
I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Macedon, Woodend, and Mount Macedon Water Supply Catchments.

Commencing at a point in the Parish of Macedon on the Stony or Willimigongon Creek downstream from the Macedon storage reservoir on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 18, section IV.; thence north-westerly across Crown allotments 18, 19, 20, section IV. and Crown allotment A to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 3, section V and along the road to the east of that allotment to its north-eastern corner; thence westerly along the northern boundary and south-westerly across Crown allotments 3 and 2, section V. to the pipe off-take on Turitable Creek near the northern boundary of Crown allotment 1, section III.; thence in a westerly

direction across. Crown allotments 10 of section VII., 16 of section II., 8 of section VII., and 27 of section II. to the western boundary of that allotment approximately 5 chains from its north-western corner; thence westerly through State Forest Reserve to the summit of Mount Macedon; thence southerly, south-westerly, northerly and south-westerly through the State Forest, across the Northern Railway line and continuing westerly through the State Forest to the Great Dividing Range on the western boundary of the Parish of Macedon; thence northerly and easterly along the Great Dividing Range to the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 5, section 5a, Parish of Newham; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 5, 4 and 3, section 5a, easterly and northerly along the boundary of Crown allotment 22a of section II., northerly and westerly alongside and through Crown allotment 12, section II.; thence northerly and easterly along a Country Roads Board road to the north-western corner of Crown allotment 19b, section II.; thence following the western, southern and eastern boundaries of that allotment to the south-western corner of Crown allotment 19c, section II.; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that allotment; thence south-easterly along the western boundary of Crown allotment 23a and across Crown allotment 19b, section II., and the State Forest Reserve to the Great Dividing Range; thence easterly along the Range over The Camel's Hump to a point in a Timber Reserve (south-east of Crown allotment 16) where the line of watershed to Smoker's Creek leaves the Divide; thence northerly through sections C and A to a point on Smoker's Creek downstream from the pipehead basin east of Crown allotment 4, section A; thence easterly to a point on Fall's Creek downstream from the pipehead basin on that creek; thence easterly hrough Crown allotment 5 and 27, section B, to a road on the eastern boundary of section B; thence southerly and westerly along the road between the line of watershed to Fall's


I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Lancefield and Romsey Catchments.

Commencing at the lower pipeline offtake from Bolinda Creek in the Parish of Kerrie near the north-western corner of Crown allotment 50a; thence southerly through Crown allotment 50a, to the road on the southern boundary of that allotment; thence westerly along that road to the north-eastern corner of Crown allotment 56a; thence south-westerly across Crown allotments 56a, 156 and 155 to the most northerly angle of Crown allotment 153; thence south-westerly along the road to the north of Crown allotment 153 to a point approximately 7 chains from the westerly corner of that allotment; thence north-westerly across the southern part of Crown allotment 187, through Crown allotments 186 and 186a; thence south-westerly along the road to the east of Crown allotment 202, across Crown allotment 203 to a point on the road approximately 10 chains from the western corner of Crown allotment 203; thence north-westerly along the road between Crown allotments 203, 204, 205 and Crown allotments 180, 181, 182, 207 to the north-eastern corner of Crown allotment 207; thence north-westerly across Crown allotment 208 to its northern boundary, where the lines of watershed of the Romsey and Lancefield catchments join; thence along that boundary to a point approximately 15 chains from the south-western corner of Crown allotment 209; thence northerly across that allotment to its northern boundary; thence westerly along the northern boundary to its north-western corner and continuing in the same direction across State Forest Reserve to the road forming the western boundary of the Parish of Kerrie; thence northerly along the road adjacent to the eastern boundary of Crown allotments 28 and 9, section II.; thence following the road adjacent to the eastern boundary of Crown allotments 28 and 9, section II.; thence following the eastern and northern boundaries of Crown allotment 17, section III., the south-western boundary of Crown allotment 5, section III., and the western

