



## Cemeteries Act 1958 (No. 6217). DUNKELD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Cemeteries Act 1958 (No. 6217), the Trustees of the Dunkeld Public Cemetery hereby make the following Rules and Regulations, which shall come into operation upon publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication every Rule and Regulation heretofore made by the said Trustees shall be and is hereby rescinded.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars in form Schedule A supplied, an order obtained, and a certificate from the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace has been delivered to the secretary or sexton.
- 2. Before any interment shall be permitted all charges must be paid, when the order for the sexton will be given authorizing the grave to be dug and the interment to take place.
- 3. The order for interment must be given to the sexton before 12 o'clock noon on the day previous to the interment where a morning interment is required, and before 2 p.m. on the day previous to the interment where an afternoon interment is required.
- The time fixed for any burial shall be the time of arrival at the cemetery and such time shall be punctually observed.
- 5. The usual hours of interment shall be between 10 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday and 9.30 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, but burials may be permitted outside of these hours on payment of the prescribed fees with the consent of the Chairman or Secretary.
- 6. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required or any alteration made thereto, it must be constructed under the direction of the Trustees or some person appointed by them. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person the burial right must accompany the application.
- 7. Every coffin placed in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and made airtight.

- 8. No adult shall be buried within 4 feet nor child under the age of twelve years within 3 feet of the ordinary surface level, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- 9. A certificate of ground for a burial place within the cemetery may be granted by the Secretary in the form and to the effect set out in Schedule B on payment of fees prescribed.
- 10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Registrar of Deaths, the Coroner, or Justice of the Peace and of the licence for disinterment from the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- the Crown authorized in that behalf.

  11. Before any person commences the erection of any tablet, headstone, monument, tomb, vault, frence, railing, or enclosure, the permission of the Trustees must be obtained, also payment made of fees set out in the scale of charges. Persons desiring to make such erection are required to submit designs, drawings, or descriptions, proposed location, also a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph, and such information as the Trustees may require. The Trustees may withhold permission and prevent the proposed erection of anything which may appear to them as unappropriate, unbecoming, or not sufficiently durable.
- sufficiently durable.

  12. Every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, headstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or other erection shall be maintained in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner or owners. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BRUSHY PARK RECREATION RESERVE, MOOROOLBARK".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in Trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Mooroolbark, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 7th June, 1960, as a site for Public Recreation and known as "Brushy Park Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve"). The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee").

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at such times as may be determined from time to time by the Committee.
  - 2. No person shall--
    - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance;
  - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
  - (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
  - (d) offer any article of food or drink or any other

    commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
  - (e) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed by the Committee on the Reserve;
  - (f) climb, jump on or get over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture, fittings, gates, stiles, seats or other structures in the Reserve;
  - (g) interfere with, break or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck any of the flowers or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve;
  - (h) leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatever in the Reserve;
  - (i) roll or throw stones\_or missiles of any, kind in the Reserve or leave anything therein that might injure any person;
- (j) light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
- (k) carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve or shoot, snare or destroy any game or birds therein without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
  - (1) bet publicily in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee;
  - (m) spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve;
- '(n) erect any building, tent or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee;
- (o) bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee;
- (p) do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
- (q) remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by an officer or employee of the Committee to leave the same.
- 3. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association or person for the purpose of holding fêtes, entertainments, musical performances, shows, sports or cycling events, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regula-

- tions, and to authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.
- 4. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practise, train or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, unless, such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time
- 5. No person except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve when, a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 6. No person shall park a motor vehicle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor vehicle shall, on demand by any authorized officer of the Committee, or an officer authorized by the club, association or persons renting or having been granted the use of that part of the Reserve for the time being, pay such fee as may be fixed from time to time, provided such fee is deemed by the Committee to be reasonable, in respect of any such motor vehicle for the use of such parking area.
- 7. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals or being the owner or having possession, care, custody or control or supervision thereof shall suffer or allow such horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals to be in or graze or wander upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. No person shall drive, ride or exercise any horse or other animal in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or any other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, and no horse or other animal drawing any such carriage, cart or other vehicle shall, whilst in the Reserve, be left unattended unless safely tethered.
- r 10. No person shall take or ride or drive any bicycle in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, except as hereinbefore provided.
- 11. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, and no person shall remain in any building in the Reserve after being directed to leave by an authorized officer of the Committee, or by an officer authorized by the club, association or persons renting or having been granted the use of that part of the Reserve for the time being, or by a police constable or Crown lands bailiff.
- 12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs or flowers
- 13. No club, association or person shall conduct any organized event such as a football match, cricket match, cycling event, fête, sports, carnival, circus, exhibition or show for which a charge is made for admission, or a collection taken up or any methods of money raising employed until submission to the Committee in satisfactory detail of a statement of proposed charges and methods of collection, and the permission of the Committee thereto first obtained.
- 14. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall, upon demand, produce and, if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.
- 15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any football match, cricket match, cycling events, fetes, sports, carnivals, entertainments or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit with the Committee, any, sum not exceeding One hundred pounds, which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure; and the Committee, in its absolute discretion may repair or make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage, from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

16. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or otherwise offending against these Regulations, or refusing to obey any person authorized by the Committee or by the club, association or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being, to keep order, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

17. No person not being a player or official shall trespass on the playing arena during the progress of any football or cricket match or cycling events or any sports gathering, nor wilfully obstruct or interrupt, or in any way interfere with any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his work or duty.—(Rs.3036.)

(a) The Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads a notice, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk requiring such owner or occupier to remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the Local Government Act 1958) from or on private property so situate within the time limited in such notice not being less than seven days from the service thereof where such trees, shrubs or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of such street or road or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads.
- (b) If any such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect within the time limited in such notice to remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property so situate the Council may by its officers, servants or agents at any time thereafter enter upon such land and remove therefrom such trees, shrubs or hedges so growing or being on such private property and may recover the cost thereof in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

#### Fences.

- 4. (a) The Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads a notice, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk requiring such owner or occupier to reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads within the time limited in such notice not being less than seven days from the service thereof thereof.
- (b) If any such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect within the time limited in such notice to reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence so situate the Council may by its officers, servants or agents at any time thereafter enter upon such land and reduce in height to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence so situate and may recover the cost thereof in a Court of Petty Sessions, as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

- (f) The proprietor of every such premises shall cause all refuse or rubbish arising from such premises to be deposited in such receptacle or receptacles and shall between such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse and rubbish cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed immediately inside a gate or opening to the street, road, lane or passage on which such premises abut.
- (g) Such receptacle or receptacles shall be constructed of metal and have a capacity of not more than 2 cubic feet with handles set on each side and be fitted with a close fitting metal lid and shall be kept constantly covered save when refuse or rubbish is being deposited therein or removed therefrom, and shall be kept in an inoffensive condition and in good order.
