Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By The Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

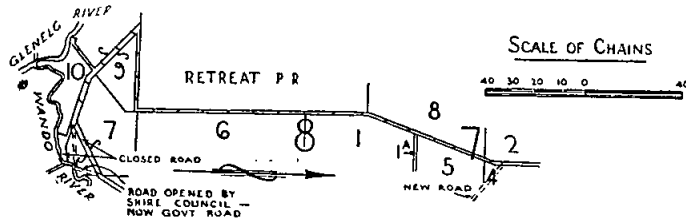
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

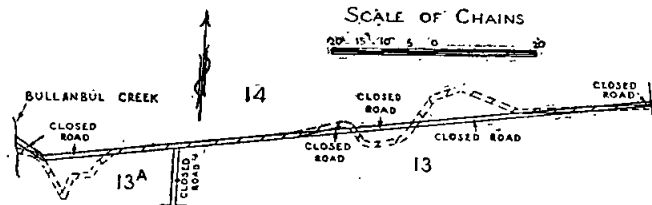

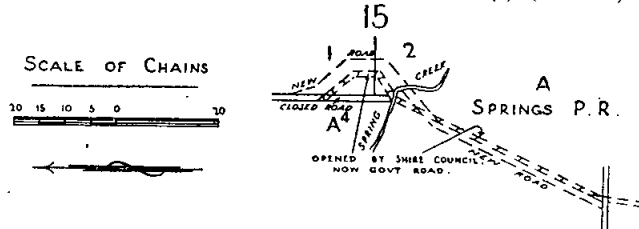

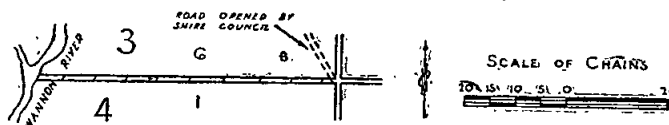

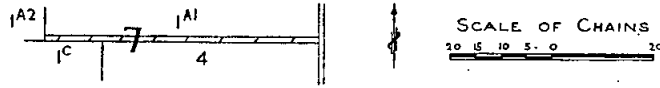
Parish of Minjah North, County of Villiers, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(M.124⁽³⁾) (D.27289).



Parish of Jerrywarook, County of Dundas, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(J.23⁽²⁾) (D.33519).



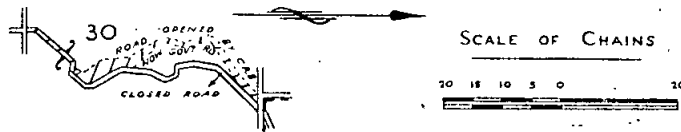
Parish of Jerrywarook, County of Dundas, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(J.23⁽²⁾) (D.33519).

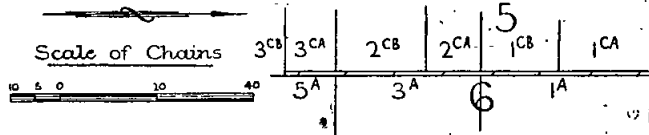

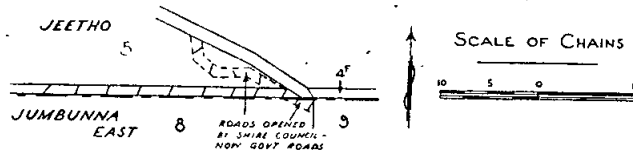


Parish of Mardan, County of Buln Buln, being the road between allotment 28B and allotment 30.—(M.524⁽⁴⁾) (D.13525).

