# PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

#### NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT ALL FISHING IN CERTAIN WATERS.

T is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation providing as follows:—

## RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and all other powers hereunto enabling the following amendments to the Rules of the Supreme Court are made and shall take effect from the date of publication in the Government Gazette:—

At the end of Rule 1p of Order LIV. of Chapter 1 and at the end of Rule 86 of Chapter 2 there shall be inserted the following words:—

"The appeal shall be by a re-hearing de novo of the application but each party may, subject to any proper objections to admissibility, rely upon any affidavit used before the Master and upon any evidence given orally before him: Provided that if any other party desires the production of the deponent or witness for examination before the Judge such affidavit or oral evidence may not be so relied upon without such production except by leave of the Judge."
