Architects Act 1958.

AMENDING REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS (No. 6) made with the approval of the Governor in Council by the Architects Registration Board of Victoria on the second day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, pursuant to and under the authority conferred by section 21 of the *Architects Act 1958*.

These Regulations shall be deemed to come into force on the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Regulations (No. 3) made by the Architects Registration Board of Victoria, and approved by the Governor in Council on the second day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and published in the *Gazette* on the fourth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and as amended by Regulations (No. 4) made by the Board, and approved by the Governor in Council on the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty, and published in the *Gazette* on the third day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty, and as further amended by Regulations (No. 5) made by the Board, and approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-second day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-third day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, are hereby further amended in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. Paragraph 3 of Regulations (No. 3) is amended by inserting immediately preceding the word "nine" the words "at least".

2. Paragraph 9 of Regulations (No. 3) is amended by deleting the expressions "5 o'clock in the afternoon of" and "5 p.m. on" and by inserting in their stead in both places the expression "12 o'clock noon on".

3. Paragraph 24 of Regulations (No. 3) as amended by Regulations (No. 5) is further amended by deleting the expression "24. The annual fee for registration shall be £2 2s. and the fee for the certificate of registration shall be £1 1s." and by substituting the following:—

"24. The following fees shall be paid to the Board by every registered architect—

- (a) a fee of £6 6s. for initial registration;
- (b) a fee of £1 1s. for the certificate of registration;
- (c) an annual renewal fee of £2 2s."

4. The first page of the "Form of Application for Registration" as amended by paragraph 5 of Regulations (No. 5) is further amended by deleting the expression "£2 2s." and inserting in its place "£6 6s."

5. Paragraph 2 of Regulations (No. 5) is amended by deleting the words "History of the" immediately preceding the words "Development of Architecture".

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

Those portions of the Eighteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shire of Mildura, excluding those portions which lie within the Parishes of Mildura and Merbein, the Shire of Walpeup and those portions of the Shire of Swan Hill which lie north from the under-mentioned boundary, that is to say:—Commencing at the south-western angle of Crown allotment 31, no section, Parish of Kulwin; thence easterly by a road and a line to a point on the west bank of the River Murray distant approximately 5,500 links easterly from the most eastern angle of Crown allotment 79, no section, Parish of Piangil, and excluding those portions thereof described in the First Schedule to this declaration.

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE CEMETERIES REGULATIONS 1957.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1958 (No. 6217) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Cemeteries Regulations 1961" and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The Cemeteries Regulations 1957 are hereby repealed.

3. No human remains shall be buried in a coffin or casket which is not so constructed as to prevent any person from seeing the contents thereof after the remains have been placed inside and the coffin or casket closed.

4. Whenever a coffin is buried otherwise than in a vault, there shall be at least 6 inches of closely packed earth between every part of it and every part of any other coffin below or alongside it, and it shall be so buried that no part of it shall be within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall be so buried that no part of it shall be within 3 feet of that level.

5. Any person who buries any human remains or in any way acts or assists in or suffers or permits such burial in contravention of this Regulation shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation and for every breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CORIO OVAL RESERVE, GEELONG.

WHEREAS by section 219 of the *Land Act* 1958, it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown land for any public purpose whatsoever or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act, and has vested such land in Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section: And whereas allotment 1 of section 86A in the Town of Geelong, Parish of Corio, County of Grant, containing 12 acres, more or less, was permanently reserved as a site for Cricket and other purposes of public recreation by Order in Council of

17th-March, 1885, and vested in Trustees by Crown grant, volume 1778, folio 467, dated 28th August, 1885, the said land being known as Corio Oval, Geelong (hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve"): Now therefore we, the duly appointed Trustees of the Reserve (hereinafter referred to as "the Trustees") in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the "Reserve".

