 2. That all property income assets rights and liabilities
- 2. That all property income assets rights and liabilities standing in the name of the said Central Gippsland and Maffra-Sale Irrigation and Water Supply Districts shall upon the union of those districts as hereinbefore provided stand in the name of the Macalister Irrigation and Water Supply District.
- That the scheme of local works for the service of the Macalister Irrigation and Water Supply District consists of a system of channels and drains with appurtenant structures.
- 4. That the total estimated cost of such scheme is £4,500,000 of which an amount of approximately £4,024,000 has already been expended on works so far constructed.
- 5. That the quantity of water assigned to the Macalister Irrigation and Water Supply District is 241,000 acre-feet per annum.
- That the sources from which the Macalister Irrigation and Water Supply District is to be supplied with water are the Macalister and Thomson Rivers.
- That the season at which such water is to be supplied is to embrace the whole year.
- 8. That the quantity of water so assigned shall be measured at the Glenmaggie Dam and the Cowwarr Weir.

The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas in which no person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building of Class I., II., III., IV., V., VI., VII, VIII., or IX. occupancy, or any outhouse, garage, carport, woodshed, shed, storeshed, laundry, stable, sleepout, fowlhouse, or sanitary convenience, the external walls of which are of material other than masonry or concrete, provided that for the purpose of this clause buildings of reinforced concrete or masonry, veneer construction conforming to the requirements of chapter 26 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, shall be deemed to have external walls of masonary or concrete.
- 3. All land within the municipal district of the City of district of the City of Horsham is hereby prescribed as the area in which buildings of Classes II. and III. occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than three storeys including the ground storey and no person shall in any such area construct a building of Class II. or Class III. occupancy to contain more than three storeys including the ground storev.
- 4. The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I. or Class II. occupancy shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Horsham.
- 5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building of Class I. or Class II. occupancy, the outer walls of which are less than 20 feet from the frontage of the allotment on which the building is constructed.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne made under the Local Government Act and numbered 412 for the control and management of the children's playgrounds provided within the Municipal District of South Melbourne.

THE Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law and order as follows:

- 1. That By-law No. 323 of the said city be and the same is hereby repealed, provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any act or omission prior to the commencement of this By-law.
 - 2. In this By-law-
 - "Supervisor of the playground" means any person authorized in writing by the Town Clerk to act as a supervisor at any children's playground specified in such written authority.

 "Child" means a person under fourteen years of age. "Children's playground" means a children's playground under the control of the Council.

 "Council" means the Council of the City of South Melbourne.

 - Melbourne.
 "Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the said city or the person acting in that behalf for the time being.
- 3. All children's playgrounds shall be opened daily from 9 a.m. until sunset. No person shall enter or remain therein at any other time unless with the permission and under the supervision of a supervisor of the playground.
- 4. No person above the age of fourteen years shall, except with the permission and under the supervision of a supervisor of the playground, enter any children's playground or use any of the swings, appliances or other equipment therein, provided however that the parent or guardian of any child shall be at liberty to enter a children's playground for the purpose only of watching over such child whilst in his charge.
- 5. No person shall use any of the swings, appliances or other equipment in any children's playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
- 6. No person shall at any one time use any of the swings, appliances or other equipment in any children's playground for a longer period than five minutes if any other person or persons is or are waiting to use the same.
- 7. No person shall in any children's playground in the
 - (a) play cricket or football except with the permission and under the supervision of the supervisor of the playground;
 (b) deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish except in a
 - basket or other receptacle provided by the Council for the purpose;
 (c) throw stones, sand or other missiles or light any fire or commit any nuisance;
- nre or commit any nuisance;

 (d) behave in an unseemly indecent or improper manner or use any profane or obscene language;

 (e) drink or have in his possession any liquor of an intoxicating nature, or enter or remain in any children's playground whilst in a state of intoxication;

 (f) play or take port in any carebiling an unbarred.
 - (f) play or take part in any gambling or unlawful game or unlawful-sport;

(g) give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices or advertisements or make or attempt to make any speech or public address unless authorized in writing by the Town Clerk to do so and then only on such occasions and in accordance with such conditions if any as may be specified in such written authority;
(h) display, sell or offer any goods for sale unless authorized in writing by the Town Clerk to do so and then only on such occasions and in accordance with such conditions if any as may be specified in such written authority;

accordance with such conditions if any as may be specified in such written authority;

(i) permit or suffer any dog or other animal or vehicle belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain therein, provided however that a bicycle, tricycle or similar vehicle may be left in any place therein set apart for the purpose by the Council;

(j) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed therein or disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person therein;

(k) write upon, disfigure, damage, destroy, deface, injure or improperly interfere with any structure, post, fence, wall, tree, plant, fitting, appliance, furniture or other equipment;

(l) refuse or neglect to obey any reasonable direction

appliance, furniture or other equipment;

(I) refuse or neglect to obey any reasonable direction of a supervisor of the playground or of an officer or employee of the Council or of any other person authorized, in writing, by the Town Clerk in that behalf;

(m) remain at any time when directed by a supervisor of the playground or by an officer or employee of the Council or by any member of the Police Force to leave the playground.

8. Any supervisor of any children's playground and any officer or employee of the Council duly authorized and any member of the Police Force shall have the right to remove or exclude from such playground or to direct to leave such playground forthwith any person who commits an offence against this By-law. Such removal or exclusion shall not relieve the person removed or excluded from any penalty provided by this By-law.

9. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided, any supervisor of a children's playground and any member or officer or employee of the Council and any other person authorized, in writing, by the Town Clerk, in that behalf may enter and remain in any children's playground at any time.

10. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any structure or any of the swings, appliances or other equipment in any children's playground.

11. Every person who does anything forbidden by this By-law or fails to do anything which he is required to do thereby or thereunder shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

12. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of South Melbourne.
