Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

REGULATION No. 96.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby repeal Regulations Nos. 90 and 91, and make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications for appointment to a permanent office in the Railways Service of any person who immediately before such appointment is in the temporary employment of the Commissioners.

No person in the temporary employment of the Commissioners shall be eligible for permanent appointment unless— $\,$

- (a) He is certified by the Railways Medical Officer as being up to the required medical standard;
- (b) The Commissioners are of opinion that such person has a satisfactory record of service, is of good character and is qualified and efficient; and
- (c) He is under the age of 53 years provided that this requirement shall not apply in the case of any officer or employee who is in the temporary employment of the Commissioners at the date of the coming into operation of this Regulation, but no such officer or employee shall be eligible for appointment on attaining the age of 60 years.

Any person who has been dismissed from the Railways Department or the Public Service for misconduct or who has been convicted of a felony or infamous offence shall not be eligible for permanent appointment in the service of the Commissioners unless, after consideration of the circumstances, the Commissioners are satisfied that he would be a suitable appointee to the permanent staff.

(f), 212, 213 and 222 of the Local Government Act 1958, and all other powers it enabling thereto, and numbered 15, for and with respect to—
 - (a) the regulating of the keeping of any animals and the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or the storage of any things which in the opinion of the Council may be offensive

in the opinion of the Council may be offensive injurious to health or dangerous;

(b) fixing the distance from any boundary or from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such animal or place or to store any such thing;

(c) suppression of nuisances;

(d) imposing penalties for breaches of this By-law.

- IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Health Act, the Local Government Act, and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows hereby Orders as follows:
- 1. This By-law shall come into operation on its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have o throughout the whole of the Municipal District. operation
- 3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
 - (a) "Council" means the Council of the City of Broadmeadows.

- (b) "Inspector" means a person appointed by the Council, pursuant to the provisions of section 31 of the Health Act 1958, to be an Inspector within the meaning of the said Act.
- (c) "Animal" means and includes horse, mare, gelding, donkey, mule, bull, bullock, cow, steer, heifer, goat, sheep, boar, sow, barrow or sucker.
- (d) "Enclosure" means and includes any area of land within which any animal is confined or kept.
- Structure" means and includes any pen, shed, building or erection within or comprising an enclosure used or intended to be used for the purpose of confining, protecting or sheltering any animal,
- 4. No occupier of any land shall cause, permit or suffer any enclosure or structure to be otherwise than in a clean, wholesome and sanitary state and condition.
- 5. No occupier of any land shall permit or suffer any animal to remain or wander in any enclosure or structure such enclosure or structure (as the case may be) not being in conformity with the provisions of this By-law.
- 6. No occupier of any land shall keep or permit to be kept any animal in any enclosure less than 1 acre in extent without the consent, in writing, of the Inspector first had and obtained.
- 7. An occupier of any land upon which any animal is kept shall---
 - (a) not permit or suffer any manure, rubbish or refuse to lie or to be accumulated otherwise than in a properly constructed fly and verminproof receptacle of impervious walls together with an impervious floor.
 - (b) at all times cause such receptacle to be effectively covered.
 - (c) cause the contents of such receptacle to be emptied within such time as may be directed, in writing, by the Inspector.
 - (d) not erect, keep or allow to be erected or kept any structure—

 - (i) within 50 feet of any street or road having a greater width than 25 feet.
 (ii) within 10 feet of any street or road having a width of 25 feet or less than 25 feet
 - (iii) within 10 feet from the boundary of the (iii) within 10 feet from the boundary of the enclosure within such structure subsists or if erected would subsist.
 (iv) so as to be a nuisance or dangerous to health or offensive.
 (v) without the consent, in writing, of the Inspector first had and obtained.
 (vi) not store any fodder within an enclosure otherwise than in a rat-proof container.
- 8. If any person is erecting or has erected any structure contrary to the provisions of this By-law the Council may by notice, in writing, which notice shall specify the manner in which it is alleged such structure specify the manner in which it is alleged such structure is being or has been erected contrary to the provisions of this By-law require such person to rectify the matters in respect of which such person is in default or to remove such structure within a period to be specified in such notice and if any person having been served with such notice as aforesaid shall fail to comply therewith he shall be guilty of an offence and the Council may cause any such structure as aforesaid to be demolished and may recover the cost of so doing from the person in default recover the cost of so doing from the person in default.
- 9. Any person who does not do anything directed to be done or does anything forbidden to be done by this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 10. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five



