Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 (No. 3736).

MILK AREA PROCLAIMED—PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF CHARLTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 (No. 3736)* it is enacted that on the recommendation of the Minister any portion of the State of Victoria may be proclaimed a Milk Area by the Governor in Council: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is also enacted that the said Act shall have effect as regards any milk area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the Milk Areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine, and Port Fairy, on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia,

by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Agriculture, do by this my Proclamation declare the Central Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Charlton together with the whole of the premises of each and every dairy and dairy farm outside such portion of a Municipal District wherever situated from which milk is sold within such portion of a Municipal District shall constitute a Milk Area to be called the Charlton Milk Area: And I do further declare that the first day of November, 1957, shall be the day on which the Act and all Regulations and Orders now in force or which may from time to time be made under the said Act shall come into operation and be of full force and effect in such Milk Area.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the third day of August 1948 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eleventh day of August 1948 respecting prohibition of all fishing in or the taking of fish from certain waters from the first day of September to the thirty-first day of October (both days inclusive) in each year by substituting for the words set opposite "Tambo River (a)" in such Proclamation the words "Below or downstream from the bridge over such river at Tambo Upper" and by deleting all of the words set after "Tambo River (b) and (c)" in such Proclamation.

- (c) By deleting all the words after "Timboon-Nirranda Road" in the words set opposite "Curdies River" in Section "B" of such Proclamation.
- (d) By deleting the word "Colac" in the "Lakes" column in Section "B" of such Proclamation.
- (e) By deleting all the words after the word "Axedale" in the words set opposite "Campaspe River" in Section "B" of such Proclamation.
- (f) By adding after the words "Hepburn Springs Park" in the words set opposite "Loddon River" in Section "B" of such Proclamation the words "nor Kangaroo Creek and tributaries above Bullarto Reservoir."

PENTAL ISLAND RIVER IMPROVEMENT TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 1.

THE Pental Island River Improvement Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *River Improvement Act 1948*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate, to be called the "Pental Island River Improvement District River Improvement Rate," is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all the properties within the Pental Island River Improvement District which are rateable to any municipality, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the net annual municipal value of such properties: Provided that the sum of One shilling shall be the minimum amount of rate in respect of any property liable to be rated in the said District.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 2nd day of July, 1957, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1957, and shall be payable on the 30th day of October, 1957, at the office of the Pental Island River Improvement Trust at Swan Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the Pental Island River Improvement Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are, hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

Should a collision take place whereby any damage is caused to any vessel, wharf, or property within the Port, or should any vessel ground or sink within the Port, then the master of any such vessel and every other person concerned in such collision grounding or sinking shall immediately report to the Harbor Master and describe the circumstances of the collision grounding or sinking (hereinafter referred to as the "accident") and confirm this report in writing as soon as possible in accordance with the following form and supply all particulars set out (where applicable).

3. Regulation No. 278 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting the words "Commissioners in writing" at the end of the Regulation and substituting therefore the words "Harbor Master and confirm this report in writing to the Commissioners as soon as possible".

LEONGATHA SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

BY-LAW No. 2.—RELATING TO CONSENTS, LICENCES, ETC., AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO HOUSE CONNEXION WORK.

THE Leongatha Sewerage Authority, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Sewerage Districts Acts and of any and every other power or authority in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. Copies of the Authority's plans and/or designs of individual house drainage will be furnished by the Authority upon application and payment for the same and subject to such conditions as follows:—

- (a) (i) Where the Authority designs the work and has same carried out for the owner, a charge shall be made equal to ten per centum (10 per cent.) on the capital cost of the work for designing, specifying, letting contract, and supervising all details in connexion with such work.
 - (ii) Consent for additions to and/or amendments of approved plans or to works previously approved will be made only on the application of the owner or his authorized agent, and on payment of a fee of Fifteen shillings (15s.).
- (b) When the Authority designs the work for the owner and the owner then carries out his own work—
 - (i) For plan of design, a fee of Three pounds (£3), plus Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) for each fitting.
 - (ii) For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Fifteen shillings (15s.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.

