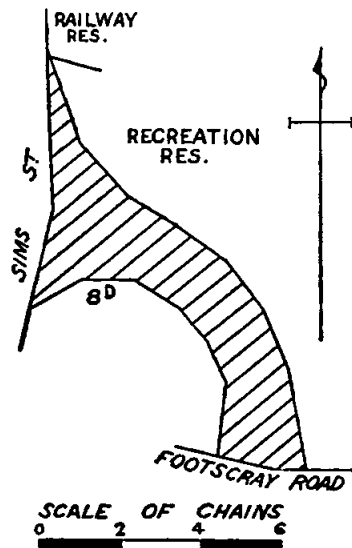

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Forests Act 1958*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing at midnight between the first and second days of December, 1961, and ending at midnight between the fifteenth and sixteenth days of April, 1962, to be the prohibited period in respect to any fire-protected area other than a State forest or national park in the State of Victoria situated in such municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto.

IRRIGATION DISTRICTS—GENERAL RATES.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 66 of the *Water Act 1958* (as amended) notice is hereby given that:—

1. The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission has levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the irrigation districts named in the Schedule hereto, a general rate in respect of the financial year ending 30th June, 1962, of 1d. in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such land, except that in any district the lands whereof have been arranged in divisions the general rate in respect of lands in the Second Division shall be one-half of the general rate for the district and the general rate in respect of lands in the Third Division shall be one-fourth of the general rate for the district and no rate shall be levied in respect of lands in the Fourth Division.

2. STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 5376.

Drainage Rates.—Irrigation Districts.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Drainage Rates for the drainage of land are hereby made and levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Irrigation Districts set out in the Schedule hereto:—

(1) In respect of all lands in the First drainage Rating Division (being the lands against which the number 1 is shown in the column designated "Rating Division—Drainage Rate" (hereinafter called the "said column") incorporated in the Register of Lands for the appropriate Irrigation District sealed by the Commission, a Drainage Rate of the amount in the pound shown in column 1 of the said Schedule of the unimproved capital value of all such lands.

(2) In respect of all lands in the Second Drainage Rating Division (being the lands against which the number 2 is shown in the said column, a Drainage Rate of the amount in the pound shown in column 2 of the said Schedule of the unimproved capital value of all such lands.

(3) In respect of all lands in the Third Drainage Rating Division (being the lands against which the number 3 is shown in the said column), a Drainage Rate of the amount in the pound shown in column 3 of the said Schedule of the unimproved capital value of all such lands.

(4) In respect of all lands in the Fourth Drainage Rating Division (being the lands against which the number 4 is shown in the said column), a Drainage Rate of the amount in the pound shown in column 4 of the said Schedule of the unimproved capital value of all such lands.

Provided that in respect of the lands in the Fifth Drainage Rating Division (being the lands against which the number 5 is shown in the said column and all lands within any urban district) no Rate is made or levied.

2. Such Drainage Rates are made and levied for the year ending 30th June, 1962, and shall be payable on 1st December, 1961, at the offices of the Commission at the places named in column 6 of the said Schedule opposite the names of the respective Irrigation Districts or Irrigation Areas thereof (as the case may be).

3. Interest will be chargeable as from the date such Rates become payable on all Rates not paid within six months from the said date.

4. For making and levying such Drainage Rates the unimproved capital valuations returned by valuers appointed by the Commission and adopted from time to time by the Commission and currently in force shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, subject to the *Water (Irrigation Districts) Act 1959*.

PENTAL ISLAND RIVER IMPROVEMENT TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 4.

THE Pental Island River Improvement Trust in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *River Improvement Act 1958*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate to be called the Pental Island River Improvement District River Improvement Rate is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all the properties within the Pental Island River Improvement District which are rateable in the municipality, the rate of Eight pence in the £1 on the net annual municipal value of such properties. Provided that the sum of One shilling shall be the minimum amount of rate in respect of any property liable to be rated in the said district.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the first day of January, 1961, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1961, and shall be payable on the 15th day of December, 1961, at the office of the Pental Island River Improvement Trust at Swan Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the Pental Island River Improvement Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate.

NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1961.

THE Nagambie Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Nagambie Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Fifty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Thirty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said land and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1961, and shall be payable on the 1st day of December, 1961, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at

a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 210,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

TOWN OF STAWELL WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1961-62.

THE Council of the Town of Stawell, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and nine pence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Town of Stawell Water Supply District. Provided that in no case shall the amount payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Six pounds (£6), and in respect of land on which there is no building less than Four pounds (£4).

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of October, 1961, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1962, and shall be payable on the 10th day of December, 1961, at the office of the said Council.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year, without further charge to any property rated by the Council, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Fifteen pence (15d.) in the pound on the net annual valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Warrnambool Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than One hundred shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Sixty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of October, 1961, and shall be payable on the 11th day of December, 1961, at the office of the said local governing body, Municipal Chambers, Warrnambool.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year, without further charge to any property rated by the Council, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Twenty-six pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Twenty-one pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 45,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WARRNAMBOOL MEMORIAL OLYMPIC POOL".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Warrnambool, Parish of Wangoom temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation and Gardens by Order in Council dated 14th April, 1959, and known as the "Warrnambool Memorial Olympic Pool", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall—

- enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
- sell or offer for sale in the Reserve or premises, any goods or articles without the written consent of the Secretary of the said Committee;
- park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set aside for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle;
- obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed in the Reserve.

2. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

3. The premises so constructed within the Reserve enclosed by a substantial fence will be open to the public during such hours as the Committee shall from time to time by Resolution fix.

4. The Committee may at any time and from time to time close the premises, or any part thereof, for such period or periods as may be necessary for the purposes of cleansing, repairing, rebuilding, or reconstructing the same, or for other like purposes.

5. The manager, lessee or person in charge of the premises shall charge every person entering the premises the proper fees or dues for the use of receptacles for clothes and bathing accommodation and the requisites as shall from time to time be fixed by any Resolution of the Committee, which fees or dues shall be exhibited in plain figures at the entrance to the pool.

6. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to remain in the premises.

7. Every person using the swimming pools shall wear a suitable bathing costume and the Committee or its authorized officers shall be the sole judge of the suitability of each costume.

8. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his or her costume, in any part of the premises open to public view.

9. No child under the age of eight years shall be admitted to the premises unless such child is in the care of a responsible person.

10. No male over the age of six years shall enter any dressing-room, shower, convenience, separate passage, or approach thereto reserved for the use of females.

11. No female shall enter any dressing-room, shower, convenience, separate passage, or approach thereto reserved for the use of males.

12. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself, or commit a nuisance in the Reserve, or bring rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter into the premises, or deposit any rubbish therein, nor leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast off clothes or other litter.

13. No person shall enter the premises or use the swimming pools whilst in an uncleanly condition or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease; any such person shall retire from the premises immediately upon being requested so to do by any of the attendants on duty in the premises.

14. No person not authorized by the pool superintendent or lessee, shall climb or attempt to climb over, onto or upon, or remain on or upon any fixture, fountain, fence, roof, building or structure surrounding or appurtenant to the pool.

15. No person, club, or association shall organize or hold any carnival or aquatic display in or upon the premises without the consent of the Committee nor shall any person, club or association charge any fees for admission to the premises without the consent of the Committee.

16. The Committee may at any time or from time to time allow any club, association, or person to use the premises, or any portion thereof, for the purpose of holding a carnival or aquatic display.

17. No person shall enter upon any of the stagings, landings, platforms, steps, or diving boards on the premises save for the purpose of entering or leaving the water or officiating in connexion with races or aquatic sports.

18. No person who is unable to swim shall use the diving pool.

19. Every person who dives from a diving board or platform into the diving pool shall, as soon as practicable, leave such diving pool and no person shall use the diving pool for ordinary bathing or swimming purposes.

20. No person shall enter the pool before first washing him or herself in the shower bath, and every bather after using the latrines shall again wash under the showers without costume before returning to the pool.

21. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the baths, or the shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume, or any bath-room, dressing room, closet, box or compartment, or any part of the premises, or any furniture or article therein.

22. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap or fitting in connexion with the premises, nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture, fittings, towels or other articles supplied for use in the swimming pool, or damage or write upon or deface the walls, ceiling or partitions or any other part of the swimming pools or premises.

23. No person shall at any time bring into the premises, or any part thereof, any intoxicating liquor.

24. No person shall climb or attempt to climb on or jump or attempt to jump over any roof or wall or other portion of any building or any fence in or upon the premises or propel, throw, cast, or roll any article or thing in the premises.

25. The Committee, pool superintendent or lessee will not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the premises.

26. Any person who finds any article shall immediately after finding the same deliver it to the pool superintendent, who shall thereupon register a description of

same and all particulars relating thereto in the book kept for that purpose, and any person who shall have lost such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof thereof be entitled to receive such article from the pool superintendent upon placing his or her signature and entering his or her address in the book referred to.

27. Any person hiring any towel, bathing costume or any article from the lessee or attendant in charge of the kiosk shall return the same on leaving the premises.

28. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the premises by any other person. Splashing, ducking, riding on the shoulders, pushing into the water or throwing into the water of any other person is hereby forbidden, and any person so acting or otherwise interfering with the use or enjoyment of the swimming pools by any other person or behaving in an unseemly or improper manner, shall immediately leave the premises when required to do so by the attendant on duty or person in charge of the premises.

29. No person using the premises shall at any time bring or introduce into the swimming pool, any beach ball, tennis ball, motor tube or water pistol.

30. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the swimming pool or in or upon any position of the premises.

31. No person shall smoke within 15 feet of any of the swimming pools in the premises.

32. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the enclosure.

33. No boy or girl over the age of eight years shall use the paddling pool.

34. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of swings, slides, or other appliances, or from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.—(Rs.7811).

CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW No. 122.

Rules relating to the Management and use of Public Baths.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under section 756 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 122 for regulating the conduct of persons using public baths within the Municipal District of the City of Camberwell and prescribing charges for such use.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and of any and every other power enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell (hereinafter called "the Council") order as follows—

1. This By-law may be cited as the "City of Camberwell (Public Bath) Rules 1961."

2. The Marginal notes shall not effect the interpretation of this By-law.

Definitions 3.

3. In these Rules unless inconsistent with the subject-matter; "Adult" means any person who is fifteen years of age or older than fifteen years of age.

"Bath Premises" means any premises maintained by the Council as public baths or a public swimming pool including all buildings and structures on such premises and all appurtenances and equipment therein.

"Bath attendant" means an employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connexion with any bath premises.

"Bottle" means any article made wholly or partly of glass, china, porcelain, bakelite, of like composition.

"Town Clerk" means the person for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Town Clerk of the Council.

"Junior" means any person who is under the age of fifteen years.

Words importing the masculine gender also include the feminine and vice versa.

Prohibition of Intoxicating Liquor.

4. No person shall—

- (a) bring into any Bath premises any intoxicating liquor.
- (b) consume intoxicating liquor on any Bath premises.

Bad Language or Offensive Behavior.

- (c) go into or appear in any Bath premises in a drunken or disorderly state or be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive language or of obscenity or indecency or conduct himself riotously or create a disturbance or obstruct, hinder or resist in the execution of his duty any Bath attendant or any officer or person appointed by the Council to conduct or aid in the good management of any Bath premises or neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any Bath attendant or any such other officer or person made in accordance with the provisions of this By-law.

Dogs.

- (d) cause or permit any dog or other animal belonging to that person or under his control to enter or remain in or upon any Bath premises.

Bathing Costumes.

- (e) use any swimming pool unless he or she is properly attired in a bathing costume so as to preserve public decency.

Entry or Use Without Payment.

- (f) enter any Bath premises or use any facility therein without having first paid to a Bath attendant the proper fee or charge as set out in the Schedule hereto.

Bottles.

- (g) bring into any dressing shed, pool, concrete concourse or surrounds of pool and/or any other area or areas as defined by notices and/or signs any bottle.
- (h) break any bottle or bottles within the curtilage of the pool area.
- (i) fail to report the breakage of any bottle or bottles.

Spitting.

