AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown Lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-General the Honorable Sir Edmund Francis Herring, K.C.M.G., K.B.E., D.S.O., M.C., E.D., Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the Thirtieth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, His Majesty King George VI. was graciously pleased to appoint me to be the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining; and further, in case of the death, incapacity, or removal of the Governor of the said State, or of his departure from the said State, or of his assuming the administration of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, to authorize and require me to administer the Government of the said State, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-ninth day of October, One thousand and nine hundred, constituting the office of Governor in and over the said State of Victoria and its dependencies as amended by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the Thirtieth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, making further provision for the administration of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in certain events. And whereas the said Governor having assumed the Administration of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia: Now therefore, I, Sir Edmund Francis Herring, the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State, do hereby proclaim that all the powers and authorities by the said Letters Patent granted to the Governor of the said State of Victoria and its dependencies and by virtue of all other powers and authorities thereunto me enabling, have become and are now vested in me as Lieutenant-Governor of the said State now residing therein, to be by me exercised and enjoyed in accordance with the terms of the said Commission.

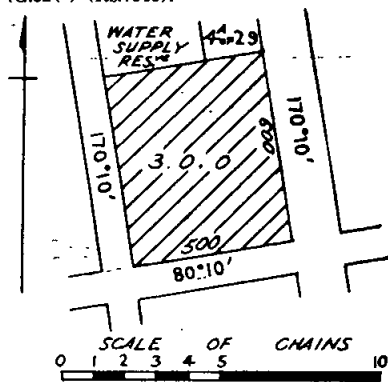

DECLARATION OF THE WIDENING OF THE GLENELG HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF WANNON.

WHEREAS by sections 21 and 74 of the *Country Roads Act* 1958 (No. 6229) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Act has taken the land necessary for constructing the highway or deviation or widening it shall as soon as it thinks such highway or deviation or widening is fit to be used as a public highway by Resolution declare the highway or deviation or widening to be a State highway or part thereof and that upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order of the Governor in Council confirming such Resolution such highway or deviation or widening shall thereupon be a State highway or a part thereof within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the highway on the land described in the Schedule to such Resolution to be part of a State highway: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

Resolution for Declaration of the Widening of a State Highway under the Country Roads Act.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "YANAKIE LANDING FORESHORE RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown land in the Parish of Yanakie as is indicated by hachure on plan marked Y/13.12.1960 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.7942, and known as the "Yanakie Landing Foreshore Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
2. No person shall bathe from the Reserve, unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.
3. No person shall enter or leave the Reserve, except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserve.
4. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass or flowers in the Reserve.
5. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings, fences, or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish in the Reserve.
6. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone, shell-grit, sand or loam.
7. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
8. No person shall commit a nuisance in any public or private bathing-box, boat-shed, or other building or erection on the Reserve.

9. No person shall carry or discharge firearms or air-guns in the Reserve.

10. No person shall shoot, trap or destroy any birds or native game within the Reserve.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. (a) No person, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee shall cause or suffer, or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge, to enter or remain in the Reserve, unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing, or other purposes of sport.

(b) Any dog found in the Reserve, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

13. (a) No person shall drive on to the Reserve or park thereon any motor car or other vehicle, except at such places as are set apart for this purpose by the Committee.

(b) No person shall drive or ride a motor cycle, motor car, bicycle, or other vehicle on the sands of the beach without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall park or leave any motor car or other vehicle on any part of the Reserve, except in an area set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

15. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve and authorized officers of the Committee, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

16. The Committee may set apart portion of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.

17. No person shall drive or park a motor vehicle of any kind within 25 yards of the children's playground.

18. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use, play with or damage any of the swings, fixtures or other equipment erected or provided in the children's playground.

19. No person shall leave or deposit any fish or fish offal on the Reserve.

20. No person shall, in the Reserve—

(a) light or use fires save in fireplaces which may be provided by the Committee, except by special permission or direction of the Committee;

(b) break glass of any kind; and

(c) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin can, orange peel, waste paper, garbage or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.

21. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

22. No person shall play or perform in any band or deliver or read any public speech, prayer or address of any kind, sing any song or enter into any public discussion on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

23. No person shall bet publicly on any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.

24. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale or hire any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

25. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

26. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve, unless by consent of the Committee.

27. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boat-house, shed, or any other building, structure or erection or booth on any site in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing-box, boat-house, shed or any other building, structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.

28. The Committee may, subject to the payment of a fee prescribed by it, allow the transfer of any permit, but no person shall sublet any site or structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

29. The granting, withdrawal, renewal, or allowance of the transfer of any permit or the subletting of any site or structure shall at all times be at the absolute discretion of the Committee.

30. If the owner of any bathing-box, boat-house, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth erected on any site on the Reserve neglects for a period exceeding twelve months to pay to the Committee the fee payable in respect thereof, then and in any such case it shall be lawful for the Committee in such manner as it thinks fit to sell such bathing-box, boat-house, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth, and to recover from the proceeds of such sale the arrears of rent and the costs and expenses of such sale.

31. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing-box, boat-house, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

32. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boat-house, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth, erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boat-house, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the chairman or secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

33. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may pull down and/or remove and/or sell such bathing-box, boat-house, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth, and recover the costs and expenses thereof from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same, but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

34. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

35. No person shall offer for sale or hire any article within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

36. No person shall drive or ride any animal or motor vehicle within the Reserve in a manner likely to cause injury to any person.

37. All persons using any conveniences provided on the Reserve by the Committee shall, on demand, pay to such Committee a fee which shall from time to time be indicated.

38. No person shall use the water closets or urinals in the Reserve or any portion of such water closets or urinals for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed.

39. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area.

40. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserve, except on such portion or portions thereof as may be specially set apart for the purpose by the Committee, and then only with the consent, in writing, of such Committee and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

41. Any person entering any structure, tent or shelter or parking a caravan in any camping area shall abide by such directions as may be given by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

42. No person, other than a person desirous of holidaying on any area set apart for camping in the Reserve, shall bring a caravan therein or erect a tent thereon and then only for a period of not more than four weeks at any one time, nor shall any person sublet such caravans, such tent, or camping site.

43. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent or shelter or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage from the site.

44. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person for use of a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by such Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded, and such Committee or its authorized officer at its or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clear up and put in order the site vacated.

45. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall on demand by any member of the Committee or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.—(Rs.7942.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty or not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ALTONA FORESHORE RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and

which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portion of the Foreshore Reserve in the Parish of Truganina as is indicated by red colour on plan marked T over 9.12.57 attached to Lands Department correspondence S.70845 and known as the "Altona Foreshore Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Altona as a Committee of Management, (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

The Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works on 13th June, 1930, in respect of the Reserve are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games or sports and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with the Regulations.

2. (a) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

(b) No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, lawns, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, excepting in the places provided for the purpose by the Committee.

4. No person shall climb, or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, excepting that horses may be bathed or exercised in the area designated for the purpose north of the Nellie-street outfall drain.

6. The Committee may debar any person from bringing into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is controlled by a leash.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

8. No person shall erect in the Reserve any structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public meeting, nor shall any band perform in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, chattels, articles or provisions of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person, not being a player or official, shall trespass on any area set aside for use by lifesavers, or other authorized club or organization for practice, demonstration or competition, during the progress of any match, practice, demonstration or competition.

13. No person shall play cricket, hockey, rounders, golf (or any other similar game), with a hard or solid ball, nor play football on the Reserve other than in the areas set apart for such games or sports.

14. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.

15. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

16. No person shall remove any sea-weed or other material from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and subject to the payment of such charges as shall from time to time be deemed reasonable by the Committee of Management.

17. No person shall remove or displace or damage or deface any board, plate, fitting or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations, or any notice fixed or set up by the Committee of the Reserve.

