AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

THE Council of the Borough of Clunes, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make and levy the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Clunes Water

On such lands and tenements a rate of Four shillings in the pound on the valuation not exceeding Twenty pounds, and One shilling in the pound on the valuation exceeding Twenty pounds.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Four pounds, and in respect of land on which there is no building less than One pound.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of October, 1958, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1959, and shall be payable on the 11th day of February, 1959, at the office of the Council, Town Hall, Clunes.

For two \$-in. services—£4 per acre—minimum £2.

The charge for water supplied by measure or agreement shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council, Town Hall, Clunes.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.
