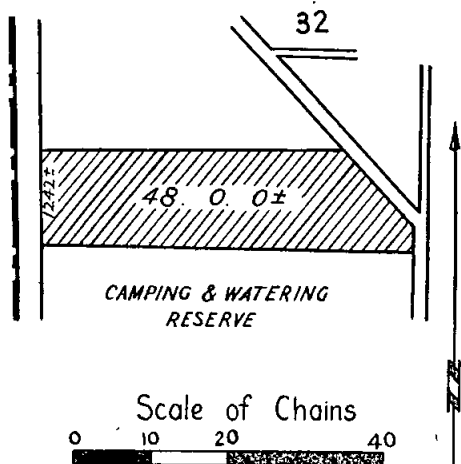

After Regulation 43 the following Regulation is inserted:—

"DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

43A. (1) In this Regulation "Department" means Department of Agriculture and "Director" means Director of Agriculture.

(2) Any officer—

- (a) who is a Technical and General Division officer in the Department, and

(5) (i) The examination in each of the Parts A. and B. mentioned in this Regulation shall be a written examination of three hours' duration; provided that the examinations in The Practice of Teaching and in Practical Soil Science shall be practical examinations as prescribed in the detailed syllabus.

Farm crops and their characteristics; distribution, soil and climatic requirements; diseases and pests and their control; fertilizer requirements; rotational practices; cultivation; seeding and harvesting; grade and quality in relation to marketing; crop improvement methods, application of mechanical aids; weed control—cultural and chemical.

Agrostology.

Botanical characteristics of pasture species; pasture plant ecology; establishment and management; improvement, utilization and conservation; disease and pest control; weed control and, for the Agricultural Division only: seed production—testing and certification; regulations under Seeds Act; rules of International Seed Testing Association.

General Plant Pathology.

Parasitic diseases: Nature and classification of plant parasitic bacteria, fungi, viruses and nematodes; variation and physiological specialization of plant pathogens; host pathogen relationships; effects of environment on disease reaction; methods of control including their mode of action, seed treatment, seed certification, bud selection, soil fumigation, health precautions; quarantine; legume rhizobia.

Non-parasitic diseases: Causes of non-parasitic disorders in plants including extremes of temperature, mechanical injuries, soil physical factors, unbalanced nutrition; plant nutrients and factors affecting their uptake and utilization; effects of nutrient disorders on plants, interaction of nutrients; control.

General Entomology.

A knowledge of insect classification and biology; principles of insect control; insecticides and methods of applying them; climatology and measurement of climatic factors.

Entomology and Plant Pathology.

Broad classification of pests and diseases; methods of control; sprays; biological control; quarantine; seed certification; seed treatment; bud selection; fumigation; mode of action of principal insecticides and fungicides; health precautions; spraying techniques and equipment. Plant Physiology and Nutrition.

- (7) lighting, &c., of obstructions generally, clauses 38 and 39;
 (8) houses, &c., encroaching on street, &c., clause 40; and
 (9) obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c., clauses 41 to 45, both inclusive.
 (11) Clause 47: driving near places of worship, &c.

Part II.—Waterworks, Drains, &c.
 Clauses 1 to 6, both inclusive.

Part IV.—Places of Improvement and Recreation, &c.
 Libraries, clauses 1 and 2.

Part V.—Regulation, &c., of Buildings.
 Clauses 5 to 8, both inclusive.

Part VI.—Building, &c., for Public Meetings, &c.
 Clauses 1 to 4, both inclusive.

Part VII.—Fire Prevention.

- (1) Foul chimneys, clauses 1 and 2.

Part XI.—Regulations of Proceedings of Council, Officers, &c.

Clause 1 and clauses 3 to 5, 12-56, inclusive, save and excepting in clause 54, the words, "The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks of one of which locks the chairman of the municipality shall have a key and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and"

2. At every ordinary meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting or meetings (provided that where copies of the said minutes have been delivered or sent by post or otherwise to the place of abode or to the usual place of business of each councillor prior to such ordinary meeting, the said minutes shall not be read but a question shall be put that such minutes shall be taken as read and confirmed), and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting or meetings shall then be signed as by the said Act required.