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations where the context admits—
 - "Improvements" shall be deemed to include any fence, gate, post, notice board, building, appliance, equipment or other property of the Trustees in the Reserve.
 - "Person" shall be deemed to include any person, club, association, organization, school or other body.
 - "Sports" shall be deemed to include sports, games, shows, entertainment, fêtes, performances and training or practice therefor.
2. No person shall, unless authorized by the Trustees—
 - (a) Remove, interfere with or damage any improvement or anything growing in the Reserve.
 - (b) By any means make visible on any improvement or on anything growing in the Reserve or on any portion of the Reserve, any advertisement, or any poster, bill, sign, placard or notice or any mark or symbol of any name, letter or figure of any kind.
 - (c) Light any fire in the Reserve.
 - (d) Bring any vehicle into the Reserve.
 - (e) Leave or deposit in the Reserve (other than in a receptacle provided by the Trustees for the purpose) garbage, litter or refuse of any kind.
 - (f) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve.
 - (g) Bring any animal into the Reserve.
 - (h) Leave or deposit in the Reserve any clothing or dead animals or birds.
 - (i) Throw or shot any stone or other missile in the Reserve.
 - (j) Have in his or her possession, carry, use or discharge any firearm in the Reserve.
 - (k) Offer for sale or hire or hawk any goods or articles of any kind in the Reserve.
 - (l) Camp in the Reserve, or erect any structure or by any other means occupy any site in the Reserve.
 - (m) Play, engage in or practise sport or games of any sort in the Reserve.
 - (n) Make or cause to be made, by any means, any loud noise in the Reserve.
 - (o) Conduct, assist to conduct or take part in any fête, carnival, concert, band or musical recital or entertainment of any kind or any assembly for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking or any activity or meeting of a like character in the Reserve.
 - (p) Cause to fly in, through or over the Reserve any model aeroplane, glider or aircraft or similar apparatus of any kind.
 - (q) Grade or scrape the ground off, or cut or burn any grass or any part of the Reserve.
3. No person shall—
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve while in a state of intoxication.
 - (c) Interfere with the peaceable enjoyment of the Reserve by any other person therein.
 - (d) Ride, or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.
 - (e) Force open any locked gate or door in the Reserve nor shall any person use any key to open any lock on such gates or doors unless authorized to do so by the Trustees.
4. Should any person receive from any Trustee or officer or employee of the Trustees any key or keys for the unlocking of any doors or gates in the Reserve he shall return such key or keys in good condition.
5. The Trustees shall have power to let the Reserve or any portion thereof to any person, for the purpose of holding sports subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and to authorize any person to make a charge for admission thereto and in particular the Trustees shall have the power to let, hire, lease or licence the Reserve or any portion thereof to a trotting club registered under the rules of the Trotting Control Board for the purpose of conducting thereon trotting race meetings to the number and extent described in a licence issued by the Racecourses Licences Board to the Trustees of the Reserve and in exercise of this power, the Trustees are authorized to enter into an agreement or similar instrument with any such club as aforesaid, defining and stipulating therein the terms and conditions applicable to the letting hiring leasing or licensing of the Reserve or portion thereof and the period of time such agreement or instrument shall remain in force.
6. The Trustees shall have the power to hold sports on the Reserve and to make a charge for admission thereto.
7. The Trustees may from time to time, set aside a portion or portions of the Reserve for the playing or conduct of any particular sport and may grant the use of such portion or portions accordingly to any person on such terms and conditions as the Trustees may decide.
8. No person shall park a vehicle in the Reserve at sports conducted at the Reserve except at such places as are set aside for the purpose by the Trustees, who reserve the right to make a charge for such parking facility.
9. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any member of the Police Force or any Trustee or servant of the Trustees or any officer of a body, club or association conducting any sports authorized by the Trustees in the proper execution of his duty or work.
10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any sports of any kind permitted under these Regulations may be required to deposit any sum which the Trustees may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such rented or hired premises and the Trustees in their absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury so sustained during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the costs of making good such injury damage or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees.
11. Any person except the Trustees or their officers and employees on duty committing on any part of the Reserve any of the following offences shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations:—
 - (a) Being on part of the Reserve where any game, sport, competition, race, entertainment, amusement is being played, conducted or carried on at any time between the commencement and conclusion of the event without the consent of the Trustees.
 - (b) Interfering with or interrupting any sports.
 - (c) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to the Reserve or any part thereof without payment of the admission charged in respect of any function for which the Trustees have authorized the charging of admission.
12. Any bailiff of Crown lands, or trustee, officer, employee or servant of the Trustees or any member of the Police Force shall have the right to remove forthwith and to exclude from the Reserve any person offending against these Regulations, and such person shall also be liable to any other penalty prescribed by these Regulations.
13. The Trustees shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any appliance and equipment or from any cause howsoever arising within the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 219 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.



CITY OF CAULFIELD.

BY-LAW No. 125.

A By-law of the City of Caulfield made under section 93 of the *Health Act* 1958 and numbered 125 with respect to the provision, use and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish, and prescribing the size and shape of and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles and with respect to preventing and regulating the deposit of refuse and rubbish upon streets and other lands and places under the control of the Council and with respect to the removal, replacement, cleansing and disinfecting of receptacles for refuse and rubbish.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1958 and all other powers thereunto it enabling the Council of the City of Caulfield and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows, viz.:—

1. By-law No. 51 of the City of Caulfield is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Premises" includes any land upon which any house, shop, factory, garage, or other building is erected and any land upon which no house, shop, factory, garage, or other building is erected but which is occupied or is used for any purpose in respect of which refuse is produced, accumulated or from which refuse results.

"Proprietor" includes the owner, the occupier and any person having the management or control of any premises.

"Refuse" includes all offensive matter wastes (except sewerage and manure), rubbish and garbage (except garden rubbish and material of a mineral nature).

