No. 6102. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two million nine hundred and fourteen thousand seven hundred and forty-four pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six and One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven."

EXTENSION OF THE HAMILTON MEAT AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation

become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Dandenong requested that the land hereinafter mentioned which has been used for a road within the said Shire be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this my Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land used for a road, being part of land known as Bakers-road, being part of Crown portion 17, Parish of Dandenong, and being the land more particularly described hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

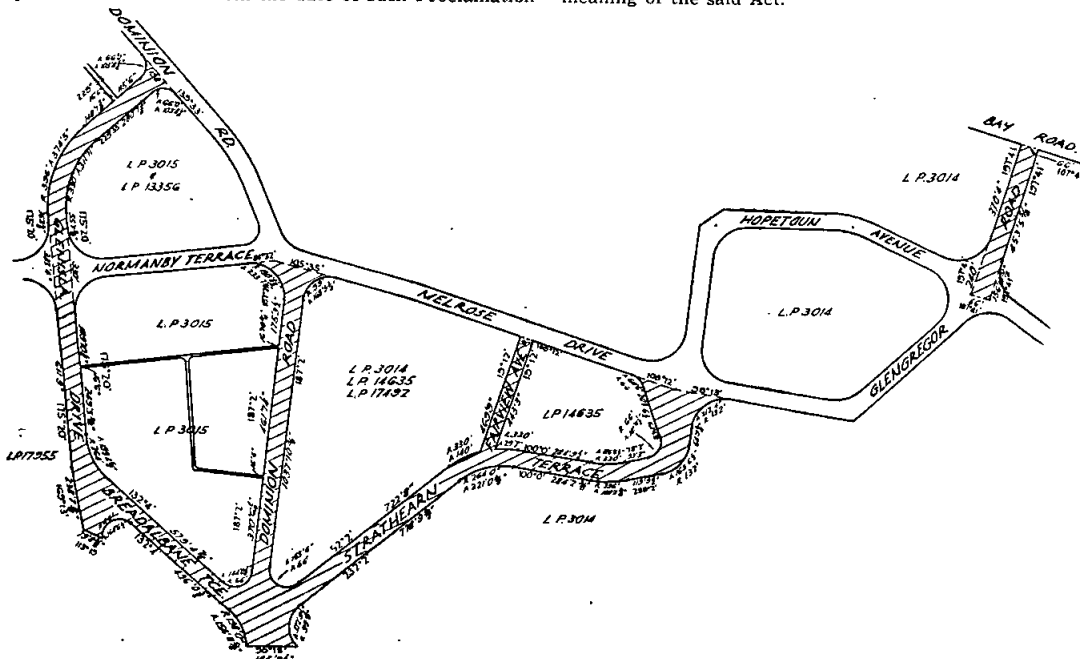

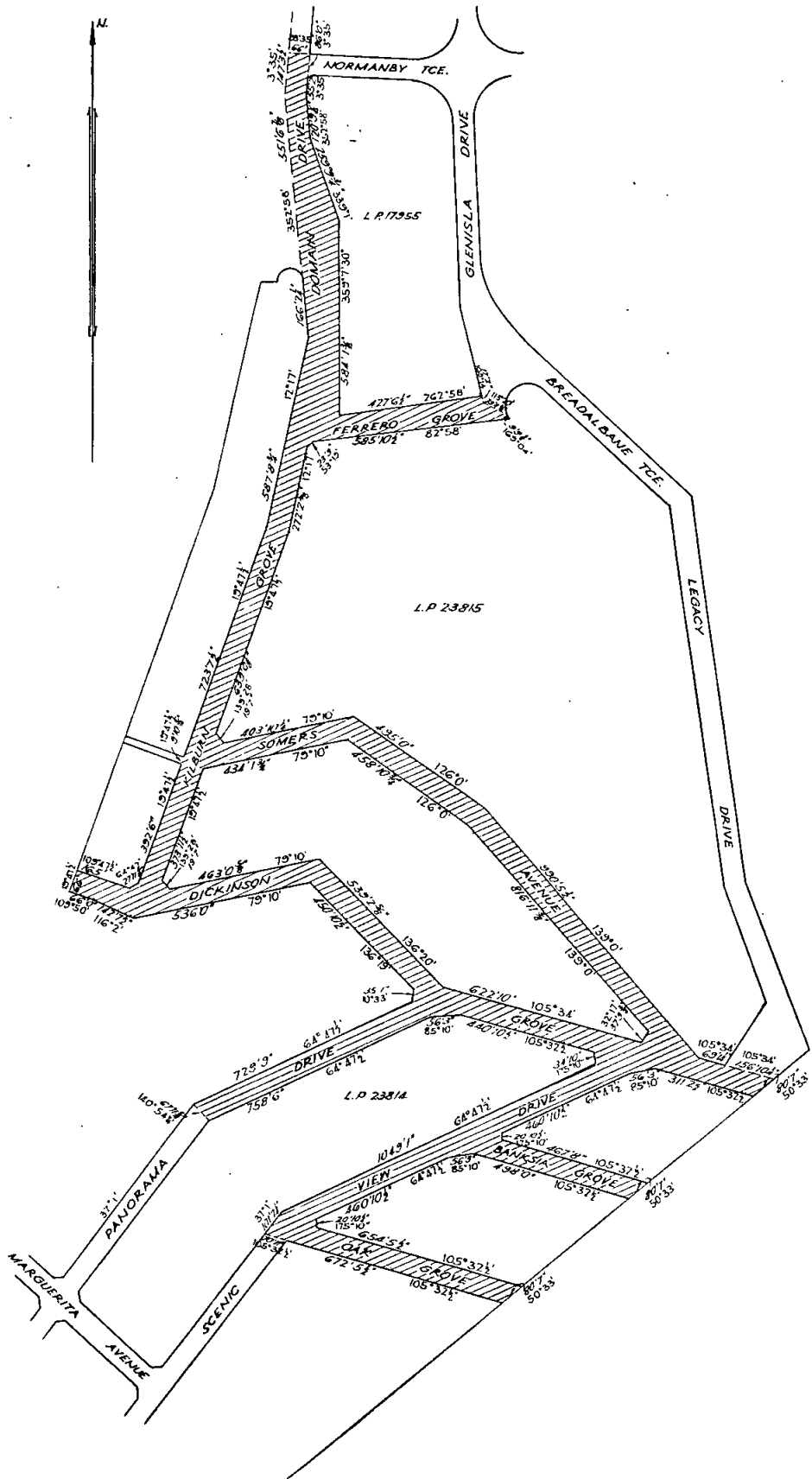

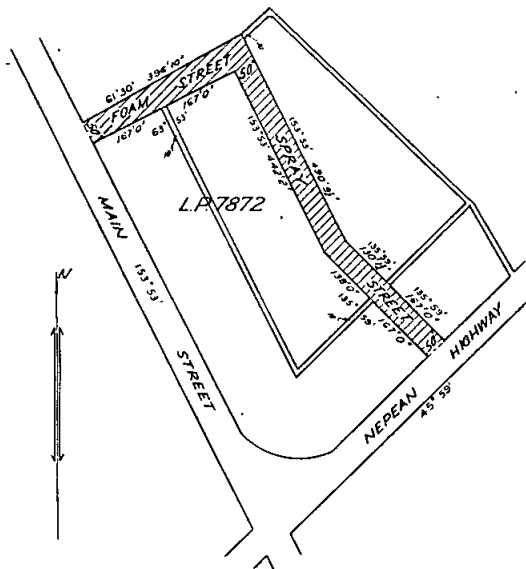

Legal Profession Practice Act 1946.

SOLICITORS (PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND PRACTICE) RULES 1957.

PURSUANT to section 43 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1946* and all other provisions in that behalf enabling, the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria doth hereby make the following rules of the Institute:—

1. These rules may be cited as the "Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1957" and shall be read and construed as one with the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1948 and all other rules amending the same, which rules and these rules may be cited together as the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules.

2. These rules shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. Rule 5 of the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1948 is repealed and the following rule inserted in lieu thereof:—

"5. (a) (i) Subject to sub-rule (c) hereof, a solicitor shall, within a period of one month after being so requested in writing by a client or such further period as the client in writing allows or as may in the circumstances be reasonable, render to the client a Bill of Costs in such detail as to be capable of being taxed and covering all work performed for that client to which such request relates and for which he has not already rendered such a Bill of Costs or been paid.

