PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF CHELSEA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Chelsea has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said city, be declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land used for a street, being part of Crown allotments 141 and 142, Parish of Lyndhurst, and being shown as Bayside-avenue on lodged plan of subdivision No. 9213, and being more particularly described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:

Bayside-avenue.

Commencing at the southern angle of lot 150, shown on the said lodged plan of subdivision, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively 57 deg. 58 min. 802 feet, 57 deg. 51 min. 973 ft. 5 in., 146 deg. 2 min. 50 feet, 237 deg. 51 min. 128 ft. 1½ in., 145 deg. 59 min. 2 feet, 237 deg. 55 min. 1,647 ft. 3½ in., and 326 deg. 2 min. 51 ft. 8 in. to the point of commencement.

CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS FOR TAKING OR KILLING WATER RATS IN CERTAIN SHIRES, MARKETING SKINS OF WATER RATS, LICENSING OF TRAPPERS, ETC.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf do by this my Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the twenty-sixth day of February, 1958, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1958, respecting conditions and restrictions for taking or killing water rats in certain Shires, marketing skins of water rats, licensing of trappers &c. as follows:—

1. In paragraph 4 for the expression—"14th day of May" there shall be substituted the expression—"19th day of July".

2. In paragraph 11 (b) for the expression—"14th day of May" there shall be substituted the expression—"19th day of July".

3. In Schedule "A" (Form "G") for the expression—"14th day of May" there shall be substituted the expression—"19th day of July".

RECLASSIFICATION OF ELECTORAL DISTRICTS OF
THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a change in the Electoral Districts of the Legislative Assembly took place on the eighteenth day of April, 1958:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 32 of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1956*, do by this my Proclamation reclassify the Electoral Districts of the Legislative Assembly into metropolitan, urban, inner country and outer country electorates as set out in the Schedule hereunder, as on and from the thirty-first day of May, 1958.

By-Law No. 379.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and pursuant to Clause 813 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 379 specifying a minimum distance of the outer walls of certain buildings of Class I. and II. Occupancy within the meaning of the said Regulations from frontage and prescribing areas in which buildings of the said Class II. Occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys including the ground storey.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf the Council of the City of Melbourne orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Class I. Occupancy" and "Class II. Occupancy" have the respective meanings ascribed thereto by Clause 601 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

"Frontage" has the meaning ascribed thereto by Clause 102 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

"Storey" and "Ground Storey" have the respective meanings ascribed thereto by Clause 102 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

2. The minimum distance from frontage of the outer walls of any building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy hereafter erected on any land described in the First Schedule shall be twenty-five feet.

3. Those portions of the City of Melbourne more particularly described in the Second Schedule hereto save and except thereof those portions more particularly described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Class II. Occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys including the ground storey.

4. Clauses 1 to 10 both inclusive of and the Schedule to By-law number 312 intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1946* and pursuant to Clause 813 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 312 prescribing areas in which buildings of Class II. Occupancy within the meaning of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys including the ground storey and amending By-law No. 248 and for other purposes" are hereby repealed.

FIRST SCHEDULE.