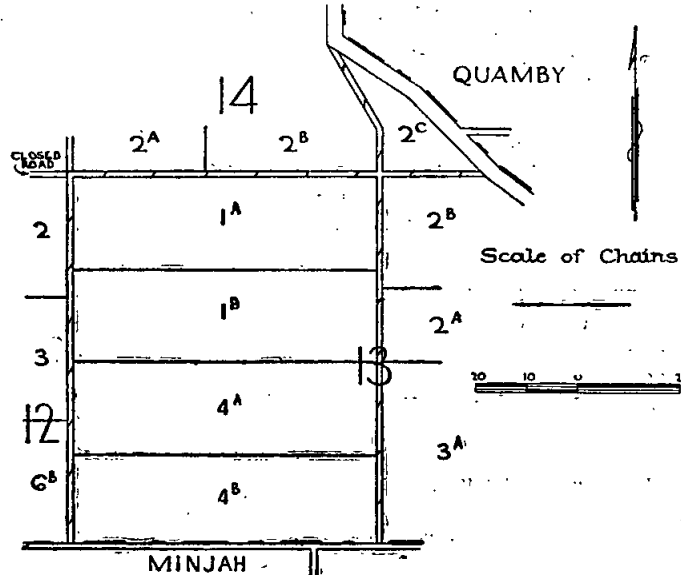

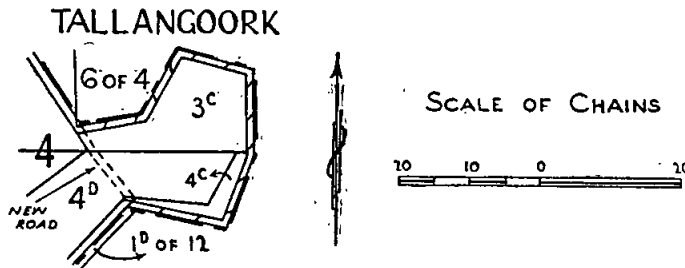

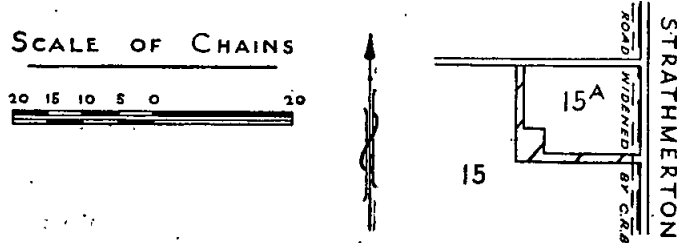

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or

exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Sandringham has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the

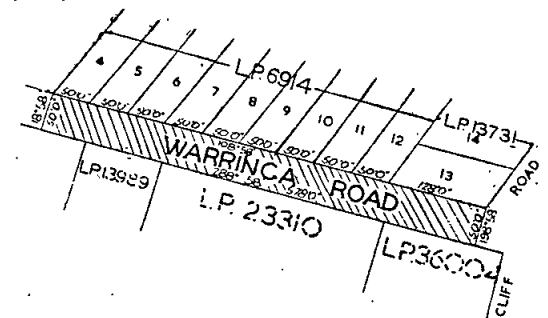

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 928 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1958* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality; or any part thereof:

And whereas the operation of the said Regulations has been extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Buninyong by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazettes* of the 25th May 1949 and 29th October 1952:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Buninyong has requested that the said Regulations be extended to further parts of the municipal district of the said Shire:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* to such parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Buninyong as are described hereunder, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the afore-mentioned parts of municipal district thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 29th July 1959, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 29th July 1959:—

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary being the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 22, Parish of Warrenheip; thence easterly by that boundary to the north-east angle of allotment 1, section 3; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotment 1 and allotments 26 and 23 of section 1 and the western boundaries of allotments 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20, section 1, to the northern boundary of Warrenheip

P.R.; thence westerly by that boundary, southerly by the western boundary of the P.R. for a distance of 3,500 links; thence westerly along the northern boundaries of allotments 35A, 35C and 35B and a line to the northern boundary of allotment 20, section 18; thence westerly by that boundary and the northern boundary of allotments 21 and 22 to the north-western angle of allotment 22; thence southerly by the western boundaries of allotments 22 and 23 to the road on the western boundary of allotment 1A; thence southerly by that road and a line in continuation thereof to the south-west angle of allotment 29A, section 24, Parish of Buninyong; thence easterly, southerly, westerly and northerly by the boundary of the Buninyong Riding to a point opposite a road along the northern boundaries of allotments E20, E8 and E3; thence westerly by a line, that road and a line in continuation thereof to the Shire boundary; thence generally northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement; but excluding those areas to which the application of the Regulations has been extended as aforesaid.

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1958* (No. 6319) it is provided that a day be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas the Township of Ocean Grove and the Township of Portarlington have been prescribed as Districts for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the first day of June, 1959, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed districts set out above—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

Fungicides Act 1958.

ALTERING STANDARD PRESCRIBED FOR LIME SULPHUR SOLUTIONS AS FUNGICIDES AND INSECTICIDES.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Fungicides Act 1958*, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in

the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the standard prescribed for lime sulphur solutions in the Proclamation of the eighteenth day of July, 1938, and, in lieu thereof, now alter the Proclamation made on the third day of March, 1936, declaring certain substances to be Fungicides, Insecticides, Vermin Destroyers and Weed Destroyers and prescribing standards therefor, in so far as it relates to the standard prescribed for Lime Sulphur Solutions in the Second Column of the First and Second Schedules by substituting in lieu thereof the following standard:—

"Shall not contain any sludge.

Shall contain not less than 27 and not more than 35 per cent. of total soluble sulphur, and not less than 19 and not more than 30 per cent. of polysulphide sulphur and not more than 2.5 per cent. of thiosulphate sulphur, as calculated as percentage by weight in volume."

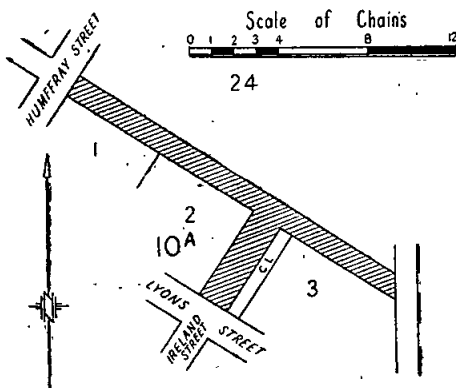

DIVIDEND.