(ii) For the purposes of this rule, a solicitor shall not be deemed to have been paid if without the written authority of his client he has appropriated moneys held by him on behalf of the client in or towards satisfaction of the amount alleged to be owing by the client to him.

(b) Without prejudice to any other liability of the solicitor, if the solicitor fails or neglects to render such a Bill of Costs within such period as aforesaid he shall, subject to sub-rule (c) hereof, forthwith pay to the client all moneys and deliver to the client all documents which he is holding on behalf of that client notwithstanding that he may otherwise be entitled to a lien upon those moneys or documents for payment of his costs;

(c) The foregoing provisions of this rule shall not apply to a solicitor who has a sufficient and satisfactory reason for not complying with the said request of his client."

NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1957.

THE Nagambie Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and three pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Nagambie Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Thirty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the first day of January, 1957, and shall be payable on the first day of November, 1957, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per one thousand (1,000) gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per one thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at one hundred and twenty thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

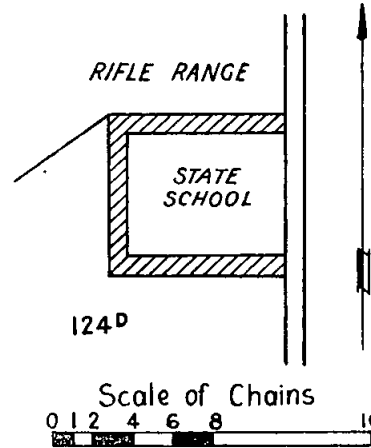

MEDICAL REGISTRATION REGULATIONS 1957.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the *Medical (Registration) Act 1957 (No. 6084)* His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make Regulations as follows (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Medical Registration Regulations 1957 and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Applications pursuant to section 4 of Act No. 6084 for registration as a legally qualified medical practitioner under Part I. of the *Medical Act 1928* shall be made to the Medical Board of Victoria in the form of the First Schedule to these Regulations and in the manner set out in the following regulations.

