PUBLIC HIGHWAY.-BOROUGH OF RINGWOOD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Ringwood has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a road within the said Borough, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land, used for a road, being part of Crown portions 16 and 18, Parish of Ringwood, and being the land described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Forests Act 1957, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing at midnight between the twentieth and twenty-first days of November, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and ending at midnight between the fifteenth and sixteenth days of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight, to be the prohibited period in respect to any fire protected area other than a State forest or national park in the State of Victoria situated in such Municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto.


