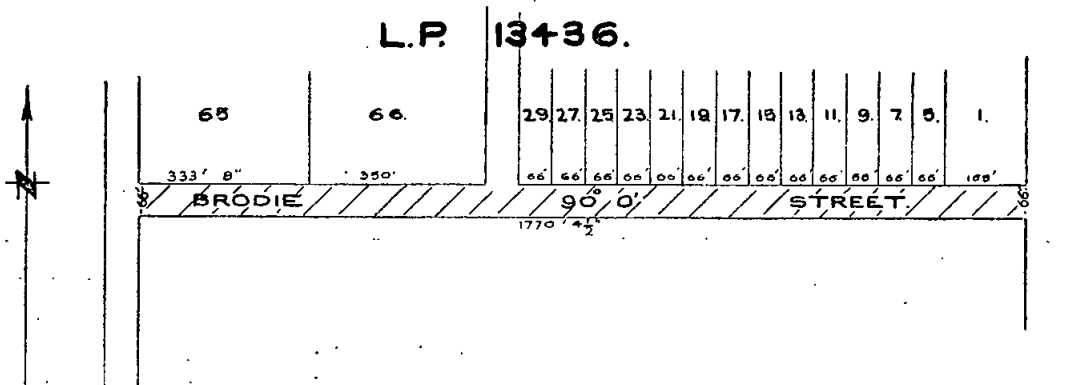
PROCLAMATION

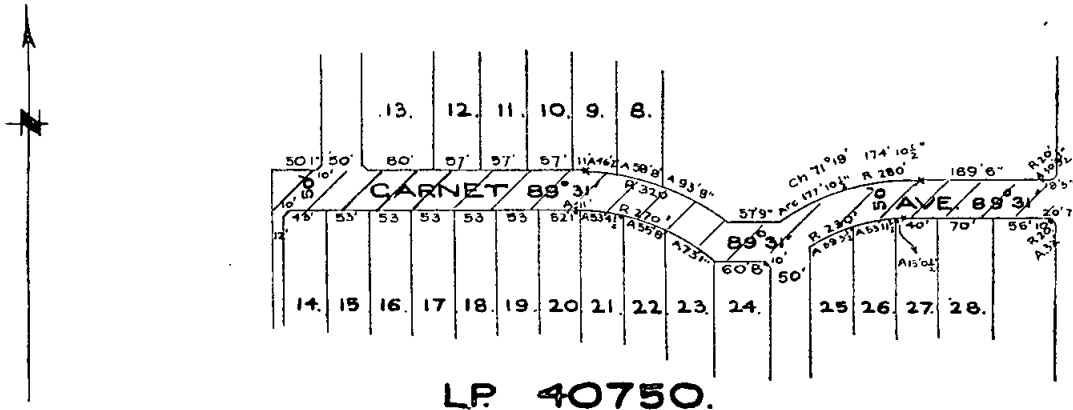
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Wangaratta has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved for streets within the said city, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all those pieces of land reserved for streets, known as Garnet-avenue and Brodie-street in the said city, and being indicated by hachure on the plans hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS AND THE MELBOURNE CITY COUNCIL, AND NUMBERED 180, FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CARLTON, FITZROY AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS; ALEXANDRA, FAWKNER, FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON, FLINDERS, PRINCES AND YARRA PARKS; POWLETT RESERVE; AND ARGYLE, CURTAIN, DARLING, LINCOLN, MACARTHUR, MURCHISON AND UNIVERSITY SQUARES.

