AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, and any amendment thereto are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".

2. Regulation No. 302 of the Principal Regulations is amended as follows:—

(a) by the deletion from the first and third paragraphs of " 'B' Berth Appleton Dock ", appearing immediately before " 'C' Berth Appleton Dock "; and

(b) by the deletion from the marginal note of "B" appearing immediately before " 'C' and 'D' Berths Appleton Dock."

3. Regulation No. 316 of the Principal Regulations is amended by the deletion of "Berth No. 16 . . . 2.14.0" appearing under the heading "North Wharf" and the substitution therefor of "Berth No. 16 . . . 2.4.0".

SHIRE OF HASTINGS.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Hastings (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Acts on the 19th day of October, 1960, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the area described or shown on the map as the Schedule hereto.

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall use or develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works, shall be accompanied by a sketch plan or copy of certificate of title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development, and type and construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out and such other particulars relating to the application as the Responsible Authority may require.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. *Schedule.*—The whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Hastings: Commencing on the shore of Western Port where the northern boundary of the Parish of Tyabb abuts thereon; thence westerly, north-westerly and westerly by that boundary and westerly, south-westerly and westerly by a road to the most northern angle of allotment 12A, Parish of Frankston; thence south-westerly by a 3-chain road to the southern boundary of the parish; thence easterly by that boundary to the north-eastern angle of allotment 1, section A, Parish of Moorooduc; thence southerly by a road to the northern boundary of the Parish of Bittern; thence southerly and westerly by the eastern and southern boundaries of the Parish of Moorooduc to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Kangerong; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary and further southerly by a road to the north-western boundary of allotment 65, Parish of Balnarring; thence south-westerly by that boundary to Stony Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to the southern boundary of allotment 63A; thence north-easterly by that boundary and a road to the north-eastern boundary of allotment 59; thence south-easterly by that boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the shore of Western Port; and thence north-easterly and northerly by that shore to the commencing point.

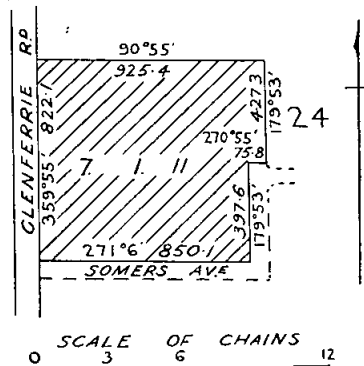

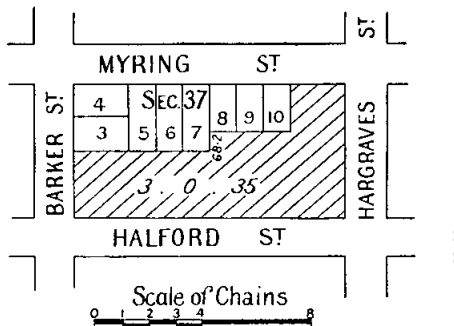

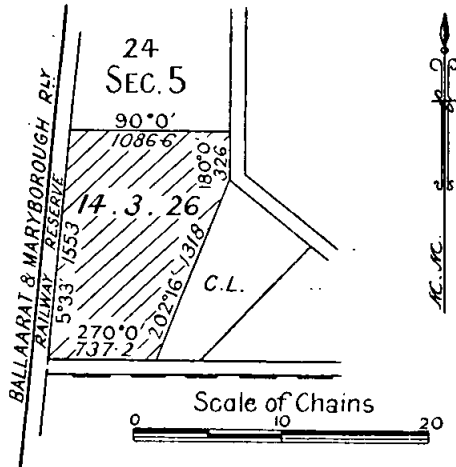
SCALE OF CHAINS

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is amongst other
things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations
for the registration of groups of brigades and for prescribing any matter or
thing authorized or required to be prescribed by the said Act:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in
the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive
Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the
Country Fire Authority Act 1958 and all other powers him thereunto enabling,
doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Country Fire Authority Groups
of Brigades Regulations 1960" and shall come into operation on the publication
thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Every application to the Country Fire Authority for the registration
of a group of brigades shall be made in the form or to the effect of the form
contained in the First Schedule.

3. The officers of a group shall be as follows:—

- (a) a Group Officer;
- (b) such Deputy Group Officers, not exceeding three, as may be
approved from time to time by the Country Fire Authority;
- (c) a Group Communications Officer; and
- (d) a Group Secretary.

