THE Morwell Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following sewerage rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Sewerage Districts Acts, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable sewered properties within the Morwell Sewerage District:—

(1) Of any land or tenement situate within the Morwell Sewerage District, a sewerage rate of One shilling and four pence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said district.

(2) In no case shall the amount of sewerage rate payable annually be less than Three pounds ten shillings in respect of any rateable sewered property on which there is a building, and One pound in respect of any rateable sewered property on which there is no building.

(3) Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1961, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1961, and shall be payable on the twelfth day of May, 1961, at the office of the Authority, situate at the Water and Sewerage Offices, Morwell.

(4) If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid rate becomes during the year 1961 a "sewered property", there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

(5) For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for

the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined in the manner provided in the Sewerage Districts Acts.

(6) Such person or persons as the Morwell Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate and charges.

The Resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Morwell Sewerage Authority on the 5th day of April, 1961, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the 21st day of April, 1961.

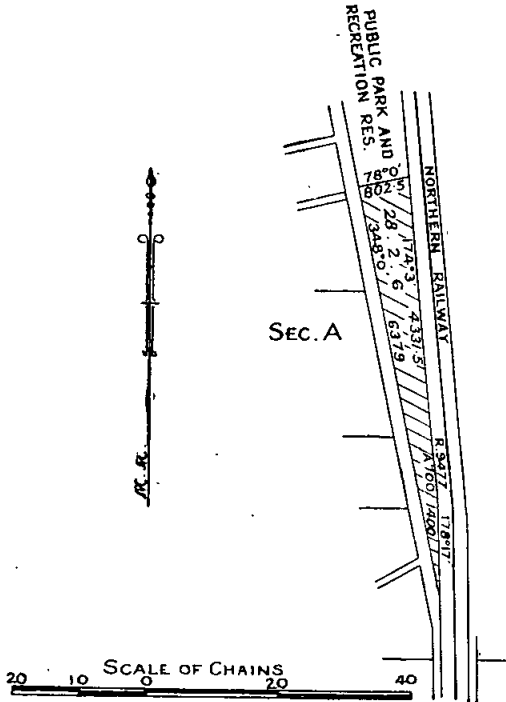

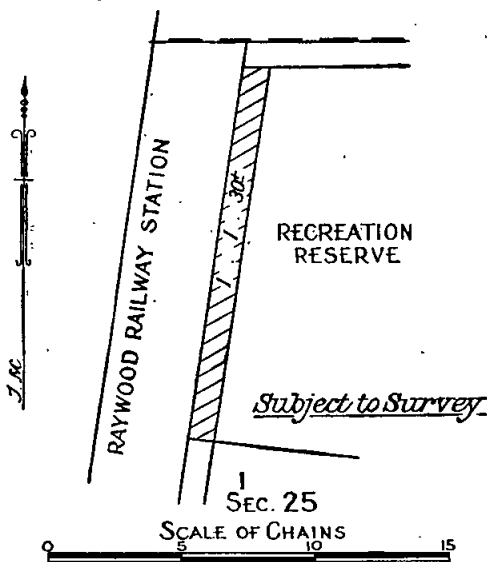

APPENDIX "E".

This table shows the payment per share for late admission, amount payable per share (except as hereinafter provided) on withdrawal before receiving an advance and the amount per share to be deducted from the sum of £50 to obtain discharge of mortgage before termination; Society based on life of 356 months; share of £50; monthly pays; notional interest rate $5\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

For late admission, the payment shall in all cases be subject to the addition of management fees as from the first pay of the Society and entrance fees as provided for in the rules.

For withdrawal before receiving an advance, the payment shall in all cases be subject to the deduction of such costs, charges, expenses, subscriptions in arrear, fines, proportion of losses or deficiencies and other deductions (if any), as are provided for in the rules. With respect to shares withdrawn before Pay No. 37, the member shall not be paid any interest on the subscriptions paid by him.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TOWER HILL GAME RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Crown land in the Parishes of Koroit and Yangery, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 7th March, 1961, as a site for the purposes of the Fisheries and Wildlife Department, and known as the "Tower Hill Game Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement of wildlife and wildlike habitat within the Reserve.
2. Without the written consent of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers no person shall—
 - (a) Dig or remove any sand, soil, scoria, stone or other material in or from the Reserve.
 - (b) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
 - (c) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
 - (d) Interfere with or damage any equipment, structure, signs, wildlife shelter belts, or any improvements constructed within the Reserve.
 - (e) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
 - (f) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy or interfere with, or take away any animal or bird of any description in or from the Reserve, or interfere with or take away any skin, egg, feathers or nest in or from the Reserve, provided that subject to the provision of the *Game Act* 1958, or any succeeding Act, the holders of current game licences may take and kill wild ducks during the open season for such ducks.

(g) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting ducks during the open season and is the holder of a current game licence. Any dog, except as mentioned aforesaid, shall be liable to be destroyed. Any cattle, as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1958, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.

(h) Carry any firearms, shoot at or kill or injure any animal or bird except the holder of a current game licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season.