18. All persons using the conveniences, dressing-sheds, or other facilities provided by the Committee of Management on the Foreshore shall pay such charges for the use of same, as shall from time to time be deemed by the Committee of Management reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

19. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and the Committee of Management may charge and take a fee not exceeding two shillings per motor car or other vehicle per day for use of such area.—(C.70845.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LAKE ALBACUTYA FRONTAGE RESERVES".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parishes of Albacutya and Kurnbrunnin temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 26th April, 1961, as sites for Public purposes and those portions of the land permanently reserved for public purposes adjoining thereto, together known as the "Lake Albacutya Frontage Reserves", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year as any portion of the Reserve, inclusive of the beach, may be set aside for purposes consistent with the reservation and with the consent of the Committee.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except with the written consent of the Committee.

4. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings, fences or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve.

5. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone, shellgrit, sand or loam.

6. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

7. No person shall put or graze in the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, sheep or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee being first obtained, except grazing rights being held from the Crown.

8. (i) No person without the consent, in writing, of the Committee shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him, or in his charge, to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.

(ii) Any dog found in the Reserve, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

9. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserve, except on such portion as may be specially set apart for the purpose in the Reserve, and then only with the consent, in writing, of the Committee and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.

10. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth on any site on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth for residential purposes.

11. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserve of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth which has been placed, erected, or established without its consent or which has not been properly erected or properly painted or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair or in respect of which the term of the permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

12. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure or erection or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last known address a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the chairman or secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

13. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same, but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

14. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.

15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding £10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

16. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve, unless by consent of the Committee.

17. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee

or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.

18. The Committee may set apart any portion or portions of the Reserve as a place for the parking of vehicles.

19. No person shall park a vehicle within the Reserve, except in places set apart by the Committee for the parking of vehicles.

20. The Committee may fix such fee as it thinks fit as the fee for the parking of vehicles in any place set apart within the Reserve for the parking of vehicles.

21. Every person who parks a vehicle in the place set apart for the parking of vehicles shall pay to the Committee or its authorized representatives on demand such fee as has been fixed by the Committee pursuant to these Regulations as the fee for parking in such place.

22. Every person bringing a vehicle into the Reserve shall obey the reasonable direction of the Committee or its authorized representatives in relation to the driving or parking of such vehicles within the Reserve.—(Rs.8033.)

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of one year, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition the tender will be declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ————" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, or if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country or origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 12 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in clause 7.

9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.

10. All orders, duly received, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.

13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in clause 7.

15. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in clause 7.

16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not con-

formed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the said Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for supplies to Technical Schools, or by any article being made at any Government establishment and supplied for the use of the Education Department, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-36*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the opinion of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

21. *Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. 1. (a) Subject to paragraphs (b) and (c) hereof, upon the land set out and described in the First Schedule hereto and used or intended to be used for any purpose specified in column 1 in the Table to this clause, provision shall be made for the accommodation of stationary vehicles in the ratio set forth in column 2 of such Table, but so that the number of car spaces so provided shall be not less than the nearest whole number to the number arrived at when the ratio is applied.

(b) So long as any existing accommodation for stationary vehicles is not diminished regard shall be had when applying the ratio set forth in column 2 of the Table to this clause only to such buildings or to such parts of buildings (as the circumstances require) constructed after the commencing date.

(c) Where land is insufficient in area to enable provision for the accommodation of stationary vehicles to be made in accordance with the Table to this clause additional provision shall be made upon other land in the vicinity for the accommodation of such vehicles so that the total area so provided complies with the requirements of the said Table.

(d) Save where access to a car space is obtained directly from a street or road an access lane or lanes of sufficient dimensions shall be provided.

(e) The area of each car space shall not be less than 140 square feet, and—

(i) where entrance to a car space is obtained from the side the combined width of the car space and the access lane shall not be less than 15 feet. Where access is obtained as aforesaid if the combined width of the car space and the access lane is not more than 16 feet the length of the car space shall be not less than 24 feet; if such combined width is more than 16 feet but less than 17 feet the length of the car space shall be not less than 22 feet; and if such combined width is more than 17 feet the length of the car space shall be not less than 20 feet;

(ii) where entrance to a car space is from an end and such car space is at right angles to the access lane, the length of the car space shall be not less than 16 ft. 6 in. and the width of the access lane shall be not less than 20 feet;

(iii) where entrance to the car space is from an end and such car space is at an angle of 45 degrees to the access lane the length of the car space shall be not less than 16 ft. 6 in. and the width of the access lane shall be not less than 12 feet.

