#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts. SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1949 (No. 5431), as amended by section 2 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1957 (No. 6137), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in relation to land in the whole of Victoria or to land in any part of Victoria described in the Proclamation require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy the vermin on such land by means of poisoning with sodium fluoroacetate (Compound 1080) strychnine or arsenic or by fumigation of burrows and warrens and specify the method by which such poisoning or fumigation shall be undertaken and further direct the time within which it will be undertaken and require such time within which it will be undertaken and require such owners or occupiers to continue such poisoning or funigation until the vermin are destroyed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

Now, therefore; I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby, in relation to land in the whole of Victoria require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy certain vermin, to wit, rabbits, on such land by means of furnigation of burrows and warrens with calcium cyanide, chloropicrin, carbon tetrachloride or carbon monoxide and direct that such fumigation shall be undertaken within the period of ten weeks commencing on Wednesday, the sixteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight and require such owners or occupiers to continue such fumigation until the rabbits are destroyed to the satisfaction of tion until the rabbits are destroyed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF ELTHAM AND ANNEXATION TO THE SHIRE OF HEALESVILLE.

- A By-law of the Shire of Mulgrave, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 74, for requiring the destruction of rats, ants, or other vermin or pests, and of weeds, and for other purposes.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mulgrave, order as follows:—
- 1, By-law No. 67 of the Shire of Mulgrave is hereby repealed.
- 2. The Council of the Shire of Mulgrave may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary or Health Inspector of the municipality requiring such owner or occupier within a time limited by such notice to destroy all rats, ants, or other vermin or pests as may be specified in such notice which are upon such property or premises.
- 3. The said Council may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary or Health Inspector of the municipality requiring such owner or occupier within a time limited by such notice to destroy all such noxious weeds as may be specified in such notice and which are upon such property or premises and the adjacent half-width of any street or road on which such property or premises abuts.
- 4. Any occupier or owner upon whom any notice under clause 1 or clause 2 of this By-law is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice within the time therein limited.
- 5. If any such owner or occupier upon whom any such notice shall be served shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may cause to be taken such measures as it may think necessary to destroy such rats, ants, vermin or pests or noxious weeds (as the case may be) at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 6. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.
- 7. In this By-law the words "Noxious Weeds" shall mean and include the following weeds, namely:—

#### Scientific Name; Common Name.

Watson'a Meriana Mill.; meriana bugle lily.

Rosa rubig'nosa L.; sweet briar.

Rubus fruticoms L.; blackberry bramble.

Ulex europecus L.; furze.

which weeds are hereby declared to be noxious weeds.

8. The  $\,$  By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
