Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and all other powers hereunto enabling, the following amendments to Chapter I. of the Rules of the Supreme Court are made and shall take effect from the

1. After Rule 5 of Order XXXVII. there shall be inserted the following Rule:—

"5A. Upon presentation of a writ of commission to the Prothonotary for sealing the person presenting the same shall file a copy thereof signed by or on behalf of the solicitor for the party issuing the same, or by the party himself if he is proceeding in person."

2. For Rules 26 and 27 of Order XXXVII. there shall be substituted the following Rules:—

27. Upon presentation of a writ of subpoena to the Prothonotary for sealing the person presenting the same shall file a copy thereof signed by or on behalf of the solicitor for the party issuing the same, or by the party himself if he is proceeding in person."

3. For the word "*praecipe*" in Rule 31 of Order XXXVII. there shall be substituted the word "copy".

5. After Rule 12A of Order LIII. there shall be inserted the following Rule:—

"12B. Upon presentation of a writ of Certiorari to the Prothonotary for sealing the person presenting the same shall file a copy thereof signed by or on behalf of the solicitor for the party issuing the same, or by the party himself if he is proceeding in person."

6. After Rule 15 of Order LIII. there shall be inserted the following Rule:—

"15A. Upon presentation of a writ of Mandamus to the Prothonotary for sealing the person presenting the same shall file a copy thereof signed by or on behalf of the solicitor for the party issuing the same, or by the party himself if he is proceeding in person."

7. After Rule 30 of Order LIII. there shall be inserted the following Rule:—

“30A. Upon presentation of a writ of Prohibition to the Prothonotary for sealing the person presenting the same shall file a copy thereof signed by or on behalf of the solicitor for the party issuing the same, or by the party himself if he is proceeding in person.”

8. After Rule 41 of Order LIII. there shall be inserted the following Rule:—

“41A. Upon presentation of a writ of Habeas Corpus to the Prothonotary for sealing the person presenting the same shall file a copy thereof signed by or on behalf of the solicitor for the party issuing the same, or by the party himself if he is proceeding in person.”

9. The Forms in Appendix G numbered 1, 3, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 21 are hereby abolished.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as “the Principal Regulations.”

2. Regulation No. 143 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following Regulation 143 substituted therefor:—
“143.

“Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, all goods (other than ales, wines, spirits, or other fermented or spirituous liquors) landed and placed upon a wharf or any area which by Resolution of the Commissioners is annexed to a wharf or in a shed shall be removed therefrom—

“(a) If the goods be cement, carbon black, plaster or whiting—within eight hours from the time of landing: Provided that any such cement, carbon black, plaster or whiting landed between 5 p.m. and 8 a.m. of the following day shall be deemed to have been landed at 8 a.m. on such following day.

“(b) If the goods be steel or steel products discharged at No. 21 Berth, South Wharf—no later than 5 p.m. of the day immediately following the day upon which such goods were landed thereon: Provided always that in the case of any such goods landed at the said berth on the final day of discharge of the vessel from which such goods are landed the Harbor Master may, upon application of the Owner, grant permission in writing for such goods to remain upon the said berth for such period not exceeding three days after the day upon which the vessel has ceased discharging as the Harbor Master may determine.

In the event that any such goods be not removed within the time limited for their removal as aforesaid, the Harbor Master may at any time after the expiration of such time remove or order the removal of any such goods to some warehouse or other place of storage or to some area of land and the Owner of such goods shall pay all charges and expenses connected with such goods and such goods shall at all times be and remain at Owner's sole risk.

“(c) In the case of any other goods—

- (i) If notice requiring removal be delivered by the Harbor Master to the Owner, Consignee or person claiming a right to the goods—within three days of the delivery of such notice.
- (ii) In any other case—within three days after the vessel from which they have been landed has ceased discharging cargo at the berth where such goods were landed:

“Provided always that if, in the opinion of the Commissioners, the exigencies of trade permit, such goods may be allowed to remain for such further time as they may specify, but in no case for more than six days after the vessel has ceased discharging cargo as aforesaid. Unless such goods be removed within the time mentioned, they may be removed by the Commissioners and stored in any bonded or other warehouse on behalf of and at the risk and expense of the Owners thereof: Provided that no goods liable to duty shall be removed, unless with the consent of the Collector of Customs, who shall nominate the warehouse to which such goods shall be removed.”