4. No person shall be eligible for election to office in a group unless he
is registered by the Authority as a member of a fire brigade.

5. The Chief Officer or any rural fire brigade registered by the Authority
may convene a meeting to form a group at any time by inviting each rural
brigade in the area proposed to be served by such group to appoint the senior
officer of such brigade to attend the initial meeting.

6. At any initial meeting for the formation of a group the proposed group officers shall be elected by ballot. A simple majority of the votes of the delegates present and voting shall be sufficient to secure election. At any meeting of a group including the initial meeting, the brigade may have only one delegate and each delegate only one vote.

7. For the purpose of electing group officers otherwise than at the initial meeting or for the purpose of filling casual vacancies there shall be a meeting of the delegates of all brigades in the group in the month of September in the year 1962 and in the month of September in each second succeeding year thereafter. The election shall be by ballot and a simple majority of the votes of the delegates present and voting shall be sufficient to secure election.

A notification of the election of group officers shall be forwarded to the Authority forthwith after the meeting by the Group Secretary. The term for which group officers are elected in accordance with this clause shall be two years commencing from the first day of December next following the month prescribed for the election.

8. The Group Officer, or, in his absence, the senior Deputy Group Officer, shall preside at all meetings of the group except the initial meeting at which a chairman shall be elected.

9. In the event of a group officer resigning or ceasing to be a member of a brigade the group shall within one month from the occurrence of the vacancy elect a successor by ballot at a meeting of the group. The officer elected shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which his predecessor was elected unless he ceases to be a member of a brigade.

10. All elections of group officers shall be conducted as nearly as possible in accordance with the regulations in force relative to the election of officers of rural brigades.

11. In addition to the powers and duties which may be exercised by a Group Officer pursuant to the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958*, he shall exercise the following powers and be responsible for the following duties, that is to say:—

- (a) He may establish a fire headquarters in the case of any major fire in the group area.
- (b) He may co-ordinate and control the activities of all brigades within the group with the object of extinguishing the fire with the least possible delay.
- (c) He may organize and co-ordinate the efforts of all casual fire-fighters who offer their services for the purpose of assisting the group or any brigade.

12. The Deputy Group Officers shall be described as first, second and third respectively in order of seniority, and shall assist the Group Officer in the carrying out of his duties and obey promptly all orders received from him. In the absence of the Group Officer the Senior Deputy Group Officer present shall assume command of the group and be vested with the powers of Group Officer.

13. The Group Communications Officer shall be responsible to the Group Officer for—

- (a) regular practice with and the testing of radio apparatus,
- (b) the establishment and maintenance of a reliable communications centre at all major fires, and
- (c) the reception and prompt distribution of all messages, and the control of all radio traffic.

14. The Group Secretary shall—

- (a) keep the records of the group including the minutes of meetings;
- (b) conduct the correspondence of the group and file all inward and copies of outward letters and circulars;
- (c) attend all meetings and carry out such of the decisions thereat as may be allotted to him;
- (d) be responsible for outside meetings to the Group Officer; and
- (e) inform the Authority in writing forthwith from time to time of any change in the membership of the group or in the officers of the group.

For the transcript, including such additional copies, not exceeding five in number, as may be required—Two shillings and sixpence for each folio of seventy-two words; and for each subsequent copy Three pence for each folio of seventy-two words.

The rates of payment for all typists, whether engaged occasionally upon copying work or upon dictation typing work shall not exceed Nine pence for each folio of seventy-two words."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "CRANBOURNE PUBLIC HALL AND GARDENS RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township and Parish of Cranbourne temporarily reserved as a site for a Public Hall and Gardens by Order in Council dated the 2nd July, 1958, and known as the "Cranbourne Public Hall and Gardens Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Hall shall be open to the public at such times and subject to such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees and charges as the Committee may determine.
2. The remainder of the Reserve shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 40 in any one year, as it or any portion thereof may be set aside by the Committee for fêtes, entertainments or amusements or for any other lawful purpose on any of which occasions admission shall be subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.
3. No person shall have the use of the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first being obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld but shall be subject to such conditions as the Committee may deem reasonable.

