PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, Section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Northcote has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used for streets within the said City, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land used for streets known as Balgonie-place and Balgonie-street and for right-of-ways, being part of Crown Portions 106 and 107, Parish of Jilka Jilka, and being more particularly described hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

BALGONIE-PLACE, BALGONIE-STREET AND RIGHT-OF-WAYS OFF SUCH STREETS.

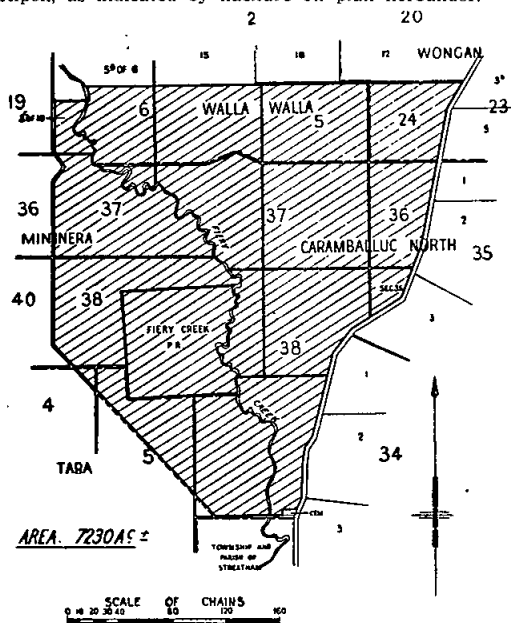
PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria within the area hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act*, 1928.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 5227.

*For the Sale and Distribution of Water for Irrigation—
Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District.*

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District, and shall come into operation on the 1st July, 1958.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge, or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be installed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be recorded by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. (a) If it appears to the Commission that any gauge or appliance for measurement is inaccurate or not registering, the quantity of water supplied in any watering during the period such gauge or appliance was deemed to be inaccurate or not registering shall be computed by accounting a watering as being the volume of water set out hereunder in this clause over any area watered, according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied, and the quantity so computed shall be deemed to be the quantity supplied during the said period.

For the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge, a watering means the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be the volume of water set out in this clause over any area watered, according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water is supplied. Graded land means land which in the opinion of the Commission has been effectively laid out for the purpose of irrigation on the border, check, or contour system.

(b) In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be computed by accounting a watering as being the volume of water set out in paragraph (a) of this clause of this By-law over any area watered according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied.

5. For the purposes of this By-law, the term "irrigation season" shall apply to the period from the first day of May in every year to the thirtieth day of April in the next succeeding year.

6. The charge for the supply of water during the irrigation season for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for such season; and if a supply is obtained in excess of any water rights apportioned to any lands during such season the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as water rights.

7. The charge for the supply of water during the irrigation season for irrigation of lands other than those to which water rights have been apportioned shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned as water rights.

8. An acre-foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law, and any By-law making an irrigation charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

9. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

10. Charges for water supplied for irrigation other than water supplied under water right shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Commission at Werribee.

11. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

12. All persons taking the water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission or its authorized officers may direct; any person who wrongfully takes water from any such works shall be guilty of an offence.

13. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the district, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission; any person not so authorized who interferes with the flow of water in any channel or with any works of the Commission, or with any registering appliance in connexion therewith, shall be guilty of an offence.

14. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to the penalty provided in the Water Acts. Such penalty shall be recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

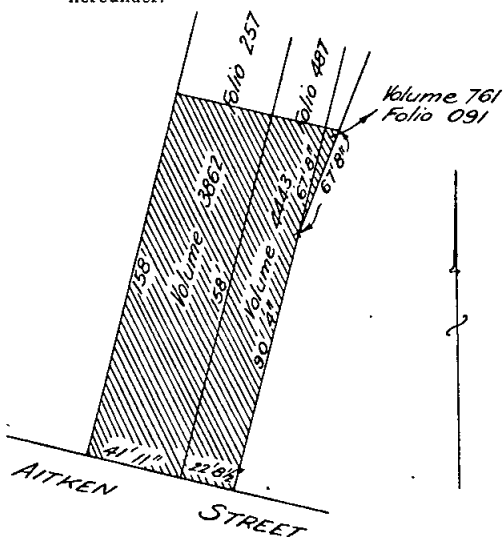

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BUNINYONG GRAVEL RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Buninyong, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 13th January, 1948, as a site for the Supply of Gravel, known as the "Buninyong Gravel Reserve", and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. The owner of any horse, cattle, or other animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition such horse, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

7. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the said Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid.

Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Five shillings nor less than Nine pence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.

8. All gravel to be removed from the said Reserve, in accordance with the permission of the Committee of Management, shall be removed therefrom subject to and in accordance with the directions of the engineer of the Council of the Shire of Buninyong, provided that and subject to such direction all gravel shall be removed in a face and for the full depth of the deposit. No overburden shall be allowed to remain on the floor of the pit, but all such overburden shall be removed and deposited as directed by the Committee of Management. All trees, stumps, logs, roots, branches, and other debris shall be removed from the pit as they are reached and fall, and shall not be left standing on "islands".—(Rs.6098.)