3. Regulation 144 of the Principal Regulations is amended as follows:—

At the commencement thereof and immediately before the word “Should” therein first appearing insert the words “Save as in Regulation 143 (b) provided”.

LIBRARY TRAINING SCHOOL REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Free Library Service Board Act 1946*, doth hereby revoke the Library Training School Regulations made on the fourth day of May, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of May, 1948, and further doth make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Library Training School Regulations 1958.
2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—
 - “Trustees” means the Trustees of the Public Library of Victoria.
 - “Chief Librarian” means the Chief Librarian of the Public Library of Victoria or any person for the time being discharging the duties of that office.
 - “Principal” means the Principal of the Library Training School or any person for the time being discharging the duties of that office.
 - “Prescribed” means prescribed by these Regulations.
3. The school shall be known as the Library Training School and shall be established and conducted by the Trustees.
4. In addition to any other courses which may be conducted by the Trustees, the following courses shall be held—
 - (a) Preliminary Certificate Course of one term of approximately thirteen weeks;
 - (b) Proficiency Certificate Course of an additional two terms of approximately thirteen weeks each.
5. The curriculum shall comprise the study of cataloguing and classification, library administration, book selection, use of reference material, the history of libraries and the development of the book from early times to the present day.
6. The number of students admitted to each course shall be not more than forty-five.
7. Before being admitted to the Preliminary and Proficiency Certificate Courses, every student shall have passed the Matriculation Certificate Examination of the University of Melbourne or shall possess such other qualifications as, in the opinion of the Trustees, may be regarded as the equivalent of such examination.
8. No person under the age of eighteen years or over thirty-five years shall be admitted as a student. Provided that the Trustees may admit a student less than eighteen years or more than thirty-five years who, in their opinion, has special qualifications.
9. Every applicant for admission shall apply, in writing, on the form contained in the Schedule hereto or to like effect. Such applications shall be examined by the Chief Librarian and Principal and their decision to allow or disallow an application shall be final.
10. A register of students shall be kept under the direction of the Principal.
11. (a) The fees to be charged for the Preliminary Certificate Course and the Proficiency Certificate Course shall be—
 - (i) Day Classes £7 7s. per term; part-time day classes of three days per week £5 5s. per term.
 - (ii) Evening Classes £5 5s. per term.

The fees to be charged for any other course conducted by the Trustees shall be £5 5s.

(b) Every student shall pay to the Accountant, Public Library, the prescribed fee before the commencement of each term.

(c) Any student who has not paid the prescribed fee will not be permitted to attend the school.

12. The Trustees may, on the recommendation of the Chief Librarian, grant a remission of one-half the fee paid by any student who within one calendar month of the commencement of any term, is unable on account of illness to resume studies during that term, provided a satisfactory certificate by a duly qualified medical practitioner is furnished in support of such absence.

13. Any student admitted to the school more than six weeks after the commencement of any term shall, on the recommendation of the Chief Librarian and approval of the Trustees, be required to pay half the prescribed fee for the unexpired portion of the term.

14. Any student not making full and proper use of the school or not making due progress shall be reported by the Principal to the Chief Librarian who shall investigate the case and report to the Trustees, and the Trustees shall decide whether the student shall be permitted to continue to attend the school.

15. (a) Any student guilty of any serious irregularity or unbecoming conduct may be suspended by the Chief Librarian.

(b) The Chief Librarian shall forthwith report such suspension to the Trustees, who if the offence is proved to their satisfaction, may, if they think fit, exclude the student from the school for such period as they may determine.

16. (a) At the conclusion of such course each student shall be required to undergo an examination or examinations in the subjects set out in the curriculum prescribed by these Regulations.

(b) The Trustees may issue a certificate of qualifications to every student who has successfully completed a course and passed the prescribed examination.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE BOILERS INSPECTION ACTS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Boilers Inspection Act* 1928 (No. 3645), as amended by the *Boilers Inspection (Amendment) Act* 1956 (No. 5975) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

PART 1.

PRELIMINARY.

Citation and Commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Boilers Inspection (Welding) Regulations 1958* and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Parts.

2. These Regulations shall be divided into parts as follows:—

- Part 1.—Preliminary.
- Part 2.—Certificates of Competency.
- Part 3.—Welding Supervisors' Certificates.
- Part 4.—General provisions.

Repeal of Existing Regulation.

