## COLAC WATERWORKS TRUST.—PROCLAMATION OF URBAN DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby proclaim that on and from the date hereof portion of the Waterworks District of the Colac Waterworks Trust within the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto shall be and become an Urban District for the purpose of and within the meaning of the said Acts.

### SCHEDULE.

#### *Cressy Reticulation Area.*

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 20, section C, Town of Cressy, Parish of Cressy, County of Grenville; thence westerly along the southern boundaries of the said Crown allotment 20 and of Crown allotments 19, 18, 17 and 16 to a point on the southern boundary of the said Crown allotment 16 distant 1,281 links from its westernmost angle; thence by a line bearing south 34 deg. 25 min. west through Crown allotment 1, section A, to a point on the south-western boundary of the said Crown allotment 1; thence south-easterly along the said south-western boundary of Crown allotment 1 to the northernmost angle of Crown allotment 3; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundary of the said Crown allotment 3 to its westernmost angle, by a line across a road to the northernmost angle of Crown allotment 15, and along the north-western boundary of the said Crown allotment 15 to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Crown allotment 63, section B; thence north-westerly by a line across a road to the easternmost angle of the said Crown allotment 63, along the north-eastern boundary of the said Crown allotment 63 to its northernmost angle, by a line across a road to the easternmost angle of Crown allotment 61, along the north-eastern boundary of the said Crown allotment 61 to its northernmost angle, by a line across a road to the easternmost angle of Crown allotment 59 and along the north-eastern boundaries of Crown allotment 59 and of Crown allotment 58 to the northernmost angle of the said Crown allotment 58; thence north-easterly by a line across a road to the westernmost angle of lot 2, section VII., along the north-western boundaries of the said lot 2 and of lot 1 to the northernmost angle

of the said lot 1, by a line across a road to the westernmost angle of lot 2, section IV., along the north-western boundaries of the said lot 2 and of lot 1 to the northernmost angle of the said lot 1, by a line across a road to the westernmost angle of lot 2, section 1 along the north-western boundaries of the said lot 2 and of lot 1 to the northernmost angle of the said lot 1 and by a line being the continuation thereof across a road to a point on the south-western boundary of Crown allotment 60; thence south-easterly along the said south-western boundary of Crown allotment 60 to a point being 500 links distant from the southernmost angle of the said Crown allotment 60; thence by a line bearing north 34 deg. 24 min. east through the said Crown allotment 60 and Crown allotments 61 and 62 to a point on the south-western boundary of Crown allotment 63; thence by a line bearing north 0 deg. 36 min. west through the said Crown allotment 63 and Crown allotments 64, 65, 66, 67 and 68 to a point on the northern boundary of the said Crown allotment 68; thence easterly along the said northern boundary of Crown allotment 68 to its north-eastern angle; thence northerly by a line across a road to the south-eastern angle of lot 12, section XV., along the eastern boundary of the said lot 12 to its north-eastern angle, by a line across a road to the south-eastern angle of lot 11, along the eastern boundary of the said lot 11 to its north-eastern angle and by a line across a road to the south-eastern angle of lot 12, section XIII.; thence easterly along the southern boundary of Crown allotment 7, section C, to its south-eastern angle, by a line across a road to the south-western angle of Crown allotment 6, along the southern boundaries of the said Crown allotment 6 and of Crown allotments 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 to the south-eastern angle of the said Crown allotment 1; thence southerly by a line across a road to the northernmost angle of Crown allotment 20 and along the eastern boundary of the said Crown allotment 20 to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are shown on a plan deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.—(Corr. 59/6807/80.)

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Forests Act 1958*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing at midnight between the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth days of November, 1961, and ending at midnight between the fifteenth and sixteenth days of April, 1962, to be the prohibited period in respect to any fire protected area other than a State forest or national park in the State of Victoria situated in such municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto.

BY-LAW No. 5375.—SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION.—WIMMERA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

**THE** State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Wimmera Waterworks District, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of December, 1961.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or



Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be installed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be recorded by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement or if it appears to the Commission that any gauge or appliance for measurement is inaccurate or not registering, the quantity of water supplied in any watering during the absence of any specific means of measurement or during the period such gauge or appliance was deemed to be inaccurate or not registering shall be computed by accounting a watering as being a volume of water 4 inches in depth over the area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water 4 inches in depth over the area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of all lands shall, on and from the 1st day of December, 1961, be Fifteen shillings for each and every acre-foot of water supplied: Provided that the minimum annual charge shall be equal to Fifteen shillings an acre in respect of the total area authorized to be irrigated under permit or Three pounds, whichever is the greater.

6. An acre-foot of water shall be, and is hereby deemed to be, such quantity of water as would cover an area of 1 acre to a depth of 1 foot.

7. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made, in writing, to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

8. Charges for water supplied for irrigation under this By-law shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Commission at Horsham.

9. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

10. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct; any person who wrongfully takes water from any such works shall be guilty of an offence.

11. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the District, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission; any person not so authorized who interferes with the flow of water in any channel or with any works of the Commission, or with any registering appliance in connexion therewith shall be guilty of an offence.

12. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to the penalty provided in the Water Acts. Such penalty shall be recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction.

 TO THE PROVISIONS OF PART VIII. B OF THE JURIES ACT 1958.**

1. These rules may be cited as the "Jurors Compensation Rules" and shall be read as if part of the 1957 Workers Compensation Rules.
2. The practice and procedure applicable to matters inquiries and proceedings under the *Workers Compensation Act 1958* and/or prescribed by the 1957 Workers Compensation Rules shall be observed, and the appropriate forms used, with such modifications as may be necessary, in respect of claims made pursuant to the provisions of Part VIII. B of the *Juries Act 1958* and of all matters consequent upon such claims.
3. Notice that a claim for compensation has been made shall be given to the Board by the Insurance Commissioner and notice of injury or claim and all other notices by a claimant shall be given to and service of proceedings taken on behalf of a claimant shall be made upon the Insurance Commissioner as if he were the employer of the claimant.
4. The claimant shall set out (*inter alia*) in the application for determination particulars of—
  - (a) the summons or other lawful direction pursuant to which the juror was in attendance at a pool of jurors or at any court or place in respect of which attendance the claim is made;
  - (b) the day or days of such attendance;
  - (c) the circumstances in which the alleged injury occurred;
  - (d) if the juror was not at the relevant time a "worker" within the meaning of the *Workers Compensation Act 1958*, particulars of the net income received by him during the period of twelve months immediately preceding his first day of attendance as aforesaid.
5. The certificate of the Sheriff giving the particulars contemplated by paragraphs (a) and (b) of rule 4 of these rules, or either of them, shall in any proceedings be received as prima facie proof of the matters so certified.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE CONDITIONS RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF FISHING BOATS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the 30th day of November, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of December, 1948, regarding registration of fishing boats and providing:—

1. No boat shall be engaged or employed by any person in fishing or in taking oysters or both in fishing and in taking oysters in Victorian waters, unless such boat shall have first been duly registered at the office of the Inspector of Fisheries, Melbourne, and a certificate of such registration issued in accordance with the form marked "A" hereunder. Such certificate shall be signed by the Inspector of Fisheries: Provided, however, that it shall be within the discretion of the Minister to refuse to register any boat or to cancel the registration of any boat.

2. Applications for certificates of registration shall be according to the form marked "B" hereunder.

3. The fee to be charged for the registration under the Fisheries Acts of any boat to be engaged or employed in fishing or in taking oysters or both in fishing and in taking oysters shall be Ten shillings (10s.), and such registration shall remain in force from the day on which the certificate of the same shall be issued until the thirty-first day of December then next ensuing and no longer: Provided that a registration of which a certificate is issued in the month of December in any year shall remain in force until the thirty-first day of December of the year then next ensuing.

4. Every such boat registered under the Fisheries Acts shall, so as to indicate the fact that it is registered, carry an identification signal. The identification signal shall be a group of three letters (not including the letters I and

O), or three figures, or a mixture of three such letters and figures. The signal shall be painted legibly on the bows of the boat, outside, clear above the water line. Such identification signal shall be 12 inches high and shall be well clear of any other letters or numerals which may be on the boat and shall be kept legibly painted in white paint on a dark background, or in black paint on a light background. Fishing boats over 25 feet in length shall have the identification signals permanently marked on top of the wheel-house or other flat uncluttered surface, but if that is not practicable, the signal shall be marked on a canvas screen which could be rolled up when not in use, but must be displayed on close approach of any aircraft. These letters shall be of standard form. (Copies of the diagrams are available from the Fisheries and Wildlife Department.) The letters or figures shall be 3 feet high, spaced 8 inches apart, painted in black on an orange background surrounded by a black border. This signal should be painted from port to starboard, so that when viewed from the stern it is read correctly, or from forward to aft so that it is read correctly when viewed from port.

5. When two boats are engaged or employed by a licensed fisherman at the same time in the one fishing or oystering operation, the smaller boat shall be deemed to be a "tender" to the larger boat. One fee of Ten shillings (10s.) shall cover the registration of both boats when used in such circumstances. The "tender" shall have the letter T over the identification signal of the larger boat painted on both bows in the manner prescribed in paragraph 4 of this Proclamation.

6. No person shall permit the fisheries identification signal to be or to remain on any boat if such boat is not registered at the office of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife, Melbourne, as a boat licensed to be engaged or employed in fishing or oystering in Victorian waters.
