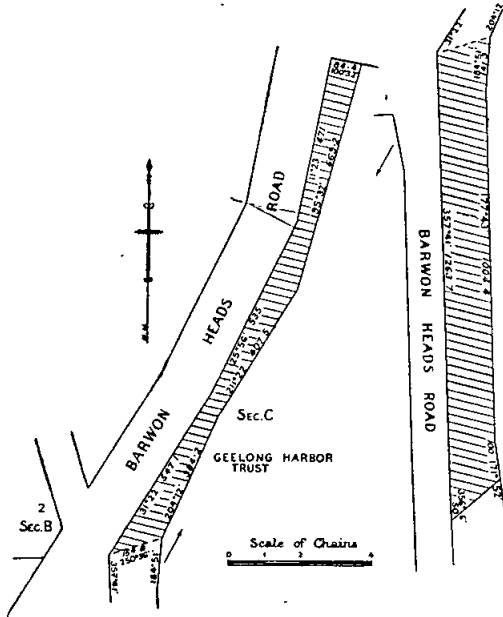

STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.
RESTRICTIONS ON ELECTRICAL APPARATUS REGULATIONS.

Consent for Water Heating Systems Supplied by Named Persons.

PURSUANT to and for the purposes of the Restrictions on Electrical Apparatus Regulations, the State Electricity Commission of Victoria hereby consents to the installation, the connexion, and, subject as hereunder set out, the use in areas supplied with electricity by the Commission or obtained from it, of 4,320 electrical elements for the heating of water, each of a capacity not exceeding—

- 1,500 watts for a 30-gallon container
 - 1,750 watts for a 40-gallon container
 - 2,000 watts for a 50-gallon container
 - 2,500 watts for a 60-gallon container
 - 3,000 watts for a 70-gallon container
 - 3,500 watts for an 80-gallon container
 - 3,500 watts for an 85-gallon container
 - 4,000 watts for a 100-gallon container
- and so in proportion at the rate of 40 watts per gallon for any container larger than 100 gallons

in which water is heated by the element and each forming part of each of a number of hot-water systems supplied by the person whose name is set out opposite to that number in a list which the Commission has deposited with the Chamber of Manufacturers, 312 Flinders-street, Melbourne, provided that at the time when the element is installed and at the time when it is connected there is fixed to the outer casing of the apparatus containing the element and applied in such a manner as to be conspicuous when the system is installed, an allocation label provided by the Commission to the said named person for the purpose of being fixed.

Any consent so far as it relates to the use of elements is given on the condition that all restrictions which may from time to time be imposed by virtue of or pursuant to the Protection of Electrical Operations Regulations shall be observed in the use of such elements, and does not extend to the use of electricity in contravention of any such restrictions.

HORSHAM SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

8. *Water Troughs.*—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Thirty shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 24,000 gallons at One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

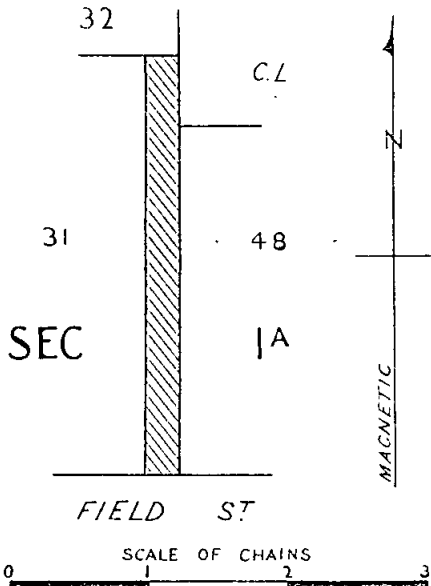

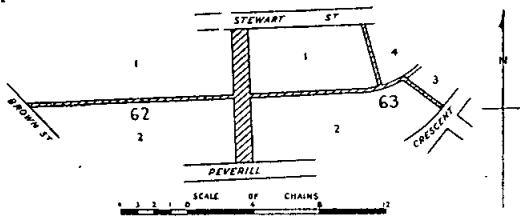

REGULATION XIX.—ALLOWANCES FOR SCHOOL REQUISITES, ETC.—
AMENDMENT No. 145.