3. Regulation 16 of the *Boilers Inspection Regulations 1952* is hereby repealed.

Interpretation.

4. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

- “Act” means *Boilers Inspection Act* 1928 as amended by any Act.
- “Board of Reference” or “Board” means the Board of Reference constituted under the *Boilers Inspection Acts*.
- “Steam boiler” means any closed vessel used for generating or holding steam under pressure greater than atmospheric pressure.
- “Pressure vessel” means any closed vessel in which air or gas is held under pressure greater than 30 lb. to the square inch above atmospheric pressure.
- “Pressure pipe-line” means any pipe-line forming part of or connecting units of a pressure vessel in which pipe-line air or gas is held under pressure greater than 30 lb. to the square inch above atmospheric pressure or any pipe-line forming part of or connecting units of a steam boiler in which pipe-line steam is held under pressure greater than atmospheric pressure.
- “S.A.A. C.B.14, Part I.” means S.A.A. Boiler Welding Certification Code published by the Standards Association of Australia and distinguished as No. C.B.14, part I.—1947.
- “S.A.A. C.B.14, Parts II. and III.” means S.A.A. Boiler Welding Certification Code published by the Standards Association of Australia and distinguished as No. C.B.14, Parts II. and III.—1958.

PART 2.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

5. No person shall use any process of welding in the manufacture, repair or alteration of any steam boiler, pressure vessel or pressure pipe-line unless he is the holder of a certificate of competency as a fusion welder issued by the Board of Reference.

Separate certificates shall be issued for the welding of—

- (a) Steam boilers and pressure vessels.
- (b) Pressure pipe-lines.

Each certificate shall state whether the holder is qualified to weld—

- (i) mild steel,
- (ii) stainless steel,
- (iii) alloy steel, or
- (iv) non-ferrous metals,

and whether by electric arc welding or oxy-acetylene welding.

The qualifications and examinations specified hereafter for all certificates shall be adapted to suit the terms of the application which shall state clearly the class of material and type of welding for which a certificate is required.

A person, the holder of a certificate of competency, may apply for an endorsement enabling him to weld in a different class of material or type of welding or both.

Fees to be paid for certificates of competency shall be—

Certificate of Competency to Weld Steam Boilers and Pressure Vessels.

6. A Certificate of Competency to weld steam boilers and pressure vessels may be issued to any person if—

- (1) (a) he has completed an apprenticeship to an engineering trade approved for this purpose by the Board and during or subsequent to such apprenticeship has had at least two years' training and experience as a manual metallic arc welder or oxy-acetylene welder; or
- (b) he has had at least five years' experience as a manual metallic arc welder or oxy-acetylene welder;
- (2) he has had experience in flame cutting and bevelling;
- (3) he completes an application form (Form A annexed) and returns it to the Secretary of the Board of Reference together with documentary evidence concerning his qualifications and experience satisfactory to the Board and the appropriate fee;
- (4) he passes a written and/or oral examination to the satisfaction of the Board in the following subjects:—
 - (a) Arc and oxy-welding equipment.
 - (b) Welding terms and definitions.
 - (c) Preparation of parts for welding.
 - (d) Welding methods and procedure.
 - (e) Elementary knowledge of electricity as applied to A.C. and D.C. circuits.
 - (f) Safety precautions as to equipment, personnel, and fire hazards.
 - (g) Flame cutting.
 - (h) Electrodes (types and applications); and

- (5) he passes the practical tests for welders of steam boilers and pressure vessels as laid down in Part I. of S.A.A. C.B.14.

7. Alternatively, a Certificate of Competency may be issued to an applicant without further examination if—

- (a) he is the holder of an "A" Grade Certificate issued by the Australian Welding Institute or a Welding Permit issued by the Department of Labour and Industry of New South Wales, or is the holder of a certificate issued by any other examining authority recognized by the Board of Reference;
- (b) he has had experience in the welding of steam boilers and pressure vessels; and
- (c) he completes an application form and returns it to the Secretary of the Board giving the number and date of issue of his "A" Grade Certificate, Welding Permit, or other certificate, as the case may be, together with documentary evidence concerning his qualifications and experience satisfactory to the Board and the appropriate fee.

Certificate of Competency to Weld Pressure Pipe-lines.

