GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

By-Law No. 91.

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year Commencing on the First day of July, 1958.

GEELONG Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928*, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such Works.

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic and/or other purposes:—

- (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £13—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On any such tenement, the annual valuation whereof exceeds £13—One shilling and sixpence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) On any land on which there is no building, the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £6—Ten shillings per annum.
- (d) On any such land on which there is no building, the annual valuation whereof exceeds £6—One shilling and sixpence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1958, and ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1959, and shall be payable on the tenth day of September, 1958.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rates, be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts by the Council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES OF THE ESTATE AGENTS COMMITTEE.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in section 8 of the *Estate Agents Act 1956* and all other powers thereunto enabling, the Estate Agents Committee hereby

makes the following amendments to the Rules of the Estate Agents Committee, made on the 26th day of November, 1956:—

1. For Rule 4, as re-promulgated on the 13th day of December, 1957, there shall be substituted the following rule:—

"4. (1) Without affecting the basis of qualification for the grant of a licence by the way of holding a licence as a sub-agent, an applicant shall be eligible to apply for a licence as an estate agent if—

(a) during the period of five years immediately preceding his application he has for a period of or periods aggregating not less than three years—

(i) been an officer or employee of the Crown or any Government department or any of the corporations or authorities referred to in sub-section (1) of section 4 of the *Estate Agents Act 1956*; and

(ii) as such an officer or employee been regularly engaged in the selling, buying, exchanging, letting, or taking on lease of or otherwise dealing with or disposing of, or in negotiating for the sale, purchase, exchange, letting, or taking on lease of or any other dealing with or disposing of—any real estate whatsoever; or

(b) the Committee is satisfied that in any special case the applicant possesses suitable qualifications and experience to be the holder of an estate agent's licence."

2. For sub-rule (i) of Rule 5 there shall be substituted the following sub-rule:—

"5. (i) The maximum commission or rate of commission that an estate agent or auctioneer may receive in respect of a service or transaction specified in the first column of the First Schedule to these Rules shall not exceed the amount calculated in accordance with the commission or rate of commission set opposite such service or transaction in the second column of the said First Schedule, provided that—

(a) the engagement or appointment to act as agent in respect of such service or transaction was entered into or made on or after the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven; and

(b) in the case of an engagement or appointment of an auctioneer to sell by auction the auctioneer shall be entitled to such further amounts which have been authorized by the seller as are actually and necessarily expended by such auctioneer on advertising and other out-of-pocket expenses."

3. For sub-rule (iii) of Rule 5 there shall be substituted the following sub-rule:—

"(iii) The term 'Subdivisional Sale' as used in the First Schedule to these Rules shall for the purposes of these Rules be read and understood as meaning 'a sale at auction' or within 30 days of being offered at auction of one or more allotments of vacant land (not being rural lands) where not less than three of such allotments have been offered for sale at the auction but does not include a sale of all the allotments so offered if all such allotments are sold as an entity at the same time and to the same purchaser."

4. For paragraph (b) of Item No. 1 of the First Schedule to these Rules there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(b) Vacant land (other than rural land) when sold at or as a result of a subdivisional sale.

(i) Where the gross purchase price realized is £5,000 or less, 5 per cent. of the gross purchase price.

(ii) Where the gross purchase price exceeds £5,000, the sum of £250 plus 2½ per cent. of such part of the gross purchase price as is in excess of £5,000."

5. For the expression opposite paragraph (d) of Item 1 in column 2 of the First Schedule to these Rules there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"3 per cent. of the total rental payable for the duration of the lease (including rental payable in advance) or the sum of £200 whichever is the greater, plus 5 per cent. of the total purchase price of stock in trade, goodwill, plant, furniture, effects,

bonus consideration or premium but not including any deposit or guarantee to secure the payment of the rental or the due performance of the covenants of the lease:

Provided that where the lease includes an option to purchase the freehold and the lessee exercises his option during the term of the lease the agent shall be entitled to an additional amount at the rate prescribed in Item 1 (c)."

The foregoing amendments shall take effect as on and from the date of consent to these amendments by the Governor in Council.

SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

By-LAW No. 48.

