AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 928 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1958* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any

municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th December 1950 the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to the whole of the then constituted municipal district of the Shire of Whittlesea.

And whereas by Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th May, 1955, the area of the municipal district of the Shire of Whittlesea was increased by the annexation of a part of the then Shire of Broadmeadows.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to such annexed part of the municipal district.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* to the said annexed part of the municipal district of the Shire of Whittlesea and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned part of the municipal district thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 19th October, 1960, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said chapter, and provided, further, that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 19th October, 1960.

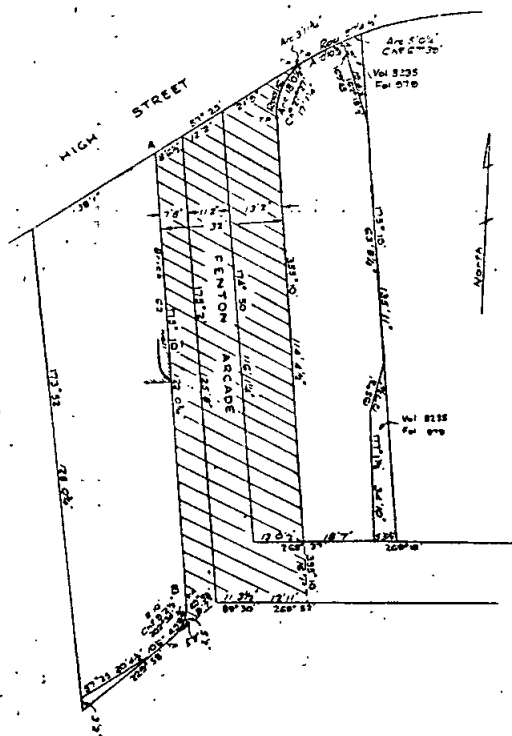
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Kew has requested that the land herein mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land used for a street known as Fenton-arcade, Kew, and being shown by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

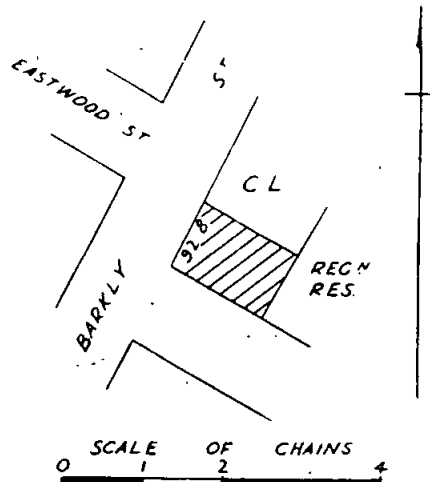

NOTICE OF FIXING ALIGNMENTS FOR OPENING UP A NEW STATE HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF ROSEDALE.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Country Roads Board, under the powers conferred upon it by the *Country Roads Act* 1958 (No. 6299), has fixed an alignment for each side of a new State highway (under the nomenclature "Princes Highway") in the Shire of Rosedale as described hereunder, that is to say:—

BY-LAW NO. 5325 AMENDING BY-LAW NO. 5224.—WATER SUPPLY SERVICES—WATERWORKS DISTRICTS AND URBAN DISTRICTS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. By-law No. 5224 made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 11th day of November, 1957, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 6th day of December, 1957, shall be and is hereby amended on and from the 1st day of August, 1960, by substituting for clause 1 of the said By-law the following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Bellarine Peninsula, Mornington Peninsula, and Otway Waterworks Districts, the Allansford, Anglesea, Antwerp, Barwon Heads-Ocean Grove, Berriwillock, Berwick, Beulah, Birchip, Birregurra, Bittern-Crib Point, Brim, Bunyip, Camperdown, Carrum Downs, Carwar, Chelsea-Frankston, Chillingollah, Chinkapook, Cobden, Cohuna, Corop, Cranbourne, Culgoa, Dandenong-Springvale, Dimboola, Dingee, Dooen, Dromana-Portsea, Drysdale, Eildon, Elphinstone, Garfield, Hastings, Heyfield, Hopetoun, Jeparit, Jung Jung, Koondrook, Lake Boga, Lalbert, Lascelles, Leitchville, Leopold, Lockington, Longwarry, Macorna, Manangatang, Marnoo, Marong, Merbein, Meringur, Minyip, Mitiamo, Mornington, Murrabit, Nandaly, Nar-Nar-Goon and Tynong, Narre Warren, Natimuk, Newstead, Nullawil, Nyah, Nyah West, Officer, Ouyen, Pakenham, Patchewollock, Piangil, Pimpinio, Portarlington, Pyramid Hill, Quambatook, Queenscliff-Point Lonsdale, Rainbow, Redcliffs, Robinvale, Rupanyup, Sea Lake, Somerville, South Frankston, Speed, Stanhope, Tallygaroopna, Tempy, Terang, Torquay, Tyabb, Ultima, Waitchie, Walpeup, Watchem, Werrimull, Wonthaggi, Woomelang, Woorinen, Wycheproof and Yaaapeet Urban Districts and the District supplied with water from the Coliban System of Waterworks.

