AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5. of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## Poisons Acts.

ADDITION TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section thirty-eight of the *Poisons Act* 1928, as amended by the *Poisons Act* 1930 and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation add to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1928 the name of the following substances or preparations, namely:—

## 1. Ataractic Substances, including:—

- (i) Phenothiazine derivatives such as Chlorpromazine, Largactil, Thorazine, Megaphen, Promazine, Sparine, Mepazine, Pacatal;
- (ii) Benzilic Acid derivatives such as Benactyzine, Karmazine, Cevanol, Nutinal, Suavital, Cafron, Lucdil;
- (iii) 1 : 3-propane diol derivatives such as Meprobamate, Equanil, Miltown, Mepavlon, Placitate;
- (iv) Benzhydrol derivatives such as Azacyclonol, Frenquel;
- (v) Piperazine derivatives such as Hydroxyzine, Atarax;
- (vi) Methylpentynol, Oblivon, Somnesin, Dormison, Atempol, Insomnol.

2. Rauwolfia and its active principles and all preparations, admixtures and solutions of Rauwolfia or its active principles.

And declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act* 1928 shall apply to the substances or preparations so added as such Division applies to the substances or preparations already included in the said paragraph (2).

ADDITION OF A SUBSTANCE TO THE FOURTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section twenty-four of the *Poisons Act* 1928, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation add to Part II. of the Fourth Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1928 the names of the following substances or preparations:—

1. Dieldrin and all substitution and/or addition products of dimethanonaphthalene whether described as Dieldrin, Aldrin, Endrin, Isodrin or by any other name and preparations or admixtures thereof except preparations containing less than 0.5 per cent. of such substances and labelled as follows:—

(a) With a statement of the percentage of Dieldrin, and

(b) with the following warning:—

"Caution.—Avoid repeated skin contact. Do not spray on food or food utensils. Wash hands after use. When spraying a room with an atomizer, close doors and windows and leave room unoccupied for at least 15 minutes."

2. Pentachlorophenol and its salts and all preparations thereof.

REMOVAL OF SUBSTANCE FROM FOURTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748).

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section twenty-four of the *Poisons Act* 1928, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do hereby remove from the Fourth Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1928 the following substance which was added to such Schedule by a Proclamation made on the 12th July, 1955, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th July, 1955:

Dieldrin and all substitution and/or addition products of dimethanonaphthalene whether described as Dieldrin, Aldrin, Endrin, Isodrin, or by any other name and preparations or admixtures thereof except preparations containing less than 2 per cent. of such substance and labelled as follows:—

(a) With a statement of the percentage of Dieldrin, and

(b) with the following warning:—

"Not to be used for spraying into the air as for flies nor for general application to large areas nor for spraying bedding. When used indoors apply directly with brush or swab. Avoid inhalation or contact with skin or food-stuffs."

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MALVERN.

## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And, whereas the Council of the City of Malvern has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land shown as Watson-street on plan of subdivision No. 2131 lodged in the Office of Titles, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

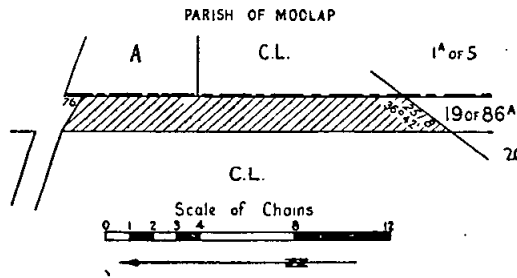

## CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Landlord and Tenant (Control) Regulations, 1957, and shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of October, 1957.

## REVOCATION:

2. All Regulations made under the *Landlord and Tenant Act 1948* and in force immediately prior to the date upon which these Regulations come into force are hereby revoked:

## RECEIPTS FOR RENT OF PRESCRIBED PREMISES TO BE GIVEN:

3. The person receiving any payment of rent of prescribed premises or of any prescribed premises together with goods shall, at the time of receiving the payment, give or cause to be given to the person making the payment a receipt for the payment specifying the date of the payment and showing the amount paid, the period in respect of which the payment is made, and, where such payment is partly in respect of premises and partly in respect of goods, containing words to that effect:

## APPLICATIONS FOR DETERMINATION OF FAIR RENT.

4. Every application for the determination of the fair rent of any prescribed premises shall be in the form or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the Schedule to these Regulations; with such variations thereto as the circumstances of the particular case demand; and shall be sufficiently signed if it be signed by the applicant or by his solicitor or by his agent authorized by him in that behalf.

## APPOINTMENT OF TIME, DATE, AND PLACE FOR HEARING APPLICATION:

5. The time, date, and place of the hearing of any application shall be appointed by the stipendiary magistrate constituting the Fair Rents Board at the place to which the application is made or by the Clerk of Petty Sessions at such place.

