AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION



DESCRIPTION.

THE COMMON HEATH.

The Common Heath, *Epacris impressa* Labill., was first found in Australia by the French explorer, Labillardière, early in the year 1793, and was described by him in 1803 following his return to Paris.

It is a slender shrub, averaging 1 to 4 feet in height, with a few erect branches, and with flowers varying in colour from white, through pink to red. The leaves are pointed, oval in shape, and less than half an inch in length. The flowers are usually solitary on short stalks, frequently turning to one side.

In the State of Victoria the Common Heath is almost exclusively confined to the southern half of the State, where it is limited to the wetter foothill country, the coastal heath lands and the Little Desert scrub. In the higher rainfall areas, it grows up to an elevation of about 2,000 feet above sea-level, while in lower rainfall areas it may be found up to 3,000 feet.

Although frequently found on flat but swampy ground, heath is absent from all the plain tracts of the State—the basalt plains of the Western District, the torrent gravels of Gippsland, and the level expanses north of the Great Dividing Range. It is particularly common in the Grampians where it flowers

AMENDMENT OF RULES OF SUPERANNUATION FUND FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE VICTORIAN DRIED FRUITS BOARD.

WHEREAS at a meeting of the contributors to the Superannuation Fund for the employees of the Victorian Dried Fruits Board specially convened, pursuant to the Rules of the said Fund, by the Victorian Dried Fruits Board for the purpose and held on the twenty-fifth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight, the making of the amendments hereinafter set out to the Rules of the said Fund was approved by not less than two-thirds of the contributors of the said Fund who would be affected by the making of such amendments present and voting at such meeting:

And whereas after the making of the said amendments

And whereas after the making of the said amendments And whereas after the making of the said amendments had been approved at the said meeting of the contributors to the said Fund the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the said Rules and of every other power it thereunto enabling, decided to make, and has made, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, the said amendments to the said Rules, that is to say, the following amendments:—

- 1. Clause 8 and the heading thereof shall be deleted.
- . 2. Clause 12 and the heading thereof shall be deleted.

3. For clause 16 there shall be substituted the following

"16. (a) Every contributor who retires as an 'employee of the Board on the ground of ill-health or of physical or mental incapacity (which ill-health or incapacity is not due to his own fault) which renders him unable to perform any duties for the Board shall be entitled to receive from the Fund the amount of the full benefit.

(b) Upon the death of a contributor the personal representatives of such contributor shall be entitled to receive from the Fund the amount of the full benefit: Provided that if at the time of payment not being less than six months after the death of the contributor no personal representatives of the contributor have been constituted the Committee may pay the amount of the full benefit payable in respect of the contributor to such person or persons as the Committee determines and if more than one in such proportions as the Committee determines: Provided further that the Committee shall not make any payment pursuant to the power conferred by the last preceding proviso to any person who is not the widower or the widower or a child of the contributor.

(c) Every contributor upon attaining the age of 65 years shall upon retirement from the service of the Board be entitled to receive from the Fund the amount of the full benefit.

(d) Every contributor who has been in the service of the Board for a period of ten years and who voluntarily terminates his service with the Board (however such termination is expressed) shall be entitled to receive from the Fund the amount of the full benefit.

(e) Every contributor who has been in the service of the Board for a period not exceeding five years and who voluntarily terminates his service with the Board (however such termination is expressed) shall be entitled to receive from the Fund one-half of the amount of the full benefit.

amount of the full benefit.

(f) Every contributor who has been in the service of the Board for a period of more than five years and who voluntarily terminates his service with the Board (however such termination is expressed) before having completed ten years' service, shall be entitled to receive from the Fund one half of the amount of the full benefit: Provided however that in any such case the said Committee may in its absolute discretion increase the amount payable to a sum not exceeding the amount of the full benefit.

(g) Every contributor who is dismissed by the Board shall be entitled to receive from the Fund one half of the amount of the full benefit.

(h) For the purposes of this clause the amount of the full benefit shall be the amount which is ascertained in accordance with the following provisions of this paragraph:

(i) Upon the retirement of a contributor or the pon the retirement of a contributor or the voluntary termination of service of a contributor or the dismissal of a contributor in any of the cases referred to in paragraphs (a), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g) of this clause or upon the death of a contributor the Fund shall be valued as at the date of such retirement, voluntary termination of service, dismissal or death (as the case may be) or if the Stock Exchange of Melbourne is not open for business on such date then as at the date on which the Stock Exchange of Melbourne shall next be open for business after the shall next be open for business after the date of retirement, the date of voluntary termination of service, the date of dismissal or the date of death (as the case may missal or the date of death (as the case may be): Provided that in valuing the Fund for the purposes of this clause there shall be deemed to be included in the Fund all the amounts which would have been paid to the Fund by the Board if the contributions of the Board to the Fund had been payable on the dates on which the contributions of contributors to the Fund would be deemed to have been made: Provided further that in valuing the Fund all income of the Fund which has accrued shall be deemed to be part of the Fund and for the purposes of this proviso all income of the Fund shall be deemed to accrue from day to day: Provided further that in valuing the Fund there shall be deducted any amount payable out of the Fund in respect of any, person, (other than the contributor in question) who had been a contributor but who had retired, had voluntarily terminated his service, had been dismissed or had died prior to the retirement, voluntary termination of service, dismissal or death (as the case might be) of the contributor in question.

(ii) The amount of the full benefit shall be the amount which bears the same proportion to the value of the Fund (as determined in accordance with the last preceding in accordance with the last preceding sub-paragraph) as the total amount of the contributions made by the contributor to the Fund bears to the total amount of the contributors including the contributor in question but not including the contributor in question but not including any person who had been a contributor but who had retired, had voluntarily terminated his service, had been dismissed or had died prior to the retirement, voluntary termination of service, dismissal or death (as the case might be) of the contributor in question."

A By-law of the Borough of Moe, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 7, for prohibiting the leaving standing of derelict or unregistered motor cars on streets or roads.

 I^N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Council orders as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law the words "derelict motor car" shall mean any derelict motor car which has remained in any street for a period exceeding 30 days.
- 2. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any street or road.

- 3. Any officer of the Council authorized by it in that behalf may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road to be removed by such reasonable means as he may think fit to some place set aside by the Council for that purpose.
- 4. As soon as reasonably may be after any such car has been removed as aforesaid the Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district a notice in the form in the Schedule
- 5. If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof, such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.
- 6. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, the Council may after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice cause the same to be sold either by public auction or private
- (b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car.
- (c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council, such residue shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.
- 7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within fourteen days from the expiration of such period of 21 days, the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.
- 8. The charge for the removal of any derelict or unregis-The charge for the relindation of this By-law is hereby prescribed as a sum equivalent to 10s.  (c) Cattle must not be allowed to wander on any part of a street or road set apart for traffic;

 (d) Cattle must not be grazed on any State highway or on any street or road within the boundaries of any township;

 (e) The permit shall not extend to or include bulls

 - of any township;

 (e) The permit shall not extend to or include bulls or horses or any cattle not owned by the person to whom the permit is granted; and

 (f) The Council shall have the right to cancel the permit at any time by notice in writing posted by registered letter to the person to whom the permit is granted at his address stated in the permit.
- (2) Cattle grazing on any street or road otherwise than in strict accordance with the conditions contained in the permit granted by the Council shall be deemed (notwithstanding the granting of such permit) to be grazing on such street or road without the consent or permission of the Council permission of the Council.
