CLOSE SEASON FOR STUBBLE QUAIL.

PROCLAMATION

YARRAGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1.

THE Yarragon Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

PART I .- INTERPRETATION.

Definitions.

- 1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
 - "The Act" means the Water Acts.
 - "Fittings" includes all appliances and things what-soever, other than pipes, used in connexion with the conveying, supplying, storing, or regulation of the flow of water in or derived from a main pipe.
 - "Main pipe" means any pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust and used for the conveying or supplying of water.
 - "Person" includes a corporation or company.
 - "Person" includes a corporation or company.

 "Private service" means and includes all pipes and fittings used in connexion with the supply of water from a main pipe to a tenement and/or in connexion with the use or consumption of such water in or on such tenement.

 "Proper Officer" means any employee of the Trust authorized to execute any function on behalf of
 - the Trust.
 - "Service pipe" means any pipe (not being a main pipe) used for the conveying or supplying of water derived from a main pipe.
 - "Trust" means the Yarragon Waterworks Trust.
 - "Works" means works of or in connexion with the laying, constructing, altering, disconnecting, removing, repairing, renewing, or maintaining of a private service or any part thereof.

All words used in this By-law which are also used in the Act shall have the meanings assigned to them by the Act.

PART II .- LICENSING OF PLUMBERS.

Unlicensed Persons not to Interfere with Private Services.

2. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any main pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service pipe, tap, or meter, or other fitting connected with the main pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and no unlicensed person shall affix, alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any such main pipe, service pipe, tap, meter, or other fitting as aforesaid.

Period of Licences. Cancellation of Licences. Fees Payable.

Payable.

3. Each licence shall be for the period ending 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to suspend or cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner or committing any breach of the Act or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of One pound, and for each renewal Five shillings.

Proof of Fitness to be Given.

4. Before any licence shall be granted by the Trust, the 4. Before any licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for such licence shall satisfy the Trust by any tests required by the Trust or by virtue of his registration by the Plumbers and Gasfitters Board of Victoria that he is a competent plumber and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to water supply and with the Act so far as it applies to town supplies. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

PART III.—CONSTRUCTION AND ARRANGEMENT OF WORKS.

Notice of Works to be Given.

- 5. No person shall execute any works (except such works as are authorized by sections 191 and 194 of the Water Act 1928)-
 - (a) Without having given to the Trust not less than two days prior to the commencement of the execution of such works—
 - (i) notice in writing of his intention so to do specifying the tenement in, on, or in respect of which it is proposed to

- execute such works and the time or times (being between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week day except a public holiday or a Saturday) during which it is proposed to execute such works;
- (ii) a complete specification in writing of the works proposed to be done setting out the mode, form, strength, material, construction, dimensions, and arrangement of all pipes, fittings, and structures intended to be used in the execution of such works;
- execution of such works;

 (iii) In the case of every private service containing any service pipe of diameter larger than 2 inches a properly prepared plan drawn to a scale specified thereon of the premises in, on, or in respect of which it is proposed to execute the said works showing thereon all buildings, erections, and structures on the said premises and the proposed arrangement of all pipes and other works which it is proposed to lay or construct therein or thereon; every notice, specification, and plan shall be signed by the licensed plumber actually engaged to carry out the works referred to in the notice, or by a licensed plumber employing another licensed plumber to carry out the work under his supervision;
- (b) contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or such notice, specification, and plan mentioned in sub-paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) of paragraph (a) of this clause.

Plumbers to Report

6. Each licensed plumber shall report to the Proper Officer of the Trust the completion of any new work, extensions, or repairs in connexion with any service within 24 hours of effecting same.

Carrying Out of Plumbing Work.

- 7. Every licensed plumber shall, in carrying out any work of water supply—
 - (a) Execute the work in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the By-laws of the Trust and any special directions or orders given or issued thereunder by the Trust by the Proper Officer of the Trust; and
 - Officer of the Trust; and

 (b) execute the work in a thorough and expeditious manner to the satisfaction of an inspecting officer of the Trust; and

 (c) use materials of the description, quality, kind, and standard prescribed by this By-law; and

