ADDITION TO THE FOURTH SCHEDULE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section 25 of the *Poisons Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation amend the Fourth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1958* by adding thereto in Part I. the following item:—

Kerosene of commerce when sold in quantities of one quart or less otherwise than in containers which comply with sub-section (2) of section 20 of this Act and are labelled conspicuously with the words: "Warning. Kerosene. Keep away from Children".

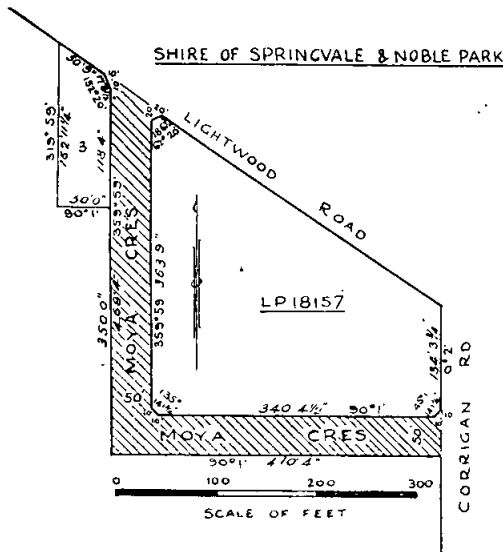
PROCLAMATION

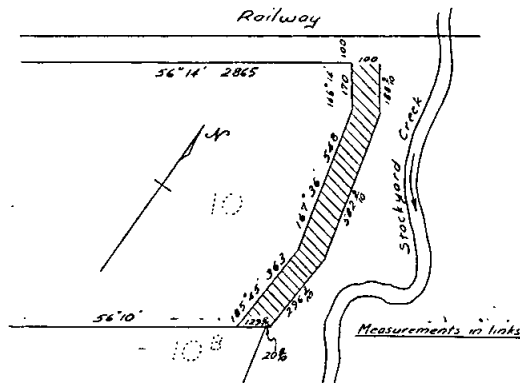

MALDON SHIRE COMMON DIMINISHED.

WHEREAS by Division 12 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Maldon Shire Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Maldon Shire Common by deducting therefrom 29 acres, more or less, of land in the Parish of Maldon, comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 6th July, 1960.

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1958* (No. 6319) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district. And whereas an area comprising the Borough of Moe, the Yallourn Town Area and the East and West Ridings of the Shire of Narracan, together with such parts of the Parishes of Darnum, Yarragon, Tanjil, Tanjil East, Narracan and Moe as are within the North Riding of the Shire of Narracan, has been prescribed as a district for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Saturday, the first day of October, 1960, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed district set out above—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

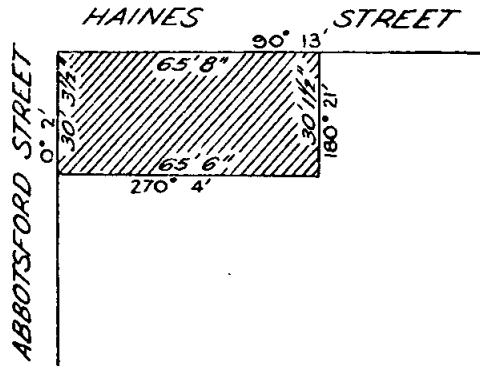

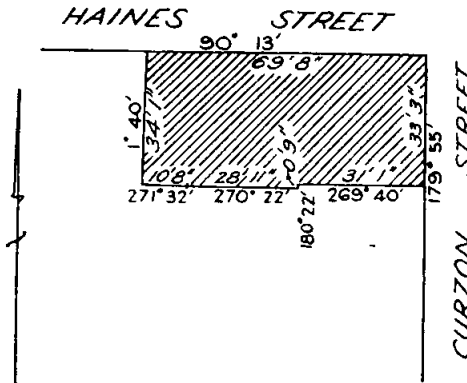

BY-LAW No. 72.

A By-law of the City of Geelong West, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 72, for prohibiting the leaving standing of derelict or unregistered motor cars on streets or roads, and providing for the removal and disposal thereof, and the imposition of charges for such removal and disposal.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Geelong West order as follows:—

1. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any street or road.

2. Any duly authorized officer of the Council may cause any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing on any street or road to be removed by such reasonable means as he may think fit to some place set aside or designated by the Council for that purpose.

3. After any such motor car has been removed as aforesaid the Council shall cause to be published in some newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto. If within fourteen days after such publication such motor car shall be claimed by any person who satisfies the Council that he is the owner thereof or is entitled to the possession thereof and the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law shall be paid, such motor car shall be released to the person so claiming it.