- (iii) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (iv) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (v) For the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer and charting the work on the Authority's plans, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vi) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work.
- The house connexion will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

(c) Where an owner designs and carries out his own work—

- (i) For the supply of a block plan, a fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.). For tenements exceeding 4,000 square feet in ground floor area and/or properties exceeding 2 acres in extent, an additional fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) shall be charged for each additional 4,000 square feet, or part thereof, and/or for each additional 2 acres, or part thereof.
- (ii) The owner shall submit for examination a properly drawn design on tracing cloth or good-quality paper and a type-written specification. The design and specification shall be supplied to the Authority in triplicate. The work shall not proceed until the owner's design and specification have been approved by the Engineer and the third copy returned to him with the official endorsement.
- (iii) For the examination of the owner's plan of design and specification, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each plan of from one to five fittings, plus Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) for every fitting over five.
- (iv) For examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.
- (v) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vi) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vii) For the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer and charting the work on the Authority's plans, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (viii) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work.

The house connexion will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby further amend as follows the Country Fire Authority (General) Regulations, that is to say:—

1. In Regulation 4 for the expression "Part II.—Permanent Fire Brigades" there shall be substituted the expression "Part II.—Permanent Officers and Members of Fire Brigades."

2. In paragraph (b) of Regulation 7 after sub-paragraph (i) thereof there shall be inserted the following sub-paragraph:—

"(ia) Class A (I.) Volunteer fire brigades to which a Station Officer or a Station Officer and one or more Sub-Station Officers have been appointed by the Authority and which include a Foreman, Apparatus Officer, Secretary and such additional volunteer officers and firemen as the Authority determines from time to time."

3. For the heading "Part II.—Permanent Fire Brigades" above Regulation 16 there shall be substituted the heading "Part II.—Permanent Officers and Members of Fire Brigades".

4. In sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 16—

(a) for the words "A candidate for appointment to a permanent brigade must", there shall be substituted the words "A candidate for appointment to membership of a permanent brigade or for appointment as a permanent officer of a volunteer brigade shall save as hereinafter provided"; and

(b) after the expression "at the discretion of the Authority", there shall be inserted the words "and the provisions relating to age hereinbefore contained shall not apply to a candidate who is already a permanent officer or (in the case of a first appointment to the position of Sub-station Officer or Station Officer in a Class A (I.) brigade) to a volunteer officer or fireman who is a candidate for such appointment".

5. After Regulation 16 there shall be inserted the following regulations:—

"16A. (1) Permanent firemen shall be classified as follows—

- (a) First year's experience;
- (b) Second year's experience;
- (c) Third year's experience;
- (d) Fourth year's experience—Grade B;
- (e) Fifth year's experience—Grade A;
- (f) Senior Firemen.

(2) The promotion of a fireman from the first to the second year's experience shall be made by the Authority upon the certificate of the Chief Officer that such fireman has given satisfactory service and has proved himself suitable. Upon such promotion the seniority of a permanent fireman shall be calculated from the date upon which he commenced his first year's experience.

(3) If his conduct and service have been satisfactory to the Chief Officer the promotion of a fireman to the next higher rank shall thereafter, until he has completed his fifth year's experience, be automatic at the end of each year of service.

(4) Promotion of a fireman at or after the end of the fifth year's experience to senior fireman shall, if his conduct and service have been satisfactory to the Chief Officer, be automatic—

- (a) upon his being or becoming qualified for such promotion by examination; or
- (b) upon completion by him of nine years' continuous service."

"16B. (1) Promotion to any permanent rank above senior fireman shall be made by the Authority and shall not necessarily be by seniority. A candidate to be eligible for promotion to any permanent rank above senior fireman shall have—

- (a) at least three years' service as a permanent fireman in the employ of the Authority; or
- (b) at least five years' service as a volunteer fireman in a brigade registered by the Authority—

and save as hereinafter provided shall have passed to the satisfaction of a Board of Examiners appointed by the Authority—

- (i) an educational test, comprising reading, writing, arithmetic, composition, spelling and general knowledge, and
- (ii) a test in practical and mechanical knowledge of fire brigade work—

as set by the Chief Officer and approved by the Authority. Not less than one month's notice of intention to hold any such tests, notifying the date and the nature thereof, shall be given by the Chief Officer in writing to every brigade.