WHEREAS each of the pieces of land known as Carlton Gardens, Fitzroy Gardens, Flagstaff Gardens, Alexandra Park, Fawkner Park, Flemington and Kensington Park, Flinders Park, Princes Park, Yarra Park, Powlett Reserve, Argyle Square, Curtain Square, Darling Square, Lincoln Square, Macarthur Square, Murchison Square and University Square, respectively (which said pieces of land are hereinafter called "the Reserves"), has been permanently reserved by the Governor in Council in accordance with section 14 of the *Land Act 1958* or previous corresponding enactments and is vested by Crown Grant in the Board of Land and Works and the Corporation of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called "the Trustees"); And whereas Regulations have from time to time been made by the Trustees under and by virtue of the powers vested in them by the Crown Grants and of other powers vested in them: And whereas it is desirable to add to, amend and consolidate such Regulations: And whereas by section 219 of the *Land Act 1958*, as amended by the *Land (Charges) Act 1959*, the Trustees are empowered to make Rules and Regulations with the approval of the Governor in Council for the care, protection and management of the Reserves and for the preservation of good order and decency therein and for the receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering in or upon the Reserves: Now therefore the Trustees by virtue of the aforesaid powers do hereby make the following Rules and Regulations for the purposes as aforesaid in respect of the Reserves of which the Governor in Council, in pursuance of section 220 of the *Land Act 1958* or previous corresponding enactments, has appointed the Council of the City of Melbourne to be a Committee of Management (hereinafter called "the Committee") with full power and authority to carry into effect and enforce the said Rules and Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the City of Melbourne Parks and Gardens (General) Regulations 1959.
2. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations all previous Regulations relating to the Reserves shall be repealed, provided that such repeal shall not invalidate or affect any thing done or any proceeding taken or hereafter to be taken against any person for any act, offence or omission contrary to the provisions of any such Regulations done, committed or made prior to the coming into operation of these Regulations.
3. The Reserves shall at all times be open to the public free of charge, save and except as otherwise provided in these Regulations.
4. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Reserves, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.
5. No person shall damage, destroy, interfere with, remove, write upon or in any manner deface any building, drain, electrical or other fitting or equipment, embellishment, fence, fountain, gate, improvement, post, property, seat, tree, water pipe, water tap or other structure of any kind whatsoever in the Reserves.
6. No person shall damage, destroy, injure, interfere with or remove any animal, bird, fish, flower, grass, hedge, lawn, plant or shrub in the Reserves.
7. No person shall interfere with the surface of any of the Reserves by digging or excavating or otherwise disturbing the soil, or remove any soil or other material therefrom.
8. No person shall enter any plots or beds in the Reserves enclosed for plantations or set apart or used for the growing of flowers, plants, shrubs or trees or for other purposes, nor shall any person trespass or walk or drive upon or over any flower-bed or shrubbery in the Reserves.
9. No person shall, without the permission of the Committee or an officer of the Committee first obtained, enter any building, conservatory, depot, dwelling, kiosk, nursery, structure, workshop or yard in the Reserves, unless the same is open to the public, and then only at such times and upon such terms and conditions and, in the case only

of the building in the Fitzroy Gardens known as Cook's Cottage, subject to the payment of such charges as may be determined by the Committee for entering thereinto.

10. No person shall throw stones or missiles or light any fire in the Reserves, or drop, leave, scatter or throw down therein any bottles, cast-off clothing, fruit peel, litter, paper or refuse of any kind.

11. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, bring into, carry or use in the Reserves any catapult, firearm or other device or weapon of any description whatsoever capable of causing injury or damage to any person or property therein.

12. No person shall spit or expectorate in or upon any part of the Reserves.

13. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, affix, remove or interfere with any bill, marking of any kind, notice or placard in, over or upon any building, fence, gate, post, tree or other structure of any kind whatsoever in the Reserves.

14. No person shall climb on or jump over any portion of any building, embellishment, fence, fountain, gate, hedge, improvement, post, property, seat, shrub, statue, tree or other structure of any kind whatsoever in the Reserves.

15. No person shall bring into or allow to remain in the Reserves any cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, sheep or other animals, save and except as provided in these Regulations, and any such animals found therein contrary to these Regulations shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed or both.

16. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog, unless such dog is held by a chain or cord.

17. No person having the care or custody of any dog shall permit or allow such dog to urinate or defecate in or upon any part of the Reserves.

18. No horse with a rider shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserves, save and except on the portions thereof specially set apart for equestrians.

19. No person having the care or custody of any horse shall permit such horse to enter or pass over or through the Reserves uncontrolled, nor shall any person break in or train any horse in the Reserves.

20. No assembly for a fête, picnic or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind or any meeting of a like character, shall take place in the Reserves, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, save and except in that portion of Flinders Park described in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

21. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, preach or declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any of the Reserves, save and except in that portion of Flinders Park described in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

22. No person shall bring into Flinders Park any amplifier, loudspeaker, microphone or other public address apparatus of any kind, nor shall any person in the said park operate any amplifier, loudspeaker or other public address apparatus of any kind, or speak into any microphone connected with any amplifier, loudspeaker or other public address apparatus of any kind located in the said park or in any adjoining street or road.