4. (a) Where any motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, the Council may after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice cause the same to be sold in such manner as the Council may think fit whether by public auction, private contract or otherwise.

(b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person satisfying the Council that he is entitled to receive the same.

(c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and satisfied the Council that he is entitled thereto such residue shall be paid into the municipal fund.

5. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car within 28 days from the expiration of such period of 28 days referred to in clause 4 (a) hereof or if the Council is of the opinion that such motor car has no commercial value the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.

6. Where in consequence of the disposal of any such motor car in accordance with the provisions of this By-law the appropriate charge or any part thereof for the removal of such motor car has not been recovered the Council may recover the same in any court of competent jurisdiction from the person who left or caused to be left such motor car standing on any street or road.

7. The appropriate charge hereinbefore referred to shall include such of the under-mentioned expenses of the Council as are applicable—

(a) the sum equivalent to 5s. for each mile or part thereof of the distance between the place where such motor car was left standing and the place

set aside or designated, pursuant to clause 2 hereof but in no case shall such sum be less than £1;

- (b) the costs of advertising the notices, pursuant to clause 3 hereof;
- (c) any auctioneer's fee and other charges or expenses reasonably incurred by the Council for the removal, sale or disposal of any such motor car.

8. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall for any wilful act or default contrary thereto be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Geelong West.

(d) The owners or occupiers of all private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads shall within 28 days after the date of coming into operation of this By-law reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

(e) The Council is hereby authorized at the expense of the owner—

(i) to remove all trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed as required by or under sub-paragraph (c) of this By-law;

(ii) to reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under sub-paragraph (d) of this By-law.

(f) Any person who fails to observe the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence

after conviction or order by any court to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Creswick.

SHIRE OF METCALFE.

BY-LAW No. 38.

A By-law of the Shire of Metcalfe, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 38, relating to the keeping of poultry.

Part I.—Introduction.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of any other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Metcalfe, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district except to premises registered as a poultry-killing premises and poultry sale-yards or any other premises when so exempt in writing by the Council.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Approved materials” means material approved by the Council.

“Dwelling” shall include a living-room, sleepout or tent, and all other rooms used for sleeping, living or cooking.

“Litter” includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw, or dry grass clippings or other similar suitable clean material.

“Battery cage” means a wire and metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.

“Person” includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises.

“Poultry” includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese.

Part II.

This part shall apply to areas zoned as residential under the Town and Country Planning Acts.

1. No person shall keep or permit to be kept on any premises in an area zoned as residential a number of fowls greater than twenty-five (25) mature birds.

2. No person shall keep in any poultry house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry house or similar structure by four unless confined in approved battery cages.

3. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any one property more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese.

4. No person shall keep any poultry on any premises, in an area zoned as residential otherwise than in a poultry house or similar structure or any enclosure or battery cage and unless such poultry house or similar structure or enclosure or battery cage is—

(a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage;

(b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five (25) feet.

(c) distant at least five (5) feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twenty-five (25) feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;

(d) distant at least forty (40) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining allotment.

5. Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed so as to hold six (6) inches in depth of litter.

6. Every poultry-house or similar structure except approved battery cages shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanised iron, jointed brickwork, cement sheet or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least eighteen (18) inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.

7. Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept in an area zoned as residential shall have a permanent roof and any walls to be constructed of approved materials and having a floor raised at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

Part III.—Provisions Relating to Poultry Farms.

In this section, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Poultry farm" shall mean any premises on which there is kept at any time a greater number of mature birds than twenty-five (25).

1. No person shall keep poultry on any poultry farm otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or enclosed poultry-run or battery cage system.

2. Where the number of mature birds is at any time greater than twenty-five (25) every poultry-house or similar structure or any enclosed poultry-run or any battery cage system shall be—

(a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;

(b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street;

(c) distant at least ten (10) feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;

(d) distant at least one-hundred (100) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land, excepting only that the owner or occupier may erect incubators or brooder houses not less than forty (40) feet from his own dwelling.

3. Every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be roofed with approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to adequate storm-water drains.

4. The ground surrounding every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be well drained.

5. The floor beneath any battery cage system and the floor of any poultry-house or similar structure shall be built up so that the surface shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

Part IV.—General Provisions.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry is kept except those exempted by Part I. (2).

1. The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any fowl house, similar structure, enclosure or battery cage system free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.

2. The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry-house, similar structure or enclosure or battery cage system to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean, wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

3. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.

4. Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be moved from the premises from time to time as Council directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive conditions.

5. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Metcalfe on the 31st day of May 1960, and confirmed on the 28th day of June, 1960.