 (f) By-law No. 42 of the Shire of Cranbourne is hereby repealed.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958, and of every and any other power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Cranbourne hereby order as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law-
 - "The Council" means the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne.
- "The Meat Inspector" means the meat inspector appointed and/or provided by the Council for the inspection and supervision of any abattoir in the meat area.
- "The Meat Area" means the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne proclaimed as a meat area in the Victoria Gazette No. 114, 1958, at the page 3987.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to the meat area as defined in clause 1 hereof and such area shall, as to the enforcement of the Meat Supervision Regulations therein, be under the direction of the meat inspector.
- 3. This By-law shall come into full force and operation its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 4. The times for slaughtering animals in the meat area shall be between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Four o'clock p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays in each week.

No animals shall be slaughtered in the meat area on No animals shall be slaughtered in the meat area on Saturdays, Sundays or gazetted holidays, unless with the consent, in writing, of the meat inspector, to whom at least 24 hours' notice of intention to slaughter on these days must be given. All expenses incurred by reason of such slaughtering on Saturdays, Sundays or gazetted public holidays shall be paid by the person obtaining such consent

- 5. No animal shall be slaughtered before it has been examined on the hoof in the meat area by the meat inspector on the days and within the times set out in clause 4 hereof.
- No animal visibly or known to be affected by any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into any abattoir in the meat area, except with the express per-mission of the meat inspector.
- 7. No person shall remove or permit to be removed from any abattoir in the meat area any carcass, or part of the carcass, of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the meat inspector and passed by him as fit for human food and branded by him with the regulation brand, or rendered unfit for human consumption in the manner prescribed by the Meat Supervision Regulations.
- 8. No sheep shall be removed from any abattoir in the meat area with the head attached.
- 9. The fees payable to the Council for examining and 5. The rees payable to the Country to Examining under branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat by, or under the direction of the meat inspector, shall be as follows:-

(a) For examining any-

(i) bull, cow, calf (other than a bobby-calf), helfer, ox or steer 0 2 6 (ii) bobby-calf, goat, kid, lamb or

sheep sheep . . . (iii) head of swine

- (b) For examining and branding any carcass f s. d. of or meat derived from any—
 - (i) bull, cow, calf (other than a bobby-calf), heifer, ox or steer 0 4 0 (ii) bobby-calf, goat, kid, lamb or .. 0 1 sheep
 - .. 0 2 0 (iii) swine
- (c) For any certificate as to an examination made by a meat inspector
 In this By-law "Bobby-calf" means a calf
 not more than six weeks old,

In addition to these fees and the expenses referred to in clause 4 hereof, a fee of ten shillings shall be paid by any person slaughtering animals on any Saturday, Sunday or gazetted public holiday.

The said fees shall be paid by the proprietor of any abattoir carried on in the meat area to the Council, and shall be so paid by the proprietor thereof to the Shire Secretary of the Council at the office of the Council at Cranbourne once at least in every week, and the amount of each such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the meat inspector.

- 10. The proprietor of any abattoir in the meat area shall not, nor shall any person having the management or control of any animal or animals in the abattoir—
 - (a) Suffer any cruelty to take place towards any animal at any time in the abattoir;
 - (b) Suffer animals to be overcrowded in the abattoir.
- 11. If the meat inspector, the health inspector of the Council, or the Council's medical officer of health shall at any time find a condition of uncleanliness or the presence of infection on or about the premises within the meat area where the manufacture or sale of small reach is carried on in circumstances in which described the meat area where the manufacture or sale of small goods is carried on in circumstances in which danger to the consumer of such small goods is apprehended by such inspector or officer, such inspector or officer may by notice, in writing under his hand, directed to the proprietor of such premises prohibit the manufacture thereat and/or the sale therefrom of small goods until such condition of uncleanliness is rectified or such infection is removed, and any such notice may be served in the manner provided by section 425 of the Health Act 1958.
- 12. Any person who shall, by wilful act or default, contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

- 5. If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof, such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.
- 6. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, the Council may after the expiration
- notice as aforesaid, the Council may after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice, cause the same to be sold either by public auction or private contract.

 (b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car.

 (c) If within three months after the date of such sale, no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council, such residue shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.
- 7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within fourteen days from the expiration of such period of 21 days, the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.
- 8. The charge for the removal of any derelict or unregistered motor car pursuant to this By-law is hereby prescribed as a sum equivalent to 10s. For each mile or part thereof of the distance between the place where such motor car was left standing to the place set aside by the Council pursuant to clause 2 hereof.
- 9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.