(2) A volunteer officer or volunteer fireman who in accordance with the provisions of sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation is eligible for promotion to a permanent rank above senior fireman shall be eligible for appointment as sub-station officer or station officer in the case of the first appointments to such positions in a Class A (I.) brigade but save as aforesaid a volunteer officer or volunteer fireman shall not be eligible for appointment as sub-station officer or station officer.

(3) On the occurrence of a vacancy in the position of station officer other than a vacancy for appointment to a position for which any volunteer officer or volunteer fireman is pursuant to sub-regulation (2) hereof eligible, the Chief Officer shall invite applications from officers with the rank of sub-station officer. If, in the opinion of the Chief Officer, none of the applicants of the rank of sub-station officer is suitable or qualified for the appointment as station officer, he shall report the same to the Authority, and the Authority may authorize the Chief Officer to invite applications for appointment to such position from qualified permanent firemen."

6. In sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 20—

- (a) after the word "Roll-call", there shall be inserted the words "in a permanent fire brigade"; and
- (b) for the expression "1 p.m., and 6 p.m.," there shall be substituted the expression "3 p.m., and 11 p.m.,".

7. Regulation 30 shall be renumbered 30B.

8. There shall be inserted between the heading "Part III.—Volunteer Fire Brigades" and Regulation 30B the following regulation:—

"30A. In this Part and in Part IV. of and the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations the expression 'Officer in Charge' in its application to an urban brigade shall mean in the case of a Class A (I.) brigade the Station Officer thereof and in the case of any other brigade the Captain thereof".

9. In sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 31 after the word "registered", there shall be inserted the words "as a volunteer officer or member".

10. In sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 31 after the word "registered", there shall be inserted the words "as a volunteer officer or member".

11. In sub-regulation (3) of Regulation 34 for the words "the captain", there shall be substituted the words "the Officer in Charge".

12. In sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 36 before the word "Officers", there shall be inserted the word "Volunteer".

13. In Regulation 37 before the word "Officers", there shall be inserted the word "Volunteer".

14. In Regulation 38 before the word "Officer", there shall be inserted the word "Volunteer".

15. In Regulation 39 before the word "Officer" (wherever appearing), there shall be inserted the word "Volunteer".

16. In sub-regulation (5) of Regulation 40 before each of the words "Officers" and "Officer", there shall be inserted the word "Volunteer".

17. In sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 43 between the words "Any" and "Officer", there shall be inserted the word "Volunteer".

18. In Regulation 44 for the word "Captain", there shall be substituted the expression "Officer in Charge".

19. Regulation 45 shall be deleted and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

" 45. The Lieutenant or Sub-station Officer in an urban brigade and the Lieutenants in rural brigades shall aid and assist the Captain or Officer in Charge in the discharge of his duties and obey promptly all orders received from him. In the absence of the Captain or Officer in Charge, the Lieutenant in an urban brigade other than a Class A (I.) brigade, the senior Sub-station Officer in a Class A (I.) brigade and the Senior Lieutenant in a rural brigade shall assume command of the brigade and be vested with all the powers of Captain or Officer in Charge".

20. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of Regulation 46 shall be deleted and the following paragraphs substituted therefor:—

" (a) In the case of a Class A (I.) brigade act with and be under the direction of the Station Officer and Sub-station Officer or Sub-station Officers and in the case of any other volunteer brigade act with and be under the direction of the Captain and Lieutenant or Lieutenants;

(b) In the case of a Class A (I.) brigade perform the duties of the Station Officer in the absence of the Station Officer and Sub-station Officer or Sub-station officers and in the case of any other volunteer brigade perform the duties of the Captain in the absence of the Captain and Lieutenant or Lieutenants".

21. In paragraph (c) of Regulation 48 after the word "brigade", there shall be inserted the words "or Station Officer thereof".

22. In sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 56 for the word "Captain", there shall be substituted the expression "Officer in Charge".

23. In Regulation 57 after the word "Captains", there shall be inserted the words "and Station Officers".

24. In sub-regulation (12) of Regulation 60 after the word "brigade", there shall be inserted the words "or Station Officer thereof".

