Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

The maximum allowance of water to be supplied per annum without further charge to any property for which a minimum annual charge has been fixed by the Commission shall be the quantity which, if charged for at Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to such minimum annual charge, and for all water supplied in excess of such allowance the charge shall be Twenty pence (1s. 8d.) per 1,000 gallons.

For recreation and cricket grounds allowance to be fixed on playing area up to amount of minimum annual charge based on charge of Four pounds (f4) per acre; water to be charged for at One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to amount of minimum annual charge, the charge for water used in excess of the allowance to be Twenty pence (1s. 8d.) per 1,000 gallons.
- 6. For cemeteries the charge shall be Tenpence (10d.) per 1,000 gallons.





- 6. The statement in duplicate required by the said Act to be furnished to the Comptroller of Stamps before the fifteenth day of each month shall be made in the form of Form "A" of the Schedule hereto and shall contain the following particulars:—