HIS Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act 1957* and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby rescind Regulation XIX.—Allowances for School Requisites and Maintenance to Pupils Attending Post-primary Schools and Classes—and make a new Regulation as follows:—

“REGULATION XIX.—ALLOWANCES FOR SCHOOL REQUISITES AND MAINTENANCE TO
PUPILS ATTENDING POST-PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND CLASSES.

1. The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, grant allowances to pupils attending State high schools, higher elementary schools, girls' secondary schools, technical schools, central schools, central classes, consolidated schools, group schools and post-primary schools in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned.

2. In this regulation except where stated otherwise 'approved' means 'approved by the Director'.

3. Where the total income from all sources of the parents or guardians of a pupil does not exceed the basic wage plus an amount of Fifteen shillings for the third and each dependent successive child not in receipt of an income of One pound or more weekly—

(a) an allowance for school requisites up to Four pounds per annum may be granted to a pupil taking the first or second year of the post-primary course at a State high school, higher elementary school, girls' secondary school, junior technical school, central school, central class, consolidated school, group school, or post-primary school;

(b) an allowance for school requisites up to Seven pounds per annum may be granted to a pupil taking—

(i) the third or fourth year of the course at a State high school, higher elementary school, girls' secondary school, central school or central class;

or

(ii) the third or fourth year of the course at a junior technical school;

or

(iii) the course for the ninth or higher school year in a consolidated school, a group school, or an approved post-primary school;

(c) an allowance for school requisites up to Eight pounds per annum may be granted to a pupil taking—

(i) the fifth year of the course at a State high school, higher elementary school, or girls' secondary school;

or

(ii) the first year of a diploma or other approved full-time course at a technical school;

(d) an allowance for school requisites up to Thirteen pounds per annum may be granted to a pupil taking the sixth year of the course at a State high school or the second or any subsequent year of a diploma course or other approved full-time course at a technical school.

4. (a) No allowance under the provisions of sub-clauses (b), (c), or (d) of clause 3 of this regulation shall be granted unless the pupil is making satisfactory progress.

(b) The allowance shall be used only for the benefit of the pupils concerned and shall not be transferable and shall not be used for the purchase of wearing apparel or of school bags or cases or for the payment of sports fees.

5. Where it is necessary for a pupil taking the course at a State high school, higher elementary school, girls' secondary school, technical school or central class, or the course above Grade VI. at a consolidated school or group school, to reside apart from his parents or guardians, the Minister may grant an allowance for maintenance up to Thirty-nine pounds per annum provided that—

- (a) the total income from all sources of the parents or guardians of the pupil does not exceed the basic wage plus an amount of Fifteen shillings for the third and each successive dependent child not in receipt of an income of One pound or more weekly;
- (b) no allowance shall be granted to any pupil—
 - (i) who has been granted an allowance for conveyance;
 - or
 - (ii) who is not making satisfactory progress; and
- (c) notwithstanding anything contained in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause, where the parents or guardians of a pupil are in necessitous circumstances, a maintenance allowance may be granted in addition to an allowance for conveyance.

6. Where a pupil taking the course at a State high school, higher elementary school, girls' secondary school, technical school, central school, central class, or post-primary school, or the course above Grade VI. at a consolidated school or group school, is residing with his parents or guardians, the Minister may grant an allowance for maintenance up to Thirty-nine pounds per annum provided that—

- (a) the total income from all sources of the parents or guardians of the pupil does not exceed the basic wage;
- (b) no allowance shall be granted to any pupil—
 - (i) who has been granted an allowance for conveyance;
 - or
 - (ii) who is not making satisfactory progress; and
- (c) notwithstanding anything contained in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause, where the parents or guardians of a pupil are in necessitous circumstances, a maintenance allowance may be granted in addition to an allowance for conveyance.