## PROOF OF SERVICE BY AFFIDAVIT.

6. In any proceedings before a Fair Rents Board; without prejudice to any other mode of proof, service on a person of any notice required by the *Landlord and Tenant (Control) Act 1957* to be given to or served upon any person may be proved by an affidavit of the person who has given or served the same or, where the same may be sent by post, of the person who posted the same and any document which purports to be such an affidavit shall be prima facie proof of the statements contained therein and shall be received in evidence in any proceedings before a Board.

## AGREEMENTS PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 28 OF THE LANDLORD AND TENANT (CONTROL) ACT, 1957.

7. Every agreement pursuant to the provisions of section twenty-eight of the *Landlord and Tenant (Control) Act 1957* shall be in the form or to the effect of the Form No. 2 in the Schedule to these Regulations with such variations thereto as the circumstances of the particular case demand, and shall be executed in duplicate and one copy thereof shall be retained by the lessor and the other copy by the lessee.

PENALTY.

8. Any person who fails to do anything required to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

(a) the premises of any lodging-house or boarding-house;

(b) any part of premises which is leased separately for the purposes of residence—

but does not include premises licensed for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or premises which though leased for the purposes of residence have ceased to be used for those purposes to any substantial extent.

“Higher rent dwelling” means prescribed premises, being a dwelling-house, which were leased at the 31st day of December, 1940, or at any time within five years before that day at a rent (not including the rent of any goods then leased therewith) of not less than the rate of Two pounds ten shillings per week, and which at the first day of November, 1954, were unoccupied or were occupied by a lessee solely for residential purposes and were not a boarding-house or a common lodging-house within the meaning of the *Health Act 1956*, and were not sub-let in part to any person.

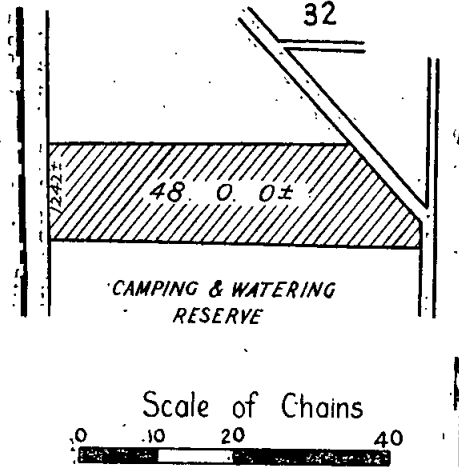

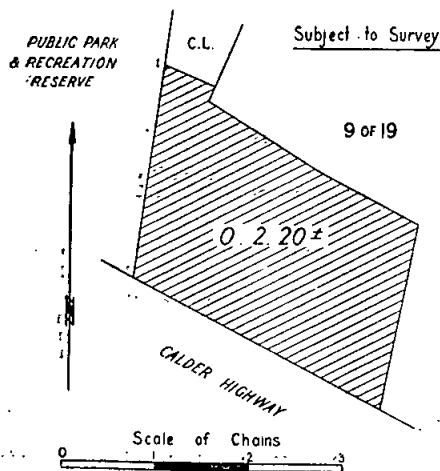

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TALBOT RECREATION RESERVE.**

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Amherst temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council of the 19th February, 1957, and known as the Talbot Recreation Reserve, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football or golf matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which such occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

(b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

(c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

(d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

(e) Carry or discharge any fire-arms or air-guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding any entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on any occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport or organized game within the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of

money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any other refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall, in the Reserve—

(a) Light a fire without the permission of the Committee.

(b) Deposit or leave any broken glass, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a place set apart or in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including cricket, tennis, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing areas, with any vehicle, or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.463.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

A By-law of the City of Kew made under the provisions of Part VII. and Part XXXV. of the *Local Government Act 1946* and numbered 93 for the control and management of public reserves, pleasure grounds or places of public resort or recreation within the said City.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In this By-law—

"Council" means the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew.

"Owner" includes the person in charge of a vehicle.

"Reserve" means and includes the following public reserves, pleasure grounds or places of public resort or recreation within the City of Kew and known as—

"Childers Reserve" abutting the east side of Park-crescent, the north side of Childers-street, and the south side of Asquith-street, and extending easterly at rear of premises Childers-street to the west side of Belford-road and north side of High-street.

"Edgevale Reserve" abutting the north side of Barkers-road and the west side of Edgevale-road.

"Eglinton Reserve" abutting the north side of Eglinton-street, the east side of Derby-street and the west side of Disraeli-street.

"Fenton Reserve" abutting the north end of Fenton-avenue.

