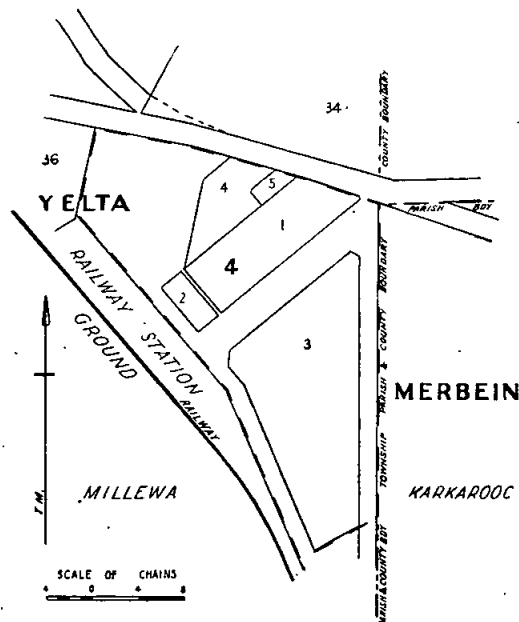
TOWNSHIP OF YELTA RESCINDED AND

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 15th September, 1953, rescinding certain Proclamations and defining a certain area of land in the Parish of Yelta as a township under the designation

of Yelta insofar as it refers to the definition of the Township of Yelta (see *Government Gazette* 1953, page 4703) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a township distinguished by the name of Yelta the area of land in the Parish of Yelta, County of Millewa within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(C.488 (1), (Y.102(2)), (C.95264).