(i) Camp within the Reserve or light or maintain any fire therein.—(Rs.2687.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MOUNT DANDENONG ARBORETUM RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Lands and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in Trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Crown land in the Parish of Mooroolbark permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 11th April, 1961, as a site for an Arboretum, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the "Reserve" who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the "Reserve" any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals, and any such found therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.
3. No person shall camp in the "Reserve" nor erect therein any booth, tent, or structure.
4. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the "Reserve" any article, fruit, or merchandise.
5. No person shall deposit in the "Reserve" any rubbish, litter, or refuse of any kind, nor stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, not cut or paint names, letters, marks or other matter on the trees, rocks, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface same, nor shall he break, cut, dig up, damage, or injure in any way or take away the whole or any portion of any trees, shrubs, plants, seeds, scrub, undergrowth, ferns, flowers, property, soil, or any vegetation in the "Reserve".
6. The lighting of fires in the "Reserve" is strictly prohibited, except in the fireplaces made and provided by the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall shoot, trap or destroy any bird or native game in the "Reserve", nor shall he, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management, carry, use, or discharge any firearms therein.
8. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the "Reserve" without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall play at, or engage in, any game or athletic sport or gymnastic exercise in the "Reserve" without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person in any part of the "Reserve" shall wilfully disturb, obstruct, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the same, nor wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management.

11. No vehicle, motor car, or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter, or pass over, or through the "Reserve" without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.—(Rs.8024.)

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

By-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the City of Dandenong, made under the *Health Act 1958* and the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 25, for the collection, removal, and disposal of nightsoil.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* and the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Approved” means approved in writing by the Council.

“Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Dandenong.

“Inspector” means a Health Inspector of the Council.

“Premises” means premises not connected to the sewers of a sewerage authority nor to a septic tank system installed with the approval of the Council (except premises having an area of 5 acres or more) and has the same meaning as in the *Health Act 1958*.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Regulations” mean the General Sanitary Regulations made under the provisions of the Health Acts.

2. By-law No. 115 of the Shire of Springvale and Noble Park (formerly the Shire of Dandenong, insofar as it relates to the City of Dandenong is hereby repealed.

3. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan closet shall cause a sanitary pan (except when being changed) to be kept in a proper position under the seat of such pan closet.

4. (1) Every such sanitary pan shall—

(a) be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22-gauge or other approved material with folded grooved seams sweated with solder or welded, and presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard, smooth and durable surface;

(b) have all surfaces which might come into contact with nightsoil free from any projections;

(c) be water tight and strongly constructed with reinforced metal bands where necessary;

(d) be provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

(2) Every such sanitary pan shall have a capacity of 14 cubic feet, with an internal depth of 14 inches and a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and shall be fitted with a suitable rim or lugs to permit an air-tight lid to be affixed.

5. (1) The proprietor of any premises shall cause to be kept in every pan closet a supply of liquid deodorant or lime sawdust, or some other dry material suitable for deodorizing nightsoil.

(2) Every person using a pan closet shall cause all nightsoil deposited in the pan to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.

6. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected an urinal shall provide such urinal with an approved apparatus for the regular discharge into the same of a sufficient approved deodorant to keep such urinal constantly deodorized.

7. No person shall place or deposit or cause or permit to be placed or deposited any slops, water, or rubbish in any sanitary pan.

8. The proprietor of any premises on which a pan closet or urinal is erected shall—

- (a) maintain such pan closet or urinal in good repair and in a clean and sanitary condition;
- (b) if and when required by the Inspector immediately and effectively disinfect such pan closet or urinal or the contents thereof; and
- (c) if and when required by the Inspector effect any repairs to such pan closet or urinal as he may deem necessary.

9. (1) No person shall cause, permit or suffer any sanitary pan to overflow or spill its contents on any part of any premises.

(2) Every person who causes, permits or suffers the contents of any sanitary pan to overflow or spill shall immediately cause the place where such contents have been dropped or spilled to be thoroughly cleansed.

10. Every person removing a sanitary pan from any premises shall immediately report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place where the contents have been dropped or spilled to be thoroughly cleansed.

11. (1) No person other than a person authorized or employed by the Council shall remove any nightsoil from any premises.

(2) No person shall bury any nightsoil in any place except at a depot nominated by the Council.

(3) No person shall dispose of any nightsoil except in the manner authorized by this By-law and the Regulations.

12. No person shall remove any nightsoil from premises situate in the area including and bounded by McCrae-street, Clow-street, Robinson-street, the railway line, and the Dandenong Creek except before the hour of eight o'clock in the forenoon on any day.

13. Every person depositing nightsoil shall—

- (a) immediately cause the sanitary pan which contained the nightsoil to be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed; and
- (b) immediately dispose of the resultant washings or filth in like manner as nightsoil.

14. Every person depositing nightsoil shall cause every sanitary pan used by him to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected before removing the same from the depot by thoroughly washing and brushing the same with a strong brush in a vat containing clean water and an approved disinfectant cleanser in such strength as may be directed by the Inspector, and then immersing and rinsing the same in a further vat containing clean water and an approved disinfectant in such strength as may be directed by the Inspector, after which the pan shall be upturned and drained before again being used.

15. No person shall use any sanitary pan for the reception of nightsoil until it has first been properly coated with well boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and thereafter similarly treated at least every thirteen weeks or sooner where deemed necessary by the Inspector.

16. Every person authorized by the Council to remove nightsoil shall cause every vehicle or other conveyance used for that purpose to be—

- (a) properly constructed and at all times maintained in a proper working order; and
- (b) thoroughly cleansed and disinfected each day after use.
