PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 (No. 3736) it is enacted that on the recommendation of the Minister any portion of the State of Victoria may be proclaimed a Milk Area by the Governor in Council. Now therefore, I, the Governor said Act it is also enacted that the said Act shall have effect as regards any milk area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the Milk Areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine, and Port Fairy, on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Agriculture, do by this my Proclamation declare that the following portions of the Municipal District of the Shire of Korong together with the whole of the premises of each and every dairy and dairy farm outside such portions of such Municipal District wherever situated from which milk is sold within such portions of such Municipal District wherever situated from which milk is sold within such portions of such Municipal District shall constitute a Milk Area to be called the Korong Milk Area.

DECLARATION OF FLUOROACETATE RABBIT BAIT AS A VERMIN DESTROYER AND PRESCRIPTION OF STANDARD THEREFOR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Fungicides Acts, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof by this my Proclamation do hereby declare the substance Fluoroacetate Rabbit Bait to be a vermin destroyer for the purposes of the said Acts and do hereby prescribe the following standard for such vermin destroyer, that is to say:—

- I fix the constituents that shall be contained therein the quantities of such constituents and their chemical or physical conditions as follows:—
 - Such bait shall be made only from oats or other cereal grain;
 - Such bait shall contain not less than 0.04 parts per centum and not more than 0.05 parts per centum of fluoroacetate;
 - Such bait shall be coloured a distinctive colour with methyl violet.

In this Proclamation, "fluoroacetate" means sodium fluoroacetate (1080), fluoroacetamide or any other derivative of monofluoroacetic acid and "Fluoroacetate Rabbit-Bait" means a prepared bait containing fluoroacetate and used or intended to be used for the destruction of rabbits.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government Act 1946 provides, inter alia, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of the 12th March, 1947, the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Bairnsdale:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to that part of the Shire of Bairnsdale described hereunder:

All that piece of land commencing at the northeast corner of Crown allotment 240A, Parish of Bairnsdale; thence generally southerly, westerly, and northerly along the eastern and southern boundaries of Crown allotments 240A and 172B to the most westerly boundary of Crown allotment 172B; thence westerly across a one-chain road to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 172A; thence westerly along the southern boundary and northerly along the

western boundary of the said Crown allotment to its north-west corner; thence northerly across a one-chain road to the southern boundary of Crown allotment 119; thence westerly, northerly and westerly along the boundaries of the same Crown allotment to the eastern boundary of a one-chain road; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 1, Section A; thence easterly along the southern boundary of a one-chain road to the southern boundary of a one-chain road to the southern bank of the Mitchell River; thence generally easterly along the said bank to the north-eastern corner of Crown allotment 9, Section B; thence south-easterly along the eastern boundary of such Crown allotment to the shore of Eagle Point Bay; thence generally southerly and easterly along that shore to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 142a; thence southerly along the western boundary of a one-chain road to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 138a; thence 269 deg. 20 min. 2,954 links and 179 deg. 20 min. 2,105 links to the south-west corner of Crown allotment 138a; thence southerly across a one-chain road to the point of commencement.

And Order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in such part of the municipal district of the Shire of Bairnsdale on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 6th March, 1958, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 6th March, 1958.