 - (d) employ only competent operatives and assistants;
 - (e) obtain permission, where necessary, for the execution of the work on, over, or through any private property, or any street, road, park, reserve, or other public place or property;
 - (f) pay all fees payable to the council of a munici-pality for the opening of any public road or street or otherwise in connexion with the works; and
 - (g) restore upon completion of the work any part of any public road or street to the satisfaction of the municipal council or other authority having control thereof; and
 - (h) except where authorized in writing by the owner or his agent to omit restoration, restore any other property interfered with by the work to the satisfaction of the Proper Officer of the Trust; and
 - (i) take all proper and necessary precautions so that no accident, damage, or unnecessary inconvenience may be directly or indirectly occasioned by the execution of the work; and
 - (j) exercise at all times immediate supervision over the work.
- 8. (a) No service pipe (other than those installed for fire service purposes and sealed in accordance with the provisions of clause 34 of this By-law) which supplies water otherwise than by measure to any tenement shall have a bore exceeding ? inch.
- (b) No person shall connect or affix to the Trust's mains any service pipe (other than those installed for fire service purposes and sealed in accordance with the provisions of clause 34 of this By-law) which has a diameter exceeding the appropriate diameter listed in the schedule

hereunder written corresponding either to the Net Annual Valuation of the property to be served, or to the antici-pated annual consumption of water at the said property

as demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Proper Officer of the Trust and certified to under his hand, whichever is the larger:

Depth of Service Pipes.

9. No person shall lay, construct, repair, or alter any private service unless every service pipe forming part thereof for such portion of its length as lies in or on private property, is securely clipped to a structure, or is laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than 12 inches below the surface of the ground. Every such service pipe for such portion of its length as lies in or on any road, street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to vehicular traffic, shall be laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than 18 inches below the surface of the ground or at such greater depth as the council of the municipality having control of the said road, street, lane, or right-of-way may require.

Access to Service Pipes.

- 10. No person shall-
 - (a) lay, construct, or alter any private service or any part thereof;
 - (b) erect or construct any building, erection of structure

in such place, position, or manner that any part of such private service is not easily accessible for the purposes of inspection, repair, and renewal unless such part is comprised of copper piping and copper fittings.

Arrangement of Stop-tap, &c.

11. Every meter, stop-tap, and stop-tap ferrule shall be opposite the tenement supplied and in one line at right angles to the main pipe to which such stop-tap ferrule is fixed, unless such an arrangement is impracticable, in which case such services shall be provided with two high-pressure screw-down stop-taps, one of which shall be fixed opposite the stop-tap ferrule on the main pipe and the other in accordance with the provisions of clause 18 of this By-law.

Cross Connexions.

12. No person shall permit or suffer any fluid, solid, or gas, which in the opinion of the Proper Officer of the Trust is capable of polluting water supplied by the Trust, to have means of access to any pipe in communication directly or indirectly with any main pipe of the Trust.

Where any service pipe is connected to any cistern, tank, or receptacle used for the storage of water or fluid, there shall be an effective air gap at the outlet of such service pipe and the said outlet shall be not less than inch above the highest possible water level in the said cistern, tank, or receptacle.

Connexions to Steam Boilers.

- 13. Water supply connexions to steam boilers shall be made as follows:
 - (a) By direct connexion from a service pipe, in which case a screw-down high-pressure stop-tap with its spindle vertically upwards shall be fixed on the piping supplying water to a boiler; a vertically acting reflux valve shall be fixed between the stop-tap and the boiler and a ½-in. testing ferrule or bib-tap shall be fixed between the reflux valve and the stop-tap; or
 - between the reflux valve and the stop-tap; or

 (b) by direct connexion from a service pipe together
 with an injected supply from a storage tank or
 condensate sump, in which case, in addition to
 the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof, the
 injected water to a boiler shall be taken through
 a separate opening in the wall of the boiler.
 In no circumstances shall a connexion be
 permitted between any service pipe and the
 piping from a storage tank or condensate sump.
 Water conenxions may be made through the Water conenxions may be made through the tops or sides of steam boilers.

Specifications for Piping and Materials.

- 14. No person shall use any pipe or fittings in or in connexion with a private service unless the same shall comply in all respects with the following specifications:—
 - (a) The whole of the pipes and fittings shall be of the best quality galvanized wrought-iron, copper, brass, cast-iron, welded mild steel, or asbestos cement, shall be sound and free from all defects, and shall comply with the relevant specifications of the Standards Association of Australia where such specifications have been
 - (b) All pipes and pieces shall be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, clear in bore, and (in case of wrought-iron piping) properly galvanized throughout, and shall be of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
 - (c) Only pipes and fittings which have been tested in accordance with the requirements of the specifications of the Standards Association of Australia will be permitted to be used for services whether inside or outside the tenement.
 - (d) All ends of galvanized wrought-iron and brass pipes bends and fittings shall be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, or fittings.
 - (e) All stop-taps and bib-taps shall be screw-down high-pressure taps made of hard brass or gun-metal.

