#### Victoria. ACT 391.-SECOND SCHEDULE.

A STATEMENT of trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England, under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion", for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him in May, 1851, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

# DISEASES NOTIFICATION REGULATIONS 1959.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958 (No. 6270) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf ye other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Diseases Notification Regulations 1959 and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. (i) The bodily conditions known as Eclampsia, Leukaemia and Scurvy are hereby prescribed as diseases for the purposes of section 162A of the Health Act 1958 (No. 6270).
- (ii) In these Regulations Eclampsia means a toxaemia of pregnancy characterized by one or more convulsions and coma.
- 3. Every medical practitioner who becomes aware that any person visited or professionally attended by him is suffering from any disease as prescribed by these Regulations or who by post-mortem examination or otherwise becomes aware that any person has died as a result of any such disease shall forthwith give notice in writing of the condition or the death to the Commission of Public Health.
- 4. Every medical practitioner who reports a case of disease as prescribed by these Regulations or reports a death caused by a disease so prescribed shall be paid a fee of One shilling and six pence.
- 5. Every medical practitioner who fails to inform the Commission of Public Health as provided by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke all previous Regulations governing the expenditure of Commissions and Boards of Inquiry, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulations, to take effect from the 20th October, 1959, that is to say:—

The Chairman of the Commission or Board shall submit an application for a special advance to defray necessary expenses, and if further funds are necessary application shall be made as often as may be necessary (provided the total amount authorized to be spent by the Commission or Board has not been spent) for a reimbursement of the amount paid out of such advance, full particulars of such amount, supported by \*vouchers, being furnished. In preparing accounts for expenditure the Secretary of the Commission or Board shall be careful to see that they are prepared in accordance with the Public Accounts and Stores Regulations 1958, and shall carefully scrutinize each item of expenditure to insure that it is a proper charge against the funds of the Commission or Board of Inquiry.

Every cheque on the official account of the Commission or Board must be signed by the Chairman or President, and countersigned by the Secretary, and any moneys received by the Commission or Board from fees, sale of goods or stores, &c., must be forthwith paid into its official account. The Secretary shall keep books giving full particulars with dates of all receipts and expenditure of the Commission or Board. Such books shall contain reference to the authority in the minute book for expenditure.

The minute book and account books shall be open to inspection by the Under-Secretary and Auditor-General. No contract shall be entered into for services the estimated cost of which exceeds £100, unless tenders shall have been first publicly invited except with the authority of the Governor in Council.

All stores under contract required shall be obtained at contract rates from the contractors to the Government for the particular articles needed.

No bonus or gratuity shall be paid without the special sanction of the Chief Secretary having first been obtained.

Where it is necessary to incur expenditure on refreshments, &c., care shall be taken to keep the cost within the lowest limits, and in all other expenditure the Secretary shall be held responsible for the exercise of due economy.

The Secretary shall submit a statement of the accounts of the Commission or Board of Inquiry to the Under-Secretary, at least once in each month.

#### EXPENDITURE TO BE AUTHORIZED BY CHAIRMAN.

No expenditure shall be incurred by any Commission or Board of Inquiry except on the written authority of the Chairman of such Commission or Board of Inquiry, and all orders for supplies shall be signed by the Chairman.

# TRAVELLING EXPENSES.

Members and Secretaries of Commissions and Boards of Inquiry and Counsel assisting Commissions and Boards of Inquiry shall, unless subject to the provisions of the *Public Service Act* 1958, be entitled to be paid an allowance for travelling and other expenses in accordance with the conditions and at the rates provided from time to time in Part VI. of the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as far as they relate to Permanent Heads.

Provided that if the Chairman of a Commission or Board be a Judge of the County Court he shall receive within Victoria the expenses for the time being payable to him as a Judge of the County Court and when sitting or travelling in another State such sum as is fixed by the Chief Secretary.

Provided further that Members of Parliament serving on Commissions or Boards of Inquiry shall not be entitled to the expenses herein specified when the Commission or Board of Inquiry is sitting in Melbourne during the session of Parliament.







IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and every and any other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Chelsea order as follows:—

No person shall use any private property for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads so as to cause or allow any such tree, shrub, or hedge to obscure or diminish the view of the driver of any motor car in any such street or road of any road traffic in any other such street or road.

Where any tree, shrub, or hedge (whether planted before or after the commencement of the Local Government Act 1958) growing on private property within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads is likely to obscure or diminish the view of the driver of any motor car in any such street or road of any road traffic in any other such street or road, the owner of such property shall remove the same or lop the same to such a height as in the opinion of the Building Inspector or other authorized officer of the Council of the City of Chelsea shall be necessary to prevent the likelihood of any obstruction to such view. - Any person who commits a breach of clause 2 hereof shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than £20.
- 4. The exercise by the Council of any of the powers conferred on it by this By-law shall not relieve any person from liability for any penalty incurred by reason of the breach of any provision of this By-law nor shall the imposition of any penalty pursuant to this By-law in any way prejudice or interfere with the Council's rights to remove and/or sell any derelict or unregistered motor car:
- 5. Any officer of the Council authorized by it in that behalf may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road to be removed by such reasonable means as he may think fit to some place set aside by the Council for that purpose.
- 6. As soon as reasonably may be after any such car has been removed as aforesaid the Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district, a notice in the form in the Schedule herete.

- 7. If within fourteen days after such publication such notor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof, such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.
- 8. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after publication of such notice as aforesaid the Council may after the expiration of 48 hours after the expiration of such notice cause the same

to be sold either by public auction or private contract.