8. Candidates for a Certificate of Competency to weld pressure pipe-lines shall have the pre-examination qualifications required by Parts II. or III. of the S.A.A. C.B.14 (which cover arc welding and oxy-acetylene welding respectively), namely:—

- (a) Two years' experience in either gas or arc welding of steel piping (as required), or
- (b) One year's experience in pipe welding under a qualified supervisor and during such period to have had three months' continuous training in pipe-line work at a school approved by the Board.

A Certificate of Competency may be issued to a person qualified under paragraphs (a) or (b) above, if he completes an application form and returns it to the Board, together with documentary evidence concerning his qualifications and experience satisfactory to the Board and the appropriate fee, and if—

- (1) he passes a written and/or oral examination in the subjects defined in the S.A.A. C.B. 14, Parts II. or III. (as required); and
- (2) he passes the practical tests for pressure pipe-line welders as laid down in Parts II. or III. of the S.A.A. C.B.14 (as required).

PART 3.

WELDING SUPERVISORS' CERTIFICATES.

9. (1) A person may be issued with a Welding Supervisor's Certificate for steam boilers and pressure vessels if—

- (a) he is the holder of a Certificate of Competency to weld boilers and pressure vessels issued by the Board;
- (b) he satisfies the Board by written examination of his ability to discharge the duties of a welding supervisor; and
- (c) he completes an application form and returns it to the Secretary of the Board, together with documentary evidence concerning his qualifications and experience satisfactory to the Board and a fee of £2 2s.

(2) A person may be issued with a Welding Supervisor's Certificate for pressure pipe-lines if—

- (a) he is the holder of a Certificate of Competency to weld pressure pipe-lines issued by the Board; and
- (b) he complies with the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of sub-section (1) of this Regulation.

Provided that the Board may exempt from examination under this part any person who is the holder of a Welding Supervisor's Certificate issued by an authority approved by the Board. Supervisors'

certificates shall enable the holders to supervise the welding of all classes of materials and types of welding in the respective categories covered by these Regulations.

PART 4.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

10. Examinations shall be conducted at such times and places as may from time to time be notified in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality where the examinations are to be conducted and candidates shall be examined according to priority of receipt of application.

11. The subject matter of examinations shall be that which is laid down in the Standards Association of Australia Boiler Welding Certification Code—Code Book 14, Parts I, II. and III; and the method of examination also shall be in accordance with such code.

12. All practical and theoretical tests of applicants for certificates issued under these Regulations shall be carried out by or under the supervision of the Board or of persons appointed for that purpose by the Board.

13. Unsuccessful applicants shall be notified in writing.

14. Unsuccessful candidates may re-submit for examination at the discretion of the Board.

15. Successful candidates shall be notified in writing and shall be issued with the appropriate certificate and they shall within fourteen days after receipt of the certificate notify the Board in writing of their having received the same.

16. A supervisor shall notify his employer of any deterioration in the quality of welding done by any holder of a certificate of competency under his supervision.

17. An employer shall notify the Board of any deterioration in the quality of welding done—

- (a) by the holder of any certificate of competency employed by him; or
- (b) under the supervision of any holder of a welding supervisor's certificate employed by him.

18. Where—

- (a) a notification made under the last preceding clause is received by the Board; or
- (b) an inspector of boilers reports to the Board that any unsatisfactory welding has been done by the holder of a certificate of competency or under the supervision of the holder of a welding supervisor's certificate; or
- (c) the Board has reason to believe that the work done by any holder of a certificate of competency or under the supervision of the holder of a welding supervisor's certificate has not been performed in accordance with established welding practice or is otherwise unsatisfactory—

the Board after proper inquiry may cancel any such certificate either absolutely or subject to its reinstatement upon the holder passing a further test to the satisfaction of the Board.

19. No holder of any certificate shall give or lend his certificate to another person. Where the Board is satisfied after proper inquiry that any holder of a certificate has contravened this Regulation it may cancel the certificate in question or suspend it for such period as the Board thinks fit.

20. Where any certificate is cancelled or suspended pursuant to these Regulations the holder shall surrender such certificate to the Board within seven days of receipt of written notification from the Board of such cancellation or suspension.

21. If any certificate is lost or destroyed the holder shall notify the Board immediately and quote particulars of the certificate.

1. In clause 46 the following words wherever they occur shall be deleted:—

- (a) "or lose possession of";
- (b) "for any lawful reason"; and
- (c) "or loss of possession".