4. No person shall drive or park a motor car or any other vehicle within the Reserve, except in an area as is set apart for a driveway or parking area, and then under such conditions as may be determined by the Committee.

5. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the Reserve or in any building thereon who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, such person may forthwith be removed notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission or holds a ticket of admission.

6. No person shall interfere with, damage or destroy the vegetation or any buildings or other property in the Reserve nor throw stones or other missiles, nor light fires, except in fireplaces specially provided for the purpose, nor deposit litter or refuse of any kind therein, nor stick bills on any building or on any structure within the Reserve.

6A. All notices of entertainments and meetings shall be subject to approval by the Committee and posted to a board provided for the purpose.

7. No person, except by the consent of the Committee, shall enter any area set apart for flowers, shrubs and trees.

8. The Committee or its authorized officers may at all times enter the Hall on lawful business.

9. Any person or persons hiring or renting the Hall or having the use of the Hall with the consent of the Committee, must at all times abide by the liquor laws of the State.

10. No person shall erect any tent, booth or other structure nor offer any article for sale or hire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first being obtained, and then only under such conditions as the Committee may determine.

11. No person shall use or cause to be used any structure, tent, caravan or vehicle of any description in the Reserve for camping or living therein.

12. Persons renting or hiring the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure in the Reserve may be required to deposit any sum of money which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of the Hall or any key thereof, or any stand, erection or enclosure, or anything contained in any of the foregoing, and the Committee, in their absolute discretion, may make good any loss, damage or injury sustained by the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such renting or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss, damage or injury from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee and all such persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and any other reasonable order given by the Committee.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or any other animal, nor permit the same to enter, without the permission of the Committee first being obtained, otherwise the same may be impounded by the Committee.—(Rs.3386.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "GLEN CROMIE PARK".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever

and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of those Crown lands reserved for Public purposes in the Parishes of Jindivick and Drouin East as are indicated by red colour on plan marked G.8/4/48 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.6145, such lands forming part of an area known as "Glen Cromie Park" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person in the Reserve shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or commit any act of indecency or offence against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

2. No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

3. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air gun or any firearm, or any shanghai, catapult or other offensive weapon in or upon the Reserve.

4. No person shall in or upon the Reserve, kill, wound, trap or snare, or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare, any bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or have any dead bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or the skin or pelt thereof, in his possession.

5. No person shall in or upon the Reserve cut down, ringbark, destroy or damage any tree or plant growing thereon.

6. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except in a place set apart for that purpose by the Committee, and no person shall leave any fire which has been lighted by him until the same shall have been thoroughly extinguished. No refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee, and then only in a place set apart for that purpose.

7. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

8. No person shall erect any tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee or its representative, and any such tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure may be erected only on the site allotted by the Committee or its representative.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. The Committee shall have power, from time to time, by Resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid for the use of the Reserve.

11. A charge fixed by the Committee, may be made for the admission of any car or vehicle to the Reserve.

12. The Committee shall have power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.—(Rs.6145.)

3. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the baths, or in the entrance to the dressing rooms, compartments, passages or conveniences of the baths or anywhere within the bounds of the pool area defined by the fences or building lines.

4. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to remain in the baths. Bicycles shall be parked only in the racks in the area set aside for the purpose.

The manager, lessee or person in charge of the baths may charge every person entering the baths the proper fees or dues for the use of receptacles for clothes and bathing accommodation and the requisites as appear hereunder, or as shall from time to time be fixed by any Resolution of the Council, which fees or dues shall be exhibited in plain figures at the entrance to the baths.

Providing, nevertheless, that the charges, if any, for the admission of school children in charge of a teacher shall be fixed from time to time by Resolution of the Council.

6. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his or her costume in any part of the baths open to public view.

7. No boy or girl under the age of ten years, who is unable to swim shall use the adult baths without the permission of the attendant in charge, unless accompanied by an adult, and no adult non-swimmer will enter the pool beyond his or her depth.

8. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself, or commit a nuisance in the baths, or bring rubbish, filth or other offensive matter into the baths, or deposit any rubbish therein, nor leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes, or other litter.

9. No person shall climb or jump over fences or walls of the baths, or roll or throw stones in the baths.

10. No person not authorized by the manager or lessee shall climb or attempt to climb over, on to or upon, or remain on or upon any fixture, fountain, fence, roof, building or structure surrounding or appurtenant to the baths.

