#### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Country Fire Authority
Act 1958 it is enacted that the Governor in Council,

Proclamation published in the Government. Gazette proclaim any period as the summer period in respect, of the
country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts
thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect
of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any Proclamation so published may be revoked, amended or varied by a subsequent Proclamation so published:

And whereas by Proclamation issued on the 22nd December, 1958, and published in the Government Gazette of the 23rd December, 1958, different summer periods expiring on the 15th day of April, 1959, were proclaimed in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid Proclamation should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief@Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Act 1958, do by this my Proclamation very the aforesaid Proclamation by proclaiming that the summer


