PROCLAMATION

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1958* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on the 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".

2. Regulation 152 of the Principal Regulations is amended by the insertion after the words "remains on the said property" of the following words:—

"Notwithstanding anything in this Regulation contained no person shall permit any self-propelled vehicle used or intended for use in the handling of goods to remain on any wharf or in any closed shed except while it is being actively employed in the handling of goods. Such vehicles except while so employed shall be either removed from the Port or removed to a place provided by the Commissioners for the parking thereof."

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

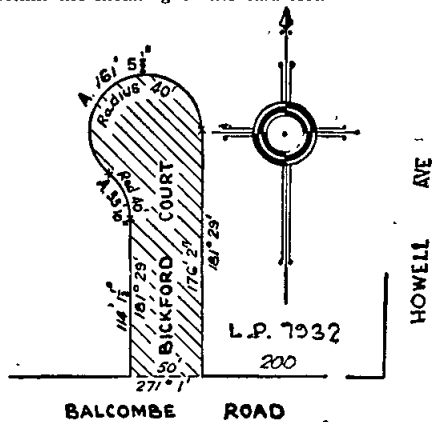
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a road within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land reserved for a road known as Bickford-court, and being part of Crown portion 46, Parish of Moorabbin, and being shown by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

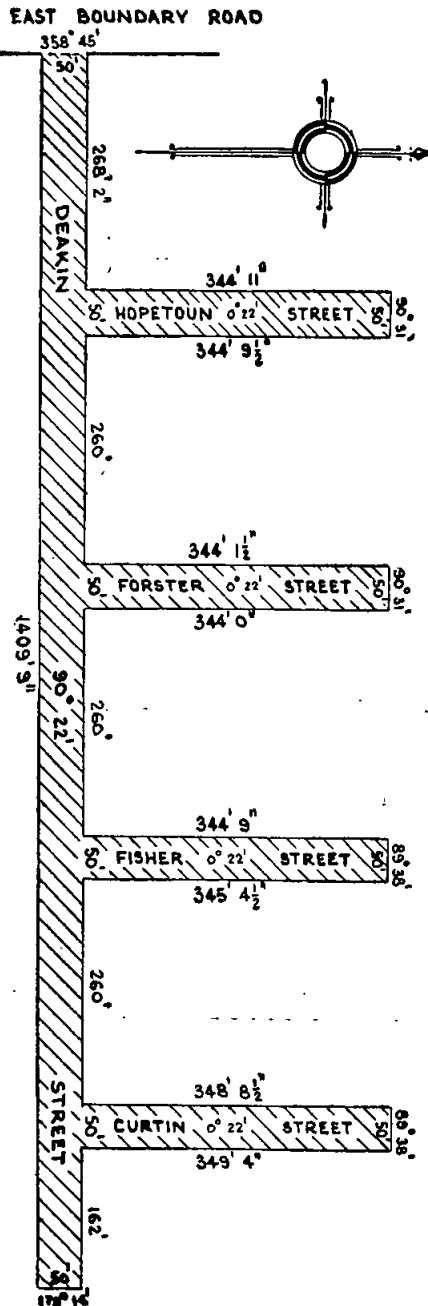

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 48, 1960.

THE Maffra Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Sixteen pence in the £1 on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated in the Maffra Urban District.

SHIRE OF BULN BULN.

BY-LAW No. 41.

A By-law of the Shire of Buln Buln, made under the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 41, for prohibiting the leaving, standing of derelict or unregistered motor cars on streets or roads, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Rate-payers of the Shire of Buln Buln orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Buln Buln.

"Derelict motor car" means any derelict motor car which has remained in any street for a period exceeding 28 days.

"Motor car" has the same meaning as in the *Motor Car Act 1958*.

"Unregistered motor car" means any motor car which is not registered under the provisions of the *Motor Car Act 1958*.

2. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any street or road.

3. Any officer of the Council authorized by it in that behalf may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road to be removed by such reasonable means as he may think fit to some place set aside by the Council for that purpose.

4. As soon as reasonably may be after any such car has been removed as aforesaid, the Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto.

5. If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner thereof and the appropriate charges prescribed by this By-law shall be paid in respect thereof such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.

6. (a) Where any such motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, the Council may after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice cause the same to be sold either by public auction or private contract, provided that any such motor car shall not be sold by private contract unless and until the same has been first offered for sale by public auction.

