Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF WOORAYL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Woorayl has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used for streets within the said Shire, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land used for streets and being part of Crown allotment 1, section 1, Parish of Kirrak, County of Buln Buln, and being described hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Maldon Shire Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Maldon Shire Common by deducting therefrom the portion in the Township of Maldon containing 36 perches, more or less, of land comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 11th April, 1958.

REVOCATION OF THE PROCLAMATION OR DECLARATION AS A MENTAL HOSPITAL OF CERTAIN BUILDINGS KNOWN AS THE MENTAL HOSPITAL, KEW.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS certain buildings known as the Mental Hospital, Kew, situated on an area of land in portion of the Parish of Boroondara, County of Bourke, bounded by Wills-street, Kew, to the south, Princess-street, Kew, to the east, the River Yarra to the north and the public park and recreation reserve adjoining the Yarra Boulevard to the west, immediately before the commencement of the *Mental Hygiene Act 1933* (No. 4157) were a hospital for the insane within the meaning of the *Mental Hygiene Act 1928* (No. 3721):

And whereas under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section thirty-four of the *Mental Hygiene Act 1928* (No. 3721) as amended by the *Statute Law Revision Act 1937* (No. 4485) every house or building being immediately before the commencement of the said Act No. 4157 a hospital for the insane was declared to be a mental hospital within the meaning of Act No. 3721 as amended by any Act:

And whereas pursuant to sub-section (3) of section thirty-four of the said Act No. 3721 it is amongst other things enacted that the declaration of any house or building as a mental hospital may at any time be revoked by the Governor in Council by order published in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke the declaration as a mental hospital of the buildings known as the Mental Hospital, Kew:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the declaration as a mental hospital of the buildings known as the Mental Hospital, Kew, on the area of land in the Parish of Boroondara, County of Bourke, bounded by Wills-street, Kew, to the south, Princess-street, Kew, to the east, the River Yarra to the north and the public park and recreation reserve adjoining the Yarra Boulevard to the west and direct that such revocation shall take effect from the first day of July, 1958.

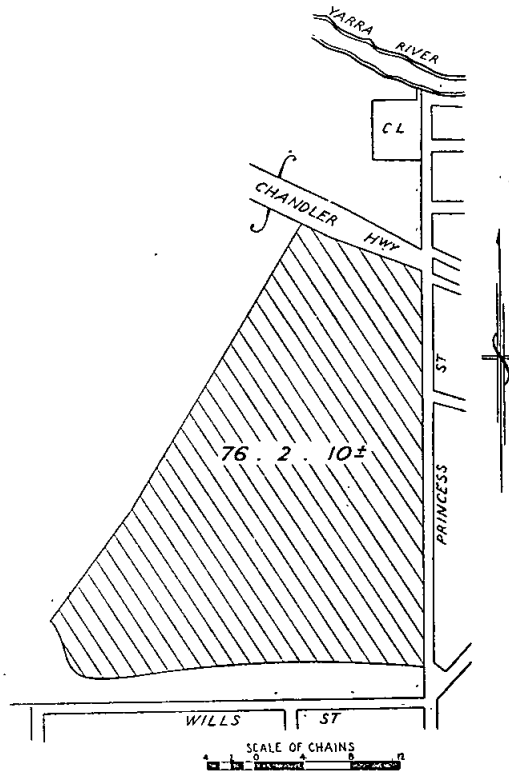

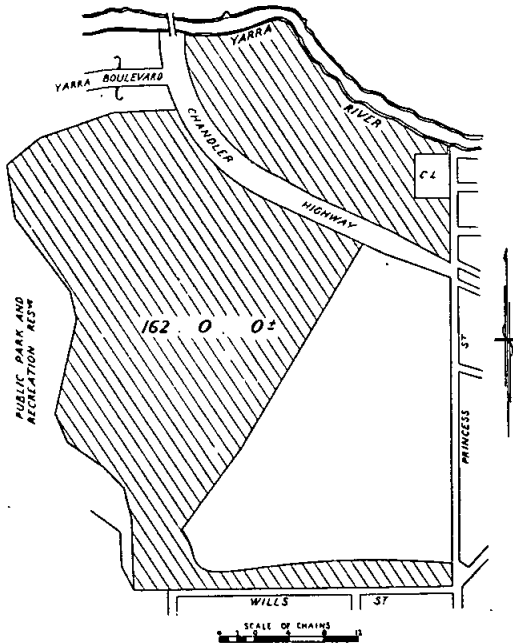

EXTENSION OF THE NARRACAN MEAT AREA.

AMENDMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE PORTLAND MEAT AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1956 (No. 6024), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation alter the limits of the Portland Meat Area so as to include the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Portland, and that part of the Shire of Portland described hereunder, that is to say:—

All that land bounded by a line commencing at a point on the shire boundary at the south-eastern angle of the Parish of Condah; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of that parish and the Parish of Myamyn to the north-western angle of allotment 4, Parish of Homerton; thence northerly by a road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 2A, section 19, Parish of Myamyn; thence westerly by a road to the northern boundary of the Parish of Drumborg; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that parish to the north-eastern angle of allotment 7 in that parish; thence southerly by a road to the south boundary of that parish being the Fitzroy River; thence north-westerly by that boundary and northerly by the western boundary of the parish to the southern boundary of the Parish of Glenaulin; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of that parish and the Parish of Balrook to the Glenelg River; thence south-westerly, north-westerly, and southerly by that river to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Warrain; thence southerly by that boundary to the south-western boundary of the shire; thence south-easterly, north-easterly, and northerly by the shire boundary to the south-eastern angle of the Parish of Condah, being the point of commencement, this area being the whole of the South and Central Ridings of the Shire of Portland.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and all other powers hereunto enabling, Chapter II. of the Rules of the Supreme Court is hereby amended by inserting after Rule 148 the following Rule:—

148A. Where a respondent or co-respondent who has been ordered to pay into court or to the Prothonotary the costs of suit or damages fails to do so in accordance with the order, the party in whose favour the order was made may at any time apply to a Judge on summons to vary the order by directing the payment of such costs or damages to an individual to be specified in the application and the Judge may, if satisfied that in the circumstances it is just and equitable to do so, vary the order accordingly upon an undertaking by that individual to lodge the amount of such costs or damages in court or otherwise deal with them, as and when received in such form as the Judge may direct. If the application is made after decree absolute or other final decree the Judge may, if satisfied as aforesaid, dispense with the undertaking.

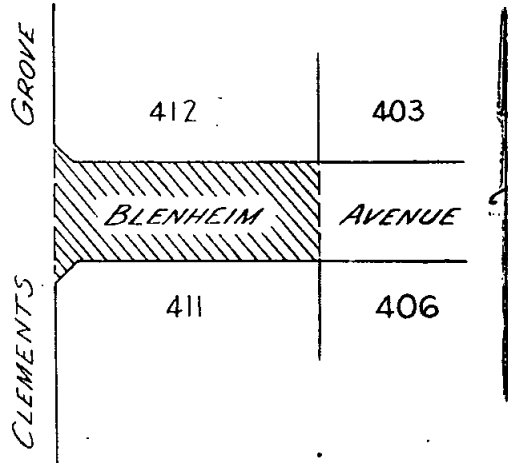

CLEAN AIR REGULATIONS 1958.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956* (No. 6024) the *Clean Air Act 1957* (No. 6125) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the "Clean Air Regulations 1958" and shall come into operation on publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Regulations 3 and 5 of the *Smoke Regulations 1936* are hereby repealed.

3. In these regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

"Boiler" means steam boiler.

"Committee" means the "Clean Air Committee" appointed under the *Clean Air Act 1957*.

"Minister" means the Minister of Health.

4. (1) Each member of the Committee shall be entitled to—

(a) reimbursement of travelling and personal expenses incurred in transacting the business of the Committee at the rate and subject to the conditions applicable to officers of the Public Service of Victoria (other than permanent heads) whose standard salaries are more than £1,750 a year;

(b) (subject to the approval of the Minister) reimbursement for use of his own car at the rate prescribed by the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations.

(2) Each member of the Committee with the exception of the Chief Health Officer and the Chief Inspector of Boilers and Pressure Vessels shall be entitled to a fee of Five guineas for each meeting of the Committee attended by him at which a quorum is present.

5. (1) The emission of dark smoke from a chimney lasting for not longer than the periods set out in the table hereunder shall be left out of account for the purposes of Section 5 of the *Clean Air Act 1957*.

Nature of Plant Served by Chimney.	Minutes in the Aggregate of Dark Smoke.

During the hour following the commencement of re-kindling of the fire in any fireplace connected to the chimney, when such fire has not previously on that day been re-kindled so as to emit dark smoke in excess of the times set out in Column 2. (2) In this regulation the expression "re-kindling of the fire" includes bringing into active operation of the fire already kindled, and "re-kindled" has a corresponding interpretation.

CITY OF FITZROY.

BY-LAW No. 109.

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 109, for prohibiting the leaving of vehicles and regulating traffic in the said City of Fitzroy.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred in the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

1. In this By-law “vehicle” means any conveyance propelled or drawn by any means, and includes a bicycle, tram-car, and any horse, either ridden or driven.

2. No vehicle shall be driven at any time in a southerly direction along Young-street, or in a northerly direction along Fitzroy-street.

3. “Park” means to permit a vehicle, whether unattended or not to remain stationary otherwise than when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to comply with the directions of a member of the Police Force or a traffic control sign or signal or when actually engaged in taking up or setting down persons or goods (and any derivative of the verb “to park” has a corresponding meaning).

In this definition “Goods” means any article loaded on to or from any vehicle primarily designed for carrying goods, or any article or collection of articles weighing more than 30 lb. or occupying more than 6 cubic feet.

4. No person shall park in Smith-street on the west side from Victoria-parade to Johnston-street for a period of time exceeding two hours between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday and 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. Saturday; Nicholson-street on the east side from Victoria-parade to Alexandra-parade for a period of time exceeding two hours between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Friday and 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. Saturday; Nicholson-street on the east side from Liverpool-street to Park-street for a period of time exceeding two hours between

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette* Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