AMENDING REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE CLEANLINESS AND FREEDOM FROM CONTAMINATION AND ADULTERATION OF FOODS, DRUGS, AND SUBSTANCES FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Cleanliness (Foods, Drugs and Substances) Regulations 1960, and shall be read and construed as one with the Cleanliness (Foods, Drugs and Substances) Regulations 1953, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Regulation 7 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition immediately after sub-regulation (2) thereof of the following sub-regulation:—

“(2A) which is used to receive or collect any article of wearing apparel, footwear, bedding or any material that is to be cleaned (including dry cleaned), laundered, repaired or renovated in any way:

Provided that it shall not be an offence against this sub-regulation for any person to sell by retail from such room or place any tobacco or confectionery which is contained in a sealed package and sold in the package in which it is received”.

3. After Regulation 8 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulations:—

“8A. No person who is engaged in the selling, serving, manufacture, production, preparation, cooking, packing, carrying, storing, handling or keeping of any food, drug or substance for sale for human consumption in any place shall in that place receive or collect any article of wearing apparel, footwear, bedding or any material that is to be cleaned (including dry cleaned), laundered, repaired or renovated in any way:

Provided that it shall not be an offence against this Regulation for any person to sell by retail from such place any tobacco or confectionery which is contained in a sealed package and sold in the package in which it is received”.

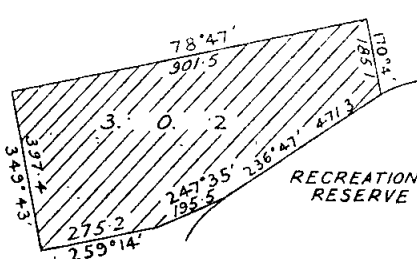

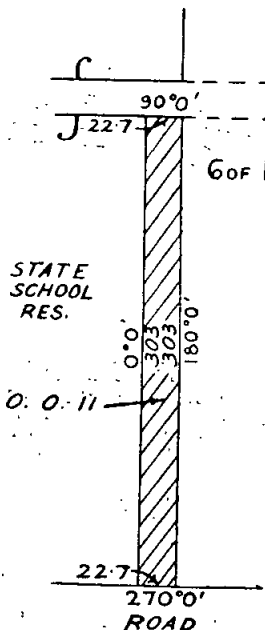

PUBLIC PARK, RECREATION AND TOURIST CAMPING RESERVE



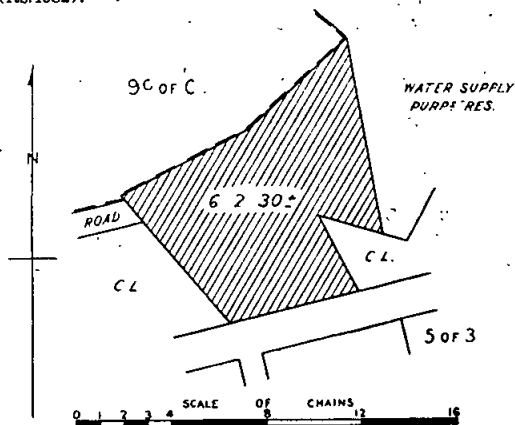

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CROWN RESERVES IN TOWNSHIP AND PARISH OF PORTLAND.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the under-mentioned Reserves:—

