PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 928 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, provides, inter alia that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof: any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamations published in the Government Gazettes on the 11th August, 1954, and the 9th July, 1958, the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Colac:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Colac has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to further parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Colac:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX, of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, to the parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Colac described hereunder:

IRREWARRA AREA

IRREWARRA AREA.

In the Parish of Irrewarra, County of Polwarth, commencing at the north-western angle of Crown allotment 1, section 20; thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 6, section 20; thence southerly to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 17, section 20; thence westerly to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 12, section 30; thence southerly and westerly along the eastern and southern boundaries of this same Crown allotment 12 to Princes Highway; thence north-easterly along Princes Highway to the southern boundary of Crown allotment 4, section 20; thence westerly along this southern boundary of such Crown allotment 4 to the South Western Railway; thence north-easterly along such railway to the southern boundary of Crown allotment 3, section 20; thence westerly along such southern boundary of Crown allotment 3 to Lake Colac; thence via the bank of Lake Colac north-easterly to the point of commencement. point of commencement.

ROSSMOYNE AREA.

In the Parishes of Nalangil and Elliminyt, County of Polwarth, commencing in the Parish of Nalangil at the north-eastern angle of Crown section 7; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of such Crown section 7 to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 1, Crown section 16; thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of the said Crown allotment 1; thence southerly via the bank of Lake Colac to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 2, section 9, in the Parish of Elliminyt; thence southerly to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 21, section 9, Parish of Elliminyt; thence westerly to the south-western angle of the said Crown allotment 21, section 9; thence northerly to a point 10 chains south of Princes Highway; thence westerly by a line 10 chains south of and parallel to Princes Highway to the eastern boundary of Crown section 18, Parish of Nalangil; thence northerly by a line 10 chains west of and parallel to the Corangamite Lake main road to the northern boundary of Crown section 7, Parish of Nalangil; thence easterly by the said northern boundary of Crown section 7 to the point of commencement. In the Parishes of Nalangil and Elliminyt, County of

ELLIMINYT AREA.

In the Parish of Elliminyt, County of Polwarth, commencing at the north-western angle of Crown allotment 48; thence easterly to the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 50; thence southerly to the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 46; thence westerly to the south-western angle of Crown allotment 46; thence northerly to the point of commencement,

northerly to the point of commencement.

And order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Colac on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 5th December, 1962, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 5th December, 1962.