A By-law of the Shire of Bellarine, made under the *Health Act 1956*, and under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 48 for the purpose of controlling the deposit and removal of refuse and rubbish and for the providing for the removal of garbage from receptacles to be used therefor.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1956*, and the *Local Government Act 1946*, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bellarine order as follows:—

1. By-laws Nos. 2, 7, and 8 of the Shire of Bellarine shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. Save and except as provided herein this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Bellarine and unless exempted by the Council, in writing, under the hand of the Shire Secretary, shall apply to every house, building or premises therein.

3. "Household garbage" shall mean refuse and other waste matter which is ordinarily produced in connexion with the preparation, handling, or disposal of food, but does not include trade waste from food manufacture or processing plants.

"Contractor" shall mean any person contracting with the Council for the removal of household refuse or any person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose.

"Garbage Collection Area" shall mean any area within the Shire in respect of which a contractor has been appointed by the Council for the collection of household garbage and in respect of which a notice has been published in a newspaper circulating in such area prescribing the same as a garbage collection area and appointing prescribed days of the week on which household garbage is to be collected in the several specified parts of such area.

4. No person shall deposit or leave or cause or permit to be deposited or left any rubbish or refuse on any street, road, lane, or passage or on any land within the municipal district excepting those areas reserved by the Council as rubbish tips provided that any rubbish or refuse deposited in such appointed area shall be deposited in such manner and in such position as indicated either by a duly authorized employee of the Council or by any notice posted therein.

5. The occupier of any house building or premises shall not deposit or cause or permit or suffer to be deposited any refuse or rubbish in the yard or grounds thereof and shall keep such yard or grounds in such condition and manner as not to be a nuisance or dangerous to health or offensive.

6. Where any refuse or rubbish (other than household garbage or refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 48 of the *Health Act 1956*) has been deposited or placed on any land, the owner or occupier thereof shall upon notice in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary so to do remove such refuse or rubbish within the time set out in the said notice.

7. The occupier of every house, building or premises in any garbage collection area shall provide keep and maintain at all times upon the said premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all household garbage produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.

8. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24-gauge or other approved material in such manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of the receptacle of anything offensive that may be deposited therein or any escape by leakage or other means of part of the contents of such receptacle.

9. Each receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles and shall be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

10. Each such receptacle shall be provided with a properly constructed close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle and such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when being filled or emptied) and where necessary an efficient deodorant shall be used in sufficient quantity to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, any slops, wet refuse or liquid waste into such receptacle nor deposit or cause to

permit to be deposited any moist refuse in such receptacle unless the same has been previously drained and effectually wrapped in paper.

11. No person shall deposit or cause or permit to be deposited any hot ashes in the said receptacle.

12. The occupier shall cause such receptacle to be at all times in good order and inoffensive and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when required to do so by the Council.

13. The occupier at such hour or hours (if any) and on such day or days as have been appointed for the collection of household garbage in that part of the garbage collection area in which the house building or premises occupied by him are situated shall cause such receptacle to be placed close to the said entrance of the said house building or premises from the street lane or right-of-way on which such house, building or premises abut in order that such receptacle may be conveniently emptied by the Contractor.

14. The Contractor—

(a) shall empty the receptacle placed for emptying pursuant to the preceding clause directly into the vehicle provided for its reception;

(b) shall where any of the contents of any such receptacle are spilled by him when emptying the same place such contents into the said vehicle and leave the surrounding area in a clean and proper condition;

(c) on emptying, shall replace such receptacle properly covered with its lid;

(d) shall at least once a week or as frequently as the Council directs, collect and remove all household garbage in a suitable covered vehicle;

(e) shall not with respect to the emptying and replacing of the said cans, the emptying of the household garbage into the said vehicles and in conveyance of such household refuse to the tip, incinerator or destructor cause any nuisance or condition to arise which may be a danger to health or offensive.

(f) shall keep all vehicles and appliances used by him clean and thoroughly disinfected with an approved disinfectant and maintain same in a proper state of repair.

15. The vehicle provided for the reception of household garbage shall so far as practicable be made water-tight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or other suitable effective means.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when household garbage is being put in or discharged from the said vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall when full be taken by the shortest practicable route to the tip, incinerator or destructor.

18. Where household garbage is authorized to be disposed of at the tip the Contractor shall cause it to be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the general Sanitary Regulations 1950, or any amendment thereof.

19. The land upon which the household garbage or refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed or grass or any cereal crops or such other plants or as the Council shall direct or approve.

20. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall for every wilful act or default contrary thereto be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which the offence against the By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