23. No person shall make or cause to be made any disturbance, noise or violent outcry or sound, or, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing in the Reserves.

24. No person shall hawk, sell or offer or expose for sale in the Reserves, or any part thereof, any article, confectionery, cordial, fruit, goods, merchandise or tobacco or anything whatsoever, or solicit or gather money therein, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

25. No person shall give out or distribute any advertisement, book, handbill, notice, pamphlet, paper, placard, program or other printed matter in the Reserves, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person litter the Reserves by dropping, leaving, scattering or throwing down any advertisement, book, handbill, notice, pamphlet, paper, placard, program or other printed matter therein.

26. No person shall bring into or sell or distribute in the Reserves any intoxicating liquor, unless authorized in writing by the Committee and licensed or holding a permit pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958* for the sale or drinking of intoxicating liquor therein, or employed by or acting

on behalf of or delivering intoxicating liquor to any person so authorized and licensed or holding a permit, and then only in such portions of the Reserves as may be set apart for the purpose or in such booths, buildings and kiosks therein wherein the sale or drinking of intoxicating liquor is permitted by the Committee and licences or permits granted pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958*.

27. No person shall have in his possession or control or consume or drink in the Reserves any intoxicating liquor, save and except in such portions of the Reserves and in such booths, buildings and kiosks therein as may from time to time be licensed premises within the meaning of the *Licensing Act 1958* or in respect of which permits permitting the drinking of intoxicating liquor have been granted pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958*, and then only while intoxicating liquor is on sale or permitted to be drunk therein.

28. No person shall erect in the Reserves any booth, tent or other temporary structure, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

29. No person shall use or cause to be used in the Reserves any caravan, structure or tent or any vehicle of any description for camping or living in, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

30. No child under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the Reserves, unless in charge of a parent, an adult friend or a nurse, and no person shall leave any such child unattended in the Reserves.

31. No person on foot shall enter or pass over or through the portions of the Reserves specially set apart for equestrians, except to cross through the openings provided for access from one part of the Reserves to another as indicated by notices therein.

32. No motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserves or stand or park therein, save and except on any portion thereof specially set apart for wheeled traffic and as provided in these Regulations, and no person, unless authorized in writing by the Committee, shall bring into, leave standing, park or use in any other part of the Reserves any bicycle, cart, motor car, motor cycle, truck, wheelbarrow or other vehicle of any description whatsoever.

33. No motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle shall be driven at a speed dangerous to the public in any portion of the Reserves specially set apart for wheeled traffic or the parking of motor cars, motor cycles or other vehicles, nor shall any motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle be driven, left standing or parked on the roadway in Princes Park known as Cemetery-road or the roadway in Yarra Park known as Brunton-avenue contrary to the provisions of the regulations for the time being in force under Part I. of the *Road Traffic Act 1958*, the provisions of which regulations shall at all times apply to the said two roads.

34. On such occasions only as the areas known as the Carlton Cricket Ground, Melbourne Cricket Ground, Olympic Park and Richmond Cricket Ground are used for cricket or football matches or other functions, the Committee may set apart portions of Flinders, Princes and Yarra Parks for the parking of motor cars, motor cycles and other vehicles, and a charge not exceeding Two shillings may be made and taken by the Committee or their authorized representatives for the parking of any motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle in the portions of the said parks so set apart.

35. No athletic sport, game or gymnastic exercise shall be played or practised or take place in any of the Reserves, save and except in such portions of Fawkner, Flemington and Kensington, Flinders, Princes and Yarra Parks as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee and in the bowling greens and tennis courts in the Reserves, and then only upon such terms and conditions and subject to the payment of such fees as may be determined by the Committee for the use of the portions of the said parks so set apart and the said bowling greens and tennis courts.

36. No person shall bet in the Reserves, nor shall any person play or take part in any gambling or unlawful game or sport therein.

37. Any person, club, organization or society having obtained the permission of the Committee to use any part of the Reserves for any purpose shall maintain and leave the same in a clean and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Committee.

38. No person shall in any part of the Reserves annoy, disturb, interrupt or obstruct any other person in the proper use of the Reserves, or obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer or servant of the Committee.

39. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Reserves any person who commits a breach of these Regulations, and such person shall, in addition to being removed or excluded, be liable to the penalty provided for an offence against these Regulations.

40. No person shall remain within the Reserves or on or within any building, property or structure whatsoever therein, after having been lawfully directed to leave the same by any officer, servant or other authorized representative of the Committee.

41. Every person in the Reserves shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order or direction of any member of the Police Force or officer or servant of the Committee, whether or not such order or direction is directed to enforcing compliance with these Regulations and notwithstanding any apparent conflict between such order and these Regulations.

42. Any person committing in any part of the Reserves any of the following offences shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person;
- (b) being under the influence of intoxicating liquor;
- (c) using profane, indecent or obscene language;
- (d) using any threatening or abusive or insulting language;
- (e) behaving improperly or riotously;
- (f) improperly interfering with or interrupting any authorized amusement, athletic sport, entertainment, game or gymnastic exercise;
- (g) obtaining admission or entry to any part of the Reserves or any building, conservatory, dwelling, depot, enclosure, kiosk, nursery, structure, workshop or yard therein, when not entitled to such admission or entry under these Regulations.

43. The right of any persons to enter the areas known as the Carlton Cricket Ground in Princes Park and the Richmond Cricket Ground in Yarra Park shall be subject to the payment of a charge not exceeding Seven shillings and six pence each on any such days (being not more than 72 in any one year in each case) as such areas may be used for cricket or football matches or other functions.

44. On such occasions (not exceeding ten days in any one year) as portions of Alexandra Park may be set apart and enclosed for public entertainments and no other, a charge for admission not exceeding Three shillings may be made and taken by the Committee or their authorized representatives for the admission of any person to the area so set apart and enclosed.

45. Those portions of the Reserves set apart for use as children's wading pools shall be subject to the foregoing Regulations (in so far as such Regulations are not inconsistent with the Rules hereinafter referred to) and shall be used subject to the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

46. The shelters for old men erected in the Reserves shall be subject to the foregoing Regulations (in so far as such Regulations are not inconsistent with the Rules hereinafter referred to) and shall be used subject to the Rules set out in the Third Schedule to these Regulations.

47. Those portions of the Reserves set apart for use as children's playgrounds shall be subject to the foregoing Regulations (in so far as such Regulations are not inconsistent with the Rules hereinafter referred to) and shall be used subject to the Rules set out in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.

48. Those portions of the Reserves on which are erected tennis courts and appurtenant buildings shall be subject to the foregoing Regulations (in so far as such Regulations are not inconsistent with the Rules hereinafter referred to) and shall be used subject to the Rules set out in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations.

49. The dressing pavilions erected in the Reserves shall be subject to the foregoing Regulations (in so far as such Regulations are not inconsistent with the Rules hereinafter referred to) and shall be used subject to the Rules set out in the Sixth Schedule to these Regulations.

50. Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 219 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, servant or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The respective pieces of land referred to in the Crown Grants specified in the first three columns of the Seventh Schedule to these Regulations are known and may be referred to by the names respectively set opposite thereto in the fourth column of the said Schedule.

The respective dates of the appointment of the Council of the City of Melbourne as a Committee of Management for the several gardens, parks, reserves and squares are set out in the Eighth Schedule to these Regulations.

Nothing in these Regulations or the Rules set out in the Schedules to these Regulations shall operate to prevent any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of or workman employed by the Committee or any member of the Police Force or any member of the staff of or workman employed by any contractor carrying out any work for and on behalf of the Committee from doing such things and taking such action as may be required of him in the course of his duties or work.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

(REGULATIONS 20 AND 21.)

In that portion of Flinders Park known as the Public Forum commencing at a point on the northern side of Batman-avenue 372 ft. 3 in. east from the eastern boundary of the site known as Olympic Baths; thence easterly 612 feet by the southern boundary of the railway reserve; thence southerly 288 feet to the northern side of Batman-avenue; thence north-westerly 593 feet along the northern boundary of Batman-avenue to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

(REGULATION 45.)

Rules Relating to Children's Wading Pools.