7. Applications for allowances on behalf of pupils shall be made on prescribed forms and, except in special cases, shall be forwarded in time to be received at the office of the Education Department not later than the twenty-eighth day of February in each year.

8. (a) Payments of allowances for school requisites shall be made to the head teacher or principal of the school at the beginning of the school year.

(b) The head teacher or principal shall—

- (i) early in the first term submit a claim on the prescribed form for the allowances for school requisites granted to pupils;
- (ii) pay the allowances, as soon as received, into the school Official Account; and
- (iii) purchase the requisites and supply them to the pupils concerned.

(c) The head teacher or principal shall keep a register showing how the allowance is expended in each case and shall balance each account in the register at the end of the year.

(d) All payments for requisites supplied to pupils shall be made from the account mentioned in paragraph (ii) of the sub-clause (b) of this clause and shall be supported by receipts.

(e) If, after payment for school requisites, there remains any balance of the allowance, the balance shall be remitted on the prescribed form by the head teacher or principal to the Accountant, Education Department, at the end of the year.

(f) A head teacher of a school other than a State high school or technical school shall at the end of the year forward certified summaries of the register showing—

- (i) the name of the pupil; and
- (ii) the amount of allowance and particulars of disbursement.

(g) In State high schools and technical schools, all books, receipts, and records in connexion with the allowances shall be available for inspection by the audit inspecting officer on the occasion of his annual visit to the school.

9. (a) Notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation an allowance for maintenance up to Twenty pounds per annum may be granted on behalf of a pupil taking an approved secondary school course at a State secondary or a registered secondary or registered junior secondary school or other approved school having technical courses, provided—

- (i) that the school is situated not less than 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;
- (ii) that there is no school bus service or suitable transport available for the conveyance of the pupil to the nearest school providing the required standard of education;
- (iii) that it is necessary for the pupil to reside away from home in order to attend school;
- (iv) that no allowance shall be granted to any pupil who has not satisfactorily completed the course prescribed for Grade VI. in State primary schools; and
- (v) that no allowance shall be granted to any pupil in attendance at a registered junior secondary school after he has completed the third year of the course prescribed in State high schools or junior technical schools.

(b) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) of sub-clause (a) of this clause, an allowance may be granted on behalf of a pupil attending a State secondary school or a registered secondary or registered junior secondary school or other approved school having technical courses situated within 20 miles of the General Post Office, Melbourne, provided that there is no other State secondary school or other approved school having technical school courses nearer to his home.

(c) An allowance granted under sub-clause (a) or (b) of this clause may be discontinued if it is considered that the pupil is not making satisfactory progress.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation where the total income from all sources of the guardian, person maintaining or person having custody of a pupil, exceeds the income prescribed in this regulation the Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it and provided the pupil is otherwise eligible, grant an allowance for requisites under the provisions of clause 3, or maintenance under the provisions of clauses 5 or 6.

11. Allowances for maintenance shall be paid half-yearly to the parents or guardians of the pupils concerned.

12. Payments of allowances granted under this regulation shall be conditional on moneys being placed by the Legislature at the Minister's disposal."

REGULATION XXXVIII.—TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.—AMENDMENT No. 147.

HIS Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act 1958* and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XXXVIII.—Technical Schools—as follows:—

1. Rescind sub-clause (a) of clause 40 and substitute the following sub-clause:—

"(a) A candidate who desires to appeal against the result of an examination in any subject or obtain a report on his examination paper shall lodge his appeal or his application for a report at the office of the Education Department on or before the twenty-eighth day of January following the annual examination, or in the case of a supplementary examination on or before the fifteenth day of March following such examination."

2. In sub-clause (b) of clause 40 for the expression "Five shillings" substitute the expression "Seven shillings and six pence".

- (iii) amend such notices by the issue of like notices;
- (iv) replace any such notices issued in respect of patterns of weights, measures or instruments submitted by the same person, by a notice substantially incorporating the particulars set out in more than one such notice; and
- (v) revoke any such notice, if describing a pattern of a weight, measure or instrument in respect of which the relevant certificate has been revoked pursuant to paragraph (c) of this Regulation."