25. In sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 61 before the word "Officers" (wherever appearing), there shall be inserted the word "Volunteer".

26. In the Second Schedule for the figures and words "60 Market-street, Melbourne", there shall be substituted the figures and words "206 Clarendon-street, East Melbourne".

27. The heading to sub-rule (2) of Rule 5 in the Fourth Schedule reading "The Captain of an Urban Brigade" shall be deleted and the heading "Chairman of meetings of an Urban Brigade" substituted therefor.

28. Sub-rule (2) of Rule 5 in the Fourth Schedule shall be deleted and the following rule substituted therefor:—

“(2) (a) In the case of an urban brigade other than a Class A or a Class A (I.) brigade in addition to the duties set out in any regulations made pursuant to the Country Fire Authority Acts, the Captain shall preside at all meetings of the brigade and committees of the brigade at which he is present. The Captain shall have a casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote. In the absence of the Captain the officer next in seniority shall preside and be vested with the powers of Captain.

(b) (i) In the case of a Class A brigade the senior partially paid officer for the time being or, if there be only one partially paid officer, such officer shall hold the office of chairman of brigade meetings until the brigade resolves in general meeting that the office of chairman of brigade meetings shall be chosen by an elective system and a choice pursuant to such system has been made.

(ii) In the case of a Class A (I.) brigade the senior volunteer officer for the time being or, if there be only one volunteer officer, such officer shall hold the office of chairman of brigade meetings until the brigade resolves in general meeting that the office of chairman of brigade meetings shall be chosen by an elective system and a choice pursuant to such system has been made.

(iii) If a Class A brigade or a Class A (I.) brigade resolves in general meeting that the chairman of brigade meetings shall be chosen by an elective system then such brigade shall at each meeting of the brigade at which a biennial election of officers pursuant to Regulation 40 is held elect by ballot a chairman of brigade meetings to hold office as such for a term of two years from and including the first day of July next following the month of election until and including the 30th day of June of the second succeeding year at the end of which day he shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election: Provided that if such a brigade at any meeting other than the meeting at which a biennial election of officers pursuant to Regulation 40 is held resolves that the office of chairman of brigades is to be chosen by an elective system such brigade shall at the same meeting elect a chairman of brigade meetings to hold office for a term until and including the 30th day of June next following the next meeting of such brigade at which a biennial election of officers pursuant to Regulation 40 is held at the end of which 30th day of June the chairman so elected shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

(iv) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the chairman of brigade meetings of a Class A or a Class A (I.) brigade shall cease to hold office as such if he ceases to be a member of such brigade or if he be removed from office by a resolution of the brigade passed at a duly constituted meeting thereof.

(v) While the elective system is operative in a Class A or a Class A (I.) brigade any casual vacancy occurring in the office of chairman of brigade meetings shall be filled by ballot of members of the brigade at a duly constituted meeting thereof but the chairman so elected shall be subject to retirement at the same time as if he had become chairman of brigade meetings on the day on which the person in whose place he is elected was last elected the chairman of brigade meetings.

(vi) The chairman of brigade meetings of a Class A brigade or a Class A (I.) brigade shall preside at all meetings of the brigade and committees of the brigade at which he is present. In case of his absence from any such meeting the members present shall elect one of their number to preside at such meeting. The chairman of any meeting of such a brigade or of a committee thereof shall have a casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote.

29. In sub-rule (3) of Rule 9 of the Fourth Schedule after the word “captain” (wherever appearing), there shall be inserted the words “or officer in charge”.

And the Honorable Murray Victor Porter, for and on behalf of Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

COUNTRY FIRE AUTHORITY (PERMITS) REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for prescribing the conditions and restrictions to be contained in permits granted under the said Act and for prescribing any matter or thing authorized or required to be prescribed for the purposes of the said Act:

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Country Fire Authority (Permits) Regulations 1957* and shall be read and construed as one with the *Country Fire Authority (Permits) Regulations 1956* (hereinafter called the *Principal Regulations*).

2. In clause 7 of the *Principal Regulations* the words "or such other conditions and restrictions as may hereafter be approved by the Authority" are hereby revoked.

