AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the area of Crown lands comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts.

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1957*, No. 6137, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation specify a day being a day not less than thirty days after the publication of such proclamation from and after which any noxious weed specified in such proclamation shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in Victoria or in any part of Victoria described in the proclamation or on such portion of their land as is specified in the proclamation.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby specify the Thirteenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight as the day from and after which the noxious weed, *Carthamus lanatus*, L.—Saffron Thistle—shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in those parts of Victoria described in the first column of the Schedule hereunder on such portions of their land as is specified in the second column of such Schedule.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality not being a city or town extend the operation

of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Alberton and Winchelsea have requested that the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal districts of the said Shires:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to such parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Alberton and Winchelsea as are described hereunder, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the afore-mentioned parts of municipal districts thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 3 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 15th December, 1958, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said chapter, and provided, further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 15th December, 1958.

Shire of Alberton.

The Townships of Alberton and Gormandale, and all that part of the Township of Victoria situated within Orr's Special Survey, bounded by Newton-street on the north, Buckley-street on the east, the Township of Alberton on the south, and Gellion-street on the west.

Shire of Winchelsea.

Commencing at the mouth of Stony Creek; thence generally south-westerly along the coastline to the Wye River; thence generally westerly along that river to the south-western angle of allotment 29B, Parish of Kaanglang; thence northerly, easterly and northerly along the eastern boundary of the State Forest to the north-western angle of allotment 27A, Parish of Kaanglang; thence by a straight line through the State Forest to the south-western angle of allotment 71, Parish of Lorne; thence along the western boundary of allotment 71 to the Cumberland Creek; thence by a straight line to the intersection of the western boundary of the Township of Lorne and the St. George River; thence along the western boundary of the said township to the north-eastern angle of allotment 22 of 5 and continuing in the same straight line to the Erskine River; thence by the western and northern boundaries of the said township to the Stony Creek; thence south-westerly along that creek to the point of commencement.