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boundary of Crown allotment 6, section III., to a point approximately 20 chains from the north-western corner of that allotment; thence north-easterly through Crown allotments 6 and 9, section III.; thence easterly through Crown allotments 9 and 8, section III.; thence northerly and north-easterly through Crown allotments 8, 1 and 2, section III., to the north-eastern corner of Crown allotment 2, section III., Parish of Newham; thence in the Parish of Rochford, northerly along the road to the west of Crown allotment 66A; thence easterly through Crown allotments 66A, 66C and south-easterly in Crown allotment 66C; thence across the Deep Creek Reserve downstream from the Lancefield storage reservoir to the central angle on the northern boundary of Crown allotment 70B; thence southerly through Crown allotments 70B and 72 to its southern boundary; thence south-westerly through Crown allotment 74 and into Crown allotment 73; thence southerly through Crown allotment 73 approximately 18 chains from the south-eastern corner of that allotment; thence southerly through Crown allotment 73 and 75 to a point on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 73 approximately 18 chains from the south-eastern corner of that allotment; thence southerly directions along the road to the east of Crown allotments 79, 80, 121, 123, 125, 118D and 118A to the south-western corner of Crown allotment 118 where the lines of watershed of the Lancefield and Romsey catchments join; thence north-easterly across Crown allotment 118 to the northern corner of that allotment; thence following the road north-easterly across Crown allotments 4 and 3 and Crown allotments 5A and 5B and continuing along boundary between Crown allotments 94 and 93 to the northern corner of Crown allotment 93; thence south-easterly and southerly through Crown allotments 94 and 93 to the northern corner of Crown allotment in the Parish of Rochford; thence south-easterly through Crown allotments 96, 90D, 92, 91A, 91B and again 91A to a point on the eastern boundary of Crown allo

ALTERATION OF EIGHTH FIRE CONTROL REGION AND ADDITION TO AND EXCISION FROM URBAN FIRE DISTRICTS THEREIN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c,. &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control of the country area. trol regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958, it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette-

- (a) add any area to or excise any area from any fire control region;

(b) add any area to or excise any area from any urban fire district; and
(c) amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any region or divide or redivide the area comprised in rural fire districts in any region into new rural fire districts:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable to make various alterations to the Eighth fire control region and the urban fire districts and the rural fire district therein:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Act and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation--

- (a) excise from the Eighth fire control region the municipal district of the Shire of Dandenong and that portion of the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin within the Eighth fire control
- (b) excise from the urban fire districts within the Eighth fire control region those parts of the municipal districts set forth and described in the First Schedule hereto;
- (c) add to the Eighth fire control region the municipal districts of the City of Dandenong and the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park;
 (d) add to the urban fire districts within the Eighth fire control region those parts of the municipal districts set forth and described in the Second
- (e) alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Eighth fire control region in accordance with the foregoing excisions and additions.

by the eastern boundaries of allotments 2 and 1 to Kirkham-road; thence westerly by Kirkham-road, and westerly by Cheltenham-road, Parish of Dandenong, to the southwestern angle of allotment C of section 24; thence northwesterly by Cheltenham-road, Parish of Mordialloc, to the most westerly angle of allotment 1 of section 20; thence north-easterly by Tootal-road to Heatherton-road; thence westerly by Heatherton-road forming the south boundaries of allotments 3 and 2, section 11, to Clayton-road; thence northerly by Clayton-road to the north-western angle of allotment 1 of section VI.; thence easterly by Police-road forming the northern boundaries of allotments Police-road forming the northern boundaries of allotments 1 and 3, section VI., and 1 and 2, section 5, to the northname and section vi., and I and 2, section 3, to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by a road to the Princes Highway; thence south-easterly by the Princes Highway, Parish of Dandenonng-to the most easterly angle of allotment 11; thence easterly by a line and the south boundaries of allotments 7p and 6 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotment 14, a line, and allotment 15 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the Heatherton-road to the point of commencement.