PART V .-- CONNEXIONS TO MAINS.

One Service Pipe to Each Tenement.

15. No person shall affix or connect or cause or permit to be affixed or connected to any main pipe more than one service pipe or private service for the supply of water for domestic purposes to any one tenement.

Connexion to Main Pipe.

16. No person shall affix or connect any service pipe to any main pipe save by means of a stop-tap ferrule to which a right-angle bend of copper alloy is properly and securely attached.

Size of Tappings Permitted.

17. (a) The maximum diameters of tappings that will be permitted for main pipes of the respective diameters set out hereunder, and for cases where the tapping is made with or without a tapping saddle, are as follows:—

Tapping Fees.

(b) No person shall affix or connect or cause to be affixed or connected any service pipe to any main pipe without having first paid to the Trust a tapping fee of Two guineas, which will cover the supply of the ferrule

Position of Stop-taps.

- 18. A high-pressure screw-down stop-tap properly secured shall be fixed on each water service in one of the following positions:-
 - (a) Between the main pipe and the building line within 6 feet of the building line and in this case the stop-tap shall be covered by a box which shall comply with the requirements of the municipality in which the service is laid.
 - (b) Where a meter is fixed, between the meter and the inlet bend thereto.
 - (c) Where a meter is not fixed, on the service pipe above the ground in an accessible position not more than 6 feet inside the building line.

Repair of Service Pipes.

- 19. Any person using any private service shall at all times keep same in proper repair.
 Trust Can Repair Service Pipe in Certain Circumstances.
- 20. If any person refuses, neglects, or delays to have any private service or any part thereof used by him properly repaired after having been required in writing by the Proper Officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust by its Proper Officers, servants, or agents, may enter into or upon any premises supplied by such private service or any part thereof and may, where necessary, repair or renew such private service or any part thereof so as to prevent the waste of water; and may charge such person with the cost and expense of such repair or renewal and such cost cost and expense of such repair or renewal and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such person to the Trust.

PART VII.-METERS.

Meters Supplied and Maintained.

- 21. (a) Except as permitted in clause 34 of this By-law, no person shall use any private service save for the supply of water solely for domestic purposes exclusive of the watering of any garden unless the whole of the water supplied to such private service passes through a meter.
- (b) Such meters will be provided and maintained by the Trust and every person, before installing a private service, shall ascertain from the Trust the size of meter to be installed and shall make provision in the arrangement and construction of the private service for connexion of such meter in accordance with the following requirements:-
 - (i) The meter shall be located within the property and not more than 6 feet from the building line.
 - (ii) The meter shall be in an easily accessible position
 - protected from accidental damage.

 (iii) The meter shall be properly and securely affixed to such private service or service pipe by means of connexions or quarter bends of brass, copper, or copper alloy.
 - (iv) The meter shall be fixed truly level on a solid foundation of brick, stone, or concrete the top of which foundation is level with or above the surface of the ground.
 - (v) All washers used for connexion couplings for meters shall be made of leather.
- (c) Pending connexion of the said meter, the person authorized to install the service pipe shall connect a distance piece in the service pipe in place of the meter.

Restriction of Access to Meter.

22. No person shall construct, place, stack, or store, or permit or suffer to be constructed, placed, stacked, or stored, any building, erection, material, or thing over or upon any meter connected or affixed to any private service, or shall do or permit or suffer to be done any act, matter, or thing whereby inspection of such meter shall be prevented, obstructed, or in any way rendered difficult or interfered with.

Replacement and Testing of Meter.

23. (a) The Trust may at any time replace or remove for test any meter attached to any private service.

Fees Returned in Certain Circumstances.

Fees Returned in Certain Circumstances.

