PROCLAMATION

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 6490. "An Act to empower the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission to enter into certain Contracts with Municipalities and Public Bodies."

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any

municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Grenville and Buln Buln have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal districts of such municipalities, and the Council of the Shire of Kaniva has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to part of the municipal district of that municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal districts of the Shires of Grenville and Buln Buln, and to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Kaniva being the Kaniva Sewerage District defined in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th April 1957 at page 1281, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the aforementioned municipal districts or part thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 1st July, 1959, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 1st July, 1959.

Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided:— Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—


PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Morwell has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for roads within the said Shire, be so declared to be public highways:




