PROCLAMATION

And whereas the Apprenticeship Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trades set out hereunder, as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, be so proclaimed, and having received no representations by or on behalf of employers or employees in the said trades against such Proclamation, has recommended to the Minister that the said trades be so proclaimed:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trades set out hereunder as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, to be Apprenticeship trades, viz.:

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the *Social Welfare Act 1960*, No. 6651, it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of the said Act shall come into operation on a day or the respective days to be fixed by Proclamation or successive Proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the fifth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty, Monday, the eleventh day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty, was fixed as the day on which Sections 1 to 5 (inclusive), Sections 15 to 23 (inclusive), Sections 49 to 54 (inclusive), paragraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e) of Section 57 and Sections 58 to 62 (inclusive) shall come into operation:

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the sixth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and sixty, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and sixty, Wednesday, the seventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and sixty, was fixed as the day on which Sections 24 to 26 (inclusive) and paragraphs (b), (c), (h) and (i) of Section 55 shall come into operation:

Now therefore, I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Saturday, the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, as the day upon which the following provisions of the *Social Welfare Act 1960* shall come into operation:—

 Sub-sections (2) and (3) of Section 38;
 Sections 39 to 48 (inclusive);

Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*, and at the request of the Councils of the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick and Grenville, do by this my Proclamation declare the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick and Grenville to be a Union for the purposes of the said Act under the title of "Shires of Ballarat, Creswick and Grenville Weights and Measures Union" and do further declare that the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on such Union under the said Act shall be as follows, that is to say:—

ALTERATION OF CONSTITUTION OF A UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at a request by municipalities constituting a Union alter or revoke any such Proclamation declaring such municipalities to be a Union for the purposes of this Act:

And whereas the Borough of Sebastopol and the Shires of Ballarat, Ballan, Bungaree, Buninyong, Creswick and Grenville do constitute a Union for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*, under the name of "Ballarat District Weights and Measures Union":

And whereas the Council of each of the said municipalities has requested that the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick and Grenville shall cease to be included in the aforesaid Union:

Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*, do by this Proclamation alter the Proclamation under which the Ballarat District Weights and Measures Union is constituted on and from the thirtieth day of June, 1961, and declare that on and from such date—

- (a) the Borough of Sebastopol and the Shires of Ballan, Bungaree and Buninyong shall constitute a Union under the name of "Ballarat District Weights and Measures Union", and
 - (b) the apportionment of the expenses devolving on such Union shall be as follows, that is to say:—

Fisheries Act 1958.

REGULATION OF THE SALE AND MARKETING, ETC., OF TROUT OF ALL KINDS NOT INDIGENOUS TO VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Fisheries Act 1958* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the fourth day of May, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twelfth day of May, 1915, respecting the prohibition of the sale, etc., of trout of all kinds not indigenous to Victoria and prescribe the methods of and regulation of consigning, selling, marketing, storing and distributing non-indigenous trout of all kinds whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere and the treatment of non-indigenous trout of all kinds whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere for consigning, selling, marketing, storing or distributing as follows:—

(1) No person shall consign, sell, market, store or distribute any non-indigenous trout of any kind whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere unless—

- (a) Every such trout has been raised, produced and processed in a Commercial Fish Farm.

- (b) All such trout have the gills and gut removed.
 (c) All such trout are packed in cardboard, cellophane or wooden containers which have imprinted thereon the processor's name and also the name and locality of the fish farm on which they were raised and processed.

(2) Any person in Victoria who is treating non-indigenous trout of any kind whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere for consigning, selling, marketing, storing or distributing shall forward to the Director of Fisheries once in every month a true statement, in writing, of all such trout so consigned, sold, marketed, stored or distributed during the preceding month.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.—These provisions do not apply to any angler storing fish for his own use nor to any processed trout imported into Australia from any other country.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE SALE, ETC., OF NON-INDIGENOUS TROUT OF ALL KINDS DURING THE CLOSE SEASON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Fisheries Act 1958* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation provide that non-indigenous trout of any kind not taken during the close season for such species of fish may be kept in possession, sold or exposed for sale during the close season for such species of fish whether such fish were taken in Victoria or elsewhere, subject to the following terms and conditions:—

(1) No person during the close season for non-indigenous trout shall have in his possession or sell or expose for sale any such trout whether in the round or fillets unless—

- (a) Each trout is contained in a package or container which has imprinted thereon the processor's name and address, or
 (b) the fillets of any such trout are contained in boxes or packages which have imprinted thereon the processor's name and address.

Valuation of Land Act 1960.

VALUERS' QUALIFICATION BOARD.

THE Valuers' Qualification Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Valuation of Land Act 1960* and with the approval of the Governor in Council hereby makes the following Rules (that is to say):—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Valuers' Qualification Board Rules 1961 and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Without in any way limiting or derogating from its powers in that behalf the Board will accept as qualified to make valuations for all statutory purposes throughout Victoria any applicant not less than 23 years of age—

(a) who has passed in the following subjects at examinations held by the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology, namely—

Valuations I,
English I,
Law I,
Law II,
Building Techniques I,
Valuations II,
Surveying for Valuers,
Building Techniques II,
Rural Land Utilization,
Economics,
Valuations III.—

and who proves to the satisfaction of the Board that for an aggregate period of not less than four years within the period of six years immediately prior to the date of his application for a certificate of qualification as a valuer—he has been continuously in practice as a valuer or as an assistant to a valuer, or,

(b) who is a Fellow or Associate of either the Valuers' Division of the Real Estate and Stock Institute or the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers who proves to the satisfaction of the Board that he has had sufficient practical experience to carry out valuations for all statutory purposes throughout the whole of Victoria.

3. A fee of Five pounds five shillings shall be paid by an applicant for the issue to him by the Board of a certificate of qualification as a valuer.

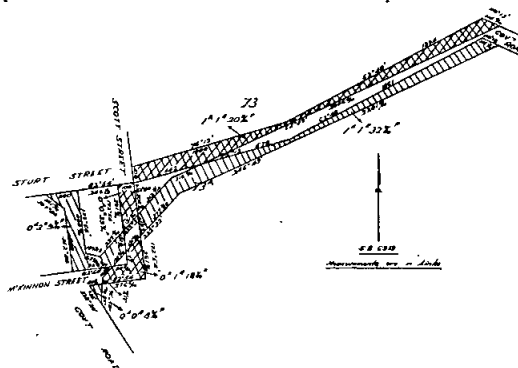

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE FOOD PREMISES REGULATIONS 1955.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* (No. 6270) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Amending Food Premises Regulations 1961", and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In Regulation 2 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 the definition of "Food Premises" is hereby amended by deleting from the second, third and fourth lines the expression "Part X. of the *Health Act 1928* or section 12 of the *Health Act 1935*" and substituting therefor the expression "Part XII. or section 244 of the *Health Act 1958*".

3. Regulation 3 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 is hereby amended by deleting the expression "1956" and substituting therefor the expression "1958".

4. Regulation 10 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 is hereby amended by adding the words "or flies" immediately following the words "or mice" in the last line.

5. Sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 13 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 is hereby amended—

(a) by deleting from the first and second lines of paragraph (d) the words "wire or approved gauze" and substituting therefor the words "approved fly-proof gauze".

(b) by repealing paragraph (g) and substituting the following paragraph therefor:—

"(g) (i) every doorway opening to the outer air shall be provided with a closely-fitting self-closing fly-proof door or an adequate fly-repellant air current;

(ii) every ventilator or window opening to the outer air shall be covered with approved fly-proof gauze;".

6. Sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 15 of the Food Premises Regulations 1955 is hereby amended by deleting from the definition of "meat" the expression "12" and substituting therefor the expression "13".

Where pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (3) of section twelve of the *Valuation of Land Act 1960* any certificate of qualification as a valuer is cancelled by the Valuers' Qualification Board the holder thereof shall, within 28 days after such cancellation, deliver his certificate to the Secretary, Chairman or any member of the Board or send the certificate by certified mail to the Board.

DECLARATION OF A RECLAMATION AREA AT KENSINGTON.

Now, therefore, I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act and upon such recommendation, doth by this Order declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Reclamation Area.

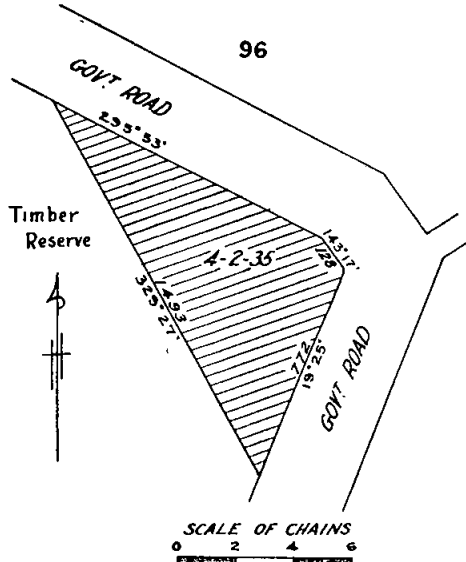

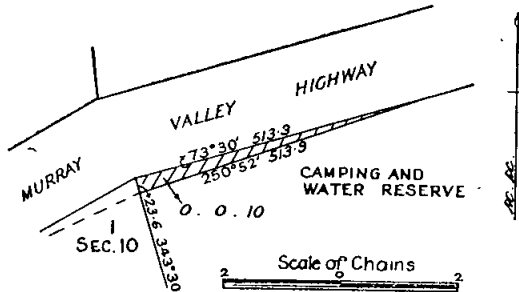

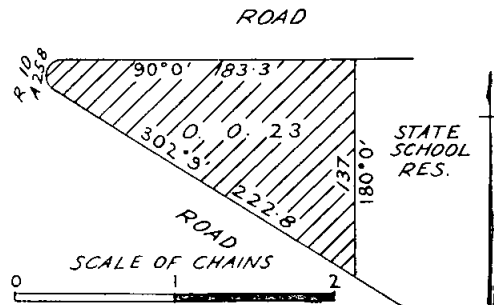

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MUD ISLANDS WILDLIFE RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands situate in Port Phillip Bay temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 12th January, 1872, as sites for Public purposes, and known as the "Mud Islands Wildlife Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement of wildlife and wildlife habitat within the Reserve.

2. Without the written consent of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers no person shall—

- (a) Dig or remove any sand, soil, guano, stone, or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (b) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage, or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees, or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
- (c) Gather, dig up, or otherwise have in his or her possession any shells, shellfish in or from the Reserve.
- (d) Enter upon, walk through, or otherwise interfere with breeding rookeries on the Reserve, which breeding areas being defined by posts around the boundaries of the breeding area.
- (e) Interfere with, damage, or destroy any water control structures, signs, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts, or any improvements constructed by the Fisheries and Wildlife Department or its authorized officers in the Reserve.

- (f) Interfere with any flow of water within the Reserve.
- (g) Carry any poison, traps, or snares within the Reserve.
- (h) Poison, trap, snare, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal or bird of any description in or from the Reserve or interfere with or take away any skin, egg, feathers, or nest in or from the Reserve.
- (i) Camp within the Reserve or light or maintain any fire therein.
- (j) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve.
- (k) Carry any firearms, shoot at, or kill, or injure, or attempt to kill any animal or bird of any description in the Reserve.
- (l) Take any boat on to the lagoon within the Reserve.—(Rs.7833.)

CITY OF HORSHAM.

BY-LAW NO. 50.

A By-law Relating to the Collection and Removal and Disposal of Refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1958* and of all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Council of the City of Horsham, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Horsham order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matter and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Horsham, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building or premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Garbage" is the animal and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of foods.

"Premises" includes land upon which no house or building is erected if the same is occupied and/or used for any purpose in respect of which refuse is produced or accumulated.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any house, building or premises, and includes the owner, occupier, and/or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse", subject as hereinafter appears, means any solid waste, and includes garbage, combustible and non-combustible rubbish, ashes, but does not include trade wastes or garden rubbish.