Standing Orders for Regulating and Appointing the Place and Hour of Meetings of the Tyers-Glengarry Waterworks Trust, and Providing for the Management and Conduct of Business Thereat.

THE Tyers-Glengarry Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

- 1. In all cases not provided for by the Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
- 2. Place and Hour of Meetings.—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically on the fourth Tuesday in the month, at 8 o'clock p.m. at the office of the Trust. Upon motin, at a velocity p.m. at the olice of the Trust. Opon notice of motion the time, day and hour of the meeting may be altered by a majority of the Commissioners. A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual address of the Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day on which such intended meeting is to be held.
- 3. Meeting, Resolutions at, Not to be Revoked.—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of at least two thirds. mined upon by a majority consisting of at least two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting (if the number of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to), or by majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.
- 4. Business, &c., Order of, Minutes,—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.
- 5. After the signing of the minutes by the Chairman, the order of the business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
 - Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.
 - (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
 - (4) Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
 - (5) Presentation of reports of committees and
 - (6) Payments.
 - (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable.
 - (8) Other motions of which previous notice has been
 - (9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
- 6. Titles, Official.—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.
- 7. Who to Speak.-If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
- 8. Chairman to Rise Whilst Addressing Meeting.—The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the Chair on such occasions.
- 9. Commissioners Not to Speak Twice on the Same Question.—No Commissioner shall speak twice on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in the explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

- 10. Points of Order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.
- 11. Commissioners Not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.
- 12. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.
- 13. Persons Not Commissioners to Leave when Requested.—No person not being a Commissioner who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.
- 14. Call of the Commissioners.—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.
- 15. Documents to be Produced.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
- 16. Motions, Amendments, and Notices Thereof.—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated, and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of meeting of the Commissioners, or if not given at the meeting then seven days prior to the day which the next meeting of the Commissioners is to take place, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.
- 17. No Motion Without Notice.—No Commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, except in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
- 18. Motions on Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.
- 19. Motions to be Moved in Order.—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.
- 20. Motions Not to be Proceeded with in the Absence of the Mover.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.
- 21. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.
- 22. Mover of Motion or Amendment Not to be Interrupted.—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.
- : 23. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.
- 24. Leave to be Obtained before Motion Withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.
- 25. Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction therof.

- 26. Mover and Not the Seconder Held to Have Spoken.

 —A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
- 27. Motion to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments shall be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.
- 28. Amendments.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 29. Amendment to Become the Question.—If an amendment be carried, the amendment shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question may be moved.
- 30. Second Amendment may be Moved.—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.
- 31. Right of Mover to Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which question shall be put from the Chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
- 32. Adjournment, Motion for.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion of adjournment be made.
- 33. Protest, Commissioners May.—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for the purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.
- 34. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.
- 35. Order of the Day to be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
- 36. Voting.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and all those voting in the negative shall then hold up their hands, and result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of an equal division he shall have a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from doing so.
- 37. Questions to be Put.—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
- 38. Contents of Petitions.—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision thereof.
- 39. Name at Beginning of Petition.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

- 40. Petition to be in Writing.—Every Petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every sheet on which it is written.
- 41. How signed.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no one else, except in cases on incapacity by sickness.
- 42. No Letters, &c., to be Attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.
- 43. Presentation of Petitions.-Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.
- 44. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition, or otherwise, must send in an application in writing, to the Trust Secretary, at least three clear days before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.
- 45. Cheques to be Signed.—All cheques shall be signed y two Commissioners, and countersigned by the
- 46. Appointment to Permanent Office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the district of the Trust, inviting applications from qualified candidates for same.
- 47. Salaries to be Fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.
- 48. Commissioners, &c., Not to be Surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a surety, for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.
- 49. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expenses of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.
- 50. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.
- 51. Secretary to Expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for the Secretary from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds sum of Ten pounds.
- 52. Addresses to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.
- 53. Suspension of Regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.
- 54. Penalty.—Every person who shall so offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

Common Seal.—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a locked box, of which the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman of the Trust and the Secretary; or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners and the Secretary be present.