"Harrison Reserve" abutting the north side of High-street, and the south side of Kilby-road.

"Hyde Park" abutting the east side Willsmere-road, the south side of Kilby-road and the west side of White-avenue and extending southerly to Sutherland-avenue.

"Kellett Reserve" abutting the south side of Fitzwilliam-street and the east side of Malin-street.

"Kilby Reserve" within the area north of Kilby-road, east of Leason-street south of Newbury-street and west of Frater-street.

"Outer Circle Reserve" extending from Princess-street to High-street and from Campbell-street to Burke-road.

"Reservoir Reserve" abutting south side Cotham-road and east side Grange-road.

"Southesk Reserve" abutting south side Cotham-road and west side Charles-street.

"Stradbroke Park" abutting the north side of Harp-road the west side of Burke-road and the south side of High-street.

"Willsmere Park" abutting the north side of Kilby-road and the west side of Willow-grove.

"Vehicle" includes every conveyance capable of being propelled, pushed or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical or other power and includes a motor car.

3. Except with the written permission of the Council previously had and obtained, no person shall at any time, play or practice cricket, football, golf, or other game, or engage in training or exercising for any sport, game, or contest in the Reserve.

4. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground of the Reserve during any cricket or football match, or sports, games, or amusements, or during practice at football, cricket or other games when any such crossing or trespassing would be injurious to, or be an undue interference with, the progress of the aforesaid football, cricket, sports, games or amusements.

5. No person shall climb, jump, or get upon or over or under any fences or gates of the Reserve, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates, or any of the buildings, seats, equipment, trees, or shrubs in the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any such fences, gates, buildings, seats, equipment or trees, or light a fire in the reserve, or dig or remove any turf or soil, or enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs or plants, or commit any nuisance in the reserve, or damage or destroy any property or thing in the Reserve.

6. No person shall throw or deposit any glass, filth, rubbish, refuse, junk, building material or waste material of any kind or cause any glass, filth, rubbish, refuse, junk, building material or waste material of any kind to fall or to be thrown or deposited upon or in the Reserve.

7. Persons using the Reserve for any purpose shall, prior to leaving the area, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, scraps, bottles, glass, or litter of any kind brought or made by them.

8. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms in the Reserve or snare, trap, catch or destroy or interfere in any way with any bird, fish or game therein.

9. No person shall throw or discharge in the Reserve any missile to the damage, danger, or annoyance of any person.

10. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Reserve.

11. No person in the Reserve shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct.

12. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article of food or drink or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement, or erect any tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure without the permission in writing of the Council.

13. No person shall make any wager for money or play any unlawful game within the Reserve.

14. No person shall, in the Reserve, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any servant of the Council, in the proper execution of his duty or work.

15. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any member of the Police Force, or any servant of the Council, to leave the same.

16. No person shall camp in the Reserve or assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission in writing of the Council.

17. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the Reserve, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council.

18. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve, or litter same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

19. No person shall ride, drive or lead or cause to be ridden, driven or led, any horse or other animal on, over or through the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council.

20. No person shall drive a vehicle in over or through the Reserve except in, over or through the portions of the Reserve set apart for such purpose and no vehicle shall be parked or be left standing in the reserve except in that portion set apart by the Council and indicated by notice in writing as a parking area, and the owner shall not permit a vehicle to remain in such parking area for any continuous period exceeding twenty-four hours.

In this clause, "drive" means to drive, propel, push or draw a vehicle.

21. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord.

22. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, or other animal, and the Council or any servant thereof shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle, sheep, or other animal found trespassing therein, and the owner of such cattle, sheep, or other animal shall be liable to the penalties provided in this By-law.

23. No person shall remove, displace, or disfigure any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed for the exhibition of any regulation or notice fixed or set up by the Council in the Reserve.

24. When in the opinion of the Council it is desirable or necessary that the use of any swing, slide, wheel, fitting, fixture or appliance erected, placed or provided in the Reserve shall be restricted to certain persons, a notice shall be posted in the vicinity indicating for whose use any such swing, slide, wheel, fitting, fixture or appliance is or are intended and no person or persons other than those so indicated shall use or interfere with any such swing, slide, wheel, fitting, fixture or appliance.

25. No person shall enter or use any dressing pavilion or other like building in the Reserve without the permission of the Council except such parts of such pavilion or other building as are set aside specifically for public use.

26. No person shall do, aid or abet any act or thing which is a breach of this By-law or which may not be in this By-law specifically mentioned and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the Reserve or any part thereof or any building therein or to interfere with the use or enjoyment thereof by the public.

