



THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

- 1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Bacchus Marsh, Goulburn-Murray, Macalister, Merbein, Nyah, Redcliffs, Robinvale, Tresco and Werribee Irrigation Districts, except within any urban districts thereof, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1961.
- 2. By-laws Nos. 4868, 4869, 5121, 5141, 5227, 5229, 5230, 5231, 5232, 5233, 5234 and 5301 are hereby revoked.
- 3. For the purposes of this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
 - (a) An "acre-foot" of water means such volume of water as would cover an area of 1 acre to a depth of 1 foot.

 (b) "Irrigation season" means in respect of any irrigation district or irrigation area thereof (as the case may be) a period for which an irrigation charge is made.

 (c) "Ordinary watering period" means, in respect of the Merbein, Nyah, Redcliffs, Robinvale or Tresco Irrigation District, any of such periods within an irrigation season as the Commission may fix from time to time after consultation with the appropriate Advisory Board as the periods during which, and only during which, water shall be supplied in respect of water rights.
 - rights.

 (d) A "watering" of any land means the volume of water supplied for any continuous application of water to such land for irrigation.
- 4. In respect of any irrigation district the Commission may, after consultation with the appropriate Advisory Board, fix the maximum quantity of water which may be taken under water right at or during any time or period by the owners or occupiers of lands in such district.
- 5. Ordinary watering periods in respect of the Merbein, Nyah, Redcliffs, Robinvale or Tresco Irrigation Districts may be fixed by the Commission from time to time after consultation with the appropriate Advisory Board.
- 6. All persons taking water from the works of the Com-mission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets, at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission or its officers may direct.
- 7. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the water balliff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.
- 8. All meters or other instruments for measurement of water supplied for irrigation shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be installed under the supervision of and to the satisfaction of the Commission.
- 9. All charges under this By-law for water supplied for irrigation of any land shall be payable on demand at the place at which irrigation charges in respect of lands in the same irrigation area or irrigation district are payable.
- 10. The charge per acre-foot for water supplied for irrigation other than in respect of any water right shall be as follows:
 - as follows:—

 (a) For water supplied to lands in the GoulburnMurray, Macalister, Bacchus Marsh and
 Werribee Irrigation Districts—the same as the
 irrigation charge per acre-foot last made for
 the district before the date on which such water
 is supplied: Provided that the charge per acrefoot for any water supplied for irrigation from
 any drain shall be, if the water is diverted by
 gravitation, one-half the amount of the irrigation charge per acre-foot last made for the
 district before such date, or, if the water is
 diverted by pumping, one-quarter the amount
 of the irrigation charge per acre-foot last made
 for the district before such date;

 (b) For water symplied to lands in the Redcliffs and
 - (b) For water supplied to lands in the Redcliffs and Merbein Irrigation Districts—
 - (i) for water supplied during an ordinary watering period, the same as the irrigation charge per acre-foot last made for the district before the date on which such water is supplied,

- (ii) for water supplied at times other than during an ordinary watering period, but during a period in which water is supplied in respect of applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of a total area of not less than 300 acres within the district, one and onehalf times the irrigation charge per acre-foot last made for the district before the date on which such water is supplied,
- (iii) for water supplied at times other than during an ordinary watering period, but during a period in which water is supplied in respect of applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of a total area of less than 300 acres within the district, twice the irrigation charge per agreefoot last made for the charge per acre-foot last made for the district before the date on which such water is supplied:

Provided that the minimum charge for a watering of any holding shall be the charge for one acre-foot of water so supplied;

- (c) For water supplied to lands in the Robinvale Irrigation District—
 - (i) for water supplied during an ordinary watering period, the same as the irrigation charge per acre-foot last made for the district before the date on which such water is supplied,
 - (ii) for water supplied at times other than during an ordinary watering period, one and one-half times the irrigation charge per acre-foot last made for the district before the date on which such water is supplied:

Provided that the minimum charge for a watering of any holding shall be the charge for one acre-foot of water so supplied;

- (d) For water supplied to lands in the Nyah and Tresco Irrigation Districts—the same as the irrigation charge per acre-foot last made for the district before the date on which such water is supplied: Provided that the minimum charge for a watering of any holding shall be the charge for one acre-foot of water so supplied. supplied.
- 11. In the absence of any specific means of measurement or during any period for which the meter or other instrument for measurement is deemed by the Commission to be inaccurate or not registering, a watering of any land shall be accounted as follows:—
 - (a) For water supplied to land in the Merbein and Redoliffs Irrigation Districts—a volume of water 6 inches in depth over such land: Provided that where application of water to the land is within an ordinary watering period and is by means of sprays a watering shall be accounted as a volume of water 3 inches in depth over such land: such land;
 - (b) For water supplied to land in the Nyah, Robinvale and Tresco Irrigation Districts—a volume of water 5 inches in depth over such land: Provided that where application of water to the land is within an ordinary watering period and is by means of sprays a watering shall be accounted as a volume of water 3 inches in depth over such land;
 - (c) For water supplied to land in the Goulburn-Murray, Macalister, Bacchus Marsh and Werri-bee Irrigation Districts—a volume of water of such depth over the land as is set out in the Schedule hereunder according to the classifica-tion of the land and the crop thereon: Provided that-
 - a watering applied to any land by means of sprays shall be accounted as a volume of water 0.25 feet in depth over such land.
 - (ii) a watering applied to an orchard within three years after planting shall be accounted as one-half the volume of a watering computed in accordance with the said Schedule,
 - (iii) the volume of water supplied during any year ending 30th June for the irrigation of any land planted to tomatoes shall be accounted as a volume 2 feet in depth over such land or such lesser

The maximum allowance of water to be supplied per annum without further charge to any property for which a minimum annual charge has been fixed by the Commission shall be the quantity which, if charged for at Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to such minimum annual charge, and for all water supplied in excess of such allowance the charge shall be Twenty pence (1s. 8d.) per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. The charge to be paid for water supplied from the channels of the Commission shall be One and one-half pence (1½d.) per 1,000 gallons, except in the cases hereinafter mentioned—
 - (a) For sluice mining, except for purposes directly connected with machinery in motion, One penny (1d.) per 1,000 gallons.
 - (b) For steam boilers, condensers, air compressors and machinery for manufacturing purposes, Six pence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

PORT FAIRY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Cometeries Act 1958, the Trustees of the Port Fairy Public Cemetery hereby make the following Regulations, which shall come into operation upon publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication every Regulation heretofore made by the said Trustees shall be and is hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING LAWN CEMETERY, PORT FAIRY.

- 1. The new section of the Port Fairy Cemetery will be known as the New Lawn Cemetery, Port Fairy.
- 2. No interment must take place without the written authority of the Trust, and the fees paid in advance.
- 3. Public Graves: The interment will take place in the public non-denominational section and the fees will be that of digging the grave plus the interment fee.
- 4. Private Section: All graves in the private section must be purchased before any interment may take place, and the monumental fees paid with the purchase of the grave.
- 5. The Trust has the right to remove from graves any wreaths remaining after one month from the interment.

REGULATIONS APPERTAINING TO MONUMENTAL WORK IN THE New Lawn Cemetery, Port Fairy.

- All fees for the erection of new headstones are to be paid in advance by the owners of graves on their original application for ground.
- 2. Any person desiring to have erected a headstone on the grave of any relative or friend who is buried in the public ground may do so by application to the Trust and paying the prescribed monumental fee; and providing that a written guarantee will be given that the names of any subsequent person buried in the same grave will be included on the said headstone.
- 3. A fee shall be charged by the Trust for any alterations to existing headstone and shall be paid in advance with the application to carry out such alterations.
- 4. Written application must be made fourteen (14) days before proposed work is contemplated. Application must give full name of the owner of the grave, the name of the deceased person buried in such grave, the denomination of the section, and the work to be carried out.
- 5. No monumental work will be carried out without the written authority of the Trust which must be produced on application for the key to the Cemetery from the Secretary.
- 6. All surrounding lawns must be covered with a tarpaulin or some thick covering so as to prevent any cement or stone chippings remaining on the lawns.
- 7. On completion of the work the area must be left clean and tidy and all refuse deposited on rubbish heaps.
- 8. The Trust deems that any application for permission to construct, alter, or inscribe any grave in the Lawn Section of the Cemetery will only be approved on the understanding that the monumental mason will comply with these Regulations and Specifications, both of which have been laid down by the Trust and gazetted by the Governor in Council. Governor in Council.
- 9. If any monumental work is found not to comply with the specifications laid down by the Trust the monumental mason responsible will be given thirty (30) days to have the same carried out to the satisfaction of the Trust at the monumental mason's own expense.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF HEADSTONES IN THE LAWN SECTION OF THE PORT FAIRY CEMETERY.

Materials.—Cement must be first quality Portland ment. Sand must be best quality red sand or washed cement. river sand.

Reinforcing must be no less than 3/8 round reinforcing bars. .I

Headstones.—The height of the headstone must not be more than three (3) feet high above ground level.

The design will be selected by the owner.

The headstone or desk must be of solid granite.

The headstone or desk will be securely fixed to the base. 11. The headstone or ledger may be fixed at an angle providing that the headstone or ledger does not protrude past the back edge of the base stone.

Foundation Piers.—The foundation piers must be twelve (12) inches wide or must exceed the width of the base stone by six (6) inches.

All foundations must be sunk 3 feet.

The piers must contain three (3) perpendicular reinforcing steel rods 5/16 inch thick which will protrude four (4) inches above so as to tie the base to the piers.

Base.—The base must be of solid granite or of concrete containing Portland cement, best quality sand and first quality blue metal, and plastered in synthetic granite rendering. Under no circumstances will scoria be allowed.

In the concrete bases four (4) reinforcing rods will run the length of the base and eight (8) rods will be spaced the width of the base at equal distances apart. The size of the reinforcing will be not less than 5/16 inch.

The width of the base will be the standard monumental width to correspond with grave width of four (4) feet.

All bases must be filled at back and sides to adjoining headstones with matching coloured cement.

The depth of the base will be twelve (12) inches.

The height of the base will be eight (8) inches.

The base will be two (2) inches below ground level at the lowest point of the ground.

All bases must contain at least one Vase set in the granite or concrete.

Headstone.-The height of the headstone or ledger must not be more than three (3) feet from the top of the head-stone to the bottom of the base.

The width must be not less than two (2) feet seven (7)

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