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "VICTORIA PARK" RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Shepparton, Parish of Shepparton permanently reserved by Orders in Council dated 3rd October, 1932, 21st January, 1937, and the remaining portion of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council dated 16th August, 1937, as a site for a Public Park, and known as "Victoria Park", Shepparton, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as "the Committee".

REGULATIONS.

- 1. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations, the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works in respect of the Reserve on the 4th of October, 1933, and the 25th of July, 1952, shall be rescinded.
- and the 25th of July, 1952, shall be rescinded.

 2. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 24 in any one year), as the Reserve may be set apart for fêtes, regattas, carnivals, or sports, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Four shillings may be charged for the admission of each adult person and a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged for each juvenile person to the Reserve. Provided that any person desirous of occupying a caravan site in the Reserve shall pay such fees set out in the permit referred to in clause 41 hereof.

 3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 4. No person shall while in an uncleanly condition or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease enter or remain in the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall climb on any of the buildings, fences or gates in the Reserve or in any manner deface, damage, or interfere with any buildings, fences, gates, structures, fixtures, fittings, equipment, posts, trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve.
- 6. No person shall enter plots or enclosures set aside as plantations for trees, flowers, plants or shrubs, nor shall any person trespass or walk upon or over any flower bed or shrubbery except with the permission of the Committee.
- 7. No person shall damage or unlawfully remove or interfere with or dig or cut away any embankment, road, path, wall, or earth-work, or any part thereof in the Reserve.
- 8. No person shall unlawfully remove, damage, or interfere with any life-buoy or other life-saving device, apparatus, equipment or the structures, erections or fittings for the housing or holding of any life-buoy, life-saving device, apparatus or equipment.
- 9. No person unless authorized by the rules of a sporting club or body shall enter upon any building, erection or enclosure now or hereafter set aside by the Committee for the exclusive use of such sporting club or body unless with the permission of the Committee.
- 10. No person shall destroy any bird, water fowl, or fauna in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. Provided that nothing

herein contained shall be construed as prohibiting persons duly licensed for the purpose from fishing in the lake in the Reserve.

- 11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, nor shall any person being in charge of a dog allow such dog to remain in the Reserve. All dogs found in the Reserve shall be liable to be seized by the Police or by any employee or Honorary Inspector of the Committee and dealt with as prescribed by the *Dog Act* 1958.
- 12. No person shall light any fire or allow a fire to be lit or allow a fire to remain alight in the Reserve except in such places approved by the Committee.
- 13. No person shall throw, deposit, put or leave any bottle, glass, carton, packet, paper, vegetable matter or other waste, rubbish or refuse in the swimming pool or any other part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose of holding rubbish.
- 14. No person shall wilfully, carelessly or negligently foul or pollute the water in the swimming pool in the Reserve.
- 15. No person shall expectorate in the Reserve nor spout water from the mouth nor blow the nose whilst in the swimming pool in the Reserve.
- 16. No person shall immerse, rinse or wash any garment or wearing apparel (including nursery napkins) or cloth fabric of any description, in the swimming pool provided that this clause does not apply to any garment while such garment is being worn by a bather.
- 17. No person shall use soap or any other form of detergent in the swimming pool.
- 18. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any shower recess or convenience occupied by any other person save with the consent of such other person.
- 19. No male over the age of 4 years shall enter any dressing room, shower, convenience, or approach thereto reserved for the use of females.
- 20. No female shall enter any dressing room, shower, convenience or approach thereto reserved for the use of males.
- 21. No person shall enter upon any of the stagings, landings, platforms, steps or diving boards at the swimming pool save for the purpose of entering or leaving the water or officiating in connexion with races or acquatic sports.
- or officiating in connexion with races or acquatic sports.

