AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Milk Pasteurization Act 1958 (No. 6319) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas the Township of Lorne has been prescribed as a district for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the fifteenth day of December, 1960, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed district set out above—

(a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or ,

(b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RESTRICT NETTING IN THE GIPPSLAND, LAKES. IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the Victoria Government Gazette to move His Excellency the Governor in Council-to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation made the twenty-fourth day of August, 1914, and published in the Government Gazette of the second day of September, 1914, respecting restrictions of netting in the Gippsland Lakes and providing as follows regarding the waters of the Gippsland Lakes: regarding the waters of the Gippsland Lakes: (1) That the use of any trammel, trawl or other net or engine, except hoop or frame nets of the dimensions, &c., specified hereafter, for the purpose of taking prawns by the holder of a professional fishing licence, to be employed in fishing shall be prohibited between the hours of Ten o'clock in the morning of any Friday and sunrise on the following Sunday. Dimensions, &c., of Hoop or Frame Nets. (a) The entrance to the hoop or frame net shall have an area of not more than Fifty (50) square feet, and the depth shall be not more - than Ten feet. (b) The size of the mesh of the net shall be not less than 11 inch.

(c) Not more than two such nets shall be allowed than on any one boat.

(2) That the use by any person of a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms shall be prohibited, provided 'that eastward, of a line running through Ludrick or Tyers Point and the Tambo Bluff the process of hauling nets known as "fireballing" may be carried on with a net up to 700 fathoms in length!

(3) That the use, at the same time, by any person of a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets) shall be prohibited, provided that in the case of "mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures 4½ inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be 1,200 fathoms. Provided further that in each case of two or more persons working together in a boat each shall be allowed to use his compliment of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.

(4) That the use, at the same time, by any person of a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net shall be prohibited.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act 1958 and all others powers hereunto enabling the following amendments to Chapter I. of the Rules of the Supreme Court are made, to take effect as on and from the first day of February, 1961:—

- 1. Order XXXVI. is hereby amended as follows:-
- (a) For Rule 13 there shall be substituted the following Rules:-
 - "13. (1) The party giving notice of trial may set the cause down for hearing by filing with the Prothonotary—
 - (a) a copy of the notice of trial; and
 - (b) in the case of a trial without a jury-
 - (i) a certificate of readiness for trial in the form No. 16B in Appendix B with such variations as circumstances require; or
 - (ii) a copy of an order of a Judge or Master that the cause be set down for trial.
 - (2) Such a certificate shall not be filed without the leave of a Judge or Master unless it states that the parties are ready to proceed with the trial upon having not less than a stipulated number of days' notice.
 - (3) The number of days' notice so stipulated shall not in any case exceed ten days.
 - (4) If the cause-
 - (a) is undefended the certificate shall state that the cause is undefended and shall be signed by the plaintiff or his counsel or solicitor; or
 - (b) is defended the certificate shall be signed by the plaintiff and all other parties who have entered an appearance or their respective counsel or solicitors.
 - (5) Such a certificate may contain a statement to the effect that the persons signing the certificate have considered the issues in the cause and are of opinion that the trial can reasonably be expected not to occupy more than a day and a half.
 - 13a. If the party giving notice of trial fails within five days after giving the notice to set down the cause the party to whom the notice has been given may upon compliance with Rule 13 set down the cause. Unless within nine days after notice of trial is given the cause is set down by one party or the other the notice of trial shall be no longer in force.
 - 13B. If, in the case of a trial without a jury, the plaintiff or any party who has entered an appearance refuses to complete a certificate of readiness for trial any party may apply to a Master for an order that the cause be set down for trial. On the making of any such order the Master may give such directions as to the listing of the cause as he thinks fit."
- (b) For Rule 16 there shall be substituted the following Rule:—
 - "16. Upon the filing of the copy of notice of trial and, where appropriate, a certificate of readiness for trial the Prothonotary shall, unless a Judge otherwise orders, enter the cause in the appropriate list for trial."
- (c) For Rule 20 there shall be substituted the following Rule:—
 - "20. (1) Separate lists of trials with juries and trials without juries to be tried at the sittings in Melbourne shall be prepared by the Prothonotary and the list of trials without juries shall be divided into two parts.
 - (2) In Part One of the list shall be entered all trials which have been certified to be trials which can reasonably be expected not to occupy more than a day and a half.
 - (3) In Part Two of the list of trials without juries shall be entered all other causes.
 - (4) Upon a request in writing signed by or on behalf of the plaintiff and all other parties who have appeared that a cause entered for hearing be withdrawn from the next list or the next two lists of causes for trial the Prothonotary may comply with such request subject to any order of the Court or a Judge.

2. At the end of Form 16A of Appendix B there shall be inserted the following Form:-No. 16B. CERTIFICATE OF READINESS FOR TRIAL. WE the undersigned certify as follows:— (1) All necessary interlocutory steps in this cause have been completed and this cause is in our opinion ready for trial upon the parties or their solicitors having not less than *..... days' notice. (2) This cause is undefended or is defended by [Insert names of parties defending] (3) This cause can reasonably be expected not to occupy more than a day and a half.** Signed..... Copies of the Authority's plans and/or designs of individual house drainage will be furnished by the Authority upon application and payment for the same and subject to such conditions as follows:—

- (a) (i) Where the Authority designs the work and has same carried out for the owner, a charge shall be made equal to ten per centum (10%) on the capital cost of the work for designing, specifying, letting contract, and supervising all details in connexion with such work.
 - (ii) Consent for additions to and/or amendment of approved plans or to works previously approved will be made only on the application of the owner or his authorized agent, and on payment of a fee of Fifteen shillings (15s.).
- (b) When the Authority designs the work for the owner and the owner then carries out his own work-
 - For plan of design, a fee of Three pounds (£3), plus Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) for each fitting.
 - (ii) For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Fifteen shillings (15s.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.
 - (iii) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's Inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.), plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
 - (iv) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's Inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten (10) fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
 - (v) For the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer and charting the work on the Authority's plans, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings or part of ten fittings in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.