(b) Any consumer may at any time request the Trust in writing to test any meter attached to his private service and through which water supplied to him passes and shall at the time of the delivery of such request pay to the Trust the sum of One pound. The Trust shall thereupon remove and test the meter or cause the same to be tested in such manner as it thinks fit. If such meter is found to be registering correctly the Trust may retain such sum of One pound in satisfaction of the fee for testing meter hereinbefore prescribed, but if such meter is found to be registering incorrectly, such sum of One pound shall be returned to such consumer.

Consumer Leaving Tenement to Notify Trust.

24. Every person who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed shall give to the Trust in writing at least six days' notice of his intention to do so.

PART VIII .- MISUSE AND WASTE.

Supply Restricted to One Tenement Only.

25. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service for the supply of water to more than one tenement.

Cisterns, Tanks, and Troughs.

26. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service or any part thereof for the supply of water to any cistern, tank, or water trough unless such cistern, tank, or water trough is watertight and is provided with an equilibrium ball-valve or other mechanism efficiently regulating the flow of water thereinto in such manner that such water shall not overflow such cistern or tank. No person shall affix any overflow pipe to any cistern or tank in such manner or position that is not open to inspection. In this clause, water trough means a water trough used for the supply of water to animals. water trough used for the supply of water to animals.

Water Closets and Urinals.

27. No person shall construct, lay, or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with, or supplies water to any urinal or water closet or any part thereof save through a cistern or tank.

28. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service for the purpose of supplying water to any bath capable of containing more than 100 gallons of

No Overflow Pipe on Baths.

29. No person shall affix an overflow pipe to any bath.

Wasting of Water.

30. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall waste the same or permit or suffer the same to run to

Sale of Water.

31. No person shall take or carry away or permit or suffer any other person to take or carry away any such water from any premises supplied with water by the Trust and no person shall sell any water supplied by the Trust.

Fire Brigades.

32. No person other than a servant or agent of the Council—Shire of Narracan or the Yarragon Fire Brigade in the execution of his duty as such servant or agent shall, without the written permission of the Trust, open, close, or otherwise interfere with any hydrant attached to any main pipe.

Taps in Parks and Reserves.

33. No person other than a servant or agent of the municipality, corporation, or body having the care and management of a public park, public garden, or reserve for public purposes shall, without the previous consent of the Trust, open, close, or otherwise interfere with any tap, valve, or other like (except a drinking fountain or other tap provided for public use) in, on, or connected with any service pipe used for the supply of water to such park, garden, or reserve.

PART IX.-PRIVATE FIRE SERVICES. Private Fire Services.

- Private Fire Services.

 34. (a) Private fire services comprising pipes and fittings not exceeding 6 inches in diameter and without meters may be permitted at the expense of the owner of the premises subject to the payment of a fee of Fifteen shillings per annum. Every such fire service shall be sealed. Except in case of fire, no person shall without the authority of the Trust wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service and in the event of any such seal having been broken accidentally or otherwise the occupier of the tenement shall within 24 hours thereafter give notice in writing of the fact at the office of the Trust, and except in the case of a fire he shall pay a resealing fee of Fifteen shillings. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of a private service except for extinction of fire. of fire.
- (b) Except as expressly provided in sub-clause (a) of this clause, all portions of private services installed for fire service purposes shall comply with all provisions of this
- (c) Every private fire service pipe shall be laid and fixed in a conspicuous position and shall be painted with a distinguishing coating of bright red paint which shall be maintained at all times.

(d) Any application for a fire service shall be made by the owner of the premises and in writing to the Trust.

(e) In the event of the owner or occupier committing any offence under the Act or any breach of this By-law or permitting or suffering any such offence or breach to be committed, the Trust may by notice in writing to the owner withdraw permission for the private fire service and such service shall thereupon be disconnected.

PART X.-INSPECTIONS.

Inspections.

35. Any person authorized by the Trust in that behalf either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case may at all reasonable times—

- (a) enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting and may inspect any private service of any part thereof or any works in course of execution therein or thereon; and/or
- (b) enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of superintending the execution of any works in course of execution therein or thereon and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises or any person engaged in executing such works any directions or instructions necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all relevant provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed during and in connexion with the execution of such works;
- (c) for any such purpose as aforesaid may dig or excavate in or upon any such premises.

Hindering of Inspections.

36. No person shall obstruct, hinder, impede, resist, oppose, or refuse admission to any premises by the Proper Officer or any person duly authorized in that behalf by the Trust, or shall fail or neglect to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given by him.

PART XI.-PENALTIES. Penalties.

