TOWNSHIP OF ANGLESEA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 17 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, in compliance with the prayer of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five rate-payers resident in a portion of the Shire of Barrabool not exceeding three square miles in extent and with the consent of the Council of the said Shire, I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby proclaim the portion of the Shire defined hereunder a township under the name of the Township of Anglesea:

Commencing on the shore of Bass Strait at a point in line with western boundary of allotment 11A, Parish of Angahook; thence northerly by a line, the western boundaries of allotments 11A and 11, a further line and the western boundary of allotment 10 to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 13; thence easterly by a line to the road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 10; thence northerly by that road for a distance of 20 chains; thence easterly by a line to the Anglesea River; thence northerly by that river to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 64C, Parish of Jan Juc; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the Township of Anglesea to the south-western angle of the said allotment 64C; thence northerly, easterly, southerly, easterly and south-westerly by the western, northern and eastern boundaries of that allotment to the south-eastern angle thereof; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the Township of Anglesea to the road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 52, section 2 in that township; thence southerly by that road and a line in continuation thereof to the shore of Bass Strait, and thence generally south-westerly by that shore to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, and in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The petitioners pray that the Governor in Council may be pleased to constitute the said area a drainage area within the meaning of the *Drainage Areas Act*.

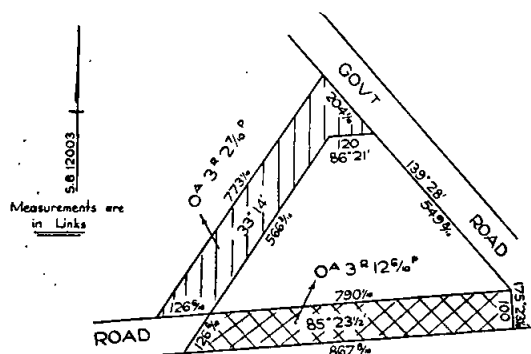

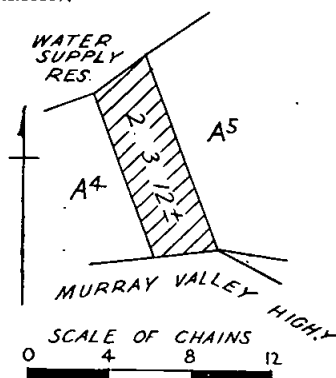

CLEAN AIR REGULATIONS 1961.

WHEREAS under the *Clean Air Act 1958* (No. 6220) it is provided that the Governor in Council may make regulations for or with respect to the several matters set out in section 14 (1) of the said Act, including the prescribing of exemptions from any provisions of the said Act: Now therefore by virtue of and pursuant to such powers and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Clean Air Regulations 1961, and shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, except where otherwise stated.

2. The occupier of any land on which is to be installed any fireplace or chimney for use in connexion with any industrial plant, or for the burning of rubbish at a public or municipal incinerator, shall submit to the Commission of Public Health complete plans and specifications of such fireplace, chimney or incinerator.

3. (1) Every fireplace or chimney referred to in Regulation 2 of these Regulations shall be fitted with equipment for arresting air impurities and complete plans and specifications of such equipment shall be submitted by the occupier of the land to the Commission of Public Health.

(2) If in the case of a particular fireplace or chimney the Commission is satisfied that there is no practicable means for arresting air impurities or that there is no practicable means for arresting air impurities when a particular fuel is burned, the occupier of the land where such fireplace or chimney is installed shall in relation to that fireplace or chimney, or in relation to that fireplace or chimney when such fuel is burned (as the case may be), be exempt

from the requirements of section 9 of the *Clean Air Act* 1958 and of sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation until such time as equipment capable of arresting air impurities becomes available.

4. For the purposes of these Regulations complete plans and specifications shall include such data, information and computations upon which the design of the fireplace, chimney, incinerator or equipment is based as are necessary for the proper examination of the proposed installation, and a description of the manner of operation of such installation.

5. The Commission on being satisfied that the fireplace, chimney, or incinerator, together with any required equipment for arresting air impurities, is of such design as will reduce the emission of smoke and other air impurities to the atmosphere to the lowest level reasonably obtainable when such fireplace, chimney, incinerator, or equipment is properly operated, shall issue an approval to install and operate such fireplace, chimney, incinerator, or equipment.

6. The occupier of any industrial premises from which air impurities are emitted to the outside atmosphere, shall provide one or more chimneys for the discharge of such air impurities and every such chimney shall include provision for an inspection opening or openings, and means of access thereto for the taking of truly representative samples of the discharge.

This Regulation shall come into effect on the first day of September, 1961.

7. The occupier of any industrial premises on which is situated a fireplace shall provide a means to the satisfaction of the Commission of Public Health whereby the person in charge of such fireplace may be enabled at all times to know without leaving the boiler or furnace room, whether or not smoke is discharging from the chimney. Such means may be one of the following:—

- (a) A window or other opening through which an unobstructed view of the top of the chimney may be had from the boiler or furnace room.
- (b) A mirror so placed as to reflect the top of the chimney, which reflection shall be visible from the boiler or furnace room.
- (c) A smoke density indicator installed so as to adequately indicate the type, volume and character of smoke being discharged.
- (d) A closed circuit television installation with the receiver located in the furnace room enabling the operator of the furnace to observe the top of the chimney.

This Regulation shall come into effect on the first day of September, 1961.

8. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £100.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Amending Infectious Diseases Regulations 1961" and shall come into operation on publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The First Schedule to the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941 as amended is hereby deleted and the following First Schedule inserted in its place:—

14. Notwithstanding the provision of Regulation 13 of the Mental Hygiene Authority Regulations as amended by these Regulations:—

(1) Any person occupying a medical position in the Mental Hygiene Branch classified as Medical Officer, Grade III., or Medical Officer, Grade II., immediately prior to the operation of these Regulations shall be deemed to be appointed to a position as Medical Officer and shall until the 31st March, 1962—

(a) be entitled to continue to receive the salary which he was receiving on the coming into operation of these Regulations;

(b) be eligible to receive a salary of £2,600 a year (Male) or £2,543 a year (Female) on passing Part I. of the course for the Diploma of Psychological Medicine;

(c) be qualified for promotion to the position of Psychiatrist on completing such course.

(2) Any person occupying a medical position in the Mental Hygiene Branch at a salary of £2,600 a year (Male) or £2,543 a year (Female) on the 31st March, 1962, shall be deemed to be appointed to a position as Medical Officer and be entitled to continue to receive the salary that he is then receiving until qualified for promotion to a position at a higher salary as provided elsewhere in these Regulations.

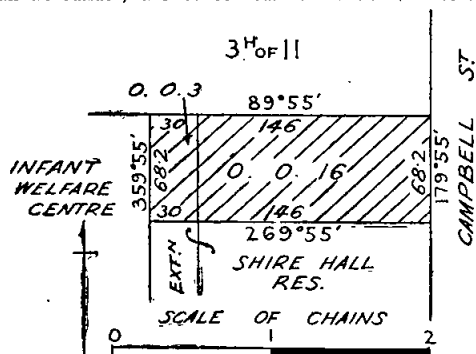

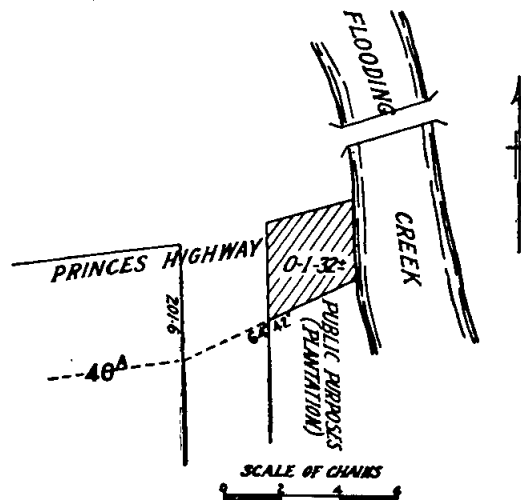

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LAKE LEARMONTH RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown land in the

