AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published, in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 6, and: 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—



WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be

absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in

And whereas the Council of the City of Shepparton has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway;

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land used for a street, shown as Coomboona-street on lodged plan of subdivision No. 15314, being part of Crown allotment 15, Parish of Shepparton, and being the land shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS FOR TAKING OR KILLING WATER RATS IN CERTAIN SHIRES, MARKETING SKINS OF WATER RATS, LICENSING OF TRAPPERS, ETC.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-wealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Act 1958, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamations made the twenty-sixth day of February, 1958, and the third day of June, 1958, and published in the Government Gazettes of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1958, and the fourth day of February, 1958, and published in the Government Gazettes of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1958, and the fourth day of June, 1958, respectively, relating to the conditions and restrictions for taking or killing water rats in certain shires, marketing skins of water rats, licensing of trappers, &c., and in lieu thereof do hereby prescribe the conditions and restrictions for taking or killing water rats, marketing skins of water rats and licensing of trappers, &c., as follows (that is to say):—

- 1. In this Proclamation (if not inconsistent with the context)-
  - "Director" means the Director of Fisheries and Game.
  - Game.

    "Official Mark" means the official mark or stamp
    used by the Director to denote that a skin has
    been lawfully obtained.

    "Water rat" means the Eastern Water Rat

    (Hydromys Chrysogaster).

(Hydromys Chrysogaster).

"Licence" means a licence issued under section 35
(1) of the Game Act 1958 (No. 6258) to take or
kill water rats and in force.

"Licensed trapper" means a person holding a current
licence to take or kill water rats.

"Dealer" means any person or persons carrying on
a business of selling skins by public auction.

- 2. A licence to take or kill water rats may be issued to any person on payment of the prescribed fee, if the Minister is satisfied that the applicant for a licence is of good character, and is a suitable person to have a licence.
- 3. The fee payable for a licence to take or kill water rats shall be Two pounds (£2).
- 4. The licence to take or kill water rats shall be in accordance with Form "G" in Schedule "A" hereto and shall be in force from the 1st day of June, or the date of the issue of the licence (whichever is the later), until the 31st day of July in the year in which it is issued and no longer, and shall not be transferable.
- The licence to take or kill water rats shall be valid only in the following shires:-

Chiltern, Cohuna, Cobram, Deakin, East Loddon, Gordon, Huntly, Kerang, Mildura, Nathalia, Numurkah, Rochester, Rodney, Rutherglen, Shepparton, Swan Hill, Tungamah, Waranga, Wangaratta, Wodonga, Yarrawonga.

- 6. The possession of a licence shall not authorize the holder to take or kill water rats in any locality proclaimed as a sanctuary under section 5 of the Game Act 1958 nor on any private property except with the permission of the owner of such property.
- 7. (a) No licensed trapper shall use for the purpose of

taking water rats any poison or shot gun.

(b) All water rats caught in snares or traps or by any other means whatsoever which are not dead when found shall be killed at once by a blow on the head.

(c) All snares and traps used for the purpose of taking water rats shall be visited by the licensed trapper at least once each day.

least once each day.

- 8. No person other than a licensed trapper shall take or kill or assist in the taking or killing of water rats.
- 9. A licensed trapper shall not dispose of the skins of water rats to any person other than to a dealer.
- 10. Every licensed trapper shall cause the dealer to whom he consigns his water-rat skins to forward to the Director 10 per centum of the gross, proceeds of the sale of such skins.
- 11. All skins of water rats taken in accordance with this Proclamation by a licensed trapper shall be consigned or forwarded by him to a dealer, together with particulars in accordance with Form "J" in Schedule "A" hereto; the licensed trapper shall at the same time forward a

duplicate of such particulars to the Director. All such skins so received by a dealer shall be properly classed and sold by public auction, provided that if no offer is received which in the opinion of the auctioneer is satisfactory, the skins may afterwards be sold by private treaty.

- 12. (a) The dealer, on receiving a consignment of waterrat skins and particulars as required in Form "J", shall cause such particulars to be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose. Such book shall be open at all reasonable times for inspection by the Director or any assistant to the said Director, or by any member of the Police Force.
- (b) Every dealer shall on each Wednesday between the first day of June and the twentieth day of August in any year in which licences to take or kill water rats are issued, send a notification in accordance with Form "K" in Schedule "A" hereto to the Director giving particulars of all water-rat skins received by him during the previous week.
- (c) The Director shall arrange for the water-rat skins referred to in such notification to be branded with the official mark.
- (d) No dealer shall permit or allow any water-rat skin, which has come into his possession or under his control, to be taken away or removed out of such possession or control until the official mark has been affixed thereto.
- 13. Every dealer shall record in the book referred to in paragraph 12 (a), the date on which the royalty was paid; the name and address of the person to whom the skins were sold and the price at which such skins were sold.
- 14. Every licensed trapper shall forward to a dealer 'all' water-rat skins taken by him during the currency of his licence; not later than fourteen days after the expiration of his licence.
- 15. Any person committing a breach of any provision of this Proclamation or a breach of sub-section (4) of section 35 of the Game Act 1958, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Two pounds (£2) nor more than Twenty pounds (£20).
- 16. Any licence granted under this Proclamation may be revoked by the Minister if the holder thereof is convicted of any offence against the Game Acts, or against any Proclamation..made thereunder, or if the Minister is satisfied that the said holder, is not a fit and proper person to hold such a licence and such revocation shall take effect seven days after notice of the decision of the Minister to revoke such licence has been served personally on the licence holder or sent to him by prepaid registered letter addressed to him at his last-known residence or place of business.

CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS TO BE OBSERVED BY PERSONS DEALING IN THE SKINS OF WATER RATS.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

- I. THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Act 1958, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation:—
  - (a) Revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-sixth day of February, 1958 and published; in the Government Gazette of the twenty-sixth day of February, 1958 respecting the conditions and restrictions to be observed by persons dealing in the skins of water rats and licensing of dealers.

- (b) Prescribe the following conditions to be observed by all persons engaged in buying, selling, con-signing, marketing or storing the skins of water rats whether taken or killed or destroyed in Victoria or elsewhere:—
- .1. In this Proclamation (if not inconsistent with the context) "official mark" means the official mark referred to or mentioned as being affixed to or branded on any
- water-rat skin.

  2. Every such person shall keep in a suitable book a true and faithful record showing in respect of all skins of water rats bought, sold, consigned, marketed or stored by him, the names and addresses of the persons from whom such skins were obtained, or to whom they were consigned, sold, or otherwise disposed of, with the dates of the respective transactions, and the numbers and kinds of: skins in each case; such book shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times during business hours by the Inspector of Fisheries or any assistant to the said Inspector, or any member of the Police Force. All such records shall be kept in a strongly bound book with consecutively numbered pages, and such book shall be used for no other purpose than for keeping the aforesaid records. The Inspector of Fisheries or any officer authorized in writing by him may take possession of all or any of such records for purposes of inspection and checking. checking.
- 3. Every such person shall, on the fifteenth and last days of each month, forward to the Inspector of Fisheries a true and correct statement, in writing, setting out the number of skins of water rats which he has in his possession on the said day, the number purchased and sold since the previous return and the names and addresses of the persons from whom such skins were bought or to whom they were sold respectively.
- 4. Any person consigning water-rat skins to a place outside Victoria shall, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the date on which it is proposed that such skins shall leave Victoria, give to the Inspector of Fisheries, in writing, full particulars of the skins proposed to be so consigned, the number of bales or packages in the consignment, the identification marks on such bales or packages, the name of the ship (if any) by which such skins will be carried, and the name and address of the consignee. At the same time the exporter or consignor of his authorized agent shall produce to the Inspector of Fisheries all invoices or other documents relating to the purchase of the said skins.
- 5. No person shall sell, consign, market, or store the skins of water rats unless such skins have first had the official mark affixed thereto by the Inspector of Fisheries or any officer authorized by him.
- '6. No person other than the Inspector of Fisheries, or any officer authorized by him, shall perforate or otherwise stamp or mark the skin of any water rat in such a way as to suggest that the official mark has been affixed thereto.
- 7. No person shall permit or allow the skin of any water rat which has come into his possession, to be taken away or removed out of such possession until the official mark has been affixed thereto.
- 8. No person shall cure, treat, tan, or preserve or prepare for tanning or preservation by any method whatsoever the skin of any water rat or place any preserving substance thereon, until the official mark shall have been affixed to such skin.
- 9. Every person shall, upon receiving into his possession any unmarked or unstamped skins of water rats submit the same to the Inspector of Fisheries within three days of such receipt who, on being satisfied that the same have been lawfully obtained, shall make his official mark on one with both. each such skin.
- 10. Any person committing a breach of any part of this Proclamation shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Two pounds (£2) nor more than Twenty pounds (£20).

Description of Land.—2 acres 0 roods 2 perches, Township of Cobden, Parish of Tandarook, County of Heytesbury, being allotment 1, section 11: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 5; bounded thence by roads bearing each 400 links; south 503 links and west 400 links; and thence by allotments 14 and 5 bearing north 503 links to the point of commencement.

Name of Trustees.—The toria Trusts Corporation. -The Presbyterian Church of Vic-

Powers of Disposition.—With the consent of the General Assembly of: "The Presbyterian Church of Victoria", to mortgage, sell, lease, exchange and transfer, and grant easements over the said land, or any part or parts thereof, and subject to such powers and the exercise thereof, to hold the said land, or so much thereof, as may from time to time remain vested in the said trustees, upon such trusts for the said Presbyterian Church of Victoria, and for such purposes, and with and subject to such powers and provisions as are contained in the document enrolled

by the Registrar-General of the State of Victoria, pursuant to the provisions of the *Presbyterian Trust Act* 1890, and styled "The Presbyterian Church of Victoria Model Trust Deed for Church and Manse Site".

#### POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION No. 73 OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

THE Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act* 1958, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

- 1. The Determination No. 59 of the Police Classification Board of 23rd July, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st August, 1956, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—
  - (a) By inserting after paragraph 91 the following proviso:—
    "Provided that if a member is discharged on resignation or has his appointment terminated during such year, such member shall be granted eight days' leave of absence for recreation in respect of each period of three months' completed service, or portion
  - (b) By deleting paragraph 92 and substituting therefor the following:—

"92. 