37. Any person who commits any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CARRYING OF EXPLOSIVES.

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Explosives Act 1928, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):--

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Explosives (Carriage) Regulations 1957 and shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. On the commencement of these Regulations, the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-eighth day of November, 1932, pursuant to the provisions of the Explosives Act 1928, and published in the Government Gazette of the thirtieth day of November, 1932, together with all amendments thereto, shall be and hereby are revoked.
- 3. (1) In these Regulations the words "Boat", "Carriage", "Explosive" and "Ship" shall be given the meaning which they bear in the Explosives Act 1928.
- (2) Wherever in these Regulations an explosive is referred to as belonging to a particular class or division of a class, reference is made to the classification of explosives made by the Governor in Council pursuant to section 53 of the Explosives Act 1928.

LICENCE TO CARRY EXPLOSIVES.

- 4. Every application for a licence to carry explosives shall be made to the Chief Inspector of Explosives and shall state the type and description of each conveyance intended to be used for carrying explosives and the kinds and quantities of explosives to be carried.
- 5. Every licence to carry explosives shall be issued subject to the provisions of the Explosives Act 1928 and the Regulations made thereunder and to any conditions included in such licence.
- 6. A licence to carry explosives shall be valid for the person to whom the same is issued and for any employee in the exclusive service of such person.
- 7. Every licence to carry explosives shall specify the quantities and classes or kinds of explosives which may be carried and the carriage or boat in which such explosives may be carried.
- 8. Every licence to carry explosives issued in accordance with these Regulations may prescribe the route which shall be followed by any carriage or boat carrying explosives and the places between which such carriage or boat shall carry explosives and explosives shall not be carried over any route or between places other than prescribed by
- 9. The Minister may, at his discretion and without assigning any reason, amend, cancel or revoke any licence to carry explosives.

CARRYING OF EXPLOSIVES.

- 10. No person shall carry explosives unless the carriage or boat in which such explosives are carried and the quantity, classes and kinds of explosives carried are such as are specified in the licence to carry explosives.
- 11. No person shall carry, or cause to be carried, any explosive which is not packed, branded, labelled, or marked in the manner prescribed by the regulations relating to the manufacture of explosives,

- 12. No person shall carry, or cause to be carried, explosives in a carriage or boat whilst such carriage or boat is carrying or plying for passengers.
 - 13. No person shall carry any explosives-
 - (a) between sunset and sunrise;
 - (b) on a Sunday or public holiday;

unless such explosives are carried on a railway or in a ship.

- 14. The use of aircraft for the carrying of explosives is prohibited provided this regulation shall not apply to aircraft operated by the Defence Forces of the Commonwealth.
- 15. No person shall carry or cause to be carried any explosive of Class 5 (Fulminate) or any explosive of Class 6 (Ammunition) which contains its own means of ignition, or any explosive of Class 7 (Firework), in the same carriage or boat with any explosive not of the Class and Division to which it belongs, unless it be separated therefrom in such a manner as to prevent any fire or explosion which may occur in one such explosive from being communicated to another explosive.
- 16. No person shall carry, or cause to be carried, explosives in any carriage or boat unless the following conditions are observed:—
 - (a) Each carriage or boat carrying explosives shall be in the exclusive charge of and constantly attended by some competent male person not under the age of 21 years and such person shall not have charge of more than one such carriage or boat; provided that where a carriage forms part of a continuous train on any railway or tramway it shall be deemed sufficient compliance with this condition if such train is in the charge of and constantly attended by some competent male person, not under the age of 21 years.
 - (b) Having regard to the provisions of condition (a) of this clause and to ensure constant attendance, there shall be in each carriage, boat or train a competent male person not under the age of 21 years in addition to the person in charge.
 - (c) Except where the carriage is on a railway, a carriage carrying explosives shall not exceed a speed of 25 miles per hour.
 - (d) No person in charge of or attending upon any carriage or boat carrying explosives shall drive or conduct the same in a dangerous or reckless manner.
 - (e) No intoxicating liquor shall be in any carriage or boat while such carriage or boat is carrying explosives and no person who is under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be in charge of or attend upon any such carriage or boat.
 - (f) No person shall smoke whilst in or in the vicinity of any carriage or boat containing any explosive. The person in charge of or any person attending upon any carriage or boat carrying explosives shall remove from his person any matches or smoking materials and deposit them in a closed receptacle or compartment in a safe position in the cabin of the carriage or boat or in some other safe place away from the explosive.
 - (g) No person engaged in the loading or unloading of explosives shall be under the influence of or have in his possession intoxicating liquor and no person while so engaged shall smoke or have on his person smoking materials, matches or other means of procuring a light.
 - (h) While loading, unloading or carrying explosives is in progress, all persons engaged in such loading, unloading or carrying shall observe all due precautions for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the explosives so being loaded, unloaded, or carried, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of loading, unloading or carrying explosives and shall take such precautions as may be necessary for preventing any other person from committing any such act.