Parish of Burrumbeet, as is indicated by red colour on plan marked B/25.5.61 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.1823, and known as the "Lake Learmonth Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

All previous Regulations in respect of the Reserve are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset and such other times as permitted by the Committee, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and also except on such days (not exceeding fifteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, cricket, football, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken by the Committee for admission to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 - (b) Climb, jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, trees, shrubs, flowers, gates, fences, seats or any equipment of any body therein nor leave nor deposit therein any papers, glass, straw, manure or any rubbish, nor roll, throw or discharge, or cause to be rolled, thrown or discharged, any stone, brick or any other substance as a missile.
 - (c) Discharge any firearm in any part of the Reserve so as to be a danger or annoyance to any other persons using the Reserve.
 - (d) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
 - (e) Remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
 - (f) In the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or disturb any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
 - (g) Affix, print, post, paint, cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee.
 - (h) Break anything made of glass in the Reserve.
 - (i) Permit any broken glass object to remain in the Reserve.
 - (j) Use the sanitary conveniences structures, or any part of the same, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portion of such structures as are specially constructed for the purpose.
 - (k) Use or cause to be used any boatshed for other than boating purposes without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
 - (l) Row or handle any boat or craft on the lake recklessly or in a manner likely to cause damage to its occupants or to any other boat or craft or to endanger the safety or comfort of any other person or to cause annoyance to any person on any other boat or on the banks of such lake.
 - (m) Being a male, other than a boy under the age of seven years, enter or use any playground, oval, place, room or building set apart for the use of females.
 - (n) Being a female, enter or use any playground, place, room or building set apart for the use of males.
3. No person while in the Reserve shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained—
- (a) Occupy or use any building, house, booth, shed or any other structure therein.
 - (b) Erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing or seat or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or in any way enclose any part thereof.
 - (c) Solicit or gather money or other thing.

- (d) Take part in any public entertainment of any sort.
 - (e) Preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public.
 - (f) Carry on any trade or business or the calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the Reserve.
4. Any written permission granted or ticket or receipt issued in pursuance of these Regulations shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee to demand the production of same.
5. Any person driving or bringing any vehicle of any nature whatever into the Reserve shall be under the absolute direction of the Committee or body hiring the Reserve. The Committee or hiring body may, at its discretion, prevent any vehicle from entering the Reserve.
6. No person shall bring into or put into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a cord or chain while remaining in the area.
7. Any dog found wandering uncontrolled in the Reserve shall be dealt with in the manner provided in the *Dog Act 1958*, or any amendment thereof.
8. The owner of any dog or other animal who permits or suffers such dog or animal to be in the Reserve otherwise than in accordance with these Regulations shall, in addition to any other penalty, be liable to make compensation for any damage done by such animal to the Reserve or anything therein.
9. Persons may camp in such portions of the Reserve as the Committee may appoint for this purpose and upon the payment of such charge as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee. This licence to camp may be withdrawn by the Committee at any time from any person.
10. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of grounds so set apart.
11. Persons or bodies renting or hiring any stand, building, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements shall, by a written undertaking, take full responsibility for any damage done to any such stand, building, or enclosure and shall make good such damage to the satisfaction of the Committee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee, and in addition the person or body so hiring shall be required by the Committee to lodge a deposit of a sum not exceeding £10.
12. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any games (football, cricket, tennis, golf, bowls, hockey, or the like) and any competitor at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground or oval during the course of such games and sport.
13. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve, or part thereof, for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, may be required to pay to the Committee a fee for the use of the ground, such fee to be fixed by the Committee.
14. Persons using or causing to be used any boat or craft on the lake shall first pay to the Committee an annual licence fee to be fixed. Such licence will be issued for the period from the 1st October to the 30th September following and may be withdrawn by the Committee at any time from any person.
15. The Committee may prescribe any safety requirements it deems necessary for the operation of any boat or craft on the lake and may refuse to license or withdraw any licence for any boat or craft at any time unless or until any requirement is fulfilled.
16. Council may prohibit the use of the lake by powered boats at any time during any specified hours.
17. No building, pier, or jetty shall be constructed in the Reserve until plans and specifications have been submitted and approved by the Committee and written permission given by it for such construction.
18. The Committee shall be at liberty at any time to require any buildings or erections in the Reserve to be altered, renovated, repaired or removed, and no stakes or posts shall be driven into the bed of the lake, and no pier or building shall be altered or removed without the authority, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
19. The Committee may provide and build such fire-places as it may think necessary, and any person lighting fires or using fires or causing or permitting fires to be used on the Reserve save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of such Committee, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