(vi) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work. The house connexion will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

(c) Where an owner designs to carries out his own work—

- (i) For the supply of a block plan, a fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.). For tenements exceeding 4,000 square feet in ground floor area and/or properties exceeding 2 acres in extent, an additional fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) shall be charged for each additional 4,000 square feet, or part thereof, and/or for each additional 2 acres, or part thereof.
- (ii) The owner shall submit for examination a properly drawn design on tracing cloth or good quality paper and a type-written specification. The design and specification shall be supplied to the Authority in triplicate. The work shall not proceed until the owner's design and specification have been approved by the Engineer and the third copy returned to him with the official endorsement.
- (iii) For the examination of the owner's plan of design and specification, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each plan of from one to five fittings, plus Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) for every fitting over five.
- (iv) For examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of Seven shillings and six pence (7s. 6d.) shall be made by the Authority for each fitting or drain altered or added.
- (v) For inspecting drains and testing by the Authority's Inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.), plus Fitteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vi) For inspecting plumbing by the Authority's Inspector, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten (10) fittings, or part of ten fittings, in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (vii) For the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer and charting work on the Authority's plans, a fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) for each ten fittings, or part of ten fittings, in the installation, plus Fifteen shillings (15s.) for each additional inspection necessary owing to faulty work.
- (viii) The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work. 

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WARRNAMBOOL FRIENDLY SOCIETIES RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved land in the Township of Warrnambool as indicated by red colour on plan marked "W" 28.11.60 attached to Lands Department plan marked w 20.11.00 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.371, and known as the "Warrnambool Friendly Societies Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve")

These Regulations are in lieu of all previous Regulations made in respect of the Reserve, which are hereby revoked.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations. REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements.
- 2. (a) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the Reserve the Committee or its employees may refuse any person admission to the Reserve or any structure therein.
- c) Climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings, or other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick or erect therein or thereon any bills or in any way injure, damage, deface, write, or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvements, structure, or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

- (c) Remove or displace any board, plate or fitting or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
- 3. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the reserve, dressing rooms, conveniences or appurtenances therein.
- 4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee, light any fire in the Reserve except in a place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the curator for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth. Every person while in the Reserve chall. or loose earth. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.
- 5. All fees and charges prescribed by the Committee shall be paid to the Secretary of the Committee or other specially authorized officer on demand.
- 6. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, holiday amusements, or any function whatsoever except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee or any club, association, or person renting the Reserve, or any partithereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced and, if for one day only, surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.
- 7. Upon application to the Committee, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the reserve for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and shall pay to the Committee such charges as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at the time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or any thing contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee. 8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection,
- 9. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve or deliver therein any article or commodity without the consent, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained, and the payment of such fee as the Committee may impose.
- 10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserve.
- 11. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage, or in any way destroy or have in his possession in the Reserve or take away therefrom any animal, bird, bird's egg or nest, or any live or dead or dressed timber or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plant, or flower
- 12. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed by such Committee.
- 13. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserve any rifle, firearm, sporting gun, or airgun without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
- 14. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.
- 15. No person shall bring or allow any dog belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the Reserve unless controlled by a leash, cord, or chain, and all dogs found swimming in any water or wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 16. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plaintations of trees, shrubs, or flowers without the consent of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area made for the purpose in the Reserve.

- 17. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.
- 18. No person shall park any motor car, cycle, or other vehicle or tether any horse within the Reserve, excepting at such area as is set apart by the Committee for the purpose, and any such person using such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee of such Committee, and shall pay on demand a fee to be determined by the Committee for use of such parking area.
- 19. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse within the Reserve or in any parking area or along any road therein recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, and the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on such road, parking area or in the Reserve. area or in the Reserve.
- 20. The Committee may at its discretion on such conditions and terms and at such times as it may from time to time fix, lease, rent, or hire to persons, clubs, or associations any tennis courts, buildings, or structures, or other part or parts of the Reserve.
- 21. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.
- 22. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 23. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first
- 24. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

A By-law of the City of Broadmeadows made under Part VII., Division I., of the Local Government Act 1958 for the prevention or minimizing of noises in any public highway or any premises within the municipal district of the Municipality and for other purposes.

No person shall create a noise in any public highway so as to cause annoyance and obstruction to, or so as to be calculated to cause annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such highway, or in any premises abutting or adjacent thereto by the use of any broadcasting receiver, television receiver, gramophone, coin-operated gramophone, public-address system or other sound-broadcasting equipment without the express permission of Council.
- 2. No person upon any public highway shall make or cause to be made any violent shout, outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such highway, or in any premises abutting thereon, or adjacent
- 3. (a) No person shall on any land or premises make or cause to be made any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort (having regard to the time at which such noise is made or caused to be made) of any person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street or read.
- (b) No person shall use or cause to be used any premises or any part of any premises so that there emanates therefrom any noise materially interfering with the reasonable comfort (having regard to the time at which such noise is made or caused to be made) of any person in any adjacent premises or in one adjacent traveless. person in any adjacent premises or in any adjacent street
- (c) The owner or occupier of any land or premises permitting any person on such land or premises to contravene the provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Provided that nothing in this By-law shall prevent the lighting of bonfires with the permission of Council and the discharge of fireworks at any reasonable time.

- 4. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing clauses by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of Five pounds for each day on which the offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court any court.