- (i) No explosives shall be loaded or unloaded from any carriage or boat in or upon any public highway, street, road, thoroughfare or public place, or at any public wharf or landing place, except with the consent of and under conditions approved by an inspector of explosives.
- (j) The loading or unloading of explosives into or out of any carriage or boat, when once begun, shall be continued with all due diligence until the same is completed.
- (k) Explosives shall not be carried in a carriage or boat which is carrying any article or substance liable to cause fire or explosion or liable to communicate fire:

Provided that this condition shall not apply to inflammable liquid contained in the fuel tank of such carriage or heat

(1) When two or more carriages carrying explosives are travelling together a space of not less than 300 yards shall be kept between each and every carriage:

Provided that where carriages containing explosives form part of a continuous train on a railway the separation of such carriages from each other shall be in accordance with paragraph (e) of clause 20 of these regulations.

(m) The explosives shall be carried with all due diligence and without unnecessary delay to the proper destination.

A carriage or boat carrying explosives shall not be stopped unnecessarily but when a stop is necessary it shall not be longer than may be reasonably required.

- (n) Except where the carriage is on a railway a carriage carrying explosives shall be so driven as to avoid so far as is practicable densely populated areas.
- (o) When approaching a railway line which he intends to cross, the driver of a carriage carrying explosives (except a carriage on a railway) shall stop such carriage at least 25 yards from such railway line and the person attending upon the carriage shall alight and proceed to the railway line and from there signal to the driver of the carriage when it is safe to cross the said line and upon being so signalled the said driver shall proceed to cross such line.
- (p) There shall not be any iron or steel in the interior of the carriage or boat where the explosive is deposited, unless such iron or steel be effectually covered with wood, leather, cloth, or other suitable material.
- (q) Due provision shall be made with respect to every carriage or boat carrying explosives to prevent the introduction of fire or any substance or article likely to cause fire or explosion, or the introduction of any iron, steel, or grit which may come into contact with packages of explosives, and to prevent water from coming into contact with packages of explosives.
- (r) Every carriage used for the carriage of explosives shall be propelled only by an engine using petrol or oil fuel: Provided that this requirement shall not apply to any truck or vehicle on a railway.
- (8) The engine of any motor vehicle carrying explosives shall not be run during the loading or unloading of explosives.
- (t) The fuel tank of a carriage or boat carrying explosives shall not be filled while explosives are on or in such carriage or boat except in case of necessity in which case the engine shall be stopped, the ignition shut off, and the tank filled only at a place where filling would not be a danger to public safety.
- (u) The person in charge of any carriage carrying explosives (other than a carriage on a railway) shall ensure that at all times other than when explosives are being loaded or unloaded the door or doors of any enclosed body of such carriage are kept locked or otherwise secured so as to prevent the escape of any explosive or access to the explosive by any unauthorized person.
- (v) Where a total quantity of more than 2,000 lb. of explosives other than those of Class 6 Division 3 is carried in a

- carriage (not being a boat or a carriage on a railway) no explosive of Class 6 Division 3 shall be carried in such carriage.
- (w) Explosives of Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, the 2nd and 3rd Divisions of Class 6 and the 1st and 2nd Divisions of Class 7 shall (except when in a boat or in a carriage on a railway) be carried in accordance with one of the following modes and the conditions applicable thereto prescribed hereunder provided that not more than 1,000 lb. of explosive of Class 5 (Fulminate) nor more than 10,000 lb. of any other explosive shall be carried in any one carriage.
 - Mode I.—For quantities not exceeding on any one carriage a total of 500 lb. of explosive other than detonators and in addition 500 detonators.

CONDITIONS.