3. In paragraph (a) of clause 8 of the *Principal Regulations* after the words "authorized by the Act" there shall be inserted the expression "(whether at the request of a municipality or public authority or of an owner or occupier of land)".

4. In sub-clause (1) of clause 10 of the *Principal Regulations*—

(a) for paragraph (a) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(a) Such permit shall authorize only the officers and members of the fire brigade named therein to carry out burning operations in accordance with the permit on the land highway road street lane or thoroughfare referred to in the permit";

(b) for paragraph (f) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(f) No burning shall be commenced under the permit until the following firebreaks have been prepared:—

(i) A base firebreak consisting of a road or other similar space or a ploughed or rotary-hoed strip not less than five feet wide and cleared of all inflammable material; and

(ii) Check firebreaks on each of the other sides of the area to be burned each consisting of a ploughed or rotary-hoed strip not less than three feet wide cleared of all inflammable material or a strip not less than three feet wide thoroughly wetted with water:

Provided that where the permit relates to burning in open grass country the officer granting the permit may in his discretion allow the base firebreak to consist of a strip not less than five feet wide thoroughly wetted with water, and the permit may be issued accordingly";

(c) in paragraph (i) for the words "and if" there shall be substituted the words "or if".

5. In sub-clause (2) of clause 10 of the *Principal Regulations*—

(a) for paragraphs (e) and (f) there shall be substituted the following paragraphs:—

"(e) (i) The person to whom the permit is granted shall not less than twenty-four hours before the main fire is lighted prepare or cause to be prepared around the whole of the area to be burned—

a firebreak not less than fifteen feet wide; or

where the permit relates to burning in open grass country and the officer granting the permit in his discretion so allows—a firebreak not less than ten feet wide—

and any such firebreak may be ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material or prepared by a combination of those methods and may include a burned strip as provided in the following subparagraph;

(ii) Any such firebreak may include a burned strip not more than five feet wide (and the permit shall be deemed to include the burning of such a strip) if before that strip is burned—

strips on either side thereof and adjacent thereto each not less than five feet wide have been ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material; or

where in open grass country the firebreak is required to be not less than ten feet wide, a strip not less than five feet wide has been ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material adjacent to the strip to be burned and on the side of it away from the main area to be burned;

(f) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (e) where the permit is granted for the burning of a firebreak not more than two chains wide in open grass country the permit may allow of the burning of the firebreak after the preparation of—

(i) a base firebreak not less than ten feet wide either ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material as to its whole width or so prepared as to not less than half its width and thoroughly wetted with water as to the remainder; and

(ii) check firebreaks on the other sides of the area to be burned each not less than five feet wide either ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material or thoroughly wetted with water”;

(b) in paragraph (g)—

(i) the word “post” is hereby revoked; and

(ii) after the words “inflammable material” there shall be inserted the words “and every post shall be thoroughly wetted with water”;

(c) at the end of paragraph (i) there shall be inserted the following expression:—“Where the permit is granted for the burning of a firebreak not exceeding two chains wide in open grass country if there is at least one fire-fighting truck equipped with a water tank and power pump available at the fire and manned by not less than six men an area not exceeding four hundred yards by the width of the firebreak may be alight at any one time; for each additional fire-fighting truck so equipped and manned an additional area of two hundred yards by the said width may be permitted to be alight at any one time; if no such truck is available the area that may be permitted to be alight at any one time shall not exceed two hundred yards by the said width”; and

(d) in paragraph (j) for the words “and if” there shall be substituted the words “or if”.

6. (1) In the Form of Permit in the Second Schedule to the Principal Regulations before the expression “(1) Office in brigade” there shall be inserted the expression:—

“The attention of the officers and members of the brigade to whom this permit is granted is directed to sub-sections (3) and (4) of section 38 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* which reads as follows:—

(3) Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with the provisions of this section or the conditions or restrictions contained in any permit granted under this section shall be

guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a term of not more than twelve months or to both such penalty and imprisonment.

(4) Nothing in this section or in any permit granted under this section shall be deemed to relieve any person of liability for any actionable damage sustained by any other person in consequence of any act matter or thing done by such first-mentioned person under any such permit."