(b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof, and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person producing to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of such motor car.

(c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof as aforesaid to the Council such residue shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.

7. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within seven days from the expiration of such period of 21 days the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.

8. The appropriate charge hereinbefore referred to shall include such of the under-mentioned expenses of the Council as are applicable:—

(a) The sum equivalent to Five shillings for each mile or part thereof of the distance between the place where such motor car was left standing to the place set aside by the Council pursuant to clause 3 hereof, but in no case shall such sum be less than Two pounds.

(b) The costs of advertising the notices pursuant to clause 4 hereof.

(c) Any auctioneer's fee and other charges of expenses reasonably incurred by the Council for the removal, storage, sale or disposal of any such motor car.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Buln Buln.

SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

BY-LAW No. 21.

A By-law of the Shire of Dundas, made under section 197 (1) (ii), 212, 213 (ii), 222, 228 (i) of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 21 for the purpose of regulating the proceedings of meetings of the Council of the Shire of Dundas and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, The President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dundas order as follows:—

1. The Council may confirm the minutes of an ordinary or special meeting at that meeting.

2. Unless the minutes of any meeting are confirmed at the meeting to which those minutes relate the same shall be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council.

3. When the minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council—

(a) not later than 48 hours before the time fixed for the holding of such next meeting a copy of the minutes shall be delivered or posted to each Councillor, together with the agenda for that meeting;

(b) the first business of the meeting shall be the confirmation of the minutes; and

(c) the said minutes shall not be read and no discussion thereon shall be permitted except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. (1) After the confirmation of the minutes as provided for in Clause 3 hereof and the signing thereof as by law required, the business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect—

(a) Apologies for absence.

(b) Outward Correspondence.

(c) Inward Correspondence.

(d) Matters held over from last Meeting.

(e) Officers Reports.

(f) Committee Reports.

(g) Delegates Reports.

(h) Deputations.

(i) Tenders.

(j) General Business.

(k) Motions of which Notice has been given.

(l) Orders of the Day.

(m) Notices of Motion.

5. (a) The Shire Secretary shall prepare and shall place before each meeting of the Council a summary of correspondence received since the last preceding meeting of the Council and may add any matter he thinks should be brought before the meeting as late correspondence.

(b) No correspondence shall be read in full at any meeting of the Council unless a Councillor, an officer or writer of the letter requests that any particular item or items of correspondence be so read.

6. (a) Special and committee meetings shall be held in camera unless at least a majority of the whole Council votes in favour of the meeting or some part of it being held with open doors.

(b) Officers of the Shire and persons engaged by the Shire to advise the Council may attend a meeting held in camera unless the Council otherwise directs.

7. All notices of motion (where notice of motion is required by law to be given) shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the Shire Secretary at the close of the meeting of Council, or at such time before the next meeting of the Council as will permit the Shire Secretary to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for special meetings, and the Shire Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

8. No notice need be given of any amendment.

9. (a) The Shire Secretary shall record in the rough minutes all motions moved and seconded at a meeting of the Council.

(b) A motion moved at a meeting of the Council need not be reduced into writing by the mover.

10. (a) It shall be necessary to keep minutes of the proceedings of any Committee.

(b) All reports of Committees shall contain a recommendation to the Council on the matters considered and shall be signed by the Chairman of the Committee.

(c) If a Committee is empowered by the Council to make decisions or take a particular course of action, then the Committee shall make a report of such action to the Council.

11. (a) Plans and specifications for any public work (other than urgent works) shall be laid before the Council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon and be open for inspection by any Ratepayer during that time.

(b) Plans and specifications for public work deemed urgent by the Council may be considered and ordered upon at any meeting of the Council.

12. (a) A deputation wishing to be heard by the Council shall make a written request to the Shire Secretary not less than 24 hours prior to the latest time for delivering a notice of business: i.e., the last Thursday in each month.

(b) A request under this Clause shall specify the name and address of a person authorized to receive notice on behalf of the deputation.

(c) The Shire Secretary shall inform the Shire President of the request.

(d) Unless otherwise directed by the Shire President, the Shire Secretary shall list the hearing of the deputation on the next Ordinary Meeting Agenda.