2. For clauses 51 and 52 there shall be substituted the following clauses:—

"51. Within forty-eight hours of the disposal of a registered motor car or trailer—

- (a) the person in whose name such motor car or trailer is registered shall by himself or an agent authorized in writing by him send or deliver—
 - (i) a notice in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the Twenty-ninth Schedule; and
 - (ii) the current certificate of registration and the owner's certificate (if any) to the Officer in Charge of the Motor Registration Branch; and
- (b) the person to whom such motor car or trailer is disposed shall send or deliver—
 - (i) a notice in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the Thirtieth Schedule; and
 - (ii) in the case of a motor car the fee provided for in section 8 of the Motor Car Act, or in the case of a trailer a transfer fee of Two shillings and sixpence to the Officer in Charge of the Motor Registration Branch.

52. In clauses 46, 51 and 54 of these Regulations disposal shall include any sale agreement to sell or letting under a hire-purchase agreement but shall not include any passing of possession to an agent for the purpose of sale or to a bailee for the purpose of alteration repair renovation garaging or other similar purpose not involving the use of the vehicle for the benefit of the bailee and dispose and disposed shall have a corresponding interpretation."

3. In clause 54 the following words shall be deleted:—

- (a) "or change of possession"; and
- (b) "or change".

4. In the Twenty-ninth Schedule the following words shall be deleted:—

- (a) "or loss of possession"; and
- (b) "lost possession of".

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "RYE OCEAN PARK RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved for Public Purposes in the Parishes of Nepean and Fingal as indicated in yellow and blue colours on the plan marked A/14.11.57 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.7713 hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

- The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year as any portion of the Reserve, exclusive of the beach, may be set aside for purposes consistent with the reservation and with the consent of the Committee.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except with the written consent of the Committee.

4. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings, fences or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve.

5. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone, shellgrit, sand or loam.

6. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

7. No person shall put or graze in the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, sheep or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained.

8. (i) No person, without the consent in writing of the Committee, shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him, or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.

(ii) Any dog found in the Reserve, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

9. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserve, except on such portion as may be specially set apart for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only with the consent, in writing, of the Committee and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.

10. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth on any site on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth for residential purposes.

11. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth which has been placed, erected, or established without its consent or which has not been properly erected or properly painted or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

12. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure or erection or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve, within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the chairman or secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

13. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above-mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

14. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.

15. No person shall bet publicly on any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

16. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the Reserve.

17. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, on the occasions of any fetes, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding £10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

18. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve, unless by consent of the Committee.

19. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission in writing issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.

20. The Committee may set apart any portion or portions of the Reserve as a place for the parking of vehicles.

21. No person shall park a vehicle within the Reserve except in places set apart by the Committee for the parking of vehicles.

22. The Committee may fix such fee not exceeding 2s. per day as it thinks fit as the fee for the parking of vehicles in any place set apart within the Reserve for the parking of vehicles.

23. Every person who parks a vehicle in the place set apart for the parking of vehicles shall pay to the Committee or its authorized representatives on demand such fee as has been fixed by the Committee pursuant to these regulations as the fee for parking in such place.

24. Every person bringing a vehicle into the Reserve shall obey the reasonable direction of the Committee or its authorized representatives in relation to the driving or parking of such vehicles within the Reserve. (Rs.7713.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TRUSCOTT RECREATION RESERVE" AT EAGLEHAWK.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make

Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Sandhurst at Eaglehawk temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated the 7th September, 1937, 23rd March, 1954, and 16th November, 1954, as a site for Public Recreation known as the "Truscott Recreation Reserve" and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall, save as hereinafter provided, be open free to the public from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m., except on such days, not exceeding twenty in each year, as the Reserve may be set aside for sports, swimming, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten shillings may be charged and taken for the use of and for admission of each adult person to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) enter and remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
- (d) offer any article for sale or operate any money-making concern, or bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve without, in either case, the consent of the Committee of Management;
- (e) enter the Reserve whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease;
- (f) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed in the Reserve.

3. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee of Management may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

4. No person shall use any part of the Reserve for the purpose of bathing except upon payment of the fees that may from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall enter or use any bathing box, dressing shed, or other dressing places authorized by the Committee of Management under any Regulation until and unless the above-mentioned fee has been paid by him or her.

6. The Committee of Management shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in the Reserve and to make a charge for admission thereto as herebefore provided.