(2) In the Conditions and Restrictions to be Observed set out on the reverse side of the Form of Permit in the Second Schedule to the Principal Regulations—

(a) for paragraph (a) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(a) This permit shall authorize only the officers and members of the fire brigade named therein to carry out burning operations in accordance with the permit on the land highway road street lane or thoroughfare referred to in the permit";

(b) for paragraph (f) there shall be substituted the expression:—

"(f) No burning shall be commenced under this permit until the following firebreaks have been prepared:—

- (i) A base firebreak consisting of a road or other similar space or a ploughed or rotary-hoed strip not less than five feet wide and cleared of all inflammable material; and
- (ii) Check firebreaks on each of the other sides of the area to be burned each consisting of a ploughed or rotary-hoed strip not less than three feet wide cleared of all inflammable material or a strip not less than three feet wide thoroughly wetted with water.

(Where the permit relates to burning in open grass country sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph (f) may if the officer granting the permit thinks fit be deleted and the following sub-paragraph inserted in its stead:—

- (i) A base firebreak consisting of a road or other similar space or a strip not less than five feet wide thoroughly wetted with water.)"

7. In the Conditions and Restrictions to be Observed set out on the reverse side of the Form of Permit in the Third Schedule to the Principal Regulations—

(a) for paragraphs (e) and (f) there shall be substituted the following expression:—

"(e) (i) The person to whom the permit is granted shall not less than twenty-four hours before the main fire is lighted prepare or cause to be prepared around the whole of the area to be burned a firebreak not less than fifteen feet wide, and any such firebreak may be ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material or prepared by a combination of those methods and may include a burned strip as provided in the following sub-paragraph.

(Where the permit relates to burning in open grass country the word 'fifteen' may if the officer granting the permit thinks fit be deleted and the word 'ten' inserted in its stead.)

(ii) Any such firebreak may include a burned strip not more than five feet wide (and this permit shall be deemed to include the burning of such a strip) if before that strip is burned—

strips on each side thereof and adjacent thereto each not less than five feet wide have been ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material; or

where in open grass country the firebreak is required to be not less than ten feet wide, a strip not less than five feet wide has been ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material adjacent to the strip to be burned and on the side of it away from the main area to be burned.

(Where the permit is granted for the burning of a firebreak not more than two chains wide in open grass country paragraph (e) may, if the officer granting the permit thinks fit, be deleted and the following paragraph inserted in its stead:—

(f) The person to whom the permit is granted shall before burning begins prepare—

- (i) a base firebreak not less than ten feet wide either ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material as to its whole width or so prepared as to not less than half its width and thoroughly wetted with water as to the remainder; and
- (ii) check firebreaks on the other sides of the area to be burned each not less than five feet wide either ploughed or rotary-hoed and cleared of all inflammable material or thoroughly wetted with water.)”

(b) in paragraph (g)—

- (i) the word “post” is hereby revoked;
- (ii) after the words “inflammable material” there shall be inserted the words “and every post shall be thoroughly wetted with water”; and

(c) at the end of paragraph (i) there shall be inserted the following expression:—“Where the permit is granted for the burning of a firebreak not exceeding two chains wide in open grass country if there is at least one fire-fighting truck equipped with a water tank and power pump available at the fire and manned by not less than six men an area not exceeding four hundred yards by the width of the firebreak may be alight at any one time; for each additional fire-fighting truck so equipped and manned an additional area of two hundred yards by the said width may be permitted to be alight at any one time; if no such truck is available the area that may be permitted to be alight at any one time shall not exceed two hundred yards by the said width”; and

(d) in paragraph (j) for the words “and if” there shall be substituted the words “or if”.

8. In the Form in the Seventh Schedule to the Principal Regulations for the expression “between Four o'clock p.m. on the day of 19 and sunrise on the following day” there shall be substituted the expression “during the period from the day of 19 to the day of 19 between the hours of o'clock p.m. on each day and sunrise on the following day”.