- (j) spit in any swimming pool nor on the floor or walls or any part of Bath premises.

Smoking.

- (k) smoke in any portion of Bath premises where a notice is displayed that smoking is not permitted.

Prohibition of persons suffering from certain diseases.

5. No person suffering from any cutaneous infectious or contagious disease shall use any dressing room or bath or enter any swimming pool.

Cleansing Before Entry.

6. No person shall—

- (a) enter any swimming pool until he has thoroughly cleansed himself to the satisfaction of a Bath attendant under a shower bath on the Bath premises in which the use of soap is permitted.
- (b) enter or remain in any swimming pool whilst he is in an unclean condition.

Soap in Swimming Bath.

- (c) use soap in any part of any Bath premises other than in the shower baths in which the use of soap is permitted.

Use of Discolouring Substances.

- (d) use any substance or preparation whilst he is in a swimming pool whereby the water in that swimming pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or rendered unfit in any way for the use of bathers.

Pollution of Water.

- (e) wilfully foul or pollute the water in any shower bath, separate bath or swimming pool.

Soiling of Towels.

- (f) wilfully soil or defile any towel or any bathing dress, trunks or drawers the property of the Council.

Pollution of Premises.

- (g) wilfully foul pollute or defile any Bath premises.

Injury, &c. to Premises or Council Property.

- (h) wilfully or negligently break, injure, damage, destroy or tamper with any Bath premises, or any key, or any towel or bathing dress, trunks or drawers the property of the Council.

Defacing Premises.

- (i) wilfully or negligently mark or deface any Bath premises or any article of furniture therein or attached thereto.

Bringing Chemicals, &c., on to Bath Premises.

- (j) bring on to any Bath premises or place in any Bath premises or in any part thereof any chemical substance liquid or powder.

Deposit of Articles for Safe-keeping.

7. (a) A person may deposit with a Bath attendant any article for safe-keeping subject to the terms and conditions contained in this clause.

(b) Any person making any deposit shall be deemed to agree that the following conditions shall be applicable thereto:—

- (i) if any article deposited be damaged destroyed lost or stolen neither the Council nor any officer employee or agent of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any such damage destruction loss or theft, howsoever occurring.
- (ii) upon production to a Bath attendant of a receipt or token given in respect of any article deposited the Bath attendant may hand the article to the person producing the receipt or token without proof that such person was the person to whom such receipt or token was originally issued.
- (iii) if any article deposited is not reclaimed within three months from the date of the deposit the Council or some person duly authorized in that behalf by the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of the same and shall be under no liability either to the owner or depositor thereof by reason of such sale or disposal.

(c) the Bath attendant with whom any article is deposited for safe-keeping shall deliver to the person depositing such article a receipt or token in respect thereof.

Articles Lost or Found.

8. (a) At every Bath premises there shall be kept by the Baths Manager or by some Bath attendant duly authorized by the Baths Manager a book (hereinafter referred to as "the lost property register").

(b) any person who finds any article which has been left in any Bath premises shall forthwith deliver it to a Bath attendant.

(c) upon receipt by a Bath attendant of any article which has been left in any Bath premises such Bath attendant shall forthwith take charge of the article and enter or cause to be entered in the lost property register a description of the article, the time and date of its receipt and the name of the finder.

(d) the Bath attendant having the custody of the lost property registered may deliver to a person apparently the owner thereof any article, particulars of which have been entered in the lost property register upon receiving satisfactory proof of ownership and on payment of the prescribed fee (if any) and upon such delivery such person shall by way of acknowledging receipt of the said article enter in the lost property register his name and address.

Disposal of Lost Property.

9. It shall be a condition of any person being admitted to enter any Bath premises (whether on payment to the Council of a fee or otherwise howsoever) that if such person leaves upon such Bath premises any article which is taken charge of by a Bath attendant the Council or some person duly authorized in that behalf by the Council may, if such article be not claimed within three months of the date on which its receipt is recorded in the lost property register, sell or otherwise dispose of the same and shall be under no liability either to the owner or leaver thereof by reason of such sale or disposal.

Non Responsibility.

10. Neither the Council nor any officer or employee of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in Bath premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in or on Bath premises.