- 1. The carriage shall be a motor vehicle in good mechanical and electrical condition.
- 2. A fire extinguisher suitable for use in the event of a petrol or oil fire on the carriage shall be carried in the cabin of such carriage.
 - 3. (a) The carriage shall have-
 - (i) a totally enclosed body; or
 - (ii) one or more closed receptacles which shall be secured in such a manner as to prevent them being dislodged.
- (b) Such totally enclosed body or closed receptacles shall be—
 - (i) approved by an inspector of explosives as being suitable for carrying explosives;
 - (ii) substantially constructed and free from exposed iron or steel in the interior;
 - (iii) covered with suitable metal on the exterior and be spark proof;
 - (iv) proof against ingress of moisture and be fitted with a close-fitting door or lid fitted with a secure lock.
- (c) The closed receptacles referred to in this condition shall have the word "EXPLOSIVES" painted conspicuously on the outside thereof.
- 4. Every carriage containing explosives in accordance with Mode I. shall have conspicuously displayed at the front and rear ends thereof warning signs bearing the word "EXPLOSIVES" in letters of not less than 4 inches in height and such signs shall be removed or covered when explosives are not being carried.
- Mode II.—For quantities exceeding a total of 500 lb. but not exceeding 6,000 lb. of explosives on any one carriage.

CONDITIONS.

- 1. The carriage shall be a motor vehicle in good mechanical and electrical condition.
- 2. The carriage shall, except for a close-fitting door at the rear, have a totally enclosed body, provided that, having regard to the isolation of the route to be followed and the infrequency with which the carriage is to be used to carry explosives, the licence may as an alternative to a totally enclosed body, authorize the use of one or more totally enclosed receptacles of sufficient capacity to carry the explosives. Such receptacles shall comply with the requirements of paragraphs (b) and (c) of condition 3 of Mode I. above and where a totally enclosed body is provided on a carriage the door of such enclosed body shall be fitted with an effective lock or other suitable securing device.

- 3. The carriage shall be so constructed that-
 - (i) a substantial sheet iron fire screen shall separate the cabin from the body of the carriage. Such screen shall be separated from the body of the carriage by a minimum air space of 6 inches and shall be without openings except those required for the driving shaft, brake controls and electric wiring conduit and shall extend to the full width of the carriage from 1 foot above the ground to the top of the cabin. The back wall of the cabin if of approved fire resistant construction satisfactory to an inspector of explosives may be utilized as part of the fire screen;
 - (ii) the outside of the body of the carriage and the whole of the underside of the floor thereof shall be covered with sheet metal;
- (iii) the fuel tanks and batteries shall be located in front of the sheet iron fire screen;
- (iv) if required by an inspector of explosives, a quick action cut off to the fuel feed pipe shall be fitted in an accessible position;
- (v) the exhaust pipe shall be wholly in front of the sheet iron fire screen and shall discharge to either side or the front of the carriage;
- (vi) the electric leads to the tail-light assembly shall be enclosed in substantial screwed metal conduit which shall be joined on to the tail-light fitting;
- (vii) a plug or switch shall be installed in front of the sheet iron fire screen in such a manner as to enable the electric power to the tail light to be disconnected in an emergency or if directed by an inspector of explosives to be so disconnected;
- (viii) two rear vision mirrors shall be fitted to give an effective rear view to both the driver and other persons attending upon such carriage.
- 4. Two fire extinguishers, at least one of which shall be a foam extinguisher, marine pattern, shall be fitted in an easily accessible position.
- 5. The interior of the cabin, in so far as is practicable, shall be free from combustible material.
- 6. Every carriage containing explosives in accordance with Mode II. shall have conspicuously displayed at the front, rear and two sides thereof warning signs bearing the word "EXPLOSIVES" in letters of not less than 6 inches in height, and such signs shall be removed or covered when explosives are not being carried.

Mode III.—For quantities exceeding a total of 6,000 lb. of explosives on any one carriage.

CONDITIONS.

- 1. The carriage shall in all respects comply with conditions 1, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Mode II. above.
- 2. The body of the carriage shall be totally enclosed except for a close-fitting door or doors at the rear or at such other position as may be approved by an Inspector of explosives and such door or doors shall be fitted with effective locks or other suitable securing devices.