4. The proprietor of any premises shall provide and maintain at all times upon his premises a refuse receptacle which shall—

- (a) Be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or of durable impervious plastic material having a minimum thickness of 1/10 in., or of other material and thickness as may be approved by the Council from time to time.
- (b) Be of strong and sturdy construction and finished in such a manner as to prevent any escape by leakage or otherwise of any refuse which may be deposited therein.
- (c) Be rat-proof and fly-proof.
- (d) Be constructed so as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.
- (e) Be provided with strongly attached side-lifting handles.
- (f) Except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom, be constantly covered with a suitable lid which shall—
 - (i) be sufficiently close fitting to make a good seal and to prevent removal accidentally or by domestic animals;
 - (ii) have an adequate handle which is strong, firmly attached and easy to grasp;
 - (iii) be capable of easy and rapid removal by the contractor authorized in that behalf by the Council.

The proprietor of any premises shall from time to time cause to be deposited in such receptacle all refuse produced or accumulated or present in or about such premises.

5. The proprietor of any premises shall not keep or maintain thereon any refuse receptacle which, when containing refuse, exceeds 56 pounds in weight.

6. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, liquid, or any liquid refuse in any refuse receptacle or place or cause or permit to be deposited any moist refuse in any refuse receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper to the intent that such moist refuse shall not leak, drain or escape from such wrapping whilst in such refuse receptacle.

7. The proprietor of any premises shall—

- (a) cause any refuse receptacle and lid thereon to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and
- (b) from time to time introduce a sufficient quantity of efficient deodorant or disinfectant in such refuse receptacle when necessary to keep such receptacle and lid and refuse therein in an inoffensive condition.

8. The proprietor of any premises shall cause on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse therefrom any refuse receptacle provided thereon to be deposited inside and within a distance of 10 feet from the entrance to such premises from the street, lane or right-of-way on which such premises abut, or in such other location as the Council may authorize, in writing, in order that the contents of such refuse receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed on that behalf by the Council.

9. No person shall place or permit or allow to be placed in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way—

- (a) any refuse receptacle unless the consent of the Council be first obtained, or
- (b) any refuse not contained in a refuse receptacle.

10. In the event of any refuse receptacle not complying with the provisions of this By-law the Council may cause written notice to be served upon the proprietor of any premises requiring him to cause such refuse receptacle to comply with such provisions or (as the circumstances may require) to replace such refuse receptacle with a receptacle complying with such provisions, and such proprietor shall within fourteen days of the service of such notice comply therewith.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Caulfield.

12. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

REGULATION No. 15.

Crossings Over Footways.

A Regulation of the City of Collingwood numbered 15 and made under the *Local Government Act* 1958, by virtue of By-law No. 30, fixing the width, inclination and depression of Crossings and Materials of which same are to be constructed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1958, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood doth hereby make the Regulation and Order as follows:—

1. Crossings over footways shall conform to the existing crossfall from building line to kerb as follows:—

For two-thirds of the width of the footpath where the width of the footpath is 9 feet or less, and for 6 feet where the width of the footpath is more than 9 feet, or the width of the paving where footpath consists of paving and nature strip. The remaining area of the slab surface shall be graded uniformly down to 1½ in. above the level of the channel sole course. The edge of the concrete at the sole course shall be rounded off to a radius of 1½ in.

2. Crossings shall be constructed of concrete and shall be constructed to the full width of gateway or doorway, but in no case less than 8 feet wide.

3. Concrete shall consist of screenings, sand and cement in the proportion of 4 : 2 : 1 by volume, and shall develop a minimum compressive strength of 2,500 pounds per square inch at 28 days.

4. All crossings shall be constructed to a depth of no less than 5 inches for residential crossings and to a depth of not less than 7 inches for commercial crossings. All commercial crossings, and where required by the City Engineer in residential crossings, B.R.C. 655 mesh reinforcement or equivalent shall be embedded in the concrete at a depth of 2 inches from the bottom of the slab.

5. All concrete shall be laid on 2 inches consolidated depth of sand.

6. No concrete shall be poured until the formation and sub-base have been inspected and approved by the authorized officer of the Council.

7. The return of kerb on each side of the crossing shall be 6 inches in width and shall extend from the break of grade of the crossing to the channel kerb and shall join the channel kerb tangentially on a radius of 5 feet, or as otherwise directed by the City Engineer.

8. Where the crossing abuts a pitched channel, the whole of the channel between the ends of the returns of kerb shall be lifted and relaid on a depth of 3 inches of concrete, and shall conform to the pitching of both sides of the crossing, or alternatively the channel may be reconstructed in concrete to fit in with the existing grade of channel.

9. The City Engineer shall be the sole arbitrator in any dispute which may arise in connexion with the construction of the crossing.

10. This Regulation shall apply and have operation throughout the Municipal District of the City of Collingwood.