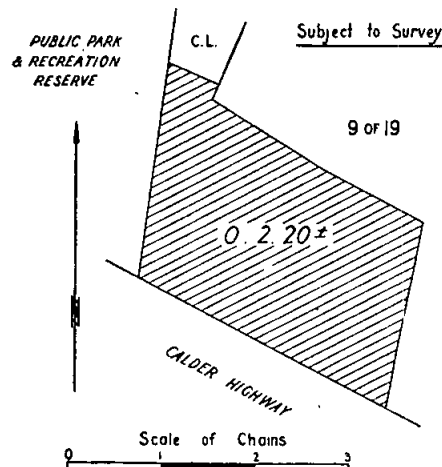

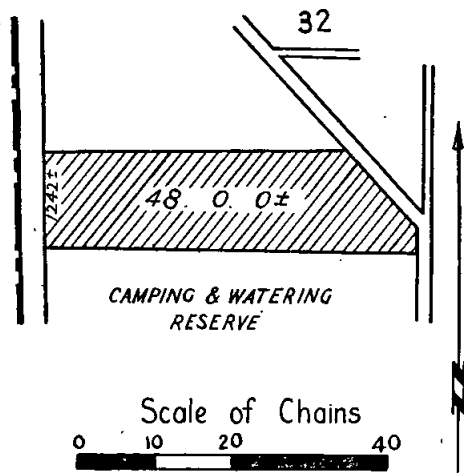

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ROSEDALE CHILDREN'S SWIMMING POOL.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Rosedale temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 4th September, 1956, as a site for a Children's Swimming Pool, known as the "Rosedale Children's Swimming Pool," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

1. No person shall enter any of the pools before first washing himself in the shower bath, and every bather after using the latrines shall again wash under the showers without costume before returning to the pools.

2. No person suffering from infectious or contagious disease or sores shall enter or attempt to enter the baths.

3. No person shall use soap in any of the pools or cause the water therein to be fouled or polluted in any way.

4. No person shall use obscene language within the baths premises.

5. No person shall spit in any of the pools, or on any seat or fixture or on the floor or walls or any portion of the building or bathing enclosure.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the baths while in a state of intoxication.

7. No person shall smoke within the bathing enclosure or any portion of the building.

8. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter the baths.

9. No person shall remain in the baths for a longer period than one hour.

10. No person shall commit any nuisance in or upon any portion of the baths premises.

11. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall either enter or leave the bathing enclosure, save by walking through the foot pools nor be or remain within the said enclosure unless decently attired in an approved bathing costume, save that the parents or guardians of small children using the pools may be permitted to accompany them within the bathing enclosure in ordinary attire, provided their feet are either bare or their footwear rubber soled.

12. No person shall at any time introduce into the baths premises any spirituous or intoxicating liquor.

13. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with, any locks, taps, or fittings in connexion with the baths, nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure fittings, or other articles supplied for use in the baths, nor write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the baths.

14. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall climb or attempt to climb over, on to or upon, or remain on or upon any fixture, fountain, fence, roof, building or structure surrounding or appurtenant to the baths.

15. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall be or remain upon the baths premises when the pool is being emptied or refilled or at night time when the lighting system is not in operation.

16. Except in the time of accident no person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall use or in any way interfere with the first-aid kits, lifebuoys, or other similar apparatus.

17. No person of either sex shall enter or attempt to enter or look into any portion of the baths premises set apart either permanently or temporarily for the use of the other sex.

18. The Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to fix the hours during which the baths shall be open for the use of females only, or for special purposes only, and no person shall enter or attempt to enter or use or attempt to use the baths or portion thereof contrary to the terms of such resolution.

19. It shall be lawful for the person for the time being in charge of the baths to expel any person or persons from the baths premises who indulge in any boisterous or rough play or unseemly conduct or who in any way commit any breach of these Regulations.

20. No person shall do any act or thing or interfere in any way with any other persons, fixture or facility established for use either permanently or temporarily at the baths which will cause or be likely to cause inconvenience, injury or danger to himself or to any other person within or without the baths.

21. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any articles lost by, or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

22. The Committee of Management may at any time and from time to time close the baths to bathers.

23. The Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid by the public for admission to the baths.

24. The said Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper management of the baths.

25. No diving shall be permitted from any structure or apparatus placed around the pool which raise the standing level above the concrete sides of the pool.—(Corres. Rs.7489.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations, shall in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.
