PHENACEMIDE.

And declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the Poisons Act 1958 shall apply to the said substance in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations already included in the said paragraph (2).

THE Balmoral Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Three shillings and six pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Balmoral Urban

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Seven pounds ten shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Two pounds ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied on the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1960, and ending the 31st day of December, 1960, and shall be payable on the 3th day of February, 1960, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in the period without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Three shillings and six pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said period.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.



 - (b) by substituting the following Schedule for the Sixth Schedule:—

SIXTH SCHEDULE.

Part I.

- (u) Any business of a kind usually carried on in office premises or professional chambers,
- (b) the business of a club, a restaurant, an hotel, a caterer for weddings and/or social receptions held on the premises,
- (c) the business of conducting, managing or servicing separately owned or occupied flats.

Provided that any building used for the purposes of any such class of business—

- (i) Has no outer wall or other erection (other than a canopy or awning not exceeding in length 15 feet from the face of the building) above the permanent footpath level opposite the centre of such building within 45 feet from St. Kilda-road and no outer wall above the same level within 15 feet or a distance equivalent to 10 per cent. of the frontage to St. Kilda-road of the land whereon it is erected whichever is the greater from any other boundary and no outer wall above the height of 55 feet from the same level within a further distance from such other boundary equivalent to 1 foot for every 3 ft. 6 in. by which the height of the building from the same level exceeds 55 feet.

 (ii) Has one car parking space of a minimum area of 140 square feet exclusive of access aisles or drives in any building other than a flat building for every 1,000 square feet of floor area in the building used for purposes other than car parking or in the case of a flat building for each flat provided that the prescribed car parking space may be provided in the open space at the sides and rear of the building if provision is made to ensure that no car parked in such place is visible from or within a distance of 45 feet from St. Kilda-road.
- (iii) Has no advertising or other sign displayed other than a sign bearing the name of the building.
- (iv) $\overline{\text{Has}}$ no street number or numbers where not incorporated in a sign referred to in sub-paragraph (iii) greater in height than 8 inches.
- (v) Is so constructed that no person within a restaurant (if any) is visible from St. Kilda-road.
- (vi) Is so constructed if used for the purposes of an hotel that any bottle department or bar is within the building and not visible from St. Kilda-road.

And provided further than no liquor or other refreshments shall be supplied in the course of carrying on the business of a club, restaurant, hotel or caterer for weddings and/or social receptions held on the premises in an area (not being part of a building) visible from St. Kildaroad.

Part II.

Any business of a kind usually carried on in a shop provided that the building or portion thereof used for such business—

- (a) Complies in all respects with the requirements of sub-paragraphs (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) of Part I. of this Schedule, and

 - (c) the depth above sea level to which excavating operations may be carried out upon the land described in the permit (such depth to be ascertained by reference to and on the basis of the levels shown on contour survey plans published by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works).
 - (2) Any person applying for such permit shall—
 - (a) make application in writing to the Council;
 - (b) with his application lodge with the Council—
 - (1) a copy of the certificate of title to the land upon which the applicant desires to commence or to carry on excavating operations;
 - (ii) a properly prepared locality plan drawn to a scale of 100 feet to the inch showing the area proposed to be excavated;
 - (iii) a detailed statement of when and how refilling and reclamation of the excavated area will be commenced and completed; and
 - (c) supply such additional information as the Council requires".
 - $\stackrel{(b)}{=}$ By deleting clause 2 thereof and substituting therefor the following:—
 - "2. Every holder of a permit to commence or carry on excavating operations shall cause the area excavated pursuant to such permit to be filled in within such time and with such material and to such level as the Council may prescribe by notice in writing to be given to the holder of the permit within three months after the expiration thereof"; and