3. (1) The applicant for registration shall personally present to the Secretary of the said Board at 295 Queen-street, Melbourne, the following:—

- (a) a completed First Schedule;
- (b) the testimonium diploma licence or certificate testifying to the qualification or qualifications by virtue of which he seeks registration;
- (c) evidence of identity such as a Passport or a letter of introduction from some medical Authority or person known to the Board;
- (d) a summary of his medical school training;
- (e) a statement of his experience in medical work after obtaining his original medical qualification;
- (f) evidence that he has, at the time of his application, been resident in Victoria for not less than three years.

(2) Where the Board is satisfied that the applicant is unable to produce the original of any testimonium diploma licence or certificate, the applicant shall submit such other evidence of qualification as the Board requires.

4. The Foreign Practitioners Qualification Committee after consideration of any application for registration submitted by the Board, shall either issue its certificate in the form of the Second Schedule to these Regulations that the applicant is a fit and proper person to be registered as a legally qualified medical practitioner or advise the Board that it is not prepared to issue such certificate.

5. In the event of the Committee advising the Board in writing that it is not prepared to issue a certificate, the Board shall notify the applicant to that effect.

6. Any notice or certificate issued by the Committee shall be deemed to be signed by the Committee if signed by the Chairman or Acting Chairman (as the case may be) and two other members of the Committee.

7. The members of the Committee shall be entitled to receive a fee of Ten guineas (£10 10s.) for each meeting of the Committee attended, and in addition may claim and be reimbursed Two guineas (£2 2s.) for out of pocket expenses incurred in attending any meeting.

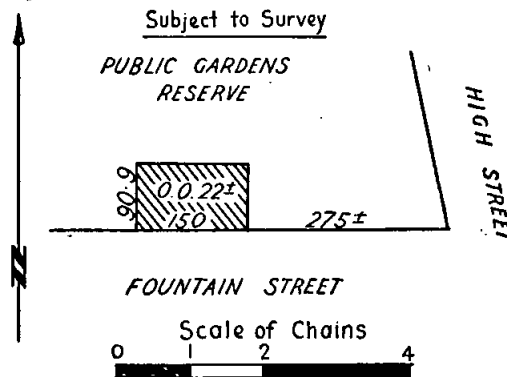

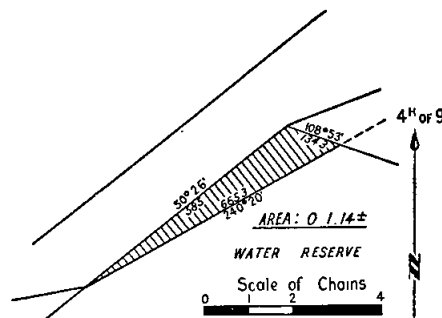

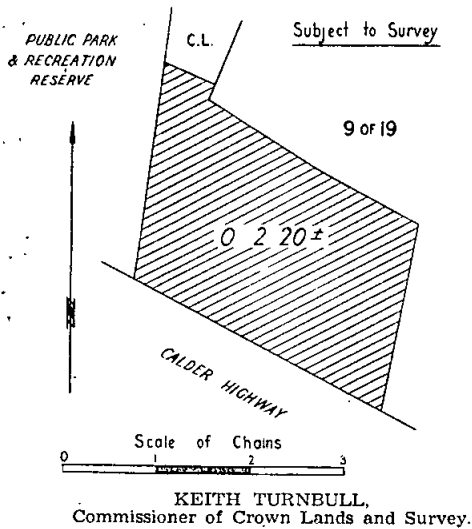

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CHINKAPOOK RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Chinkapook temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 22nd August, 1956, as a site for Public Recreation known as the "Chinkapook Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 days in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for tennis, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall—
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
 - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
 - (c) bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
 - (d) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
4. The Committee shall have the power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person, to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these regulations.

5. No person except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

7. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any organized sport or game within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care may be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring, shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

9. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with, break, or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

10. No persons shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

11. No persons shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No persons shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. No persons shall play, practice, or engage in any sport including tennis, quoits, hockey, or any games, or foot-racing except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

14. No persons shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horse-back without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

15. No persons shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No persons, club, or any other body shall without the consent of the Committee first obtained grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

17. No persons shall remove any earth, sand, stones, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.7479.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

(b) Where the Authority designs the work for the owner, and the owner then carries out his own work:—

(i) For plan of design, a fee of Three pounds (£3) plus Five shillings (5s.) for each fitting.

(ii) For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Authority, a fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.

(iii) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.), plus Twenty shillings (20s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.

(iv) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's inspector a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.), plus Twenty shillings (20s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.

The design and specification shall be supplied to the Authority in triplicate. The work shall not proceed until the owner's design and specification have been approved by the Authority and a third copy returned to him with the official endorsement.

(iii) For the examination of the owner's plan of design and specification a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.).

(iv) For examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Authority, a fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.

(v) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.), plus Twenty shillings (20s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