- (1) 38 acres 3 roods 26 perches, being the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1873, as a site for a Public Park, and by Order in Council dated the 5th August, 1958, for the additional purposes of Public Recreation, in the Township and Parish of Portland, and known as "Alexandra Park" (Rs.4600).
- (2) 15 acres 2 roods 27 perches, being the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 17th February, 1959, as a site for a Public Park and Recreation in the Township and Parish of Portland, and known as "Fawthrop Park" (Rs.6150).
- (3) 20 acres 1 rood, being the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 2nd August, 1949, as a site for a Public Park and Public Recreation in the Township and Parish of Portland, and known as "Flinders Park" (Rs.6399).
- (4) 8 acres 3 roods 30 perches, being the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 18th May, 1953, as a site for a Public Park and Public Recreation in the Township and Parish of Portland, and known as "Nelson Park" (Rs.7147).
- (5) 1 acre 1 rood 13 perches, being the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 22nd December, 1958, as a site for a Public Park and Public Recreation in the Township and Parish of Portland, and known as the "Market-street Reserve" (Rs.5829).
- (6) 32 acres 2 roods 20 perches, being the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 25th May, 1960, as a site for Botanic Gardens, Park and Recreation purposes in the Township and Parish of Portland, and known as "Henty Park" (Rs.3739).

and hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves".

The Reserves have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Committee may set the Reserves apart for cricket, football or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserves and not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) for each child, and a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each conveyance, carriage, cart, horse-drawn vehicle or motor vehicle, exclusive of the driver and passengers to the Reserve, provided that no

vehicle of which the tare is two (2) tons or greater shall enter the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.

2. No person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserves on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and no persons, other than the players, performers or competitors shall enter into or upon or remain in or upon any room, building, structure, enclosure or area set apart for players, performers or competitors at any games, shows, fêtes, sports, entertainments or competitions, or for any exhibits, exhibitions, or performances at any such games, shows, fêtes, sports, entertainments or competitions, and no person shall at any time enter into any building or structure set apart by the Committee for the use by a sporting body or other organization.

3. No persons, except members of the Committee or its officers or employees, shall enter any part of the Reserves when a charge for admission is made without payment of the fee chargeable for such admission.

4. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserves whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserves;
- (d) bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
- (e) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserves in the execution of his lawful duties;
- (f) enter, cross, be on or trespass on any playing ground, area, enclosure, course or cycle track, or any building, room or any part thereof, whilst any games, sports, races, competitions, entertainments or amusements are being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such events without the consent of the Committee;
- (g) interfere with or interrupt any games, sports, competitions, entertainments, or amusements;
- (h) obtain or attempt to obtain permission to enter any part of the Reserves when not entitled to such admission under the Regulations;
- (i) play, practise or engage in any game or sport in the Reserves at any time without the consent of the Committee, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee shall determine.

5. No person without the consent, in writing, of the Committee shall bring or put in the Reserves any horses, cattle, goats, sheep or pigs.

6. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserves to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding fêtes, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

7. No club or association of any kind, having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of

any club or association, or any other person, shall play, practise, train or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserves at such time: Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserves and play tennis thereon on paying to the club or association for the time being hiring the Reserves, or portion thereof, or the Committee (as the case may require) a reasonable amount as court fee.

8. No person without the consent, in writing, of the Committee shall—

- (a) cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserves, unless such dog be or shall continue to be under proper control on a cord, leash or chain and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person;
- (b) bring into the Reserves any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.

9. The Committee may at any time by notice set up prohibit the taking of a dog or dogs into any particular portion or portions of the Reserves.

10. No person shall—

- (a) interfere with, break, or damage in any way whatsoever any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or cut or destroy grass, or damage the turf in the Reserves;
- (b) climb or jump over any of the trees, gates, passageways, barriers, railings or fences in the Reserves;
- (c) post, stick, paint or otherwise affix or mark any advertisement, bill, placard or other notices therein, or on any structure, erection, rock, tree, fence or anything in or around the Reserves;
- (d) remove, deface or damage any notice, board, structure or fittings within the Reserves;
- (e) roll, throw or discharge, or cause to be rolled, thrown or discharged, any stone, brick, or other substance as a missile;
- (f) light a fire, except at such places as set apart by the Committee;
- (g) spit or expectorate on the paths or in any structure or any part of the Reserves whatsoever.

11. No person shall camp in the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, then only upon the conditions determined by the Committee and in the area specified by the Committee.