4. The following paragraphs are hereby added at the end of paragraph (a) of Regulation 64:—

- "(xii) if submitted for verification after the thirty-first day of December, 1960, and marked with the letter 'S' or the word 'SQUAT', have its lowest graduation mark corresponding to a capacity of not less than 2 fluid drachms; and
- (xiii) if submitted for verification after the thirty-first day of December, 1960, and not marked with the letter 'S' or the word 'SQUAT', have its lowest graduation mark in accordance with the following Table:—

Capacity Corresponding to Highest Graduation Mark.	Capacity Corresponding to Lowest Graduation Mark.
Not over 2 fluid drachms	Not less than 10 minims.
Over 2 fluid drachms but not over 4 fluid drachms	Not less than 20 minims.
Over 4 fluid drachms but not over 2 fluid ounces	Not less than 60 minims.
Over 2 fluid ounces but not over 4 fluid ounces	Not less than 4 fluid drachms.
Over 4 fluid ounces but not over 8 fluid ounces	Not less than 1 fluid ounce.
Over 8 fluid ounces but not over 10 fluid ounces	Not less than 4 fluid ounces.
Over 10 fluid ounces but not over 20 fluid ounces	6 fluid ounces.
Over 20 fluid ounces	10 fluid ounces."

5. The following expression is hereby inserted before the word "gallons" in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (h) of Regulation 68:—

"subject to any relevant provisions of regulations under the *Dairy Produce Act 1958*,".

6. In Regulation 132, the expression "(except in the case of an instrument of the belt conveyor weigher type)" is hereby inserted after the expression "Provided that".

7. The following paragraphs are hereby added at the end of Regulation 191:—

- "(l) any farm milk tank, the level of which is adjusted by means of movable packing pieces; or
- (m) any weight ticket issued pursuant to paragraph (e) of the proviso to Regulation 236."

8. In paragraph (a) of Regulation 193, the expression "for use for trade" is hereby revoked.

9. In Regulation 200—

- (a) the expression "six ounces," is hereby inserted between the expressions "four ounces," and "eight ounces";
- (b) in paragraph (i) of the first proviso the expression "or less than one fluid ounce net measure" is hereby revoked; and
- (c) the second proviso is hereby revoked.

10. In Regulation 201—

(a) in sub-paragraph (iv) of paragraph (a) the following expression is hereby inserted after the word "nature":—

"and any stock food as defined in and registered pursuant to the *Stock Foods Act 1958*"; and

(b) in paragraph (b), the word "of" is hereby inserted between the expressions "section 75" and "the Acts".

11. The following proviso is hereby inserted after paragraph (f) of Regulation 202:—

"Provided that this paragraph shall not apply where—

(a) the price of any piece of meat is clearly and prominently shown on any such piece exposed for sale; and

(b) a clear and prominent statement of the relevant price per pound of each kind of meat so exposed is so displayed as to be easily seen by the purchaser or prospective purchaser."

12. In the first proviso to sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of Regulation 204, the expression "sauces," is hereby inserted between the expressions "ice cream," and "concentrated soup".

13. In Regulation 208 as amended, the expression "(b) Pursuant to sub-paragraph (j)" is hereby revoked and is replaced by the expression "(c) Pursuant to sub-paragraph (j)".

14. The following paragraph is hereby inserted at the end of Regulation 211:—

"(d) Coke packed in closed packages of net weight fourteen pounds or marked "NET WEIGHT WHEN PACKED 14 LB." shall not be subject to sub-section (4) of section 81 of the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*."

15. In Regulation 219—

(a) paragraph (c) is hereby revoked and the following expression is substituted therefor:—

"(c) In any case where briquettes made from brown coal and produced by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria are enclosed in packages—

(i) such ticket may be in the form of a plainly printed statement on such package; and

(ii) where such briquettes are packed by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria and the packages are in the same state as when so packed, a plainly printed statement of the name of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria shall be deemed to comply with the requirements of paragraph (a) of Regulation 220 of these Regulations."; and

(b) the following paragraph is hereby added at the end of such Regulation:—

"(d) In any case where coke is packed in closed packages—

(i) such ticket may be in the form of a plainly printed statement on such package; and

(ii) where the packages are in the same state as when so packed, a plainly printed statement of the name and address of the packer shall be deemed to comply with the requirements of paragraph (a) of Regulation 220 of these Regulations."