Every persons who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RUSSELL RESERVE AT LAKE BURRUMBEET.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purpose as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown lands in the Parishes of Brewster, Haddon, and Burrumbeet shown in pink colour on lithograph plan B over 7.857 attached to Lands Department correspondence No. C.70834, and known as the "Russell Reserve" hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The said reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset and such other times as permitted by the Committee, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and also except on such days (not exceeding fifteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, cricket, football, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken by the Committee for admission to the Reserve.

2. No person shall:—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(b) Climb, jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, trees, shrubs, flowers, gates, fences, seats or any equipment of any body therein nor leave nor deposit therein any papers, glass, straw, manure, or any rubbish, nor roll, throw

- or discharge, or cause to be rolled, thrown or discharged, any stone, brick or any other substance as a missile.
- (c) Discharge any firearm in any part of the Reserve so as to be a danger or annoyance to any other persons using the Reserve.
 - (d) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
 - (e) Remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
 - (f) In the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or disturb any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
 - (g) Affix, print, post, paint, cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee.
 - (h) Break anything made of glass in the Reserve.
 - (i) Permit any broken glass object to remain in the Reserve.
 - (j) Use the sanitary conveniences structures, or any part of the same, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portion of such structures as are specially constructed for the purpose.
 - (k) Use or cause to be used any boatshed for other than boating purposes without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (l) Row or handle any boat or craft on the lake recklessly or in a manner likely to cause damage to its occupants or to any other boat or craft or to endanger the safety or comfort of any other person or to cause annoyance to any person on any other boat or on the banks of such lake.
 - (m) Being a male, other than a boy under the age of seven years, enter or use any playground, oval, place, room or building set apart for the use of females.
 - (n) Being a female, enter or use any playground, place, room or building set apart for the use of males.
3. No person while in the Reserve shall without the consent, in writing, of the committee first obtained:—
- (a) Occupy or use any building, house, booth, shed or any other structure therein.
 - (b) Erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing or seat or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or in any way enclose any part thereof.
 - (c) Solicit or gather money or other thing.
 - (d) Take part in any public entertainment of any sort.
 - (e) Preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public.
 - (f) Carry on any trade or business or the calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the Reserve.
4. Any written permission granted or ticket or receipt issued in pursuance of these Regulations shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee to demand the production of same.
5. Any person driving or bringing any vehicle of any nature whatever into the Reserve shall be under the absolute direction of the Committee or body hiring the Reserve. The Committee or hiring body may, at its discretion, prevent any vehicle from entering the Reserve.
6. No person shall bring into or put into the Reserve nor suffer to be in the Reserve any greyhound, whippet, cattle, horses, or sheep without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. Any dog other than those described above may be brought into the Reserve if controlled by a cord or chain while remaining therein.
7. Any dog found wandering uncontrolled as aforesaid in the Reserve shall be dealt with in the manner provided in the *Dog Act 1928* or any amendment thereof.
8. The owner of any dog or other animal who permits or suffers such dog or animal to be in the Reserve otherwise than in accordance with these Regulations shall, in addition to any other penalty, be liable to make compensation for any damage done by such animal to the Reserve or any thing therein.
9. Persons may camp in such portions of the Reserve as the Committee may appoint for this purpose and upon the payment of such charge as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee. This licence to camp may be withdrawn by the Committee at any time from any person.
10. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of grounds so set apart.
11. Persons or bodies renting or hiring any stand, building, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements shall, by a written undertaking, take full responsibility for any damage done to any such stand, building, or enclosure, and shall make good such damage to the satisfaction of the Committee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee, and in addition the person or body so hiring shall be required by the Committee to lodge a deposit of a sum not exceeding £100.
12. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any games (football, cricket, tennis, golf, bowls, hockey, or the like) and any competitor at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground or oval during the course of such games and sport.
13. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve, or part thereof, for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee a fee for the use of the ground, such fee to be fixed by the Committee.
14. No building, pier or jetty shall be constructed in the Reserve until plans and specifications have been submitted and approved by the Committee and written permission given by it for such construction.
15. The Committee shall be at liberty at any time to require any buildings or erections in the Reserve to be altered, renovated, repaired or removed, and no stakes or posts shall be driven into the bed of the lake, and no pier or building shall be altered or removed without the authority, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
16. The Committee may provide and build such fireplaces as it may think necessary, and any person lighting fires or using fires or causing or permitting fires to be used on the Reserve save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of such Committee, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.
17. Every person who shall infringe any of these Regulations for the management of the Reserve may be removed therefrom or from any property therein, or directed to leave forthwith the Reserve or such property therein, by any officer or employee of the Committee or by any member of the Police Force, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to prosecution as provided by law.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WAHGUNYAH RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE".
