AMENDMENT OF THE SECOND SCHEDULE TO THE
POISONS ACT 1958 (No. 6336).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section four of the *Poisons Act 1958*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation amend the Second Schedule to the said Act in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. By the addition of the following items to the 1st Part of the said Schedule:—

“Propoxyphene, its salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts, solutions, or other substances containing more than one part per centum of propoxyphene.

Norcodeine, its salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts, solutions, or other substances containing more than one part per centum of norcodeine.”

2. By the addition of the following items to the 2nd Part of the said Schedule:—

“Propoxyphene, its salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts, solutions, or other substances containing one part per centum or less of propoxyphene.

Norcodeine, its salts, preparations, admixtures, extracts, solutions, or other substances containing one part per centum or less of norcodeine.”

AMENDMENT OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1958 (No. 6336).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section thirty-nine of the *Poisons Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation amend paragraph (1) of the Sixth Schedule to the said Act in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. By the addition of the following items:—
 - “Nicomorphine (di-nicotinic acid ester of morphine) and its salts and all preparations thereof”;
 - “Normorphine (N-demethylated morphine) and its salts and all preparations thereof” and
 - “Dimenoxadol (dimethylaminoethyl 1-ethoxy-1,1-diphenylacetate) and its salts and all preparations thereof.”
 2. In the item beginning—
 - “Pyrrolidine derivatives”
 - (i) by the addition after the word “racemoramide” of the words “levomoramide, dextromoramide” and
 - (ii) by the deletion of the word “its” and the substitution therefor of the word “their”.
 3. By the addition to the item beginning “1, 3-dimethyl-4-” the word “Proheptazine” as the first word in the item, so that the item reads:—
 - “Proheptazine (1, 3-dimethyl-4-phenyl-4-propionyloxyhexamethyleneimine), its salts, and any preparation, admixture, extract, solution, or other substance containing any proportion thereof.”
 4. By the addition to the item beginning “4-morpholino-2, 2-diphenyl” the words “Dioxaphetyl Butyrate” as the first words in the item, so that the item reads:—
 - “Dioxaphetyl Butyrate (ethyl 4-morpholino-2, 2-diphenyl butyrate), its salts, and any preparation, admixture, extract, solution, or other substance containing any proportion thereof.”
 5. By the addition to the item beginning “4-4-diphenyl-6-” the word “Normethadone” as the first word in the item, so that the item reads:—
 - “Normethadone (4, 4-diphenyl-6-dimethylamino-3-hexanone), its salts and all preparations thereof.”
- And declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the *Poisons Act 1958* shall apply to the substances or preparations so added in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations already included in the said paragraph (1).

PROCLAMATION

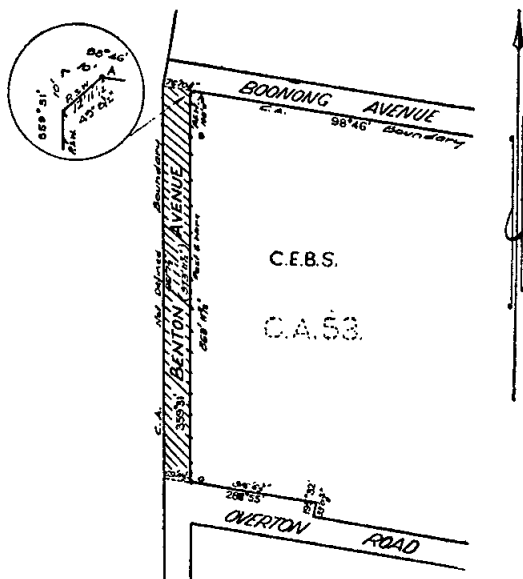
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a

public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land used for a street known as Benton-avenue and being part of Crown allotment 53, section A, Parish of Frankston, and being indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved for streets within the said Shire, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this

Proclamation declare that all those pieces of land reserved for streets and being described hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

(a) LAMB-STREET.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Road Traffic Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that Part II. of the said Act shall apply only in respect of infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of such Part by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation:

And whereas it is also enacted in the said Act that any such Proclamation may provide that such Part of the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements or in respect of traffic infringements or in any particular area or circumstance:

And whereas it is further enacted that no such Proclamation shall be made in relation to parking infringements unless the council of any municipality the municipal district or any part of the municipal district of which is specified therein has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part to such municipal district or part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh has requested the Governor in Council to extend the application of such Part, in respect only of parking infringements to the Shire of Bacchus Marsh:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the Shire of Bacchus Marsh as an area in which Part II. of the *Road Traffic Act 1958* shall apply in respect only of parking infringements occurring after the date hereof.

THE USE OF SPOTLIGHTS, ETC., FOR HUNTING NATIVE GAME.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Game Acts and all other powers me thereunto enabling do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the Proclamation made the seventh day of September, 1926, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifteenth day of September, 1926, prohibiting the use of spotlights or any similar light of any kind whatsoever for taking, killing or hunting, or for attempting or assisting to take, kill or hunt any species of native game shall not apply to kangaroos authorized to be killed in accordance with an authority in writing issued under the provisions of section 33 of the *Game Act 1958*.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PRESCRIBE THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE SALE, ETC., OF GUMMY SHARK OR SCHOOL OR SNAPPER SHARK DURING THE CLOSE SEASON.

I, IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this Notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation providing that gummy shark or school or snapper shark not taken during the close season for such species of fish may be kept in possession sold or exposed for sale during the close season for such species of fish whether such fish were taken in Victoria or elsewhere subject to the following terms and conditions:—

INTERPRETATION.—“Official Stamp” means the mark or imprint of a stamp containing the Coat of Arms of Victoria over the letters VIC or the mark or imprint of a stamp containing the Coat of Arms of South Australia over the letters S.A. or the mark or imprint of a stamp containing the Coat of Arms of Tasmania over the letters TAS.

- (a) Every person who has in his possession any carcasses of gummy shark or school or snapper shark for the purpose of sale during the close season for such species of fish shall forward to the Director of Fisheries and Game on or before the first day of the close season in each year a true statement in writing of all such fish so held in his possession.
- (b) Every person who has in his possession any fillets of gummy shark or school or snapper shark for the purpose of sale during the close season shall contain all such fillets in closed boxes and forward to the Director of Fisheries and Game on or before the first day of the close season in each year a true statement in writing of all such shark so held in possession.
- (c) The Director of Fisheries and Game on being satisfied that the gummy shark or school or snapper shark referred to in such written statement were legally obtained shall cause the official stamp to be marked on each carcass of such fish near to and forward of the dorsal fin or on the boxes containing fillets of such shark.

(d) No person during the close season for gummy shark or snapper or school shark shall have in his possession or sell or expose for sale any such shark whether in the carcass or in filets unless:

- (1) Each carcass of gummy shark or snapper or school shark bears the mark or imprint of the official stamp or
- (2) the filets of any such gummy shark or snapper or school shark are contained in closed boxes bearing the mark or imprint of the official stamp.
- (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of clause (d) (2) the filets of gummy shark or school or snapper shark may be removed from such stamped boxes during the close season for use in the preparation of meals or for selling or exposing for sale in a place of retail business.

(SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA).
INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1958*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Town and Country Planning Board (hereinafter referred to as the responsible authority), having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act on the 23rd day of September, 1959, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the area described or shown on the map as the Schedule hereto:—

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall use or develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the responsible authority.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works shall be accompanied by a sketch, plan or copy of certificate of title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development, and type and construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out and such other particulars relating to the application as the responsible authority may require.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. Schedule of land affected—

All that area of land contained within the following boundary:—Commencing at a point where the bank of the Delatite Arm of the Eildon Reservoir intersects the western boundary of allotment 19, section B, Parish of Eildon; thence southerly by that boundary

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RECREATION RESERVE KNOWN AS "THE OLD CHINAMAN'S GARDEN" AT MOOROOPNA.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purposes whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Crown land reserved by Order in Council of 9th August, 1932, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish and Township of Mooroopna containing 21 acres 3 roods 30 perches, together with the abutting permanent reservation along the Goulburn River (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve") in respect of which the Aborigines Welfare Board has been appointed a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

2. No person shall while on the Reserve—
 - (a) unlawfully assault or beat any other person;
 - (b) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, or insulting manner, or use any threatening, indecent, abusive, or insulting words;
 - (c) harbour any person whose admission to the Reserve is not permitted or approved in accordance with these Regulations;
 - (d) damage, deface, destroy, or interfere with any building, fence, machine, animal, or other property on the Reserve;
 - (e) have in his possession any firearm, weapon, or explosive, poisonous, narcotic or intoxicating substance or liquid;
 - (f) gamble or bet;
 - (g) be under the influence of any intoxicant;
 - (h) be indecently clothed;
 - (i) damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve;
 - (j) light fires in the open except in a properly constructed fireplace.
3. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind in the Reserve.
4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
5. The Committee shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any vehicle or machine, nor any dog unless controlled by chain or cord without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
7. Any permission of approval granted under the provisions of these Regulations may be revoked at any time if it appears to the Committee of Management that any condition imposed in connexion therewith has not been complied with, and when such permission or approval is revoked the person or persons in respect of whom it was granted shall leave the Reserve immediately. Every such person who fails to leave the Reserve immediately may be removed by a member of the Police Force.—(Rs.4230.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by

any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "CRESSY RECREATION RESERVE".

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.

4. Stripping shall be commenced within six weeks from date of acceptance of offer unless otherwise authorized by the Commission.

9. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.

10. Except with the permission of the officer in charge, no tree of less than 5 inches diameter shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated in the licence. Wherever a size limit is stated it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.

11. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of issue of licence unless otherwise authorized, in writing, by the officer in charge.

12. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take such precautions as the officer in charge may direct to safeguard such bark from loss by fire.

13. No bark shall be removed without the permission of the officer in charge, and it must be carted from the forest and weighed not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark unless otherwise authorized by the officer in charge.

14. The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the officer in charge and at a rate satisfactory to the Commission.

15. All bark must be weighed at the weighbridge stipulated in the licence, or at such other weighbridge as may be approved by the officer in charge, and in all cases at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.

16. Prior to removal of the bark satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty. The licensee shall pay such royalty at the rate tendered on weights as disclosed by the weighbridge dockets.

17. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be determined by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire otherwise than in accordance with the Forests Acts and Regulations.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette Officer* not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

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
