ENROLMENT IS COMPULSORY

NOTICE is hereby given that the rolls for the above-mentioned Conjoint Election will close on Thursday, 1st June, 1961.

QUALIFICATIONS OF ELECTORS

Every person of the full age of 21 years-

(a) who is a natural-born or naturalized subject of Her Majesty; and

(b) who has resided in Australia for six months and in Victoria for three months and in any subdivision for at least one month immediately preceding the date of such person's claim for enrolment—

shall be entitled in respect of residence in such subdivision to be enrolled as an elector on the roll for the subdivision in which such person resides and for no other subdivision.

ENROLMENT COMPULSORY

Every qualified person who is not already enrolled for the subdivision in which he or she resides, but who has so resided for a period of one month last past, must, within 21 days after becoming entitled to enrolment or transfer of enrolment, send or deliver to the Electoral Registrar for the subdivision a claim card duly filled in, signed and witnessed.

PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO ENROL OR TRANSFER ENROLMENT—Up to F

Enrolment claim cards are available at all POST OFFICES and ELECTORAL REGISTRARS' OFFICES.

REMEMBER

If you have recently turned 21 years of age, or changed your address, or become naturalized, and you have not, as yet, attended to your enrolment obligations, you should comply with the law immediately.



WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in lorce:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Frankston has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land used for a street known as Holmesstreet, Frankston, being part of Crown allotments 6L and 6M, Parish of Frankston, and being shown by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1961.

THE Mortlake Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound on the annual valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Mortlake Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building be less than Five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1961, and shall be payable on the 1st day of June, 1961, at the office of the said Trust.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Shire of Lillydale has made By-laws numbered 77-144 (inclusive). By-laws No. 113-144 (inclusive) have been made with respect to that part of the municipal district that will become the municipal district of the Shire of Croydon on 24th May, 1961, and By-laws No. 77-112 (inclusive) have been made with respect to the residue of the municipal district. The numbers, titles, and summaries of the contents of the By-laws are:—

77. By-laws Repealing By-law.—Repealing all By-laws at present in force within the Shire (except By-laws Nos. 36, 41, 60, 65, 66, 69 and 76).

78 and 114. Argentine Ants By-law.—(a) Requiring the destruction of Argentine ants; (b) empowering the Council to cause measures to be taken to destroy Argentine ants at the expense of the owner or occupier of any property or premises in the event of the failure of that owner or occupier to comply with the requirements of this By-law; (c) empowering the Council to recover the cost of such measures from that owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily; (d) prescribing penalties for breaches of this By-law.

79 and 117. 



DOG RACING CONTROL BOARD (FEES AND TRAVELLING EXPENSES) REGULATIONS 1961.

IS Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Racing Act* 1958, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations shall be cited as the "Dog Racing Control Board (Fees and Travelling Expenses) Regulations 1961" and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. The "Dog Racing Control Board (Fees and Travelling Expenses) Regulations 1955" and the "Dog Racing Control Board Regulations 1958" are hereby revoked.
 - 3. In these Regulations "Board" means the Dog Racing Control Board.
- 4. The Chairman of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of Three hundred and sixty-four pounds a year.
- 5. Every member of the Board other than the Chairman, shall in respect of his attendance at each meeting of the Board be entitled to receive a fee of Three pounds three shillings.
- 6. The Chairman and every member of the Board shall be entitled to be reimbursed travelling and other expenses in accordance with the conditions and at the rates provided from time to time in Part VI. of the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as last amended by the Regulation made by the Public Service Board on the 28th November, 1960, and published in the Government Gazette of the 30th November, 1960, so far as they relate to Permanent Heads.







TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS. AMENDMENT No. 11.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Teaching Service Act 1958, hereby rescinds Regulation 18 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations and substitutes therefor the following regulation:-

REGULATION 18.

Staffing of Secondary Schools.

1. District high schools, higher elementary schools, girls' secondary schools, central schools and central classes shall, subject to the provisions of the *Teaching Service Act* 1958 relating to the classification of teachers, be staffed as shown hereunder.

- 2. Head Masters may be appointed to or retained in high schools in accordance with the following scale:— $\,$
 - (a) A Head Master of the Special Class to or in a school-
 - (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils and which is in the metropolitan area; or
 - (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 500 pupils and which is outside the metropolitan area.
 - (b) A Head Master of the First Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 250 pupils.
 - (c) A Head Master of the Second Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of less than 250 pupils.
- 3. Head Mistresses may be appointed to or retained in high and girls' secondary schools in accordance with the following scale:—
 - (a) A Head Mistress of the Special Class to or in a school-
 - (i) which has a net enrolment of at least 600 pupils and which is in the metropolitan area; or
 - (ii) which has a net enrolment of at least 500 pupils and which is outside the metropolitan area.
 - (b) A Head Mistress of the First Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 250 pupils.
 - (c) A Head Mistress of the Second Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of less than 250 pupils.
- 4. The metropolitan area, referred to in clauses 2 and 3 above, shall be as defined in clause 3 of Regulation 4 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations.
- 5. A Senior Mistress of the Special Class may be appointed in a high school where there are more than 500 girls in attendance.
- 6. Excluding the Head Master or Head Mistress, the staff of assistant teachers in a secondary school shall be on the following basis, except as otherwise determined by the Tribunal, after consultation with the Director:—
 - (a) For each district high school there shall be one teacher for every 20 pupils in attendance up to 200, and one additional teacher for every 33 pupils in attendance in excess of 200;
 - (b) for each higher elementary school or girls' secondary school there shall be one teacher for every 25 pupils in attendance;
 - (c) for each central school there shall be one teacher (excluding Manual Arts teachers) for every 35 pupils in attendance;
 - (d) for each central class there shall be one teacher for every 30 pupils in attendance.
- 7. The staff provided for a new school shall be on the basis of the estimated attendance in accordance with the above provisions.
- 8. In addition to the classified teachers provided for in this Regulation, six relieving teachers classified in the Third or Fourth Class may be appointed to and employed in secondary schools.
