PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government Act 1946 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 5th May 1958, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 5th May, 1958.

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Mirboo has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part in respect only of parking infringements to the Shire of Mirboo:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation specify the Shire of Mirboo as an area in which Part II. of the Road Traffic Act 1956 shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946, section WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Dandenong has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a road within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land, used for a street, being part of Crown Portion 26 Parish of Dandenong, and being the land described hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, namely:

Commencing at the south west angle of lot 9 on Lodged Plan of Subdivision No. 5255; thence bearing 90° 3′ for 2507 feet 2½ inches; 180° 3½ for 66 feet; 270° 3′ for 2507 feet 2½ inches; 359° 59′ for 66 feet to the point of commencement.

The owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) between the hours hereinbefore set forth in any street, road or part thereof specified in the said Schedules hereto shall, when requested by any officer of the Council or member of the Police Force, give to such officer or member of the Police Force information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle so standing in contravention of the Puller. this By-law.

BY-LAW NO. 32, RELATING TO THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL, AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

N pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act
1928, and of any other power thereunto enabling
them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Rosedale,
in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors,
and Citizens, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the
purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within
their jurisdiction, make the following By-law No. 32
(that is to say):—

- 1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government
- This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Seaspray and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every camping area.
- 4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof. "Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises building, or premises.
- 5. The proprietor of every house, building, premises or camping area shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, premises, or camping area.
- 6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not more than 26-gauge securely riveted and soldered or other approved material in such a manner

as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

- 7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by
- $8.\ It$  shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.
- 9. Every such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep in an inoffensive condition.
- 10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper. Nor shall garden clippings be placed in such receptacle.
- 11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.
- 12. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse such receptacle to be deposited close to and within 10 feet inside of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or perso authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.
- 13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and removal.
- 14. The contractor or person employed or authorized by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council Council.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which the receptacle is taken.

- 15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, depren to be the configuration. danger to health, or offensiveness.
- 16. Such vehicle shall be provided by the contractor and shall be so constructed and of a type approved by the Council, and such vehicle may be required to be fly-proofed and/or waterproofed.
- 17. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, where as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of such methods as may be required by the Health Inspector or Engineer, and in such a manner as not to create a nuisance.
- 18. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be kept clean, thoroughly disinfected, and maintained in a proper state
- 19. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's tipping the contractor or other person authorized or employed by the Council shall bind the surface with clean earth, or other material as may be approved or directed by the Health Inspector or Engineer.
- 20. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the Gazette Officer.

#### 2. Other matter.

- (a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.
- (b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.
- (c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.
- (d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

THE VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE is published on Wednesday Evening in each week, and Notices for insertion will be received by the Government Printer at or before Two p.m. at ordinary rates, and late advertisements between Two p.m. and Five p.m. at double rates on the day preceding the day of publication.

Single copies of the VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE are One shilling, posted One shilling and three pence.

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The title (65 Reward, Dissolution of Partnerships, &c.) forms one or more lines as a heading.

On an average, ten words make a line.

Every signature must likewise be counted as a line.