20. Every person who shall infringe any of these Regulations for the management of the Reserve may be removed therefrom or from any property therein, or directed to leave forthwith the Reserve or such property therein, by any officer or employee of the Committee or by any member of the Police Force, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to prosecution as provided by law.—(Rs.1823.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BRIDGEWATER PUBLIC PARK RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown land at Bridgewater as is indicated by red colour on the plan marked B./25.5.61 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.1495, and known as "Bridgewater Public Park Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

All previous Regulations in respect of the Reserve are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language or conduct shall remain on the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.
- 3. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
- 4. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve, other than a tent or booth, and then only as hereinafter provided.
- 5. No person shall camp or erect any tent in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions, and the payment of such fees, as the Committee shall determine.
- 6. No person shall erect a booth in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, nor shall any person offer for sale in the Reserve any articles, without the permission, in writing, and subject to such conditions and payment of such fees fixed by the Committee.
- 7. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee on the Reserve shall pay such charges (if any) for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee.
- 8. No person shall light fires, except in places set apart for that purpose by the Committee, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.

9. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.

10. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearm in or upon the Reserve.

11. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without permission of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. Permission of the Committee must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Reserve.

14. The Committee may set aside from time to time set aside certain portions of the Reserve for the playing of any particular game or sport, and may grant the use thereof to any individual, club or association of clubs on such terms and conditions as may be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

15. No person shall swim in any water within the Reserve on any occasion when such water is set aside by the Committee for use by vessels or other craft and water skiers as hereinafter provided.

16. The Committee may set aside any portions of the water within the Reserve for use by vessels or other craft and by water skiers on such terms and conditions as it may determine and all persons in control of such vessels or other craft and all water skiers shall comply with the directions of the Committee or its authorized representatives.

17. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident or occurrence causing any injury or damage to any person or property arising from the use of any vessel, article or appliance within the Reserve or from any cause whatsoever or howsoever arising within the Reserve.

18. A person shall not navigate or use a vessel or other craft or manipulate any water ski, surfboard or similar device on any inland water carelessly, recklessly or negligently or at such a speed or in such a manner as will cause any annoyance or nuisance or as is dangerous to or likely to cause injury by its wash or otherwise to any person or damage to any property, including another or the same vessel.

19. A person shall not, whilst under the influence of intoxicating liquor, or of a drug, attempt to take charge of or to put in motion any vessel or other craft or manipulate any water ski, surfboard or similar device or navigate or berth or moor a vessel or other craft on any inland water.

20. A person in charge of any vessel or other craft shall observe the steering and sailing rules set out in the Schedule hereto.

21. (1) A person shall not—

(a) navigate or use a mechanically powered vessel or other craft; or

(b) use or manipulate any water ski, surfboard or similar device at a speed greater than 5 miles per hour within 100 feet of any person swimming or bathing or of any structure not used for water ski-ing, or of any vessel or craft under way, at anchor, moored, or engaged in fishing.

(2) A person towing any other person on water ski or on a surfboard or other device at a speed greater than 5 miles per hour shall not permit the person being towed to approach within 50 feet of any person swimming or bathing or of any structure not used for water ski-ing, or of any vessel or craft under way, at anchor, moored, or engaged in fishing.

