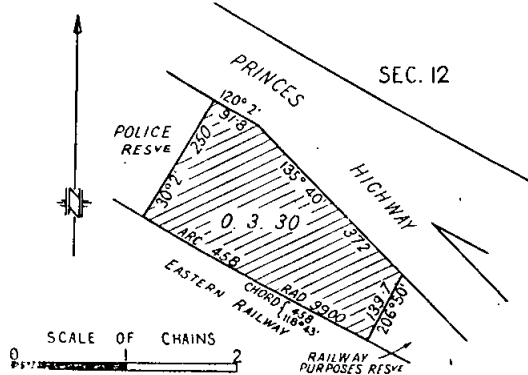

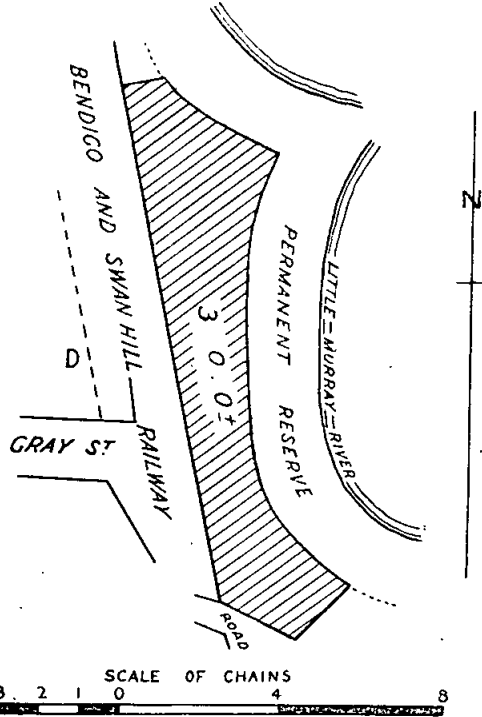

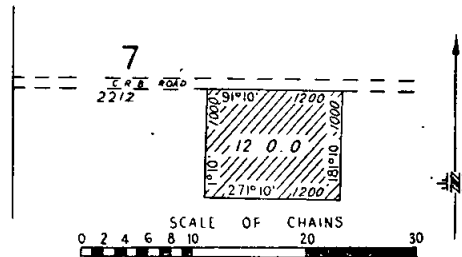

(b) where the owner is not the occupier, proof by statutory declaration of the occupier as to—

- (i) his right to occupy such premises, exhibiting to the statutory declaration a true copy of any document evidencing that right;
- (ii) the name, address and occupation of the person to whom the rent is paid, the amount and mode of payment thereof, and to the best of his knowledge and belief the name, address and occupation of the person entitled to receive such rent.

(2) On or before the hearing of any such request, the owner shall produce to the said Board his documents of title to such premises and the occupier shall so produce the documents by virtue whereof he occupies such premises."

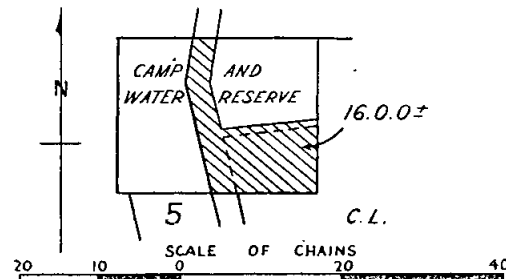

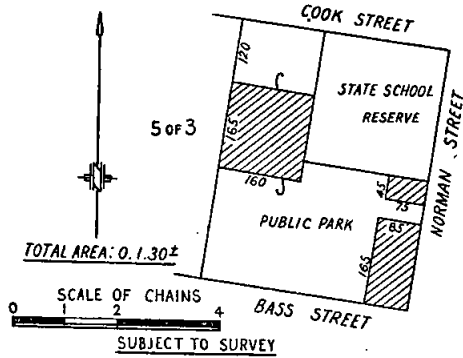

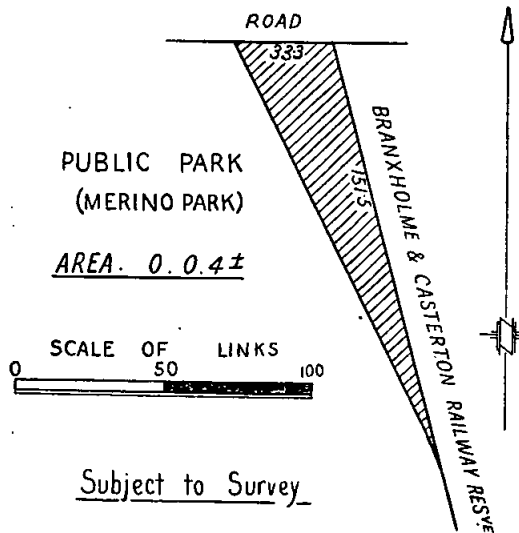