 22. No person shall throw stones, sticks or missiles of any kind in the Reserve. Neither shall any person play cricket or other ball game in the Reserve to the danger of other persons in the Reserve; nor play any ball game in the swimming pool in the Reserve or on the sandy beach, lawn areas or land adjacent to such swimming pool except with the permission of the Committee.
- 23. No person shall drive any motor vehicle nor ride any motor-cycle or bicycle in the Reserve at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public and in no case shall such speed exceed 10 miles per hour.
- 24. No person shall bring into or drive any semi-trailer or commercial truck in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee, provided that this clause does not apply to those motor vehicles known as utilities.
- 25. No person shall park any motor vehicle (including motor-cycle) in any part of the Reserve in such manner as may cause obstruction to other traffic.
- 26. No person shall drive any motor vehicle nor ride any motor-cycle or bicycle in the Reserve except on the roadways or tracks constructed for vehicular traffic.
- 27. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or permit the same to enter without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and any moneys received by the Committee for agistment shall be expended in maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 28. The Committee shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be deemed to be the occupier of the Reserve with all power incidental to that status, within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958.
- 29. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any kind in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 30. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized sport including rowing, swimming, tennis, football, cricket, footracing or any other games, except in portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose and subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

- 31. No person shall bring into, have in his possession, or consume in the Reserve any intoxicating liquor except with the permission of the Committee.
- $32.\ No$ person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- 33. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee or honorary inspector of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.
- 34. Every person or club using the buildings, rooms, erections or areas provided or erected in the Reserve may be charged such fees and rents for the use thereof as the Committee may from time to time consider reasonable and as shall be consistent with these Regulations. The moneys received in fees and rents shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and a statement thereof shall be forwarded annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 35. Persons renting or hiring any site, stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, games, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may determine not exceeding fifty pounds (£50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such site, stand, building, erection or enclosure and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such site, stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee. All persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any orders given by the Committee.
- 36. No person shall publicly address any assembly within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 37. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve or in any of the buildings, structures or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations:—
 - (a) Crossing or trespassing on any playing ground, bathing area or course during any sports or during practice by any person or member of any sports club, for the time being occupying the Reserve, or any portion thereof, with the consent of the Committee.
 - (b) Behaving improperly or riotously.
 - (c) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any sports or holiday amusement or any practice thereat.
 - (d) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.
- 38. Any person, club or society having obtained permission of the Committee to use any dressing shed, pavilion or other structure or enclosure shall maintain and leave the same in a clean and tidy condition. No room fitted with lock and key shall be left unlocked after use.
- 39. No person shall force open any locked gate or door to any enclosure, room or building in the Reserve, nor shall any person use any key to open any lock on such gates or doors unless authorized so to do by the Committee.
- 40. Should any person receive from any member, officer or employee of the Committee, any key or keys for the unlocking of any doors or gates in the Reserve, he shall return such key or keys in good order and condition.
- 41. All keys shall be returned to the caretaker of the Reserve or to the Town Clerk of the City of Shepparton before sunset of the day on which such keys were received, unless otherwise allowed or directed by the Committee.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Harrow, Parish of Harrow, temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated the 15th May, 1871, and 5th February, 1957, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Harrow Recreation Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements.

No person shall-

2. (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the Reserve the Committee or its employees may refuse any person admission

to the Reserve or any structure therein.

(b) Climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, buildings, equipment, notices, fittings, or other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick other improvements in or around the Reserve, nor stick or erect therein or thereon any bills or in any way injure, damage, deface, write, or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings, equipment, notices signboards, or other improvements, structure, or fittings therein or thereon, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

(c) Remove or displace any board, plate or fitting, or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.

