LTERATION OF URBAN AND RURAL FIRE DISTRICTS WITHIN THE EIGHTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the sixteenth day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the seventeenth day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions, and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts and the remainder (if any) of each such fire control region (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district: was proclaimed to be a rural district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority, by Proclamation published in the Government Graytle. ment Gazette-

- (a) create any new urban fire district; and
- (b) amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any region:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary and desirable to add to the urban fire districts within the Eighth Fire Control

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Act and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation—

(a) create as a new urban fire district that part of the Eighth Fire Control Region which is described in the Schedule hereto; and

(b) alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Eighth Fire Control Region to the extent rendered necessary by the excision of that part of such region described as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Berwick; Township of Garfield, Parishes of Bunyip and Koo-Wee-Rup East, County of Mornington: Commencing at the north-east angle of Crown allotment 22, no section, Parish of Bunyip; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the aforementioned allotment and a line to the northern boundary of Crown allotment 53A, section B, Parish of Koo-Wee-Rup East; thence north-westerly by the northern boundaries of allotments 53A and 31A of section B and 53A of section C to the north-east angle of allotment 19, Township of Garfield; thence southerly and north-westerly by the eastern and southern boundaries of the Township of Garfield and a line the western prolongation of the southern boundary of the Township of Garfield to the most northerly angle of allotment 35, section U, Parish of Koo-Wee-Rup East; thence northerly by a line to the south-west angle of allotment 20, Parish of Bunyip; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a line to the north-west angle of allotment 21B; thence easterly by the northern boundary of allotments 22A and 22 to the point of commencement.


PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice published in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, count, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby proclaim that all that piece of land used for a street known as Patterson-street, Nunawading, being set out as a street on lodged plan No. 8056, being part of Crown portion 79, Parish of Nunawading, and being shown by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.