5. The proprietor of every house, building or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises or land upon which such house, building or premises is erected a properly constructed ratproof and flyproof receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, buildings or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle and with a proper handle or other lifting devices and such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered with such lid (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such receptacle and lid and refuse in an inoffensive condition.

7. Such receptacle and lid shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24-gauge or other material approved by the Council, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle or lid of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

8. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not less than 1½ cubic feet nor more than 3 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man, and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle or place or cause or permit to be deposited any moist refuse in such receptacle, unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper to the intent that such moist refuse shall remain confined in such wrapping whilst in such receptacle and shall not become loose or spread therein.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed in such receptacle any ashes or dust from fires or vacuum cleaners, unless—

- (a) such ashes or dust has been effectually wrapped in paper to the intent that such ashes or dust shall remain confined in such wrapping whilst in such receptacle and shall not become loose or spread therein;
- (b) such ashes are cold and combustion has completely ceased therein.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle and lid to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle and lid with tar or other suitable substance if required to do so by the Council.

12. The proprietor (at such hours and at such times as may be appointed by the Council) shall cause such receptacle, or not more than two (2) such receptacles, to be deposited close to the kerb of the street or roadway abutting on the land upon which such house, building or premises is erected in order that the contents of such receptacles may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall remove from such receptacle any rag, cloth or similar substance except for the disposal of the whole contents of such receptacle in a manner and at a place approved by the Council.

14. Any person who commits a breach of the By-law shall be liable for every such breach to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of such continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 233.

A By-Law of the City of Prahran made under the *Local Government Act 1958* and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria as amended by the Uniform Building Amending Regulations numbers 1 and 2 and numbered 233 for prescribing areas and determining certain matters or things left to be prescribed and determined by the Council of a Municipality under the said Regulations as amended as aforesaid.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, as amended as aforesaid and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Prahran order as follows:—

1. (1) Those portions of the Municipal District of the City of Prahran coloured blue on the plan attached hereto and more particularly described in Schedule A to this By-law are hereby prescribed as areas in which no buildings of Class II. Occupancy (as classified under the said Regulations) containing more than two stories (including the ground story) shall be constructed on any allotment.

(2) No person shall in the said portions of the said Municipal District construct or cause to be constructed on any allotment any building of Class II. Occupancy so as to contain more than the number of stories hereinbefore prescribed.

Provided that where the ground story of a building of Class II. Occupancy is devoted exclusively to the parking of wheeled vehicles it may contain one story in excess of the maximum number hereinbefore prescribed.

2. (1) The said portions of the said Municipal District are hereby prescribed as areas in which no buildings of Class II. Occupancy on any allotment shall contain:—

- (a) More than four flats each comprising a superficial area in excess of 500 square feet for the exclusive use of the occupants thereof, or
 (b) more than eight flats each comprising a superficial area of 500 square feet or less for the exclusive use of the occupants thereof.

Provided that on any allotment having an area in excess of 12,000 square feet a building of Class II. Occupancy may contain—

- (i) one additional flat containing a superficial area in excess of 500 square feet for the exclusive use of the occupants thereof for every 2,000 square feet by which the allotment exceeds 12,000 square feet in area, or
 (ii) one additional flat containing a superficial area of 500 square feet or less for the exclusive use of the occupants thereof for every 1,200 square feet by which the allotments exceeds 12,000 square feet.

(2) No person shall in the said portions of the said Municipal District construct or cause to be constructed on any allotment any building of Class II. Occupancy so as to contain more than the maximum number of flats hereinbefore prescribed.

3. (1) The whole of the said Municipal District is hereby prescribed as an area for off-street parking in relation to all buildings of Class II. Occupancy.

(2) The provisions contained in Schedule B of this By-law shall apply in respect to all buildings of Class II. Occupancy constructed after the date upon which this By-law shall come into operation.

4. Words or expressions used in this By-law and defined in the said Regulations shall where the context so admits bear the same meanings as in the said Regulations.