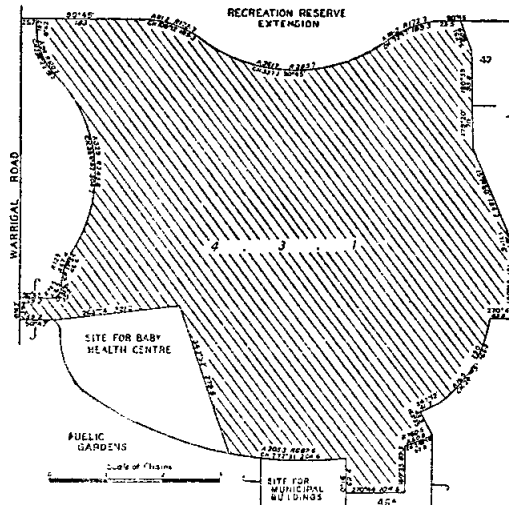

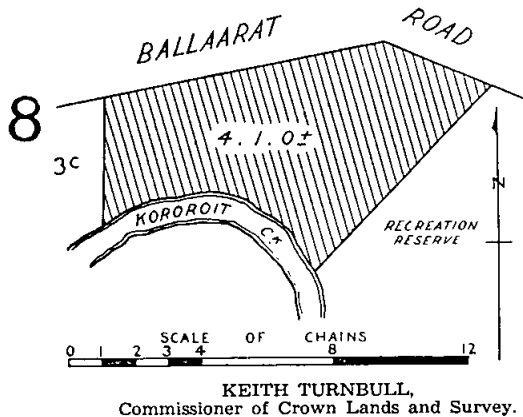

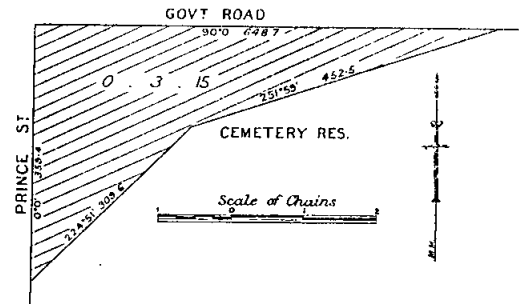

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TATURA SHOW YARDS AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Tatura, Parish of Toolamba West, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 21st July, 1959, as a site for Show Yards and Public Recreation and known as the "Tatura Show Yards and Public Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public for cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Ten Shillings may be made for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except in the fireplaces provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit, any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission of the Committee first obtained, in writing.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purposes by the Committee, and then only on the payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as are determined by such Committee.

8. (a) No person shall erect therein any building, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

(b) No person or organization shall erect any building therein for any purpose whatsoever without first obtaining, in writing, the permission of the Committee.

9. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. All applications for the use of the Reserve must be lodged in writing with the Secretary of the Committee fourteen days before the ground is required.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

15. No person shall leave, deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in a place provided for the purpose and indicated by notice-board.

16. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of breach of these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons.
- (b) Being under the influence of liquor.
- (c) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing-ground area, enclosure, or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof, whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, or amusement is being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, obscene, or unseemly language.

(e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words.

(f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously.

(g) Interfering with or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment, or amusement or practice thereat.

(h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

17. No person shall—

(a) remain in the Reserve who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance;

(b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;

(c) bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

18. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound, or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system, or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

19. No person shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker, except in and upon such portions of the Reserve, as may be set aside for that purpose, and then only when he shall—

(a) have obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee on payment of a fee not to exceed Five Pounds (£5) for any meeting or sporting event held in the Reserve; and

(b) that during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket or have a bag, either of which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.—(Rs.111.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "KENNET RIVER CAMPING AREA RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown lands in the Parish of Wongarra as are indicated in pink tint on plan marked K./27.11.1939, but exclusive of the Ocean-road (Tourists' Road) traversing the area referred to, such plan being attached to Lands Department Correspondence Rs.4936, and known as the "Kennet River Camping Area Reserve" hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve".

The reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations, the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works, in respect of the Reserve, on 20th December, 1939, and 18th November, 1948, shall be rescinded.

2. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall bathe from the Reserve unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.

4. No person shall enter or leave the Reserve except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserve.

5. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass or flowers in the Reserve.

6. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings, fences, or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve.

7. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone, shell grit, sand, or loam.

8. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move, or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

9. No person shall commit a nuisance in any public or private bathing box, boat shed, or other building or erection on the Reserve.

10. No person shall carry or discharge firearms or air-guns in the Reserve.

11. No person shall shoot, trap, or destroy any birds or native game within the Reserve.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. (i) No person, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee shall cause or suffer, or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge, to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing, or other purposes of sport.

(ii) Any dog found in the Reserve except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

14. (a) No person shall drive on to the Reserve or park thereon any motor car or other vehicle except at such places as are set apart for this purpose by the Committee.

(b) No person shall drive a motor cycle, motor car, bicycle, or other vehicle on the sands of the beach without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall park or leave any motor or other vehicle on any part of the Reserve except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

16. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve and authorized officers of the Committee shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

17. The Committee may set apart portion of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.

18. No person shall drive or park a motor vehicle of any kind within 25 yards of the children's playground.

19. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use, play with, or damage any of the swings, fixtures, or other equipment erected or provided in the children's playground.

20. No person shall leave or deposit any fish or fish offal on the Reserve.

21. No person shall, in the Reserve—

(a) Light or use fires save in fireplaces which may be provided by the Committee, except by special permission or direction of the Committee;

(b) break glass of any kind; and

(c) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin can, orange peel, waste paper, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.

22. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound, or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

23. No person shall play or perform in any band or deliver or read any public speech, prayer, or address of any kind, sing any song, or enter into any public discussion on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

24. No person shall bet publicly on any part of the Reserve and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.

25. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

26. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

27. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve unless by consent of the Committee.

28. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth on any site on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth for residential purposes.

29. If the owner of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, erection, or booth erected on any site on the Reserve neglects for a period exceeding twelve months to pay to the Committee the fee payable in respect thereof prescribed pursuant to the last preceding sub-section, then and in any such case it shall be lawful for the Committee in such manner as it thinks fit to sell such bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or other building, structure, erection, or booth, and to recover from the proceeds of such sale the arrears of rent and the costs and expenses of such sale.

30. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, erection, or booth which has been placed, erected, or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

31. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or other building, structure, erection, or booth, erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, erection, or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the chairman or secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

32. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may pull down and/or remove, and/or sell such bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, erection, or booth, and recover the costs and expenses thereof from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

33. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

34. No person shall offer for sale any article within the Reserve or within any structure thereon, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

35. No person shall drive or ride any animal or motor vehicle within the Reserve in a manner likely to cause injury to any person.

36. All persons using any conveniences provided on the Reserve by the Committee shall, on demand, pay to such Committee a fee which shall from time to time be indicated.

37. No person shall use the water closets or urinals in the Reserve or any portion of such water closets or urinals for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed.

38. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area.

39. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserve except on such portion or portions thereof as may be specially set apart for the purpose by the Committee, and then only with the consent, in writing, of such Committee, and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

40. Any person entering any structure, tent, or shelter, or parking a caravan in any camping area shall abide by such directions as may be given by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

41. No person, other than a person desirous of holidaying on any area set apart for camping in the Reserve, shall bring a caravan therein or erect a tent thereon and then only for a period of not more than four weeks at any one time, nor shall any person sublet such caravan, such tent, or a camping site.

42. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer, to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent, or shelter or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary, and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter, or garbage from the site.

43. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person for use of a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by such Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded, and such Committee or its authorized officer at its or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clear up and put in order the site vacated.

44. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission in writing issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.—(Rs.3989.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WYCHEPROOF SWIMMING POOL RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following

Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Wycheproof temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 29th July, 1958, as a site for a Swimming Pool, known as the "Wycheproof Swimming Pool Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. Every person within the Reserve shall wear suitable bathing costume and no person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume, in any part of the Reserve open to public view.

2. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter or remain within the Reserve.

3. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself, or commit a nuisance in the Reserve.

4. No person shall bring any rubbish or offensive matter into the Reserve, and no person shall deposit any rubbish therein unless it is deposited in a receptacle provided for the purpose.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or walls of the Reserve, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

6. No person shall without the permission in writing of the Committee, hawk, sell or offer for sale, in the Reserve, any goods or articles.

7. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the Reserve.

8. No person shall bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve, and no person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

9. No person shall enter the Reserve whilst in an unclean condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the Reserve immediately upon being requested to do so by any attendant on duty in the Reserve.

10. No person shall enter the Swimming Pool within the Reserve until he or she has first used the showers provided.

11. No person shall expectorate within the Reserve or improperly foul or pollute the water in the baths, or shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume, or any bathroom, dressing-room, closet, box or compartment, or any part of the baths, or any furniture or article therein.

12. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap or fitting within the Reserve, nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting, towel, or other article supplied for use in the baths, or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any part of the baths, within the Reserve.

13. No person shall at any time within the Reserve use indecent or offensive language, nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

14. Any person finding any article in the Reserve shall immediately thereafter deliver same to one of the attendants in charge, who shall thereupon register a description of same, and all particulars relating thereto, in the book kept for the purpose, and any owner losing such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the attendant in charge upon entering his or her signature and address, and signing a receipt for such article in the book referred to.

15. The Committee shall not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Reserve.

16. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Reserve by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner, shall immediately leave the Reserve when required to do so by any attendant in charge of the Reserve.

17. No man or boy above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

18. No woman or girl shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

19. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the attendant or person in charge of the Reserve may refuse admission to any person.

20. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with the attendant or any person employed within the Reserve or any officer of the Committee in the performance of his or her duty.

21. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any ball or substance of any kind within the Reserve.

22. No Club, Association or person shall, without the written authority of the Committee, hold any entertainment, performance, sports, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve.

23. The Committee shall have the power from time to time to fix and regulate, by resolution, the fees to be paid for admission to the Reserve, and the times during which the Reserve shall be open to the public.

24. The Committee shall have power to let the Reserve to any Club, Association or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances or sports subject to the payment of such fees, and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and to authorize any Club, Association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

25. The Committee shall not be held responsible in any way for any accident or injury sustained by or to any person whilst within the Reserve.—(Rs.7738.)

CITY OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

By-LAW No. 51.

A By-law of the City of Newtown and Chilwell, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 51, for the purpose of prevention and control of fire in relation to the storage of solid fuel and for suppressing nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Newtown and Chilwell order as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law "Solid Fuel" includes firewood, mallee roots, briquettes, coal, coke and charcoal.

"Ton" in relation to the several kinds of solid fuel set out below shall, without restricting its ordinary meaning, be deemed, until the contrary be shown, to be equal to the number of cubic feet set out in respect thereto ascertained by measurement in the stack or on the ground namely:—

Firewood	40 cubic feet.
Mallee roots	40 cubic feet.
Briquettes	30 cubic feet.
Coal	30 cubic feet.
Coke	75 cubic feet.
Charcoal	100 cubic feet.

- 2. Every person who shall in or upon any place or premises within the City of Newtown and Chilwell stack, store or cause commit or suffer to be stacked or stored any solid fuel shall comply with the following requirements:—

(a) No solid fuel shall be so stacked or stored so as to prevent or impede in case of fire access to or exit from any building or to or from the

place or premises where it is stacked or stored or to or from any adjoining place or premises.