(f) The occupier of land wherein provision is or is to be made for the accommodation of stationary vehicles in conformity with this clause shall before any building or work is constructed or enlarged, rebuilt or extended on such land, lodge with the Council a plan upon which shall be delineated all car spaces and access lanes constituting such accommodation and shall at all times in conformity with such plan clearly indicate on the ground the boundaries of all such car spaces and access lanes.

SHIRE OF WARRAGUL.

By-LAW No. 67.

A By-law of the Shire of Warragul, made under the *Health Act 1958*, and numbered 67, for the purpose of providing for the collection and disposal of nightsoil.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1958* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Warragul, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the areas described and set out in the Schedule to this By-law.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Inspector” means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“The Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

“Officer of the Council” means any regularly and duly appointed officer of the Council.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as described herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of nightsoil, and shall cause such pan (except when being exchanged) to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22-gauge or other approved materials or materials presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with nightsoil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be water-tight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles. Each pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an air-tight lid to be affixed. The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises and another pan, thoroughly cleansed and in good order, shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleaned.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person or persons authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause it to be properly, efficiently, and sanitariously disposed of—

(a) at a depot provided by the Council or a Sewerage Authority in accordance with the requirements of the *Health Act and Regulations*; or

(b) at a depot provided by the contractor or authorized person and registered with the Council; or

- (c) by means of desiccation, incineration, destructive distillation, or by treatment with absorbent substances or chemicals, or by discharging into a sewer of a Sewerage Authority, or by connecting with an approved septic tank system, or by any other method authorized by the Council with the approval of the Commission of Public Health.
16. If such nightsoil be disposed of in trenches, then—
- (a) such trenches shall not be more than 18 inches wide and shall be excavated to a regular plan;
- (b) no trench shall be more than 18 inches nor less than 9 inches deep and the depth of any one trench shall be sensibly uniform throughout its length;
- (c) every trench shall be so located in relation to the slopes of the land that its bottom shall be at the same level throughout its length;
- (d) the first trench in every depot or unit shall be excavated (subject to compliance with Regulation 27 (b) of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950) near the lowest part of such depot or section and each subsequent trench shall be higher than its predecessor until the depot or unit has been used;
- (e) in all cases where the soil is such that liquid is not readily absorbed the bottom of the trench shall be broken up roughly so that liquid from the nightsoil may drain rapidly into the spaces between the clots, provided that no trench shall be so used where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.
17. Nightsoil shall be emptied into trenches in such a manner as to avoid splashing and so that no nightsoil shall be less than 6 inches below the surface of the undisturbed soil; and it shall be covered immediately with soil to a depth of at least 6 inches. Covering of nightsoil shall be done so as not to cause overflowing or to raise the surface of the nightsoil closer to ground level than 3 inches, and any soakage to the surface shall be immediately covered with clean earth, the necessary filling to be obtained by excavation of another trench in a parallel position to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in.
18. Spilled nightsoil shall be forthwith collected and buried as described in the foregoing and the soiled ground shall be immediately covered with clean earth.
19. Every depot as a whole and in large depots where the slope of the surface or character of the soil so requires, every section shall be protected from ingress of water from neighbouring land; and provision shall be made by means of check banks, trenches, and/or apparatus to prevent the escape of polluted drainage from such depot, and it shall be the responsibility of the contractor or persons authorized to ensure that such escape of polluted drainage shall be prevented.
20. Such contractor or persons authorized by the Council for that purpose shall immediately report to the Council any escape of polluted drainage from a depot however caused.
21. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of nightsoil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the nightsoil.
22. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—
- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60-lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber; or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water then rinsing in clean water and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of accol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.
23. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

24. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the depot and maintained in a proper state of repair.

25. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any nightsoil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

26. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause to be buried any nightsoil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

27. The inspector or any other officer or officers duly appointed by the Council shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

28. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

29. All complaints and infringements against this By-law shall be reported to the Council, in writing, within 24 hours after such occurrence of infringement.