40. Except in the case of an investment society, the maximum amount which may be paid to a member by way of dividend in respect of any share held by him shall not exceed Six per centum per annum on the amount paid on the share.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1958* and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby amend the Police Regulations 1957 as follows (that is to say):—

1. In Regulation 267—

- (a) For the expression "Foot Police—12/6" substitute the expression "Foot Police—20/-".
- (b) For the expression "Mounted Police—15/-" substitute the expression "Mounted Police—24/-".
- (c) For the expression "Motor Car or Motor Cycle Police—22/6" substitute the expression "Motor Car or Motor Cycle Police—32/6".

2. Regulation 268 is hereby revoked and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—

"268. (1) The services of Police applied for by Government Departments, municipalities, corporations, banks, firms, &c., for escorting or guarding money or valuable property shall be charged for as follows:—

Escort Duty,
&c.

Foot Police—45/- per man for the first two hours or portion thereof, and thereafter an additional charge of 22/6 for each hour or portion thereof, including time spent in going from and returning to station.

Mounted Police—54/- per man for the first two hours or portion thereof, and thereafter an additional charge of 27/- for each hour or portion thereof, including time spent in going from and returning to station.

Motor Car or Motor Cycle Police—70/- per man for the first two hours or portion thereof, and thereafter an additional charge of 35/- for each hour or portion thereof, including time spent in going from and returning to station.

(2) The services of Police engaged in checking, on the premises of car distributors approved by the Chief Commissioner, particulars entered by the distributors on the prescribed form respecting the registration of new motor vehicles shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per motor vehicle.

(3) The services of Police in furnishing information in respect of an accident to the parties involved or to their properly accredited representatives, shall be charged for as follows:—

- (a) for information supplied from an Accident Report—Five shillings per inquiry;
- (b) for a typed copy of each statement of a witness—Five shillings per foolscap page or part thereof (no charge shall be made in cases where statements are made available for copying);
- (c) for an interview with a member of the Police Force in the presence of an officer—Ten shillings per interview."

And the Honorable Lindsay Hamilton Simpson Thompson, for and on behalf of Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Relating to Derelict or Unregistered Motor Cars.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, made under the Local Governments Acts, and numbered 93, for prohibiting the leaving standing of derelict or unregistered motor cars on streets or roads.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood, order as follows:—

1. In this By-law the words "derelict motor car" shall mean any derelict motor car which has remained in any street for a period exceeding twenty-eight (28) days.

2. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any street or road.

3. Any officer of the Council authorized by it in that behalf may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road to be removed by such reasonable means as he may think fit to some place set aside by the Council for that purpose.

4. As soon as reasonably may be after any such car has been removed as aforesaid the Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district, a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto.

5. If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof, such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.

6. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid the Council may after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice cause the same to be sold either by public auction or private contract.

(b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car.

(c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council, such residue shall be paid into the municipal fund.

7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within twenty-eight (28) days from the expiration of such period of twenty-one (21) days, the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.

8. The charge for the removal of any derelict or unregistered motor car pursuant to this By-law is hereby prescribed as Five pounds (£5).

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

- (i) Accountant.
- (ii) Architect.
- (iii) Artist.
- (iv) Barrister.
- (v) Boarding-house.
- (vi) Business consultant (but not so as to permit the conducting or training of classes of pupils or students on the premises).
- (vii) Chiropodist.
- (viii) Consulting engineer.
- (ix) Dentist.
- (x) Dressmaker (provided that not more than one power-driven household sewing machine is used in connexion therewith).
- (xi) Masseur.
- (xii) Medical practitioner.
- (xiii) Photographer.
- (xiv) Physio-therapist.
- (xv) Sculptor (provided that the following conditions are observed:—

- (a) that such business is wholly carried on in detached buildings and not in the principal house or other building erected on the site,
- (b) that no pneumatic tools and/or machines producing or emitting noise are used,
- (c) that no rough cutting of materials is carried out, and
- (d) that no assistants or employees are engaged in the business.

- (xvi) Solicitor.
- (xvii) Veterinary consultant (provided that no animals are stabled, housed, or accommodated on the premises).

Notwithstanding the foregoing, none of the said trades, industries, manufactures, or businesses may be conducted except by a person engaged in the conduct thereof who actually resides on the premises upon which the particular trade, industry, manufacture, or business is so conducted.

(b) The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (vii) of sub-clause (b) of clause 9 of the said By-law numbered 130:—

(vii) The proprietor of any business permitted by the preceding paragraph (vi) may erect and display a signboard indicating the name of such proprietor and the nature of such business, but in no case shall any such signboard be of greater area than 15 inches square or be erected without the proprietor or other person erecting the same having obtained the written approval of the Council or its duly authorized officer to the erection thereof and in no case shall this paragraph or anything in this By-law otherwise contained, authorize, or be deemed to authorize the construction, installation, or erection of any display window or shopfront or other structure or thing designed to display or advertise the trade, industry, manufacture, or business of such proprietor or any other

person or the goods, merchandise, or chattels manufactured, sold, or dealt with or the services provided by such proprietor or other person.

If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof, and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof, such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.

6. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid the Council may, after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice, cause the same to be sold either by public auction or private contract.

(b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car.

(c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council, such residue shall be paid into the municipal fund.

7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within fourteen days from the expiration of such period of 21 days, the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.

8.