(ii) Any person who wilfully continues an offence contrary to the provisions of this By-law after a conviction or order of the court in respect of such offence, shall be liable on conviction to a further penalty of not more than One pound for each day on which the offence is so continued.

#### CITY OF MOORABBIN.

##### BY-LAW No. 231.

A By-law of the City of Moorabbin, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946* and numbered 231, for the purpose of regulating traffic and prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles standing in the streets and roads or parts thereof specified in this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless repugnant or inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Council” means the Council of the City of Moorabbin.

“Motor car” has the same meaning as in the *Motor Car Act 1951*.

“U” turn means the complete turn referred to and illustrated in clause 15 of the Road Traffic Acts (Metropolitan) Regulations 1955.

“Vehicle” includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, or mechanical power, and includes a motor car.

2. No driver of a motor car or other vehicle shall—

- (a) make a “U” turn, or
- (b) drive in the reverse direction—

on that part of Centre-road, Bentleigh, situated between Jasper-road and Lorraine-street.

3. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) a motor car or other vehicle standing in any of the following places:—

(a) On the west side of Burgess-street, Bentleigh, between Centre-road and Brewer-road between sunrise and sunset for a period exceeding two hours; or

(b) on those portions of Bendigo-avenue, Daley-street, Mitchell-street, and Robert-street, Bentleigh, between Centre-road and a point 600 feet south therefrom (subject to the absolute prohibition as to certain portions thereof contained in sub-clauses (c) and (d) hereof) between sunrise and sunset for a period exceeding two hours; or

(c) on the west sides of Bendigo-avenue, Daley-street, Mitchell-street, and Robert-street, Bentleigh—

(i) between a point 110 feet south of Centre-road and a point 165 feet south of Centre-road, and

(ii) between a point 450 feet south of Centre-road and a point 500 feet south of Centre-road; or

(d) on the east sides of Bendigo-avenue, Daley-street, Mitchell-street, and Robert-street, Bentleigh, between a point 300 feet south of Centre-road and a point 350 feet south of Centre-road; or

(e) on the east side of Bent-street, Bentleigh, between Centre-road and Morres-street between sunrise and sunset for a period exceeding two hours; or

(f) on those portions of Vickery-street, Bentleigh, between Centre-road and Morres-street and Godfrey-street, Bentleigh, between Centre-road and Horsley-street (subject to the absolute prohibition as to certain portions thereof contained in sub-clause (g) hereof) between sunrise and sunset for a period exceeding two hours; or

(g) on those portions of the west side of Vickery-street and Godfrey-street, Bentleigh, between a point 100 feet north of Centre-road and a point 150 feet north of Centre-road; or

(h) on the west side of Bent-street, Bentleigh, between Centre-road and Morres-street; or

(i) on the east side of Nicholson-street, Bentleigh, between a point 117 feet north of Centre-road and a point 100 feet further northwards.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout those parts of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin set out in paragraphs 2 and 3 hereof.

5. By-law No. 190 of the City of Moorabbin is hereby repealed.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 15th day of April, 1957, and confirmed the 3rd day of June, 1957.

## BOROUGH OF KYABRAM.

## BY-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Borough of Kyabram, numbered 6, relating to the collection, removal, and disposal of refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1928 and of any other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Kyabram, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Kyabram.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewerage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

4. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

5. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24-gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leaking or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

6. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 2 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

7. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

8. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

9. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

10. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council's Inspector.

11. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

12. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

13. Whenever any trade refuse has accumulated in or about any shop or business premises in such quantity or in such manner as would render inconvenient the removal of such trade refuse in the manner prescribed by the By-law by the contractor or other person authorized in that behalf by the Council, the proprietor of such premises shall upon being required so to do by the Inspector forthwith remove such trade refuse to the tip, incinerator, destructor, or depot appointed or ordinarily used by the Council for the reception of such rubbish. The provisions of this clause shall not be deemed to limit the liability of such proprietor under any other provisions contained in this By-law.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its inception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the approved tip, incinerator, or destructor, where, as soon as practicable, the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or by some other method as may be approved by the Council or, in the case of a tip owned or conducted by the Council, by a method as may be approved by the Commission, and in such manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. The Council shall cause all refuse from any premises to be disposed of in an efficient, proper, and sanitary manner at an approved tip, incinerator, or destructor, and no person shall dispose of such refuse at such tip, incinerator, or destructor in such manner as to create a nuisance.

21. The Council's Inspector shall have full power to enter in or upon any premises, yards, or land at any time for the purpose of inspecting receptacles, vehicles, plant, places, and all other things therein and thereon for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Borough of Kyabram on the 25th day of July, 1956, and confirmed at a meeting of the Council held on the 12th day of September, 1956.