11. No person other than the manager or the lessee shall hawk, sell or offer for sale in the baths any goods or articles without the permission of the Council.

12. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the baths.

13. The Council may, by Resolution, close the baths or any part thereof, on any day or days, or at any times, should it be considered necessary to do so, and may also vary the periods or hours during which the baths shall be open to the public for bathing purposes.

14. In the event of the Council holding or authorizing a swimming carnival or other entertainment in the baths, it shall have power by Resolution to prohibit bathing in the baths whilst such carnival or entertainment is being held, and to fix the prices which shall be charges for admission to such carnival or entertainment.

15. No person using the baths, nor any attendant, lessee, officer, servant, or other person employed thereat, shall at any time bring or introduce into the baths, or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

16. No person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

17. No person shall use the baths whilst in an uncleanly condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the baths upon being requested so to do by any attendant on duty at the baths.

18. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the baths, or the shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume or any shower, closet or urinal or any bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box or compartment, or any part of the baths, or any furniture or article therein.

19. No person shall enter the pool without first washing him or herself in the shower bath, and every bather after using the latrines shall again wash under the showers without costume before returning to the pool.

20. Every person not being the holder of a seasonal or monthly ticket shall, before entering the baths, pay to the authorized money taker the price of payment for entrance to the baths as set out aforesaid, and every person shall, before being furnished with any towel, bathing costume, or locker, pay to the authorized money taker the price of payment thereof, and the deposit for same as set out aforesaid, and after use shall return same to the attendant in charge who will return the deposit or deposits lodged.

21. No seasonal or monthly tickets shall be transferable and any holder of a seasonal or monthly ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and all the rights and privileges given by such ticket.

22. Any person hiring any towel, bathing costume or any article from the manager or lessee shall return the same on leaving the baths.

23. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap or fitting in connexion with the baths, nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting, towel, or other article supplied for use in the baths, or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the baths.

24. No person shall at any time while being in or upon the baths use indecent or offensive language, nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

25. No person shall occupy the shower baths for an unreasonable time.

26. Any person finding any article in the baths shall immediately thereafter deliver same to one of the attendants in charge, who shall thereupon register a description of same, and all particulars relating thereto, in the book kept for that purpose, and any owner losing such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the manager, lessee or attendant in charge upon entering his or her signature and address, and signing a receipt for such article in the book referred to.

27. The Council, manager or lessee will not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

28. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the baths by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner, shall immediately leave the baths when required to do so by any attendant in charge of the baths. Only one person shall stand on or dive from the diving boards at one time and no person shall prevent any other person from diving from the boards. No one shall use any board if the manager or person in charge deems it dangerous for divers or other swimmers to use the boards at any time.

29. No man or boy shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

30. No woman or girl shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

31. No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to the baths unless, in the opinion of the manager, lessee or attendant such child is in the care of a responsible person.

32. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the lessee or manager or person in charge of the baths may refuse admission thereto to any person.

33. No person shall use or interfere with any rope, raft, lifebuoy or life-saving appliance in the premises unless in case of accident and danger occurring to a bather rendering their use necessary for the saving of life.

34. No person shall use any soap or other substance of preparation in any place or manner in the premises whereby any water in any swimming pool in the premises may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers. Approved soap is permitted in shower recesses only and at hand basins.

35. Beach balls, motor tubes or other inflated rubber or plastic articles are not permitted in the main pool. Toddlers may be permitted to take rubber toys into the paddling pool. Water polo may only be practised and played at times and by teams approved by Council. No other ball games of any kind will be permitted in pool or pool surrounds.

36. No person shall be in possession of any bottle or glass within the enclosure, except when standing within 6 feet of the kiosk.

37. No person shall enter the baths unless an attendant or other competent person is present. Solo bathing is prohibited.

38. No person shall spit, spout water, or blow their noses in the pool.

39. No person shall engage in boisterous or rough play within the baths enclosure, or in the dressing rooms or shower rooms.

40. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with the manager, lessee or any person employed at the baths or any officer of the Council or duty lifesaver in the performance of his or her duty thereat.

41. No person over the age of six years shall use the paddling pool.

42. Only members of the Maffra Life Saving Club and authorized officers of the Council will enter the club-room.