7. The Committee of Management shall have power to let the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports subject to payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as provided herebefore in these Regulations.

8. No club, association, or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

9. No persons, except the Committee of Management or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.

10. No person shall damage any building in the Reserve or the furniture or fittings thereof.

11. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with or break, or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, get upon or over any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures or electrical fittings or equipment, water pipes, drains, showers, life buoys, or fixtures and fittings of any kind whatsoever, nor roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, or banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve except at such place or places as is or are set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

13. Children under the age of ten years not being under the control of some competent person may be removed from the Reserve by any member of the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall carry or use fire-arms, catapult, or other weapon or device of any description capable of being used to injure any bird or animal in the Reserve without the written permission of the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall permit, allow, or suffer any horse, cow, goat, swine, or other animal, or any poultry of any description to wander or to be put or placed in the Reserve without the authority of the Committee of Management first being obtained, and no person shall bathe any horse, or cause, suffer, or permit any dog or other animal to swim or enter the water in the Reserve.

16. No person shall disturb any bird, water fowl, or fauna in the reserve. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord. Should any dog led by a chain or cord annoy any person, or disturb any bird, water fowl, or fauna in the Reserve, the person in charge of such dog shall, at the request of any member of the Police Force or authorized officer of the Committee of Management, immediately remove such dog from the Reserve, and shall not permit such dog to again enter in the Reserve unless with permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any member or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.

18. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee of Management, or by the club, association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being, to keep order shall be liable to be removed therefrom notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

19. Persons hiring or renting any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any sports, swimming, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding £25 (Twenty-five pounds), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or any thing contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

20. No person shall use soap or any other preparation or cause the water within the pool to be polluted in any way.

21. The Committee of Management shall not be held responsible in any way for any accident or injury sustained by or to any person or persons whilst within the boundaries of the Reserve.

22. The Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by Resolution, to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper care and management of the Reserve.

23. No male person over the age of twelve years shall stand, sit, remain, or loiter within 20 feet of the buildings set apart for the exclusive use of females in the Reserve.

24. No male person shall enter or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter, or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of males. The provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to male persons under the age of seven years.

25. All dogs, except as herein provided, and all cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

26. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, tent, booth, or other structure without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, and then only after payment of any fees which the Committee of Management may charge. No person shall spit or commit any other nuisance upon any path, structure, or erection in the Reserve. No person shall bet in any part of the Reserve, except with the permission of the appropriate authority or authorities.

27. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

28. No person shall ride any bicycle or motor cycle within the Reserve or bring into the Reserve any motor car, horse, carriage, cart, or other vehicle, except in such parts of the Reserve as may be set apart by the Committee of Management, and then at a pace not exceeding 5 miles an hour. On such days when a charge for admission to the Reserve is being made, as provided for in these Regulations, a charge as approved by the Committee of Management may be made and taken as a parking fee for each motor car, bicycle, motor cycle, carriage, cart, or other vehicle entering such part of the Reserve as set apart by the Committee of Management.

29. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

30. No person shall, except with the consent of the Committee of Management and the Fisheries and Game Department, release any fish into or upon the water within the Reserve.—(Rs.4719.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff or member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

100 Words a Minute.

Regulation 56—

(1) Any person who satisfies the Board, by test, of her ability to write shorthand at the rate of 100 words a minute shall be eligible from the date of passing such test or the date of commencing duty, whichever is the later—

(a) If an adult to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade II.; or (b) if a minor, to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade I., and be paid a standard salary appropriate to one year in advance of her age, and on attaining the age of 21 years, to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade II.

(2) Pending permanent appointment any employee who is qualified as aforesaid may, as from the date of passing such test or the date of commencing duty, whichever is the later, be paid with the approval of the Board a total emolument equivalent to the salary to which she would have been entitled in terms of the preceding sub-regulation.

120 Words a Minute.

Regulation 56—

(3) No officer or person shall be eligible to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade III., unless she has satisfied the Board, by test, of her ability to write shorthand at the rate of 120 words a minute.

(4) Any Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade II., who satisfies the Board by test, of her ability to write shorthand at the rate of 120 words a minute shall be eligible from the date of passing such test, to receive an allowance at the rate of £13 a year.

Only permanent officers classified as Shorthand Writers and Typists, Grade II., may sit for the test at 120 words a minute.