12. The Committee may, at any time, by notices set up, impose restrictions on the speed at which any cycle, motor cycle, motor car or other vehicle may travel within any portion of the Reserves, and the rider or driver of any cycle, motor cycle, motor car or other vehicle travelling at a speed exceeding that permitted by any notice set up by order of the Committee shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

13. No person shall park a motor car or other vehicle within the Reserves, except at such places, if any, as are set apart for the purpose.

14. No person shall ride or drive any animal or bicycle on any path or foot track within the Reserves.

15. The Committee may at any time by notice posted up in the Reserves prohibit the taking of bicycles, motor cycles, motor cars, or other vehicles into any portion or portions of the Reserves, and the owner or user for the time being of any bicycle, motor cycle, motor car, or other vehicle found in such portion or portions shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

16. No person while in the Reserves shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained—

- (a) offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale;
- (b) erect any building, tent, booth, structure, or obstruction on any portion of the Reserves, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee;
- (c) solicit or gather money or other thing;
- (d) take part in any public entertainment of any sort;
- (e) preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind;
- (f) carry, use or discharge any fireworks, firearms, air gun, or other lethal weapon;

- (g) leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any glass, bottle, paper, fruit, peel, litter or rubbish, or refuse of any kind except in receptacles provided by the Committee for the purpose;
- (h) engage in public betting.

17. No person shall use the sanitary conveniences, structures, or any part of the same, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then use only such portion of such structures as are specially constructed for the purpose.

18. No male person, other than a boy under the age of six (6) years, shall enter or use any place, room or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any place, room or building set apart for the use of males.

19. No assemblies for sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, concerts, band performances, picnics, or for the purposes of public worship or public speaking for any purpose shall take place in any portion of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

20. Persons renting or hiring or permitted to use or occupy any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the Reserves, or any portion thereof, on the occasions of any sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, band performances, picnics, or other gatherings may be required to pay to the Committee such fee as the Committee may determine, and also to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or of the Reserves, or any portion thereof; and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or by the Reserves, or portion thereof, during such occupancy, hiring, use or occupation, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or injury, and may also deduct the cost of cleaning up any rubbish or litter resulting from such occupation, hiring, use or occupation from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting, hiring, using or occupying shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

21. The Committee may withdraw, cancel, or annul any permit or consent for the occupation of any site within the Reserves.

22. The Committee may set apart a portion of the Reserves as and for a children's playground.

23. No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter upon the children's playground or play on the swings or other appliances set apart for the use of children, provided that parents and others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over the children who are in their charge.

24. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings or other appliances, or from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserves.

25. Any person who shall infringe any of these Regulations for the management of the Reserves may be removed therefrom, or from any property therein, or directed to forthwith leave the Reserves or such property therein by any officer or employee of the Committee, or by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to prosecution as provided by law.

26. No person shall remain in the Reserves or in any property thereon at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee, or by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any member of the Police Force to leave the same.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ROY SCHINTLER RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 18th May, 1960, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Doutra Galla, and known as the "Roy Schintler Recreation Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as "the Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, excepting on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, golf, tennis, riding, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, excepting in the places provided for the purpose by the Committee.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person shall display any advertisement within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

8. No person shall erect in the Reserve any structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public meeting, nor shall any band perform in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, chattels, articles, or provisions of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person, not being a player or official, shall trespass on the playing arena during the progress of any football or cricket match, or any sports gathering, nor wilfully obstruct or interrupt, or in any way interfere with, any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his work or duty.

13. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket or football match, or sports, show, &c., or during practice of football or cricket when any such crossing or trespassing would be injurious to, or cause undue interference with, the progress of the aforesaid sports, football, or cricket, &c.

14. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.

15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, matches, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute

discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

16. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the Reserve, shall pay to the Committee a fee for the use of the Reserve, such fee to be fixed by the Committee.

17. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

18. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee for that purpose, and the Committee may charge and take a fee not exceeding One shilling and six pence per motor car or other vehicle per day for use of such area on such days as a charge for admission is being made, as provided hereinbefore in clause 1.

19. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game, or sports, or picnics, and from time to time grant any club or association or clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

20. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.

21. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations, or any notice fixed or set up by the Committee of the Reserve.

22. No person shall drive or propel a motor car or vehicle of any kind in, over, or through the Reserve except in, over or through the portion of the Reserve set apart by the Committee for such purpose.