- (b) No solid fuel in any quantity exceeding in the aggregate 20 tons shall be stacked or stored within 4 feet of the boundary of the allotment or premises where such fuel is kept except where same is stored in a fireproof building approved for the purpose by the Council provided always that the Council may by permit, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk allow solid fuel in excess of 5 tons to be stacked or stored to such closer distance than 4 feet as may be set out in the said permit to the boundary where such boundary is a public street or right of way. Where any brick, concrete or other fire resisting wall is built on a boundary alignment of the said allotment or premises the Council may authorize wood or other solid fuel to be stacked or stored within such lesser distance than 4 feet as the Council shall think fit having regard generally to the circumstances of the case including the fire resisting qualities of the said wall and the nature of the adjoining premises.
- (c) Firewood when stacked on end shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not be more than 8 feet above the level of the ground on which it stands.
- (d) Firewood when stacked horizontally shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not at any point be more than 10 feet above the level of the ground on which it stands.
- (e) Mallee roots shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not at any point be more than 8 feet above the level of the ground on which they stand.
- (f) No solid fuel shall be stacked upon the roof of any building, out-house, shed or other construction.

3. No solid fuel exceeding in the aggregate 10 tons shall be stacked or stored within 15 feet of any hotel, boarding-house or private residence or any building within which any person resides. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section any proprietor of premises where solid fuel exceeding 10 tons in the aggregate is stacked or stored and which premises were so used prior to or at the time of this By-law was made, may by application, in writing, to the Council, seek a reduction of the 15 feet and the Council may, in writing, authorize the storage of solid fuel at such lesser distances, but in no instance shall it be nearer the boundary of the allotment or premises than 4 feet or as provided in section 2 (b) hereof.

4. No owner or occupier of any woodyard or of any premises where solid fuel is stacked stored or kept for the purpose of sale shall permit any chips, bark, sawdust, rubbish or waste of a combustible nature to accumulate or to remain on the premises so as to create a fire hazard.

5. If any person by wilful act or default contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law he shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law and liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

6. Every woodyard or premises where solid fuel is stored in excess of 10 tons, shall be provided with a water service and an adequate length of hosing which shall be retained in position permanently. Such water service and hosing shall be approved by the Council.

7. This By-law shall operate throughout the City of Newtown and Chilwell.

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply and have operation in the Townships of Trafalgar, Yarragon, Thorpdale, Yallourn North, Erica and Walhalla within the municipal district of the Shire of Narracan, except to premises registered

as a poultry killing premises and poultry saleyards when so exempt, in writing, by the Council.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, "poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese; "person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of such premises; "approved materials" means materials approved by the Council of the Municipality.

5. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live poultry, except in a fowl-house or similar structure to which may be attached an enclosed fowl-run.

6. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any fowl-house or similar structure a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such fowl-house or similar structure by six.

7. Every fowl-house or similar structure or any enclosed fowl-run on any premises shall be—

- (a) Distant at least 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage.
- (b) Distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.
- (c) Distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet.
- (d) Distant at least 6 feet from any boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
- (e) Distant at least 40 feet from any dwelling, whether on the same or adjoining land.
- (f) Of a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total overall superficial area exceeding 100 square feet.

8. The Council may grant a dispensation from the requirements of the clauses relating to distances in any case where it is satisfied that such dispensation will not unreasonably affect living conditions in any building or dwelling.

9. Every fowl-house or similar structure in which poultry is kept shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material of not less than 2 inches thick, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground, and shall be graded outwards so that any water flowing thereupon shall flow into a properly constructed and graded outfall drain.

10. Every fowl-house or similar structure shall be rendered ratproof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, unless the floor pavement is ratproof to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor of the Council, and all the walls shall be constructed of approved ratproof material.

11. All poultry food shall be stored in ratproof containers.

12. The occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall cause the fowl-house and attached run to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

13. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 19th day of October, 1959, and confirmed on the 16th day of November, 1959.

2. *Other matter.*

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette* Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