(e) If the deputation is listed for hearing the Shire Secretary shall give to the person specified in the request, written notice of the time and date and place of the Meeting at which it will be heard.

13. (a) Only three speakers may address the Council on behalf of the deputation.

(b) If members of the deputation other than the appointed speakers interject or attempt to address the Council the Shire President shall read sub-clause 16 (i) to the deputation.

(c) If there are further interjections or attempts to address the Council after this sub-clause has been read the Shire President shall read it to the deputation a second time and upon any further interruption the Shire President shall call on the next business and the deputation shall not be heard further.

14. No member of a deputation other than the three speakers on its behalf may stand upon the floor of the Council Chambers.

15. (a) If a Councillor who has given a notice of motion will be absent from the meeting for which the notice was given he may ask the Shire President or Shire Secretary to inform the meeting of the reason for his absence and of his desire that the notice of motion be held over until the next Ordinary Meeting.

(b) Notwithstanding any request under this Clause if a Councillor who has given notice of motion—

- (i) is absent from any part of the Meeting for which the notice was given; or
- (ii) does not move the motion when it is called by the Chairman; any other Councillor may himself move the motion forthwith.

16. (a) The procedure upon any motion or amendment is—

- (i) the mover reads it without speaking to it; and
- (ii) the seconder says—"Seconded" without speaking to it.

(b) A motion or amendment which is not seconded lapses.

(c) Should the mover of a motion be unable to obtain a seconder for his motion then he may ask permission of the Chairman to speak on the motion.

17. (a) If a motion or amendment is seconded—

- (i) the Chairman asks—"Is the motion opposed?" or "Is the amendment opposed?"
- (ii) any Councillor may ask the Chairman for further information; and
- (iii) if no Councillor indicates opposition the Chairman declares the motion or amendment carried and it shall be treated in law as having been passed unanimously.

(b) If any Councillor indicates opposition to a motion or amendment which has been seconded, or requires further information—

- (i) the mover addresses the Council upon it;
- (ii) the seconder speaks to it; and
- (iii) it is open to debate.

18. (a) Except in the case of sickness or infirmity a Councillor rises when speaking at a Council Meeting.

(b) The Chairman remains seated when speaking at a Council Meeting.

(c) It is not necessary to rise when speaking at a Committee Meeting.

19. (a) No Councillor when speaking shall be interrupted except by the Chairman or upon a point of order.

(b) If a Councillor is interrupted by the Chairman or upon a point of order he shall remain silent until the Chairman has ceased speaking or the point of order has been disposed of.

20. In case of competition for the right to speak the Chairman decides the order in which the Councillors concerned are to be heard.

21. (a) Save that the mover of a motion has a right of reply no Councillor shall speak more than once to the same motion or amendment.

(b) A Councillor who has spoken to a motion may speak to any amendment of it.

22. No Motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

23. The Councillors in meeting of Council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of President, Chairman or Councillor as the case may require.

24. The original mover of a resolution shall be allowed not more than five (5) minutes to speak thereon, all other speakers shall be allowed not more than five (5) minutes to speak on any motion or amendment, provided that any speaker may be granted an extension of time for a further five (5) minutes upon a motion being duly moved, seconded and carried by the meeting provided further that no discussion shall be allowed upon a motion to grant an extension of time.

25. (a) A point of order is an objection that the matter objected to is—

- (i) in contravention of this By-law.
- (ii) defamatory.
- (iii) disloyal.
- (iv) irrelevant.
- (v) irreverent.
- (vi) obscene; or
- (vii) *ultra vires*.

(b) Rising to express a difference of opinion or to contradict a speaker is not a point of order.

(c) A point of order is taken by stating—

- (i) the matter complained of; and
- (ii) the Clause constituting the point of order.

(d) A Councillor may take a point of order notwithstanding that the Chairman or another Councillor is speaking at the time.

(e) The Chairman may take a point of order although it has not been taken by any Councillor.

26. A Councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

27. The Chairman may adjourn the Meeting to consider a point of order but shall otherwise rule upon it as soon as it is taken.

28. (a) A Councillor may move that the Chairman's ruling be disagreed with.

(b) A motion under this Clause—

- (i) shall specify the ruling to be substituted for the Chairman's ruling;
- (ii) shall be considered in priority to any other business; and
- (iii) if carried shall be acted upon instead of the ruling given by the Chairman.