23. No person shall at any time play, practice, or engage in any sport or game except in those portions of the Reserve specially set apart by the Committee in accordance with clause 19 of these Regulations.—(Rs.7924.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "SALE CRICKET AND RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Sale, Parish of Sale, temporarily reserved as a site for Cricket and Public Recreation purposes by Order in Council dated 20th October, 1959, and known as the "Sale Cricket and Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve") in lieu of all previous Regulations, which are hereby rescinded.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public for cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Ten shillings may be made for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except in the fireplaces provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, in writing.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purposes by the Committee, and then only on the payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as are determined by such Committee.

8. (a) No person shall erect therein any building, or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

(b) No person or organization shall erect any building therein for any purpose whatsoever without first obtaining, in writing, the permission of the Committee.

9. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. All applications for the use of the Reserve must be lodged, in writing, with the Secretary of the Committee within fourteen days before the ground is required.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fêtes, sports, or holiday or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon.

15. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in a place provided for the purpose and indicated by notice board.

16. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of breach of these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons;
- (b) Being under the influence of liquor;

(c) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing-ground area, enclosure, or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof, whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment, or amusement is being played, conducted, or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee;

(d) Using profane, indecent, obscene, or unseemly language;

(e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting words;

(f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously.

(g) Interfering with or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment, or amusement or practice thereat;

(h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.

17. No person shall:

(a) remain in the Reserve who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance;

(b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;

(c) bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

18. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound, or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system, or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

19. No person shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker, except in and upon such portions of the Reserve, as may be set aside for that purpose, and then only when he shall—

(a) have obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee on payment of a fee not to exceed Five pounds (£5) for any meeting or sporting event held in the Reserve; and

(b) that during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket or have a bag, either of which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.—(Rs.1072.)

- (a) Prohibiting or regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges which may constitute a hazard to traffic.
- (b) Requiring the removal of trees, shrubs, or hedges growing on private property within 30 feet of the junction of streets or roads so as to prevent the same from constituting a hazard to traffic.
- (c) Requiring the owner of property situate within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads to reduce the height of any fence thereon to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. unless the Council otherwise consents.
- (d) Where any person is in default, authorizing the Council to carry out such work as may be necessary to effect compliance with the requirements of this By-law.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Newtown and Chilwell, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and every other power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. No person shall use any private property for the growing of trees, shrubs or hedges within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads so as to cause or allow any such tree, shrub or hedge to obscure or diminish the view of the driver of any motor car in any such street or road or any road traffic in any other such street or road.

2. Where any tree, shrub or hedge (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act 1958*) growing on private property within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads is likely to obscure or diminish the view of the driver of any motor car in any such street or road of any road traffic in any other such street or road the owner of such property shall remove the same or lop the same to such height as in the opinion of the building inspector or other authorized officer of the Council shall be necessary to prevent the likelihood of any obstruction to such view.

3. The owner of any property on which is erected a fence within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads shall reduce the height thereof to not more than 3 ft. 6 in. unless the Council, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk consents to such fence remaining at or being reduced to such a height exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. as shall not in the opinion of the Council obscure or diminish the view of the driver of any motor car in any such street or road of any road traffic in any other such street or road.

4. Where any person fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law, the Council may by its engineer, building inspector or other authorized officer and workmen enter upon the subject property and as the case may require—

- (a) remove or lop any trees, shrubs or hedges growing thereon contrary to clauses 1 and 2 of this By-law;
- (b) reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any fence or portion thereof which does not comply with the provisions of clause 3 of this By-law—and may recover the expense of so doing from the owner.

5. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction by any court.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city.

Any dog so found may be seized by the police or by the officer or officers of the municipality duly authorized in that behalf and dealt with as if it had been seized under section 15 or section 16 (as the case requires) of the *Dog Act* 1958.

(3) An offence shall be deemed to have been committed under sub-clause (2) hereof upon non-compliance with such notice after the expiration of seven days from the date on which the said notice would in the ordinary course of post have reached the said owner or occupier, or from the date of personal service of the said notice on the said owner or occupier as the case may be.

5. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 and not more than £20, and to a further penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which the offence against the By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

6. This By-law shall have operation through the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Huntly.