Prohibition of Payment Except for Ticket, &c.

11. A person shall not pay, nor shall any Bath attendant or other officer or servant of the Council receive any fee for admission to or for the use of any facility in any Bath premises, except in being permitted to pass through a turnstile which automatically registers such admission or except in exchange for a printed ticket bearing the name of the Council in exchange for a ticket issued from a cash register of the Council.

Use of Prescribed Entrances and Exits.

12. (a) No person shall enter any Bath premises except through a prescribed entrance or leave any Bath premises except by a prescribed exit.

Prohibited Areas.

(b) No person shall enter or remain in any portion of any Bath premises not set aside for public use.

(c) No male person shall enter or use any part of any Bath premises for the time being set apart or appropriated for the use of females, nor shall any female person enter or use any part of Bath premises for the time being set apart or appropriated for the use of males.

Deposit on Towels, &c.

13. (a) Every person who hires any towel, bathing gown, or other article the property of the Council, shall pay a deposit in respect of each article according to the scale which may from time to time be determined by the Council, and shall return any article so hired by him to a Bath attendant before leaving the Bath premises.

(b) If any article so hired is returned in good order and condition the deposit paid in respect thereof shall be refunded to the person returning that article, but if any article is not returned or is returned in a damaged condition, then without prejudice to any other remedies of the Council a Bath attendant may forfeit the whole or (in his discretion) any part of the deposit to the Council.

Temporary Closing.

14. The Baths manager may temporarily suspend admittance and or clear the Bath premises or any part thereof of any person or persons if in his opinion such action is considered necessary.

Transfer of Tickets, &c.

15. No ticket, token, licence or receipt issued as provided by this By-law shall be transferable and no person other than the person to whom same was originally issued shall enjoy any benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

Professional Coaches.

16. The Council may at its discretion, permit from time to time, for such times Fees and under such conditions as it may resolve by Council resolution the use of Bath premises to professional coaches. Every person desiring to be registered as a professional coach in respect of any Bath premises shall first sign and lodge an application in writing addressed to the Town Clerk stating his full name and his private and business addresses and the Bath premises in respect of which he desires to be registered.

The Council may refuse to register any or all professional coaches in respect to any Bath premises if it so resolves by resolution of the Council.

Nothing in this clause shall prevent a Teacher from any School (whether State School or otherwise) from giving instruction to pupils admitted to Bath premises under School Classes rates of admission.

Season Tickets.

17. A Season Ticket which has been issued to any person shall only entitle such person to be admitted to the Bath premises from which such Season Ticket was issued.

Suspension of Charges During Galas.

18. During any period for which any Bath premises or any part of a Bath premises have been left for galas or other entertainments—

- (a) The charges for admission to that pool or those premises shall be suspended.
- (b) No season or other tickets, licences, or tokens issued by or on behalf of the Council shall have any force or effect or be available for entrance to or use at any such galas or other entertainment.
- (c) Neither the Council nor any of its officers or employees shall be in any way responsible for the due carrying out or performance of such gala or other entertainment, and—
- (d) Neither the Council nor any of its officers or employees shall be in any way responsible for any article deposited with any person in charge of or in any way connected with any such gala or other entertainment or present thereat.
- (e) Neither the Council nor any of its officers or employees shall be in any way responsible for any injury to or any loss or damage sustained by any person during the time any such gala or entertainment is being held.

Power to Eject Offenders.

19. If any person offends against any of the provisions of this By-law that person may (without prejudice to his liability to a penalty in respect of that offence) be requested by a Bath attendant to leave the Bath premises and if he does not forthwith do so any Bath attendant may, using no more force than is reasonably necessary, eject that person from the Bath premises.

Penalties.

20. Any person committing a breach of or an offence against any of the provisions of this By-law shall upon conviction for every such breach or offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds.

Hours of Admission.

21. Bath premises will be open to the public on the days and between the hours as may be determined from time to time by Resolution of the Council.

REPEAL.

22. By-law No. 50 of the City of Camberwell is hereby repealed.

OPERATION AND EXTENT OF OPERATION.

23. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of Camberwell.

24. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.