- 17. Explosives of Class 7 (Firework)—Division 3—Manufactured Fireworks (Shop Goods)—shall (except when in a boat or in a carriage on a railway) be carried in accordance with the following conditions:—
 - (a) The carriage shall be a motor vehicle in good mechanical and electrical condition.
 - (b) Packages of fireworks shall be carried either in a fully enclosed carriage or in a carriage having raised sides the packages of fireworks being effectively covered with tarpaulins.
 - (c) Every carriage containing fireworks in accordance with this clause shall have conspicuously displayed at the front and rear thereof warning signs bearing the word "Fireworks" in letters of not less than 4 inches in height.
 - (d) The quantity of Manufactured Fireworks (Shop Goods) permitted on any one carriage shall not exceed 10,000 lb.
 - (e) Where the quantity of Manufactured Fireworks (Shop Goods) carried on any one carriage exceeds 2,000 lb. no other goods of an inflammable nature shall be carried.
- 18. Nothing in these regulations shall apply to any explosive of the First Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) provided all due precautions are taken for the prevention of accidents.
- 19. Explosives shall not be carried in any carriage or boat appropriated for the removal of refuse, or be handed or forwarded to any person employed in the removal of refuse.
- 20. When explosives are to be carried or are being carried on a railway the following additional conditions shall apply:—
 - (a) Explosives shall not be carried in a train conveying passengers.
 - (b) Explosives of Classes 1, 2, 3 and 4, the 2nd and 3rd Divisions of Class 6 (Ammunition) and the 1st and 2nd Divisions of Class 7 (Firework) if packed in outer packages which fulfil all the requirements of the Explosives Act 1928 and are contained in addition to such outer packages in metal cases or cylinders of a pattern approved by an inspector of explosives and by the Victorian Railways Commissioners may be carried with ordinary goods in a van or carriage not containing any article or substance liable to cause or communicate fire or explosion provided that—
 - (i) No explosive of the 5th (Fulminate) Class or explosive of the 6th (Ammunition) Class containing its own means of ignition or any explosive of the 7th (Firework) Class, shall be conveyed in the same carriage with any explosive not of the class and division to which it belongs.
 - (ii) Not more than 2,000 lb. of explosives other than detonators and not a greater number than 60,000 detonators shall be so carried in any one train.
 - (c) Explosives not contained in approved metal cases or cylinders as provided herein shall be carried in a closed van or vans specially constructed and exclusively used to carry explosives; such van or vans shall have no exposed iron or steel in the interior thereof and the doors of such carriage shall be fitted with suitable locking devices so as to prevent access to the explosives by unauthorized persons. When explosives are being carried in such carriage the doors shall be kept closed and securely locked at all times except when explosives are being placed into or removed from the carriage.
 - (d) Not more than 12,000 lb. of explosives shall be carried in any one carriage and not more than 60,000 lb. of explosives shall be carried in any one train at any one time.
 - (e) Every carriage carrying explosives shall be placed as far as practicable from the engine attached to the train and carriages containing explosives shall be separated

from each other and from the engine by separating carriages not containing explosives or inflammable material in accordance with the following:—

- (i) Where the quantity of explosives being carried in a carriage is not more than 300 lb. of explosives (other than detonators) or not more than 10,000 detonators, one or more carriages.
- (ii) Where the quantity of explosives being carried in a carriage exceeds 300 lb. of explosives (other than detonators) or exceeds 10,000 detonators, not less than three carriages.
- (f) Every carriage containing explosives in accordance with this clause shall have conspicuously displayed thereon warning signs bearing the word "EXPLOSIVES" in letters not less than 6 inches in height.
- (g) There shall not be carried with any explosive in the same carriage any matches or similar articles, acids or other chemicals, petroleum or other inflammable liquids, calcium carbide, oily goods, charcoal, lamp black, or any other article or substance of an inflammable nature or liable to spontaneous ignition or to cause or communicate fire or explosion.
- (h) Explosives of the 3rd Division of Class 7 (Firework) shall not at any time be carried in any carriage used exclusively to carry other classes of explosives but may be carried in any suitable carriage approved for such use by the Victorian Railways Commissioners, provided that no article or substance of an inflammable nature or likely to cause fire is carried in the carriage with such fireworks; provided also that the packages in which such fireworks are contained comply with the requirements of the Explosives Act 1928 and are approved by the Victorian Railways Commissioners for carriage in a vehicle.
- (i) No explosives shall be loaded on to or unloaded from a carriage except between sunrise and sunset.