1. No person over twelve (12) years of age shall enter any of the children's wading pools (hereinafter called "the wading pools"), provided that parents and attendants shall be at liberty to enter the wading pools to watch over children in their charge.
2. Cricket or football shall not be played in the wading pools.
3. The wading pools shall be used only for the purpose for which they are provided.
4. All fruit peel, paper and other litter shall be placed in the rubbish baskets provided by the Committee for the purpose, and such fruit peel, paper or other litter shall not be deposited in the wading pools.
5. Every person in the wading pools shall obey the lawful directions of any officer of the Committee in respect of his or her conduct therein.
6. No responsibility shall lie upon the Committee in respect of any accident arising from the use of any of the wading pools.
7. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle or scooter in any of the wading pools or bring any animal into the same.
8. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee shall have the right to remove or exclude from any of the wading pools any person who commits a breach of any of these Rules, or who wilfully damages the wading pools, and such person shall, in addition to being removed or excluded, be liable to the penalty provided for an offence against these Regulations.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

(REGULATION 46.)

Rules Relating to Old Men's Shelters.

1. The shelters for old men (hereinafter called "the shelters") shall be open daily from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.
2. No person shall bring into any of the shelters any intoxicating liquor.
3. No person shall enter or remain in any of the shelters while in a state of intoxication.
4. No person shall play or take part in any gambling or unlawful game or sport in any of the shelters.
5. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal under his control to enter or remain in any of the shelters.
6. No person shall bring any bicycle into any of the shelters.
7. No person shall use any indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner in any of the shelters.

8. No person shall leave any bottles, cast-off clothing, fruit peel, paper or refuse of any kind in any of the shelters.

9. No person shall deliver any public address in any of the shelters.

10. No person shall in any of the shelters annoy, disturb, interrupt or obstruct any other person in the proper use of such shelter, or obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer or servant of the Committee.

11. No person shall damage, destroy, interfere with or remove, any fitting, furniture, lock or tap in or about any of the shelters, or write upon or deface any door, partition or wall in or forming part of any of the shelters.

12. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee shall have the right to remove or exclude from the shelters any person who commits a breach of any of these Rules, or who wilfully damages the shelters, and such person shall, in addition to being removed or excluded, be liable to the penalty provided for an offence against these Regulations.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

(REGULATION 47.)

Rules Relating to Children's Playgrounds.

1. No person over twelve (12) years of age shall enter the children's playgrounds (hereinafter called "the playgrounds") or use any of the equipment erected thereon, provided however that parents, adult friends and nurses shall be at liberty to enter the playgrounds to watch over children in their charge.
2. No piece of equipment in any of the playgrounds shall be used by the same child or children for a period longer than five minutes, if any other child or children is or are waiting to use such equipment.
3. The equipment in the playgrounds shall be used only for the purpose for which it is provided.
4. Cricket or football shall not be played in the playgrounds.
5. All fruit peel, paper and other litter shall be placed in the rubbish baskets provided by the Committee for the purpose, and such fruit peel, paper or other litter shall not be dropped, left, scattered or thrown down in the playgrounds.
6. Every person in the playgrounds shall obey the lawful directions of any officer of the Committee in respect of his or her conduct therein.
7. No responsibility shall lie upon the Committee in respect of any accident arising from the use of the equipment in the playgrounds.
8. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any of the playgrounds or bring any animal into the same.
9. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee shall have the right to remove or exclude from any of the playgrounds any person who commits a breach of any of these Rules, or who wilfully damages any of the equipment or property in the playgrounds, and such person shall, in addition to being removed or excluded, be liable to the penalty provided for an offence against these Regulations.

FIFTH SCHEDULE.

(REGULATION 48.)

Rules Relating to Tennis Courts.

1. The hours during which the tennis courts (hereinafter called "the courts") shall be open, the terms and conditions under which the courts may be used and the charges to be made for the use thereof shall be as determined by the Committee from time to time.
2. All persons using the courts shall be decorously dressed and shall wear tennis shoes.
3. No female player shall enter or use any dressing-room set apart for males, nor shall any male player enter or use any dressing-room set apart for females.
4. Onlookers must not trespass on the courts or dressing-rooms or interfere with persons playing on the courts.
5. No person shall bring into any of the courts or dressing-rooms any intoxicating liquor.
6. No person shall enter or remain on or in any of the courts or dressing-rooms while in a state of intoxication.
7. No person shall play, or take part in any gambling, or unlawful game or sport on or in any of the courts or dressing-rooms.

8. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal under his control to enter or remain on or in any of the courts or dressing-rooms.

9. No person shall bring any bicycle into any of the courts or dressing-rooms.

10. No person shall use any indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner on or in any of the courts or dressing-rooms.

11. No person shall leave any bottles, cast-off clothing, fruit peel, paper or refuse of any kind on or in any of the courts or dressing-rooms.

12. No person shall on or in the vicinity of any of the courts cause or permit any sound or noise to be emitted from any wireless set, gramophone or other instrument, so as to cause or be calculated to cause annoyance to any other person.

13. No person shall damage, destroy, interfere with or remove any fence, fitting, furniture, gate, light, lock, net or tap in or about any of the courts or dressing-rooms, or write upon or deface any door, partition or wall in or forming part of any structure provided for use with any of the courts.

14. The Committee will not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person on or in or in the vicinity of any of the courts or buildings thereon; and no person whatsoever has any authority from the Committee to accept any article for safe keeping.

15. No responsibility shall lie upon the Committee in respect of any injury or loss suffered by any person while on the courts, or in the buildings appurtenant thereto or any accident arising from the use of the courts or the said buildings.

16. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee shall have the right to remove or exclude from any of the courts any person who commits a breach of any of these Rules, or who wilfully damages the courts, and such person shall, in addition to being removed or excluded, be liable to the penalty provided for an offence against these Regulations.

SIXTH SCHEDULE.

(REGULATION 49.)

Rules Relating to Dressing Pavilions.

1. The dressing pavilions (hereinafter called "the pavilions") will be open while the sports grounds in the Reserves are in use, but shall be closed not later than 7.30 p.m.

2. No person shall bring into any of the pavilions any intoxicating liquor.

3. No person shall enter or remain in any of the pavilions while in a state of intoxication.

4. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal under his control to enter or remain in any of the pavilions.

5. No person shall bring any bicycle into any of the pavilions.

6. No person shall damage, destroy, interfere with or remove any fitting, furniture, light, lock or tap in or about any of the pavilions, or write upon or deface any door, partition or wall in or forming part of any of the pavilions.

7. No person shall use any indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent manner in any of the pavilions.

8. Any person finding any article that may be left in any of the pavilions shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to the officer or servant of the Committee in charge of such pavilion, who shall thereupon register a description of the same and all particulars relating thereto in the book kept for that purpose, and any person who shall have lost such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive the same from the said officer or servant upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to and giving a receipt for such article in the aforesaid book.

9. The Committee will not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person in or in the vicinity of any of the pavilions.

10. No person shall leave in any of the pavilions any bottles, cast-off clothing, fruit peel, paper or refuse of any kind.

11. No person shall in any of the pavilions annoy, disturb, interrupt or obstruct any other person in the proper use of such pavilion, or obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any officer or servant of the Committee.

12. No person except officers and servants of the Committee and the umpires, players and officials of the teams playing or practising with the authority of the Committee on the sports grounds in the Reserves shall enter or use any of the pavilions, nor shall any person other than officers and servants of the Committee enter any room other than that set apart for his or her use.

13. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee shall have the right to remove or exclude from any of the pavilions any person who commits a breach of any of these Rules, or who wilfully damages the pavilions, and such person shall, in addition to being removed or excluded, be liable to the penalty provided for an offence against these Regulations.

CITY OF BENDIGO.

BY-LAW No. 100.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo made under the Local Government Acts and numbered 100, for prohibiting the leaving standing of derelict or unregistered motor cars on streets or roads.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

1. In this By-law the words "derelict motor car" shall mean any derelict motor car which has remained in any street for a period exceeding 28 days.

2. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any street or road.

3. Any officer of the Council authorized by it in that behalf may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road to be removed by such reasonable means as he may think fit to some place set aside by the Council for that purpose.

4. As soon as reasonably may be after any such car has been removed as aforesaid the Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto.

5. If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.

6. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid the Council may after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice cause the same to be sold either by public auction or private contract.

(b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car.

(c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council such residue shall be paid into the municipal fund.

7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within 28 days from the expiration of such period of 21 days the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.

8. If any such owner or occupier shall, within the time limited by such notice, fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such rats, ants, vermin, or pests, or noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier, and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