22. (1) A person shall not navigate or use a vessel or other craft within 100 feet of any vessel or buoy on which is displayed a red flag with a white diagonal cross indicating "diver below".

(2) A person shall not display a red flag with a white diagonal cross on any vessel unless there is a diver below or in the vicinity of such vessel.

23. A person shall not navigate or use a vessel or craft towing a water skier or skiers unless accompanied by at least one other responsible person in the vessel or craft.

24. All mechanically propelled vessels or craft shall be fitted with an effective silencer or other device for the purpose of preventing offensive noise from machinery.

25. All mechanically propelled vessels capable of a speed in excess of 10 miles per hour and less than 30 feet in length shall be fitted with an effective automatic device for rapidly closing the throttle should the driver's hand or foot leave the throttle.

THE SCHEDULE REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING REGULATIONS STEERING AND SAILING RULES.

1. When two sailing vessels are approaching one another so as to involve risk of collision, one of them shall keep out of the way of the other as follows, viz.—

(a) A vessel which is running free shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close-hauled.

(b) A vessel which is close-hauled on the port tack shall keep out of the way of a vessel which is close-hauled on the starboard tack.

(c) When both vessels are running free with the wind on different sides, the vessel which has the wind on the port side shall keep out of the way of the other.

(d) When both are running free with the wind on the same side, the vessel which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the vessel which is to leeward.

(e) A vessel which has the wind aft shall keep out of the way of the other vessel.

2. When two mechanically propelled vessels are meeting end on or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter its course to starboard so that each may pass on the port side of the other.

3. When two mechanically propelled vessels are crossing so as to involve risk of collision, the vessel which has the other on its own starboard side shall keep out of the way of the other.

4. When a mechanically propelled vessel and a sailing vessel are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision, the mechanically propelled vessel shall keep out of the way of the sailing vessel.

5. Where by these Rules one of two vessels is to keep out of the way, the other shall keep its course and speed.

6. Every vessel which is directed by these Rules to keep out of the way of another vessel shall, if the circumstances of the case admit, avoid crossing ahead of the other.

7. Every mechanically propelled vessel which is directed by these Rules to keep out of the way of another vessel shall on approaching it, if necessary, slacken its speed or stop.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, every vessel overtaking any other shall keep out of the way of the overtaken vessel.

9. In a narrow channel every mechanically propelled vessel when proceeding along the course of the channel shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such vessel.

10. In obeying and construing these Rules, due regard shall be had to all dangers of navigation and collision, and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from the above Rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.—(Rs.1495.)

AMENDMENT OF AND ADDITION TO THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF "ROSALIND PARK" BENDIGO.

THE Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, doth hereby make the following amendments and additions to the Regulations made on 20th February, 1952, and amended on 4th January, 1956 and 27th September, 1960, for the care, protection and management of the land in the City of Bendigo reserved by Order in Council of 5th February, 1952, as a site for Public Recreation and Drainage purposes, and known as "Rosalind Park".

PART III.—MUNICIPAL SWIMMING POOL.

By deleting Regulation 1 and substituting therefor the following:—

1. (a) No person shall enter the pool without paying such admission fee as is fixed from time to time by the Committee.

(b) No season ticket shall be transferable and any holder of such ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and all rights and privileges given by such ticket.

By the addition in Regulation 13 of the words:—

"Family season ticket—£10."

By the addition of the following Regulations:—

14. No person shall interfere with the use or enjoyment of the pool by any other person and any person so acting or behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the pool when requested to do so by any attendant in charge of the pool.

15. No person shall at any time bring any intoxicating liquor into the pool.

16. In the event of the Committee holding, or permitting to be held, a swimming carnival or other entertainment in the pool, the Committee shall have power to prohibit bathing in the pool whilst such carnival is being held.

17. No person, club or association shall organize or hold any carnival, aquatic display or other function in the pool without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.—(Rs.1375.)