- 3. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserve, dressing-rooms, conveniences, or appurtenances therein.
- 4. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee, light any fire in the Reserve except in a place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the curator for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of
- 5. All fees and charges prescribed by the Committee shall be paid to the Secretary of the Committee or other specially authorized officer on demand:

 6. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, holiday amusements, or any function whatsoever except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee or any club, association, or person renting the Reserve, or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of

any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced and, if for one day only surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the

- 7. Upon application to the Committee, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and shall pay to the Committee such charges as the Committee may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

 8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at the time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or any thing contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

 9. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve or deliver therein any article or commodity without the con-
- deliver therein any article or commodity without the con-sent, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained, and the payment of such fee as the Committee may impose.
- 10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserve.
- 11. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage, or in any way destroy or have in his possession in the Reserve or take away therefrom any animal, bird, bird's nest or egg, or any live or dead or dressed timber or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plant, or flower.
- 12. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed by such Committee.
- 13. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserve any rifle, firearm, sporting gun, or airgun without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
- 14. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.
- 15. No person shall bring or allow any dog belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the Reserve unless controlled by a leash, cord, or chain, and all dogs found swimming in any water or wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 16. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any enclosed for plantations of trees, shrubs, or flowers without the consent of the Committee first obtained, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area made for the purpose in the Reserve.
- 17. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.
- 18. No person shall park any motor car cycle, or other vehicle or tether any horse within the Reserve, excepting at such area as is set apart by the Committee for the purpose, and any such person using such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee of such Committee, and shall pay on demand a fee to be determined by the Committee for use of such parking area.
- 19. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse within the Reserve or in any parking area or along any road therein recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature and the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on such road, parking area or in the Reserve.
- 20. The Committee may at its discretion on such conditions and terms and at such times as it may from time to time fix, lease, rent, or hire to persons, clubs, or associations any tennis courts, buildings or structures, or other part or parts of the Reserve.

21. The Committee shall not be responsible for accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground, nor from any

cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.

22. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

23. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

24. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone,

24. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.
25. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games or foot racing except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine. determine.

26. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horse-back, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the

Reserve.

27. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work or duty.

28. No person, other than players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey, or golf), and other than any competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.—(Rs.1733.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with Every person who contravenes or tails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and Schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the manner in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (of officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the Schedule or Schedules hereunto annexed.
- 2. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
- 3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the Schedule for which his tender is accepted.
- 4. - 7. Prohibiting or regulating the use of private property at the junction of streets or roads for growing of trees, &c.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958, and numbered 211 for prohibiting or regulating the use of private property at the junction of streets or roads for growing of trees. &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg order as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law the term "restricted area" means that area of any property situate at the junction of two or more streets or roads which is bounded by lines commencing at the corner of the said property nearest the said junction and running thence in each direction along the boundaries of such property to points thirty feet from the junction and thence by lines running to a point of intersection lying ten feet from each of the said boundaries. Provided always that if the said boundaries do not actually intersect the point of commencement of the said lines shall be the point at which they would intersect if produced in straight lines.
- 2. No occupier of any property situate at the junction of two or more streets or roads shall suffer permit or allow to be or grow upon any restricted area any tree, shrub or hedge which is in excess of a height of 3 ft. 6 in. above the level of the footpaths of the said streets or roads.
- 3. The occupier of any property situate at the junction of two or more streets or roads shall within 14 days after the receipt of notice from the proper officer of the Council requiring him so to do remove, or lop any tree shrub or hedge situate in any restricted area.
- 4. The occupier of any property situate at the junction of two or more streets or roads shall within fourteen days after the receipt of notice from the proper officer of the Council requiring him so to do reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. that portion of any fence which is within any restricted area.
 - 5. The Council may at the expense of the owner-
 - (a) remove or lop any trees, shrubs or hedges not removed or lopped in compliance with a notice given pursuant to clause 3 of this By-law;

(b) reduce in height any portion of a fence not reduced in height in compliance with a notice given pursuant to clause 4 of this By-law—