29. No Councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on Councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

30. Whenever any Councillor makes use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Councillor, the Councillor so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Council.

31. Any Councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw or to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

32. Any person not being a Councillor, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Council, is guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who does not leave when lawfully requested by the Chairman so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

33. Any such person who being lawfully requested by the Chairman to leave any such meeting may be forthwith removed, and any constable or peace officer or any person requested by the Chairman so to do, may remove such person.

34. Any Councillor may or might demand the production of any documents of the Council applying to the question under discussion.

35. (a) Except as provided by section 181 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, all Councillors shall vote.

(b) The Chairman has—

(i) a deliberative vote; and

(ii) if there is an equal division of votes—a casting vote.

(iii) The Chairman has no casting vote upon the election of a Chairman.

(c) Should more than one candidate be nominated for the position of Chairman and there are an equal division of votes, then the decision shall be made by lots. Procedure to be as follows:—

As many pieces of paper as there are candidates—marking one piece with the word “elected” and leaving the other piece blank. These shall be placed in a receptacle, and each candidate shall take one out, the one with the words “elected” on it shall be Chairman.

(d) All questions shall be decided by open voting.

36. (a) The Chairman without being so requested may direct the Shire Secretary to read the question motion or amendment to the Meeting before the vote is taken.

(b) Before any matter is put to the vote a Councillor may require that the question motion or amendment be read again.

37. Save that a Councillor may demand a division Councillors shall remain seated in silence while a vote is being taken.

38. The Chairman may direct that the vote be recounted as often as may be necessary for him to satisfy himself as to the result.

39. Whenever a division is demanded by any Councillor, the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the Chairman.

40. (a) The Chairman may direct or a Councillor may demand a division.

(b) When a division is directed or demanded the vote already taken shall be treated as a nullity and the division shall decide the question motion or amendment.

(c) The Shire Secretary shall record the names of the Councillors voting in the affirmative and of those voting in the negative on a division.

41. The Chairman shall declare the result of the vote or division as soon as it is taken.

42. Except upon a motion to rescind or alter it no resolution shall be discussed after the vote upon it has been declared.

43. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

44. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

45. Any Councillor may protest against any resolution of the Council and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council by the protesting Councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such Councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest is given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Council.

46. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the Councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may at the next meeting of the Council be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

47. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such debate may at the next meeting of the Council be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

48. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice has been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the municipal district inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

49. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

50. No officer of the Council may partake in any discussion before the Council table unless called upon to do so by any Councillor for an explanation on the matter discussed or having first obtained permission from the Chairman to speak.

51. Any matter affecting an officer of this Council shall be brought to the attention of the President immediately, who then shall take control of the matter. Any irregularities in the affairs of the Council must also be brought to the attention of the Shire President immediately.

52. The common seal of the Council shall be kept by the Shire Secretary in a safe place and shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of the Council and in the presence of the Shire President and one other Councillor and the Shire Secretary, or in the absence of the Shire President then in the presence of two Councillors and the Shire Secretary.

53. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained or incorporated in this By-law may be suspended for a special purpose on the affirmative vote of not less than five Councillors.

54. If any officer of this Shire resigns, is absent, incapable of acting or refuses to act, as is provided in the *Local Government Act*, then the Council may appoint an officer to an acting position until a permanent appointment has been made as in accordance with section 48 of this By-law and section 158 (i) of the *Local Government Act 1958*.

55. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Dundas.

56. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

2. No person shall plant on any private property situate at the junction of streets or roads any tree, shrub, or hedge abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom, or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads.

3. The owner of any property situate at the junction of any streets or roads shall within fourteen days after the giving by the Shire Secretary of notice, in writing, so requiring—

(a) remove or lop any trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the coming into operation of this By-law) from or on private property so situate where such trees, shrubs or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet

of such street or road, or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads;

- (b) reduce to a height not exceeding 3 feet 6 inches any portion of a fence within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

4. The Council may at the expense of the owner—

- (a) remove or lop any trees, shrubs or hedges which are not removed or lopped in compliance with any notice served in accordance with clause 3 (a) of this By-law;

- (b) reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height in compliance with any notice served in accordance with clause 3 (b) of this By-law.

5. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
